

Citizen And Community Empowerment For Real Change

Nelson Mandela once said: "The most powerful weapon is not violence but it is talking to the people." We believe this to be true and will employ this as a strategy and will be a LISTENING, VISIONARY AND RESPONSIVE GOVERNMENT THAT STAYS IN TOUCH WITH ITS PEOPLE AND NOT LEAVE ITS PEOPLE BEHIND.

We will immediately seek ways to empower our citizens and rebuild stronger communities for a strong Turks and Caicos Islands.

A PDM Government has developed plans for implementation that will empower its citizens at all levels: as an individual, as a community, as an Island and collectively as a country. The PDM will utilize empowerment tools as a priority. A PDM Government will seek to initiate poverty strategies which will eventually eradicate poverty, thus promoting social justice and equality for all.

Citizenship Empowerment

Knowing who we are and Re-establishing Ourselves as a People

The Turks and Caicos Islands enjoys a strong heritage and

a culture that we can be proud of. There are too many who continue to say that we have no culture because we have not been doing the best job at preserving, showcasing and passing it on from generation to generation. PDM believes that knowing who we are and instilling a sense of pride from this knowledge is key to the best future for these Islands. A PDM Government will ensure that every citizen is exposed to knowledge of who we are in two main ways:

- By re-establishing the Heritage and Cultural Commission which will lead in the development of a Policy and Strategic Plan.
- 2. By introducing the teaching of Civics at all educational levels.

Participation in Governance as a tool of empowerment

PDM believes that within these Islands lie the answers to the myriad of challenges we face as a people, and further that a Government who talks to and consults with its people governs best. A PDM Government will see that its people are key partners in this country's development and will keep them informed and involved through Town Hall Meetings, Freedom of Information and Quarterly Press Conferences, as a duty.

Home Ownership as a tool of empowerment

The PDM believes that home ownership and its protection is key in empowering our people. To this end the PDM will introduce:

First Time Homeowners Encouragement Plan



- 1. Waive Stamp Duty on private land purchase for first time homeowners.
- 2. Introduce a concession on all building materials for construction to first time homeowners.
- 3. Introduce a concession for first time homeowners' initial purchase of furniture and appliances.
- 4. Work with financial institutions to lock in a low fixed interest rate for the first three years.
- 5. Work with landscaping companies to provide

- affordable landscaping packages to all homeowners.
- 6. Enforce planning laws to ensure all subdivisions have proper infrastructure, paved roads with sidewalks, LED street lights and landscaping.
- 7. Make Crown Land available to Turks and Caicos Islanders who want to build their first home by creating a new Crown Land Policy that is fair, transparent and respectful to their right as a belonger desirous of owning a piece of land.





Social Safety Net/Social Services

A PDM Government believes that the way a country treats its vulnerable is very telling as to who it is. A PDM Government believes that no Government of the people should ignore the unique needs of special groups like our elderly, physically and mentally challenged citizens, and those living below the poverty line. A PDM Government believes that the needs of

each citizen must be addressed and will:

- a. Establish a fully staffed and expanded Gender Department.
- b. Establish a fully staffed Youth and Children's Department.
- c. Expand Social Services to aid in meeting the needs of those who require home help and other special opportunities.
- d. Introduce short term unemployment benefits.
- e. Present an Eradication of Poverty Plan.

Mortgage/Foreclosure Plan

- We will work with the Banks and other institutional lenders to agree to a 120-day moratorium on foreclosures. This 120 day moratorium would allow for the appropriate consultation to take place within the financial sector and it would also allow the necessary legislative authority to put in place the items below. This will be done within our first 100 days in office.
- 2. We will move to freeze interest accumulation.
- 3. We will work to obtain the agreement of the banks to a write-off of 100% of the unpaid interest and fees for those mortgagors that are facing foreclosure. This should be acceptable to the banks as they would have already made provisions against these losses.
- We will work with the Banks to reduce interest rates and will seek to attract a US Bank to our Shores in

- order to expand options for services to our people.
- 5. We will pass legislation if necessary to protect homeowners from foreclosure where they have already paid back more than a certain percentage of their mortgage loans. This will require close consultation with the banks and other interested parties. Once you have reached a certain level of home mortgage debt repayment, you should have some assurance that you will no longer be in danger of losing your home.
- 6. We will pass legislation to give greater protection to borrowers in relation to interest, add-on charges and other bank fees.
- 7. We will extend the first-time homeowners exemption from stamp duty to persons who lost their first home in foreclosure but are trying to buy a home once again.

Employment, Compensation and Retirement

A PDM Government believes that a Government must create an economy that benefits its people and that includes their personal and family empowerment. A PDM Government will seek to push the following initiatives:

- a. Create a Job Policy.
- b. Introduce Equal Pay Legislation.
- c. Create a Policy/Law for use of police records in job placements in a special program.
- d. Explore the possibility of a pension fund for workers in the hospitality industry.
- e. Empower Turks and Caicos Islanders to have ownership stake in local corporations.

The People of this country deserves a Labour System That Works. We will ensure that labour works for us. To this end a PDM Government will:

- Reform the Labour Department and provide adequate resources so it can successfully carry out its mandate and will create a physical presence in North Caicos and South Caicos.
- Ensure that there is a database that contains labour data inclusive of labour skills and will use this information to inform national needs areas for skills training, scholarships and local College/University Programs.
- 3. Create The Partnership Program between public and private sector that will address belonger placement on jobs, especially returning students.
- 4. Create a comprehensive database that will include status of all individuals and that will aid in monitoring work permits issued.
- 5. Introduce a policy that enures certainty and transparency for the guest workers as to the length and terms of their



- stay in the Islands.
- Succession Plans that will see periodic independent reviews for understudies and designates whether in the public sector or in the private sector through the staffing plans.
- 7. Ensure that Labour Inspectors are adequately staffed and trained to address not just job placements and the facilitation of work permits, but to ensure that persons are protected on his/her job.

Community Empowerment

The PDM will strengthen communities throughout the Turks and Caicos Islands in its effort to build a stronger country. A PDM Government will:

- a. Re-establish communities through a Ministry with direct responsibility.
- b. Promote national volunteerism through communities.
- c. Create green spaces and parks.
- d. Create Neighbourhood Watch Programs.
- e. Through strong partnerships, the PDM will Introduce and support Single Parent Programs with particular reference to After School Support in communities for children.
- f. Ensure that basic infrastructure supports well-lit, clean, safe and strong communities.
- g. Provide recreational facilities.
- h. Support and help to build strong families.





PILLAR 2

National Security Strategy For Real Change

he Turks and Caicos as an archipelago of Islands enjoy many natural benefits but our lay also presents many challenges as our borders are open and subject to breaches. There must be a real effort made to protect and manage our borders because at the root of most our nation's challenges are immigration issues – legal and illegal. We can ill afford to conduct business as usual with scanty resources, weak border patrol, haphazard and unplanned population growth.

A PDM Government will have a five prong approach to Immigration and will ensure that all responsible to protect and manage are well resourced with trained personnel, equipment and tools supported by a modern computerized system and a comprehensive, simple and modern legislation.

A PDM Government will set the following as priorities:

Immigration Control

A PDM Government will ensure that there are internal controls supported by a comprehensive database that will include information pertaining to visitors and guest workers, to control and manage immigration.

- A PDM Government will ensure that there is enforcement of the laws and will strengthen responsible Units/ Departments.
- 2. A PDM Government will ensure that there is a clear, objective and transparent path to citizenship with a citizenship program that enhances assimilation.
- 3. A PDM Government will responsibly grow the population through a carefully crafted population policy which will be based on census data, national plan and skills needs.
- 4. A PDM Government will establish a Multiculturalism Department to address and ensure respect and cohesion among the many cultures.

Foreign Relations

A PDM Government will continue to foster and strengthen relationships with Caribbean, Europe and our sister overseas territories and the United States of America.

 A PDM Government will continue to enhance the relationship between the TCI and its neighbours, pursuing opportunities for cooperation in Border Control, Drug and Human Trafficking and Illegal Immigration. A PDM Government will support the establishment of Consulates to address the needs of the different nationalities within the Turks and Caicos Islands.

A PDM Government will form an Association with all the Caribbean Overseas Territories and ensure a stronger front on issues affecting us all.

- A PDM Government will establish regular engagements with the Foreign and Commonwealth Office and the Government of the United Kingdom.
- A PDM Government will establish relationships with regional and international Media Houses in all our efforts to secure TCl's repositioning in the global arena.
- A PDM Government will set the stage to ensure that the Turks and Caicos becomes a leading decision maker in the policies of CARICOM and the Wider World.
- A PDM Government will develop a China Policy, with regard to Chinese investment in our country.

Border Protection

Border Patrol and Protection is critical to the managed and controlled growth of these Islands. The Interim Government had commissioned a Radar Station and we will continue to support this effort. However a PDM Government would recognize that the fight against illegal immigration requires a comprehensive approach:

- A PDM Government will begin a serious campaign jointly with the Haitian people to discourage human trafficking and the dangerous sea voyage to our shores.
- A PDM Government will commit to begin to prosecute those involved in the encouragement of the entry of illegal sloops and the hiring of undocumented workers.
- A PDM Government will engage the Regional and International Governments, in particular the Haitian Government to deal with this matter as a matter of urgency.
- A PDM Government will engage the UK Government on the matter of their constitutional responsibility to protect our borders.
- A PDM Government will establish a Border Protection
 Unit which will encourage cooperation between
 agencies with responsibility for some aspect of border
 patrol and protection thereby maximizing the best use of

our resources.

 A PDM Government will encourage a closer relationship between the Radar Station Unit and the Marine Police.

Courts and Prison

These Islands must place a greater commitment to a fair judicial system and the rehabilitation of offenders ensuring that each has an opportunity to successfully reenter society and become productive citizens.

- A PDM Government commits to review the Justice System with a view to ensuring that the Courts and Director of Public Prosecution's Office receive the resources they require to carry out their function effectively and efficiently. A PDM Government will commit the necessary parliamentary/legislative and administrative reform.
- A PDM Government is also committed to ensure that the accused receives due process and that justice is swift and fair.
- A PDM Government will ensure a comprehensive review of the HM Prison and will ensure that there is adequate funding to ensure that the persons in custody receive the

- best care and rehabilitative programs to ensure that they have the best opportunity to reintegrate into society.
- A PDM Government will ensure that a "Second Chance Program" is introduced that will work with the Public and Private Sector for job placements.
- A PDM Government will create a clear and transparent process for the expunging of records and for the use of Police Records in seeking employment.
- A PDM Government will work with the Criminal Justice System to introduce alternative sentencing for certain offenses.

Crime and Policing

Unfortunately, it is revealed that younger persons are becoming involved in criminal activities. Swift and deliberate action must be taken to curb this before it becomes an alternative way of life for youngster of the Turks and Caicos Islands. This country needs a strong Government that will take this issue head on with plans and resources.

- Gun crimes and crimes against tourists will be managed through a special program and with stiffer penalties. In order to address gun crimes there must be an aggressive effort to stop guns at entry points and to get them off the streets.
- Unsolved murders will be another priority and a victim's family management program will be instituted as a matter of urgency.
- A high level of unsolved cases tend to lead criminals to believe that they can get away with committing these offences. An aggressive plan to solve cases and not allow trails to go cold will serve as a deterrent.
- The introduction of biometrics and new crime fighting tools such as finger printing, CCTV, etc. will be a priority for a PDM Government.
- A PDM Government will look after its residents and its tourists and see no reason why any group should be at a loss. We will spare no efforts to ensure a safe place to live, work and visit.
- Within the first 100 days, we will meet with Law Enforcement and begin a comprehensive review of the Police Force.

The truth is today's criminals are younger, colder, braver or more desperate and are altogether of a different kind. We as a country can no longer fight the crime and criminal of yesteryear. This country has continued to take a weak stance and luke warm response to crime. This country needs a strong Government that will take this issue head on with plans and resources.

conomic development has stagnated over the last four years. Little effort, if any, has gone into attracting new investments and into exploring new and innovative ways of raising revenue. The PNP showed that it was not operating from a clear plan by its sporadic approach to tax introductions. The people and business community have struggled to survive under the PNP Government and the climate of uncertainty created by them did not prove to be an attractive quality for investors. Within the first 100 days we will reinstitute TEAM TCI, which saw the joint promotion of the Public and Private Sectors, with the Governor and then Chief Minister's participation in marketing the country.





Concessions

Concessions will be looked at on an individual basis; it cannot be a one size fits all. However, we will set some general rules that will be applied and the state of the economy will be the biggest determinant of that.

All concession periods should be relatively short, with a set time limit. A concession for the developmental stage of a project can be justified, but once in operation that entity should compete on a level playing field with other businesses.

A PDM Government will also explore new and innovative gains for a TCI Government in the area of concessions.

Special Development Areas

A PDM Government will introduce Special Development Areas (SDAs), where we will pre-approve concessions through The Encouragement of Development Ordinance, which will expand to local businesses.

We have identified areas as SDA's in the Turks & Caicos Islands and expect that the use of SDA's will stimulate the economy in areas of need.

Reduce The Red Tape

For the existing businesses on the Islands, we will work with them and their associations to reduce red tape and unnecessary business costs; but in the spirit of cooperation, we will expect a degree of social responsibility from those businesses.

We will also prepare a Policy for the Encouragement of Expansion in Existing Businesses.

Spread The Wealth

A PDM Government will work with the large developers to identify small business opportunities within their developments for Turks & Caicos Islanders to own and manage.

We will ensure that within the business plan there is a comprehensive training program for the development of Turks & Caicos Islanders.

Cost Of Doing Business

A PDM Government will conduct a comprehensive review of the cost of living and the cost of doing business in the TCI together with a full review of the Tax Structure and will take measures to reduce costs in order to ensure that we retain a competitive edge.

Level Playing Field



Consequently, the future of any nation is inextricably linked to emphasis on education and demonstrated through its policies and practices in educating its youth along with all its people. It is on this premise that the PDM administration, in effecting the change purported in this Blue Print and in keeping with its campaign slogan, would spare no effort and maximize the use of the appropriate resources to improve education milieu from early childhood education through to tertiary level in the Turks and Caicos Islands.

The PDM, from its inception, realized the importance of education to the development of our people and building our nation. Our track record shows evidence of the efforts and strides we have made in providing educational opportunities for all of our people through pumping much needed resources in scholarships when opportunities were not available at home. At the same time, much training and development of educational infrastructure was put in place to provide more opportunities in the education sector. Therefore, a new PDM government would spare no effort and utilize all resources available to maintain levels of support to students, raise standards and extend provisions in education: for example the launching of an annual 'Read a Book' competition. In keeping with modern trends, the PDM would seek to create an educational system that also fosters a spirit of entrepreneurship and enterprise with a view of producing persons with the skills for wealth creation, a more competitive job market and more optimal living.

In this 2016 PDM administration, the thrust remains recognizing that education is one of the major pillars of economic development and self-sufficiency; given that knowledge, information and human capital are the main economic assets to an advanced nation. We would endeavor to effect an education system which provides resilience, develops skills for lifelong learning and respect for individual differences.

The PDM envisages that under this administration the people would be able to run their own affairs. Therefore we commit to ensuring that the Turks & Caicos Islands has an education system that is as good as any can obtain in any other country in the region and the rest of the world. We will embark on curriculum reform and schools rationalization to address the needs of twenty first century development and the labor market of the Turks & Caicos Islands.

A PDM Government will transform education and will immediately change the Ministry of Education into the Ministry Of Education and Training so as to capitalize on the resources and assistance that are available for training regionally and internationally. A PDM Government with its commitment to the welfare of its people will concentrate on five major education constructs that would serve to meet our development objectives outlined in this Blue Print.

A PDM GOVERNMENT WILL FOCUS ON THE FOLLOWING PRIORITIES:

Primary and Secondary Education

- The modernization of schools' curriculum and our entire education system, providing state of the art facilities where possible.
- Building of a new primary school in Providenciales to help alleviate the overcrowding of the current schools; making comfortable classes with respect to student teacher ratio, creating an environment where everyone is equally valued and an open, caring and stimulating climate is fostered.
- Expand the curriculum at the primary and secondary school level to include: public speaking Develop affiliations with regional entities like Heart Trust and BTVI in the furtherance of Skills Training.and communication skills, foreign language, environment, marine and agriculture science and heritage and tourism.
- Review, update, reprint and encourage the production of local books.
- The establishment of Magnet Schools.
- Focus on literacy and numeracy development from the early stages of development in the schools.
- Provide facilities that would seek to improve students' performance in the Caribbean Certificate of Secondary level competencies.
- Ensure that all schools have proper sporting facilities.
- Place emphases on the arts and sciences early in the primary schools by providing labs.
- Improve the administration of education by training nationals in educational administration for both the primary and secondary schools.
- Promote and include entrepreneurship in the curriculum.
- Continue the development of programs for "At Risk Students", and for the differently abled students seeking to identify the different abilities as earliest as possible.
- Improve and provide the support services to students in





primary and secondary schools; improving guidance and counselling and other social emotional services.

Tertiary Education and Training

A PDM Government will erect a Purpose Built College Campus that will be able to transition to a full fledged University. We will include continuing education that is industry and national development led. A PDM Government will

- Transform the Turks and Caicos Islands Community College into the leading National Institution for training, education and research and focus on.
- Extend campuses throughout the islands through the latest technologies and building a purpose built campus in Providenciales.

National goals which will include a focus on adult education and reeducation programs.

- Establish a technical vocational center to provide the practical and technical skills needed by the kind of development that is envisage by this government, and providing opportunities for adult training and retraining.
- Encourage community partners in education so as to reduce the strain and ease the burden of the education system.
- Establish literacy targets.
- Build libraries in all the communities as an extension to those provided in the schools.
- Provide educational opportunities as part of the prison

- and juvenile reform.
- Focus on the utilization of standardize tests and procedures.
- Continue developing programs and training in specific areas of education: early childhood, physical education, special needs education, remedial education, reading etc.
- Ensure that prospective teachers are trained up to at least the bachelors' level before entering the school system.
- Provide free education up to the associate degree level.

Protective measures.

- Embark on an aggressive timely schools' repair plan.
- Provide for and maximize students' safety.
- Ensure the proper designation of bus stops for the drop off and pick up of students.
- Provide sidewalks in communities where students have to walk to and from schools, so as to ensure the safety of the students and other pedestrians using the roads.
- Improve the computerization and proper storage of information and students records.
- Provide CCTV systems at the schools.

Scholarship and Funding

- Encourage and reintroduce the concept of developers contributing to the scholarship program and review the scholarship policy.
- Introduce a student revolving loan fund program.
- Review the restrictive scholarship fund with a few to expanding the countries and national needs area for tertiary education.



PILLAR 6

Healthcare Reform For Real Change

The Turks and Caicos Deserve First Class Health Care Facilities

dequate healthcare is the right of all citizens.
An assessment of the healthcare provisions in the Turks and Caicos Islands reveals a blatant disregard for the sanctity of life. The system is in the worst state it has ever been, even with two state of the art hospitals. Perhaps, that is one of the biggest mistakes of the PNP administration, where healthcare is beyond the pockets of its citizens as payment for the facilities to Inter Health Canada continue to skyrocket. A PDM government will intervene on behalf of its citizens and ensure that healthcare becomes a right of all citizens or persons living in these islands.

The current state of healthcare in this country is a major concern for the residents of these Islands, specifically in the area of affordability, accessibility and quality of care. Healthcare is universal: our current policies leave the most vulnerable without access. The number one concern is funding. On top of the funding challenges that exist, TCI has fueled the 'perfect storm' in health care by significantly making it more difficult to access health care. The truth is two new hospitals do not necessarily translate into improving the health of a nation. As a result of the foreign run and maintained facilities TC Islanders have been pushed nearer or below the poverty line. Funding that should be devoted to education and infrastructural development are realigned to pay for those monstrosities. As a result, patients and the general public suffer.

A PDM Government will provide health care that is affordable and accessible. A PDM Government will focus on the following areas as priorities:

Accessibility

Healthcare is universal and your PDM Government will reform this sector by ensuring that there is access for all to healthcare. The current policies leave some of those in need and those most vulnerable without access. A PDM Government will address the major challenge of access to healthcare and will recognize groups that currently already use the services, those who require special consideration and the apparent restrictive NHIP Registration policy.

Primary Health Care

Lip service will never advance health care. Responsible and intentional action is needed and not 'colourful' bandaids for the

entire TCI. A PDM Government will redevelop and refocus healthcare in the TCI beginning with Primary Health Care and preventative measures. The PPP, with Interhealth Canada, has proven costly for TCI. A PDM Government will take time to study and discuss the alternatives and seek to improve the arrangement that currently exists. Questions on "what, where, how and when", will be considered in the efforts at reducing the expenditure to this single entity in an effort at redirecting significant amounts to primary health care. PDM believes that the health of the TCI is tied to the strength of primary care not hospital services.

Health Information

Robust ongoing health information is paramount. No analysis, planning or strategy can be properly developed without this. The MOHH has failed miserable in this area in spite of all the resources available. In regards to TCIs health system, there is a desperate need for overhauling. In addition, deliberate and honest leadership needs to be initiated that would give attention to the health needs of all people within the Turks and Caicos Islands

Strong Education and Healthy Lifestyle Initiatives

Recent statistics revealed that over 60 percent of deaths in TCI are as a result of lifestyle diseases. A PDM Government will aggressively address this trend by funding ongoing research and Awareness Campaign encompassing healthy lifestyle initiatives which will include School Nutrition Programs, National Screenings, Government's structured support and recognition of properly registered medical associations/foundations and a strong robust education program for all age groups.

Leadership In Healthcare Sector

A PDM Government recognizes the vacuum of leadership in the national healthcare sector and recognizes the need to fill this void as a matter of urgency. A PDM Government will position and establish the TCI Government as the much needed leader.

PDM is committed to dismissing the notion that health care is Interhealth Canada and that this sector is driven and improved by and because of the presence of two Hospitals. A PDM Government will lead and not wait for this entity as is seemingly done now. Critical services can be properly led by TCIG through MOHH and NHIP in collaboration with the private sector and other regional and international partners





PILLAR 7

The Environment, Land Use And Planning Development For Change

THE NATURAL ENVIRONMENT - LAND AND SEA

and protect and conserve our environment for present and future generations.

"Development has brought prosperity to some, but the benefits of development have not gone to all our people, and it has come at a great price – the price of our natural heritage. This is unfortunate because protecting the environment and developing our country do not have to be mutually exclusive. We can and must do both. The preservation of our culture, economy and quality of life depend on it".

PDM Government will plan, use our lands

The PDM will establish critical priorities in an effort to quickly to address environmental concerns. We will focus largely on education and awareness, protection and conservation and sustainable use and development. A PDM Government will ensure the following:

THE ENVIRONMENT

- A PDM government will commission and complete an environmental awareness audit which will be conducted to determine public views and levels of environmental awareness. In order to raise public awareness, the PDM government will work with the National Trust, DEMA and other individuals and agencies to conduct quarterly environmental awareness workshops and will ensure there is education at all levels.
- A PDM government will conduct an extensive review of existing environmental curricula, conduct a gap analysis to determine where additional curricula are needed and develop a comprehensive national environmental curriculum with age-appropriate levels for all school years.
- 3. The wealth of TCI's environmental cultural heritage, such as medicinal plant lore, traditional boat building skills, traditional construction methods, storytelling, etc., is being eroded and lost. As elders pass away, this critical knowledge dies with them. A PDM government will work with the public and private sectors and local NGOs to immediately develop and implement an environmental cultural archive. The archive will be based on recorded



- interviews with elders and historic documents.
- 4. A PDM government will incentivize environmental stewardship among people of all ages, by providing funds for DEMA to expand their current Community Conservation Partner Program.
- 5. A PDM government will reinstate the Conservation Fund and join the Caribbean Challenge Initiative. The Conservation Fund will be funded by a one percent tax on tourism-related services (as previously). The Conservation Fund can also be funded by implementing user fees for some protected areas, which will also provide revenues for improved management. By joining the Caribbean Challenge Initiative, TCI will receive matching funds for every dollar raised for conservation and will join with Caribbean partners in the region to promote regional sustainability.
- A PDM government will upgrade environmental legislation consistent with 21st century needs. TCI's capacity to protect the environment is dependent upon good laws. Many of our laws and policies are outdated and inadequate. A PDM Government will review and modernize our laws.
- 7. A PDM government will ensure that our protected areas provide benefits to all by developing a sustained ecotourism plan for each of the protected areas, promoting sustainable Belonger business opportunities.
- 9. A PDM government will introduce a comprehensive national anti-litter campaign styled the "Spic and Span Program" and will assist in the management of the environment through alternative sentencing measures.
- 10. A PDM Government will establishing a fully functioning Climate Change Desk.



LAND USE AND PLANNING DEVELOPMENT

- 1. A PDM Government will complete the Crown Land Audit, which is till, after many years in a dormant state and will introduce a complete database that captures both names and parcel numbers to aid research.
- 2. A PDM Government will develop and implement a sustainable National Physical Development Plan. At the foundation of sustainable development is sustainable planning. The development of a National Physical Development Plan will be based on a simultaneous evaluation of the environmental baseline, ensuring that development decisions and conservation work in tandem with each other.

- · Abandoning the raffle system for the grant of land
- Reintroducing lease holdings for land, with a stronger management system
- Reduce the size of the plots of land to ensure greater numbers of persons, present and future are able to benefit from land distribution
- Reviewing and introducing a more investor friendly policy in regards to the grant of commercial land
- 4. A PDM Government will ensure that there is a properly resourced Crown Land Unit and Planning Department with greater emphasis on management of land and enforcement of laws.
- 5. A PDM Government will return responsibility of land management to an elected official.

PILLAR 8

Infrastructure and Transportation For Real Change

he Turks and Caicos Islands has experienced and witnessed its infrastructure crumbling and not keeping pace with the level of development taking place over the past 12 years, especially since 2012.

A PDM Government understands the need for our country's infrastructure to keep pace with development, to attract new investment and to provide visionary projects that will foster sustained development and reflect the desires of a changing nation.

A PDM Government understands its responsibility to its tax paying people to provide basic infrastructure and services and will not renege on its duty.

REPAIRS AND INSTALLATIONS

A PDM Government will engage in a comprehensive plan to repair and rebuild crumbling infrastructure in a purposeful strategic scheduled and manageable way by addressing the following priority areas:.

- · An aggressive repairs plan for all Government Buildings.
- An aggressive 4 year plan paving all major roadways.
- Through negotiation with the private sector, seek to have roadways owned and maintained by them, thus relieving government of some of the burden of upkeep and maintenance
- Will address flood prone areas using the Study that was already carried out and will institute proper drainage systems
- Will institute water access for residents who wish to have city water, will map areas and schedule installations.

CRITICAL RECORD KEEPING

A PDM Government recognises the need to establish proper systems and recording of assets and will ensure that the following is completed:

- The revitalization and Proper logging of TCIG's assets with valuations
- Proper Road Safety Database and Management system

ROAD SAFETY MANAGEMENT

As a growing country and a highly sought after tourist destination, A PDM Government recognizes the need to have stronger road management systems, including resources, properly named streets, proper signage for road users and major sites.

A PDM Government will:

• Ensure daily inspection of vehicles



- Ensure stronger road safety presence
- Ensure a comprehensive review and strengthening of the Road Safety Department

Signage

Increase presence in street and directional signage; especially in areas such as school zones, attractions and place of common use.

Free Wifi

Create Public Zones for free Wi-Fi.

There are key Institutions and Infrastructural projects that will revolutionize these Islands.

A PDM Government will deliver innovative and cutting edge plans that will include:

- 1. Creative and Performing Arts Centers and a High Performance Sports Center where our youth can develop their talents.
- 2. A Public Transportation Authority to manage and regulate this Industry.
- A Public Housing Department that will govern themajor project in an effort to provide legal and affordable homes.
- 4. The Heritage and Cultural Commission with a Multiculturalism Department to assist in the management of the many cultures living among us.
- 5. The PDM remains disappointed that the TCI after 20 years has not built a purpose built facility for its Provo Campus of the Turks And Caicos Islands Community College.

 A PDM Government will erect a Purpose Built College Campus that will be able to transition to a full fledged University.

- 6. A Sports Commission for the effective and efficient management of sports in these Islands.
- 7. A Comprehensive Plan to address drainage country wide. We will undertake to institute a comprehensive drainage system.
- 8. A Waste Management & Water Authority will enhance our performance in these areas.
- 9. An immediate comprehensive plan to repair the crumbling Sea Wall on Grand Turk.
- 10. Build a Spine Link Road linking the Caicos Islands, with the first phase being the linking of North Caicos to Providenciales in keeping with the vision of our Party first leader, and national hero the Right Excellent Hon. JAGS McCartney.









Governance for Real Change

The Constitution, Legislation And The Civil Service

A PDM Government will prioritise key areas of governance to address immediately:

THE CONSTITUTION

The PDM remains the only Party that has an Official Position on the 2011 Constitution. The PDM maintains that it is regressive in several provisions and there is need to revisit the Constitution to ensure that locally elected Government governs unhindered. We will within the first 100 days travel to the UK to agree a process on the way forward for the Constitutional review and will address the following a matter of priority.

A PDM Government will vigorously and urgently engage the British Government, inter alia, the following:

- The Current Constitution and our relationship
- Internal and External Security and its constitutional Responsibility
- An amendment to the Processing of Overseas Territories Passport
- · Post Brexit Plan

LEGISLATION

There is need to review legislation and to introduce a comprehensive social legislative agenda.

Review

The PDM will review critical legislation as a matter of priority including, but not limited to the Crown Land Ordinance, Police Ordinance, Public Service Ordinances and Policies and the Immigration Ordinances .

New Legislation

A PDM Government will introduce new legislation that will facilitate the return of several Statutory Bodies . The following pieces of legislation will be priority:

- Sports Commission
- Culture and Heritage Commission
- Public Transportation Authority
- Water and Sewerage Authority

The creation of a Legislative Agenda

A PDM Government will create and publish periodic legislative agenda

Ensure Consultation on major laws to change

A PDM Government will ensure that the legal requirements for consultation are met and will createa lead organization with the responsibility to engage in real and meaningful consultation on behalf of the Government.

RESOURCES FOR LEGISLATION PASSED AND UNDER RESOURCED

A PDM Government will review legislation passed by the PNP Government for which no resources were put in place to ensure its enforcement and delivery of services. The PDM will make the following Bills priority:

- The Women and Children Bills
- Disaster Management Ordinance

CIVIL SERVICE

An effective and efficient Civil Service is critical to the growth and management of the country. Therefore a PDM Government will introduce Policies to ensure a happy and productive work environment that will not only retain civil servants but will also attract the brightest minds in the Turks and Caicos Islands.

Benefits/Incentives

A review of the compensation package offered Civil Servants is a priority to a PDM administration. This will be given time and attention to ensure that Civil Servants in all aspect of work will be adequately compensated whilst many of the civil servants have enjoyed a pay increase through a regarding exercise recently conducted, there are those who felt that they were not fairly assessed and also those who did not receive any material benefit to. A PDM Government will review salaries in an effort to assess the need for a cost of living allowance increase.

- The PDM believes that the payment of pensions and gratuities denied Civil Servants have been a disincentive and have perpetuated the loss of key employees. Reinstating these rights will enhance the attractiveness of the Civil Service and will serve to retain those with institutional knowledge, training and experience. Therefore a PDM Government will seek to reinstate gratuities for post 1992 staff and the introduction of Pensions for the Civil Service.
- A PDM Government will implement policy to ensure that





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there is a structured Performance Appraisals Program for Promotion and Training.

• A PDM Government will explore the possibility of an optional Payment Scheme for Established Staff for bi monthly versus monthly payments of salaries.

Training and Succession Planning

Training and Forward Planning is critical to the future of the Civil Service and to ensuring that our people

- A PDM Government will ensure that there is an ongoing aggressive Training Plan to enhance the skills set in the Civil Service. This Plan will also lend into the National Scholarship Policy and National Development Plan.
- The PDM will continue its quest to ensure that qualified Turks and Caicos Islands assume positions as Heads of Departments in the various ministries. Where deficiencies exist, a vigorus training programmed will be instituted to ensure that TC Islanders are adequately trained.

 A PDM Government will ensure that our people are positioned to occupy senior positions in the Civil and Public Service.

Physical and General Work Environment

Members of the Civil Service have had to work under strenuous and unhealthy conditions. Working in buildings that have been condemned because of structural or other health challenging defects. The PDM believes that the work environment must be conducive to productivity and that the physical space can have positive and negative effects on levels of productivity.

 A PDM Government will, therefore, seek immediately to commission a review of the physical working condition of civil servants and will prepare an aggressive repairs plan to improve the physical working condition of the civil service.

Local Representation and Dialogue

The PDM believes that it is vital to have a healthy dialogue between a Government and its civil service.

A PDM Government will therefore support the effective operation of the Civil Service Association (CSA) and will hold structured periodic meetings with Civil Service The PDM Government will identify a local government model that will seek to strengthen local government through an elections process in order to have a more efficient and effective micro level management that will allow national candidates to focus more on the macro management and general direction of the country.

A PDM Government will expand Local Government to include an Office for Cockburn Town Major/Administrator. There has always been a misconception that the Island of Grand Turk is managed by central government. This is not in reality the case, hence there is not office or person responsible for Grand Turk leadership like the District Commissioners on several other Islands. This office should be properly resourced and legally empowered to undertaken critical functions such as leading small capital projects lighting, cleaning, hurricane preparedness etc .



20 Things you may not know

→ Technological Advancement

Your PDM Government introduced internet services in the Islands, computerized all primary schools and introduced our children to the information age. Your PDM Government waived all duties on the importation of computers and accessories. Now that is progress. This PNP Government taxed the use of the internet and removed Information Technology teachers from Schools.

→ Scholarships

Your PDM Government increased scholarships from \$300,000 to over \$5m. Now that is progress. This PNP has reached the pre 2003 scholarship levels and has since cancelled developers contributions to the scholarship fund.

→ Debt Repayment

Your PDM Government, when it inherited huge debt from the Washington Misick Administration, marketed TCI overseas, grew the economy and brought in \$1b in investment. This PNP Government raised revenue on the backs of its people mercilessly and shrunk the economy and reduced the dollar's spending power.

→ Financial Structure and Maturity

Your PDM Government introduced a Development Fund and a Reserve Fund. Your PDM Government in showing strong fiscal management was successful in negotiating forgiveness of a part of the debt left by the Washington Missick Administration.

→ Cost of Living

Your PDM Government, during its time in office, reduced the high cost of living by lowering electricity rates through Island subsidies, lowering cell phone rates after successful negotiations with Cable and Wireless, lowering Land Transfer Stamp Duty. Your PDM Government increased minimum wage from \$2.50 at that time to \$4.00. This PNP Government introduced more taxes and tax increases than any other Government ever in the history of the Turks and Caicos Islands and drasticallt increased the cost of

living in these Islands.

→ College Education

Your PDM Government developed the Associates Degree Progams at the TCICC and obtained international accreditation for TCICC Programs so that credits from our College were accepted vitually by every University abroad. Your PDM Government spent over \$10m to build a proper College Campus in Grand Turk.

→ Infrastructure

Your PDM Government renovated most of Government Office Buildings and constructed the Leeward Highway in Providenciales. Your PDM Government expanded the physical infrastructure at the Eliza Simons, Ona Glinton, Adelaide Omeler, Iris Stubbs, Enid Capron and Ianthe Pratt Primary Schools. Your PDM Government set lands aside for an additional Primary School in Providenciales and for a purpose Built Community College. It was a standing PDM Policy to ensure that local contractors were involved in major capital projects. Your PDM Government ceased barged water and began to introduce city water and install new Reverse Osmosis Plants.

→ Civil Service

Your PDM Government instituted a policy that successfully saw our own in senior position and top positions the Civil Service. At that PDM gave the Civil Service the biggest raise across the board.

→ Home Ownership & Land Distribution

Your PDM Government provided financing for TCInvest to ensure that persons earning under \$1300 per month can own a 2 bedroom home. Your PDM Government allowed Turks and Caicos Islanders to get freehold title to the land before they build once they could secure a loan from the Bank. Between 1999 – 2003, your PDM Government awarded over 2200 parcels of land to Turks and Caicos Islanders. Your PDM Government secured \$1m from NIB to TCInvest to secure funding for low cost homes.

→ Small Businesses

Your PDM Government introduced the Small Business Unit and supported local businesses with concessions and land. Funding was provided through TC Invest for small businesses under your PDM Government.

→ Law And Order

Your PDM Government after showing its resolve to show good governance, was able to negotiate with the UK Government funding for defense and for a Police Station.

→ Party Leadership

Your PDM has to date have the distinguished record of having the country's first Chief Minister and only named National Hero (Rt Excellent Hon JAGS McCartney) , the longest serving Chief Minister and Party Leader (Hon Derek Taylor) who is the only Leader to lead his Party to 3 consecutive wins at the Polls and the first OT Leader to serve as President of the Overseas Countries and Territories Association and the first Leader to host a Caricom Heads of Government Meeting.

→ Youth & Sports
