History: The Diocese of Winona was erected in 1889. It included the St. Rose of Lima Church and School/ St. Francis Xavier Academy, Avoca, Minnesota, 1884-1896 (closed) (Winona, 1889-1896).

History of St. Rose of Lima Church and School/ St. Francis Xavier Academy

St. Rose of Lima Church and School/ St. Francis Xavier Academy, Avoca, Minnesota, included some Hunkpapa and Ojibwa Indian students.

1882-1885	The Society of the Holy Child Jesus (Drexel Hill, Pennsylvania) established and staffed St. Francis Xavier Academy, a boarding and day school for young ladies
1880s	The student body included Hunkpapa Indians from the Standing Rock Reservation under arrangements by Reverend Francis M. Craft
1885-1896 (closed)	The Sisters of St. Joseph of Carondelet (St. Paul Province, St. Paul, Minnesota) staffed St. Rose School/ St. Francis Xavier Academy

A fire destroyed St. Rose of Lima Church
