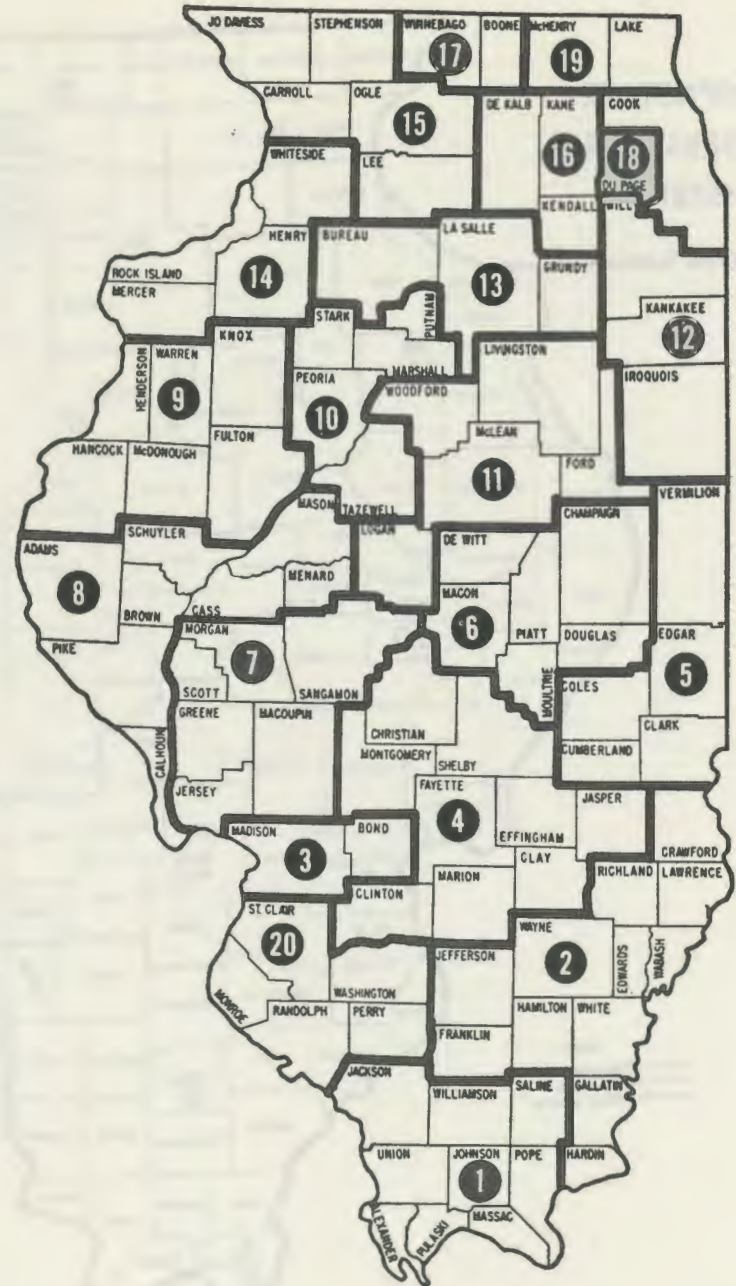

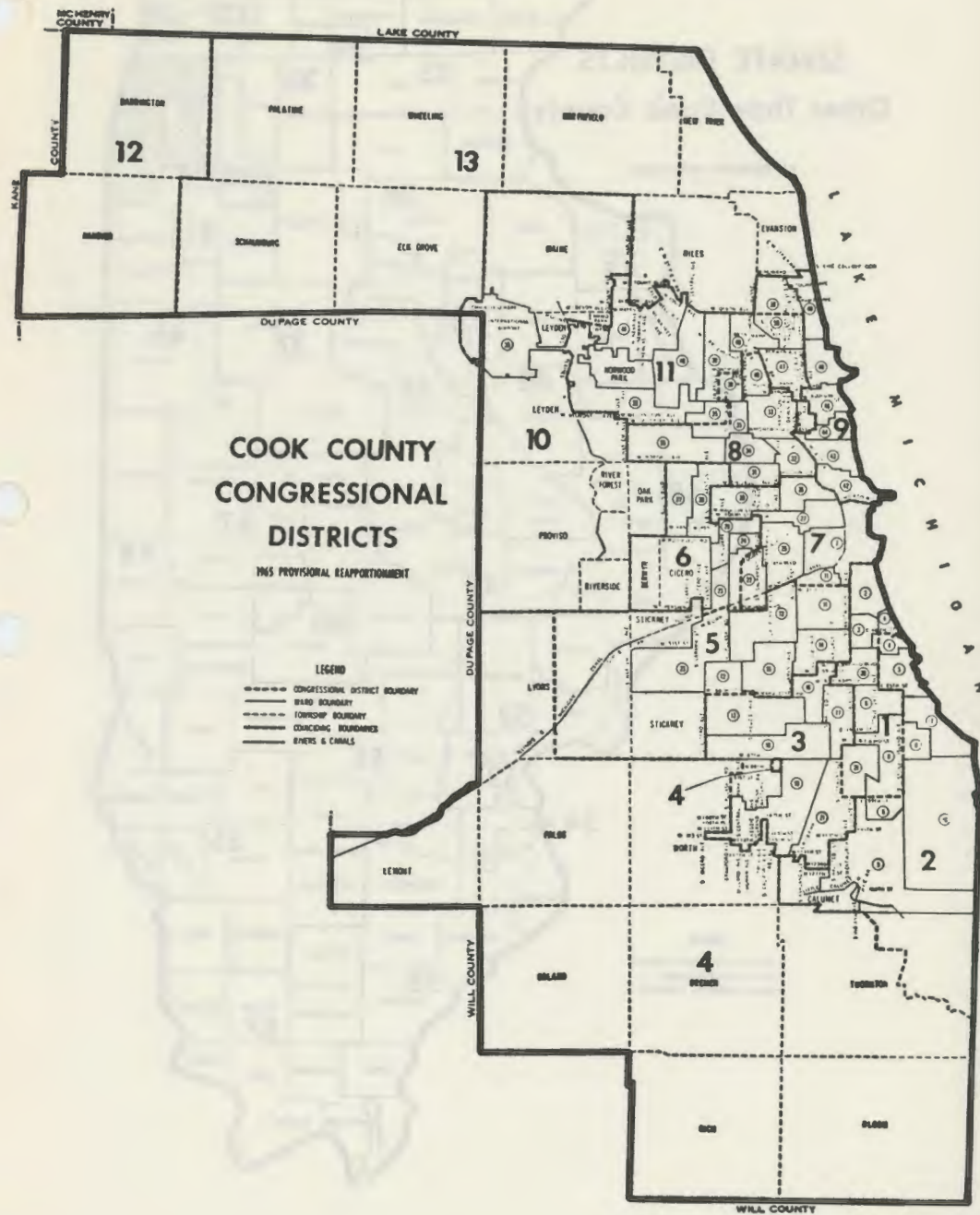
1965 PROVISIONAL REAPPORTIONMENT

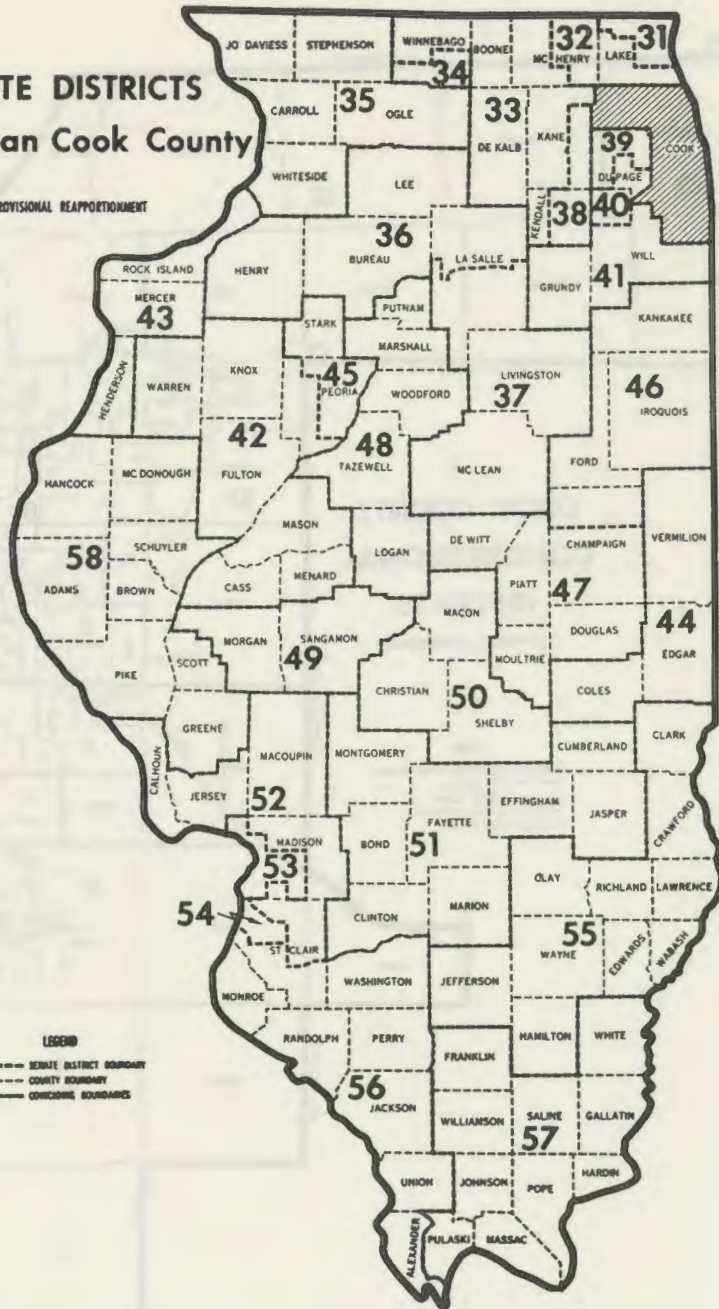

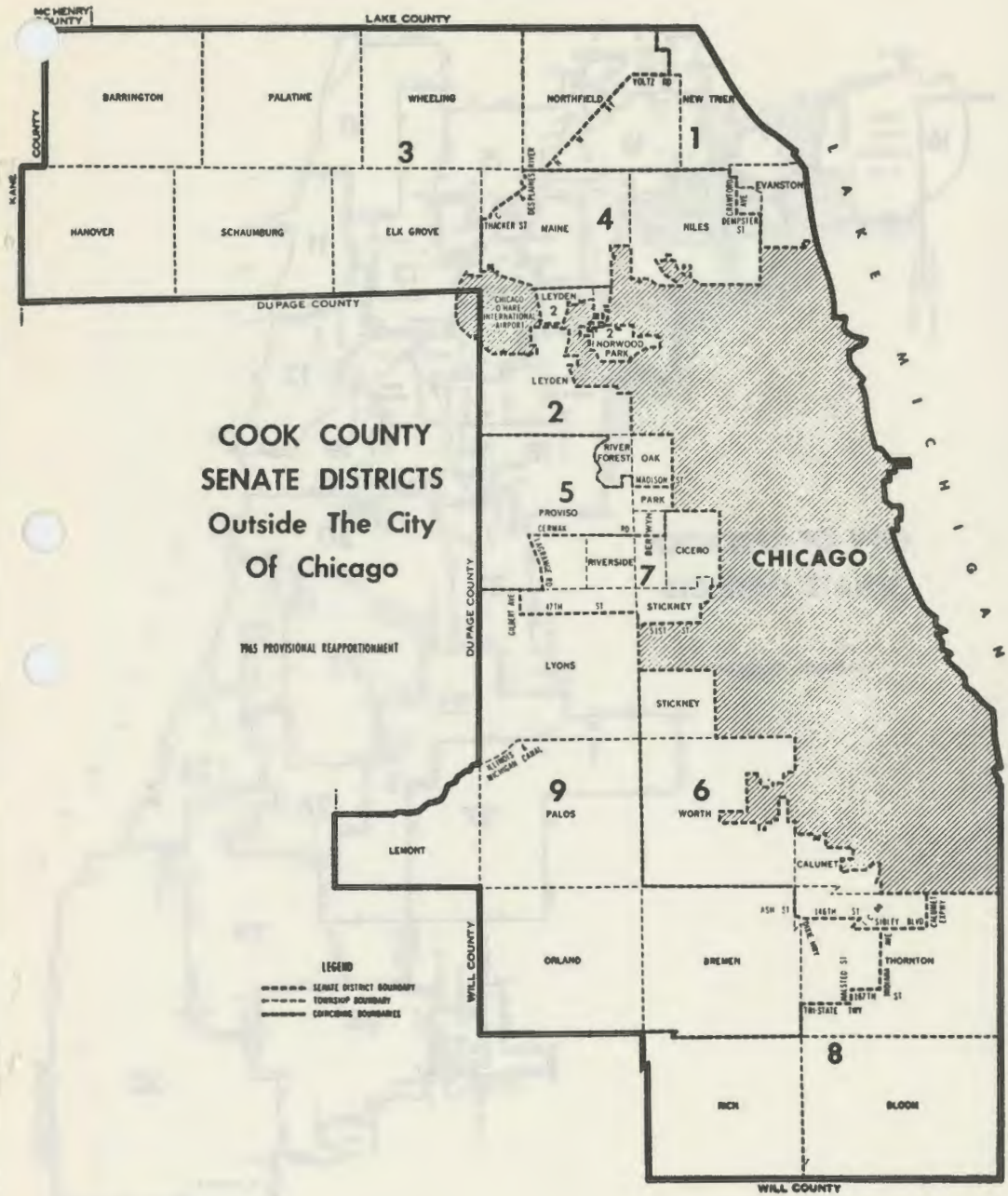

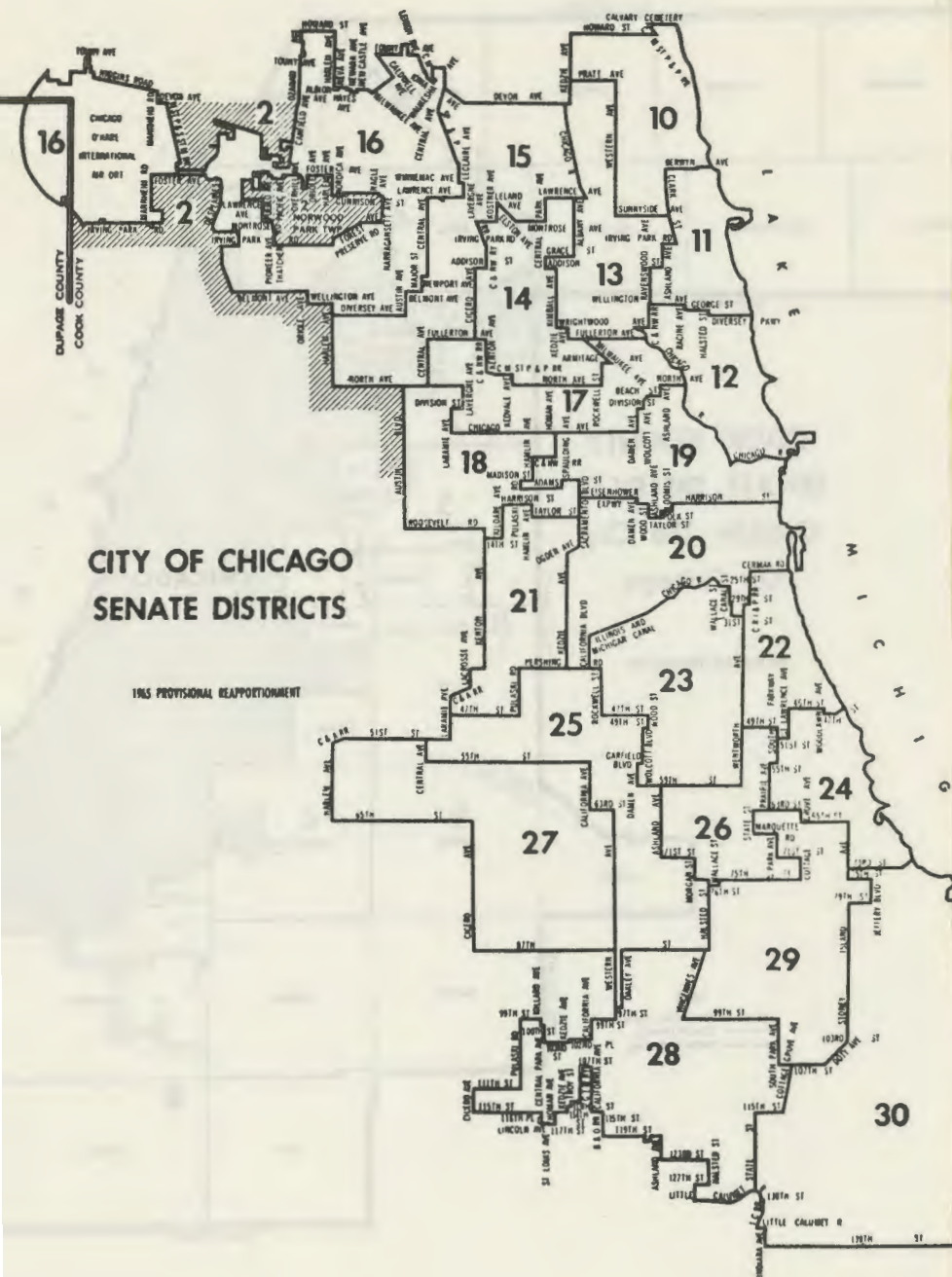
COOK COUNTY SENATE DISTRICTS Outside The City Of Chicago
