

AN EXTRAORDINARY CLUB SERVANT

It was tempting to entitle this tribute to that lovely lady Dolly Phillips, "Goodbye Dolly" — but that would be unthinkable. Dolly, after all, is part of the Vetch Field fabric and fills a special place in the hearts of many people who have served the Swans.

To start with, her employed period stretched from the Haydn Green era of 1947 to the second "Promotion" side and through the joyous rise to Division One, the tumble to bankruptcy, the resurrection that tearfilled day in Cardiff and into the present season. She stopped working only because she fractured a bone in her elbow otherwise she would have gone on and on.

Someone suggested that she was the Tommy Hutchison of the tea urn and Tommy would have smiled at the implied compliment in that statement. Yet the tea urn was only one part of the role which she played at the Vetch Field.

When she started during the Haydn Green era she used to wash the kit — and all by hand. When Billy Macandles took over she extended her role — cleaning offices, press room and stands, making the tea, helping Secretary Reg Harvey with the wages, controlling the programme boys and, at one stage looking after the Welsh League team. In football parlance she was an All Rounder.

Her forty-two years at the Vetch brought her into contact


with all the giants of our club history. Roy Paul, Trevor Ford, Joe Sykes, Lennie & Ivor Allchurch, Terry Medwin, Barry Jones, Herbie Williams, Harry Griffiths, Alan Curtis, Robbie James and Tommy Hutchison. And all of them had and have a soft spot for "Dolly".

She recalls the time when showers were first put in the Vetch Field dressing rooms. She was standing in the bath cleaning the shower heads when Barry Jones and Sid Gready turned a hose on her. "I was soaking", laughed Dolly, "but they were lovely lads".

Two of her great friends were Joe Sykes and, unsung, Glyn Evans — who did great work behind the Vetch scenes. Glyn used to stay with Dolly and had slept in her house on the night before he was to die in a road accident.

Dolly has known all the Press-men, too — from the famous "Rolande" up to the present day. And some have come under the lash of her tongue — for "making a mess in the press box". She told one crestfallen smoker "I'll put Frank Bown onto you lot!" And Frank — who frightened many, might just have sorted them out! But to today, when we all have the opportunity to say "Thank you Dolly". Perhaps we ought to insist that Tommy Hutchison makes the presentation to her. "Tommy's my Toy Boy" she giggled. "No, really I'm a mother to them all" she reflected. Indeed, Dolly, and thank you for ALL you have been to ALL of us.

Their History' . . .

The Club was originally formed as "Riverside" in 1899. Following the elevation of Cardiff to city-status in 1905, the Club changed its name to "Cardiff City" in 1907. The present organisation was formed when they turned professional under the same name in 1910 and moved to their present Ninian Park ground which was built on the site of the corporation's refuse-tip! Cardiff joined the Southern League in which they played until 1920 when they were elected to the Football League's Second Division. F.A. Cup semifinalists and promoted to Division One in 1921, they were First Division runners-up on goal average in 1924 in what remains the closest-finish to a League Championship in the 100 years of the competition. They were F.A. Cup Finalists in 1927, beating Arsenal. Relegated in 1929, they went down from Division Two in 1931 and had to seek re-election to Division Three (South) in 1934. Cardiff won the Third Division (South) Championship in 1947, and were back in Division One by 1952, but they only remained until 1957. They regained a place in Division One in 1960, but were again relegated in 1962, and have yet to return to the top flight. In 1975 they went down to Division Three, but immediately regained their place, only to go down in 1982. Again they won immediate promotion, but they suffered two consecutive relegation (1985, 1986) to plunge into Division Four, from which they won promotion last season, as well

as winning the Welsh Cup for the twentieth time. Cardiff have also been runners-up in the trophy on eight occasions. Ninian Park Attendance Record — 61,566 (Wales v. England) October 14th 1962. Current Capacity - 42,000.

Their Manager

Scottish-born FRANK BURROWS was a defender with Raith, Scunthorpe and Swindon during his playing career. He then joined the coaching-staff at Swindon before becoming Manager at Portsmouth from 1979 to 1982. He was later on the coaching-staff at Southampton and Sunderland, and was appointed Cardiff City's Manager in May 1986.

Two years after reaching one of the lowest points in their 78-year professional history by dropping for the first time into Division Four after two consecutive relegations. CARDIFF CITY took their first step back towards League respectability in 1987/88 by winning promotion to Division Three as runners-up to Wolves, and they finished the season in style by winning the Welsh Cup for the first time in twelve years when they defeated Wrexham 2-0 at Swansea

The 1987/88 season was a very consistent one for City — they remained in the top six of Division Four from early November '87, they stayed in the top-three automatic promotion-positions from late January 1988, and their Welsh Cup win put them back into the European Cup-Winners Cup for the first time since 1977/78 when they entered the competition as Welsh Cup runners-up.

Only one player appeared in every League and Cup game for City in 1987/88 - top scorer JIMMY GILLIGAN who obtained 26 first-team goals (20 League, 6 Cup). A £17,000 signing from Lincoln City in the summer of 1987, Gilligan was previously with Watford, Grimsby, Swindon and Newport (loan). He formed an effective attacking partnership in Cardiff's promotion with forward KEVIN BARTLETT who was Cardiff's second-highest scorer with 14 in League and Cup, and he's a former Portsmouth apprentice who was signed from non-league Fareham Town in September 1986. Caerphilly-born striker PAUL WHEELER played in about half of Cardiff's first-team matches last season, mainly as substitute, though he was top scorer for City's reserve team. A former Bristol Rovers apprentice, he was with Welsh League Clubs. Taffs Well and Aberaman before joining City, originally as a part-timer, in August 1985. Former Welsh International striker IAN WALSH was signed from Grimsby Town on a free transfer, but the former Crystal Palace, Swansea City and Barnsley player suffered from injury and illness in 1987/88 and didn't make many appearances for City after his December '87 arrival

Close-season signing STEVE LYNEX from West Bromwich Albion on a free transfer is an experienced attacking player who, after originally joining Albion as an apprentice, moved on to Shamrock Rovers,

Birmingham City and Leicester City where he made over 200 League appearances. He also had a loanspell at Birmingham, and rejoined Albion in late-March 1987, having a semi-regular place last season. Another summer 1988 signing is midfielder STEVE TUPLING who cost £7,000 from Newport County after joining them from Darlington in the summer of 1987. Tupling spent a number of seasons with Darlington for whom he played over 100 League games, and he began his career in Middlesborough. This past summer has seen the return to the Club of midfield player JASON GUMMER, a Tredegar-born Welsh Youth Cap who joined City originally as an apprentice. He made his debut in '85/86 but in November 1987 decided to give up the game. Rhondda-born Welsh International ALAN CURTIS, capped 35 times for his country, plays mainly these days in a right-sided midfield role although he has been better known in his career as a forward. He began his career with Swansea City for whom he made his debut in 1972, and he returned to the Club after a brief spell with Leeds eight years ago. He later went to Southampton from whom Cardiff signed him in the summer of 1986. City had plenty of competition for midfield places at the start of this season - Blackpool-born MARK KELLY established a regular place in '87-88 after being signed from Shrewsbury Town at the start of that season, while another regular midfielder in the promotion season was Havant-born PAUL


WIMBLETON who came to Cardiff in the summer of 1986 from his only other club Portsmouth where his career had been seriously hampered by a knee injury. He was named in last season's P.F.A. Fourth Division Eleven. Slough-born BRIAN McDERMOTT usually plays on the left of midfield, and he was signed in the summer of 1987. Originally with Arsenal for whom he made 61 First Division appearances, he has since played for Fulham (loan), Oxford United, Huddersfield (loan) as well as having spells abroad.

Defenders

Cardiff had the best defensive record in the Fourth Division together with Torquay in '87/88 and much of the credit went to skipper and central defender TERRY BOYLE who missed just one first-team game. A former Welsh International, he was originally with Tottenham as an apprentice before moving to Crystal Palace. He later played for Bristol City and Newport County from whom Cardiff signed him for £22,000 in the summer of 1986, and he, like Wimbleton, gained a place in the '87/88 P.F.A. Fourth Division Fleven, Another former Welsh International defender with the Club is Swansea-born NIGEL STEVENSON who spent twelve years with Swansea City, going with them from Fourth to First Division, and back again! He's also had loan-spells with Cardiff and Reading, and he came to Cardiff on a permanent basis in the summer of 1987. Aberfan-born teenager GARETH ARRAHAMS another central defender, is the Club's former youth-team captain, and he was originally an apprentice with the Club, turning professional in the summer of 1987 and having a few first-team games near the start of last season. Another young defender who has come through the Club's junior ranks is Gwent-born JASON PARRY who can play at either full-back or in the centre of defence, and he too had a few first-team games in early 87/88.

One defensive newcomer with the Club this season is full-back IAN RODGERSON, signed in the summer for a small fee from his local club Hereford United with whom he had been a fairly regular first-teamer over the past few seasons. Cardiff-born full-back PHIL BATER is in his second season with his hometown club, having begun his career with Bristol Rovers to whom he returned after a spell in the early 1980s with Wrexham, and he came to Cardiff in the summer of 1987 from Brentford where he had spent one season Former Bedford, Bristol Rovers and Coventry City player NICKY PLATNAUER was signed from Birmingham City in September 1986 as a midfield player, but last season switched to left-back where he proved very effective.

Cardiff have an experienced goalkeeper in former Scottish International GEORGE WOOD who was signed originally on loan from Crystal Palace in late January 1988. Previously with East Stirling, Blackpool, Everton and Arsenal. Wood signed on a further one-year contract in the summer






