### CONCURRENT RESOLUTIONS.

#### NUMBER I.

Concurrent Resolution of both Houses of the Legislature of the State of Minnesota, proposing Amendments to the Constitution of the State.

Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Minnesct 1, (the Senate concurring):

That there be and hereby are proposed for the approval or rejection of the people, the following amendments to the Constitution of the State, viz :

That Section two (2) of article nine (9) of the Constitu-

tion be amended so as to read as follows:

The Legislature shall provide for an annual tax sufficient to defray the estimated ordinary expenses of the State for each year, and whenever it shall happen that such ordinary expenses of the State for any year shall exceed the No tax to be levincome of the State for such year, the Legislature shall pro-led to pay intervide for levving a tax for the ensuing year sufficient, with est or principle other sources of income, to pay the deficiency of the preced-oursilred bonds ing year together with the estimated expenses of such ensu-without vote of ing year. But no law levying a tax, or making other provi-people sions for the payment of interest or principal of the Bonds denominated "Minnesota State Railroad Bonds" shall take offect or be inforce until such law shall have been submitted to a vote of the people of the State, and adopted by a majority of the electors of the State voting upon the same.

That Section ten (10) of article nine (9) of the Constitu-

tion be amended so as to read as follows:

The credit of the State shall never be given or loaned in aid of any individual, association or corporation; nor Credit of State shall there be any further issue of bonds denominated " Min- never to be hannesota State Railroad Bonds," under what purports to be an ed or more bonds amendment to Section ten (10) of Article nine (9) of the Constitution, adopted April fifteenth, eighteen hundred and

fifty-eight, which is hereby expunged from the Constitution, saving, excepting and reserving to the State, nevertheless, all rights, remedies and forfeitures accruing under said amendment.
