A good understanding of demographic forces and emerging trends is useful for policy makers, planners, businesses and the academia.

The Singapore Department of Statistics compiles, monitors and analyses Singapore's population statistics and indicators in detail. A report on **Population Trends** that puts together different aspects of demographic statistics is released annually. **Population Trends, 2020** is the sixteenth edition of the annual series.

The report comprises five chapters, namely, 'Population', 'Households and Housing', 'Family Formation and Dissolution', 'Fertility' and 'Mortality'. Key definitions and concepts are explained in text boxes in each chapter. Time series of commonly used indicators are included in the Statistical Appendices. Population Trends

Chapter 1 Population

Population Size and Growth

Singapore's resident population was 4.04 million as at end-June 2020, an increase of 0.4 per cent from the previous year (Table 1.1). The Singapore citizen population grew by 0.6 per cent over the previous year to 3.52 million while the permanent resident population remained stable at 0.52 million.

Overall, Singapore's total population decreased slightly by 0.3 per cent from the previous year to 5.69 million as at end-Jun 2020, largely due to the 2.1 per cent decrease in the non-resident population to 1.64 million as at end-Jun 2020.

Population

Total population comprises Singapore residents and non-residents. Resident population comprises Singapore citizens and permanent residents. Non-resident population comprises foreigners who are working, studying or living in Singapore but not granted permanent residence, excluding tourists and short-term visitors.

Singapore's population estimates are compiled using the register-based approach since the *Census of Population 2000*. The basic count and profile of the population are based on a person's place of usual residence i.e. *de jure* concept.

Age Structure

The median age of the resident population rose further to reach 41.5 years as at end-June 2020, from 41.1 years in 2019 (Chart 1.1). The proportion of the elderly residents aged 65 years and over also rose from 14.4 per cent to 15.2 per cent over the same period.

Chart 1.1 Age Distribution of Resident Population

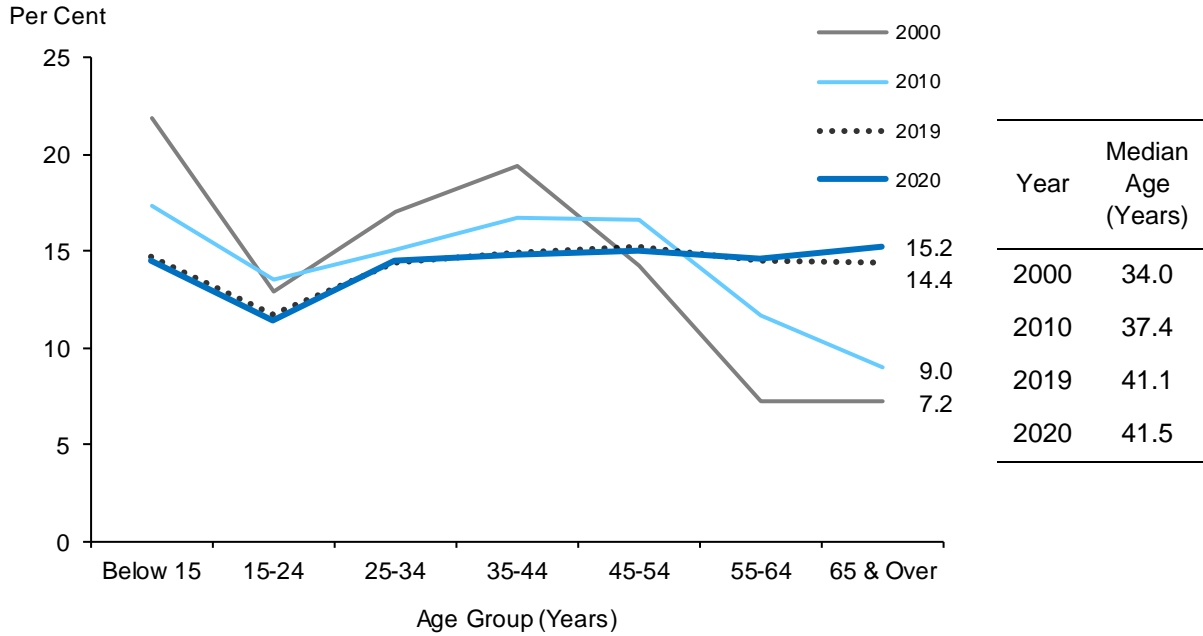
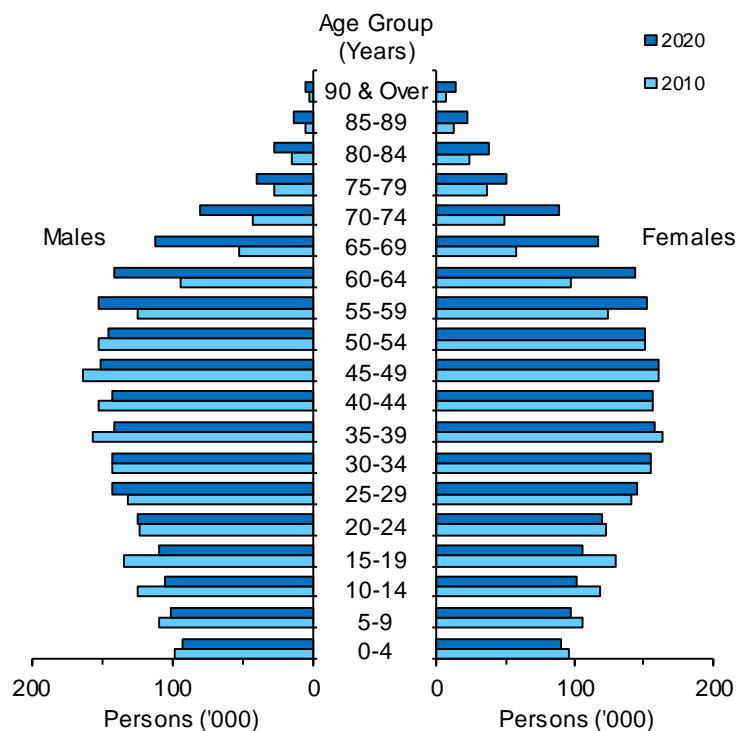


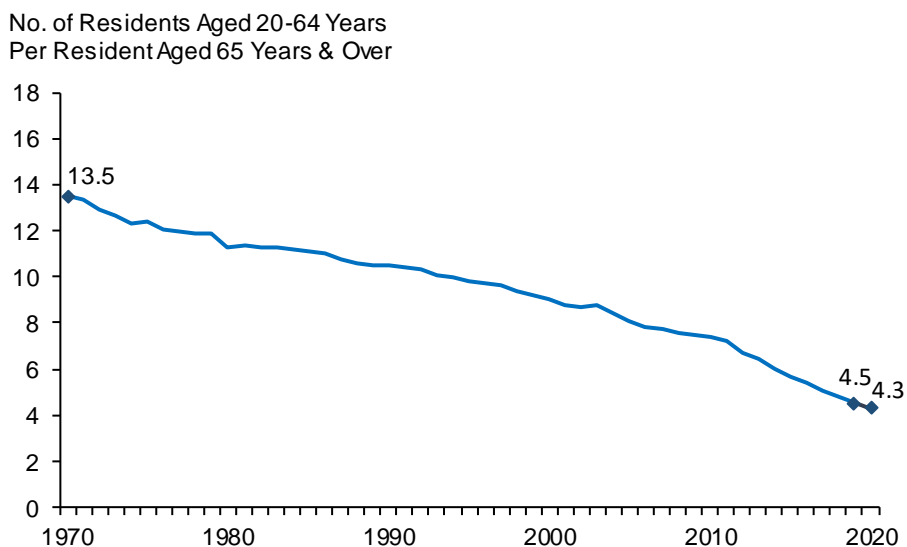
Chart 1.2 Age Pyramid of Resident Population



Old-Age Support Ratio

The old-age support ratio of residents, computed as the ratio of residents aged 20-64 years for each resident aged 65 years and over, declined further to 4.3 as at end-Jun 2020 (Chart 1.3).

Chart 1.3 Resident Old-Age Support Ratio

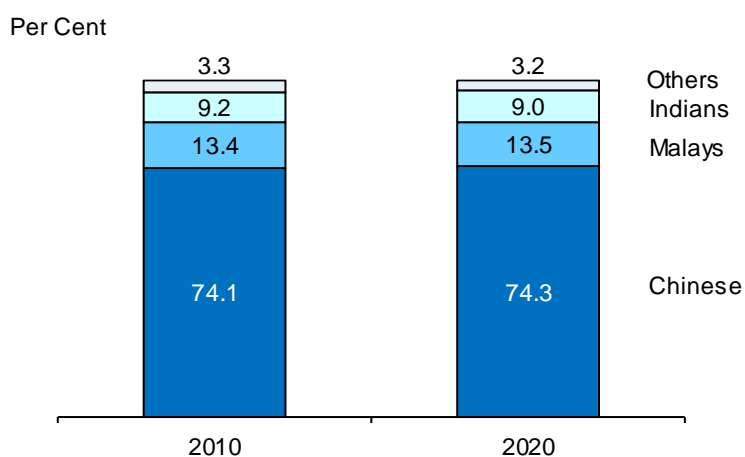

Ethnic Composition

As at end-June 2020, Chinese made up 74.3 per cent of the resident population (Chart 1.4). This was followed by Malays at 13.5 per cent, and Indians at 9.0 per cent.

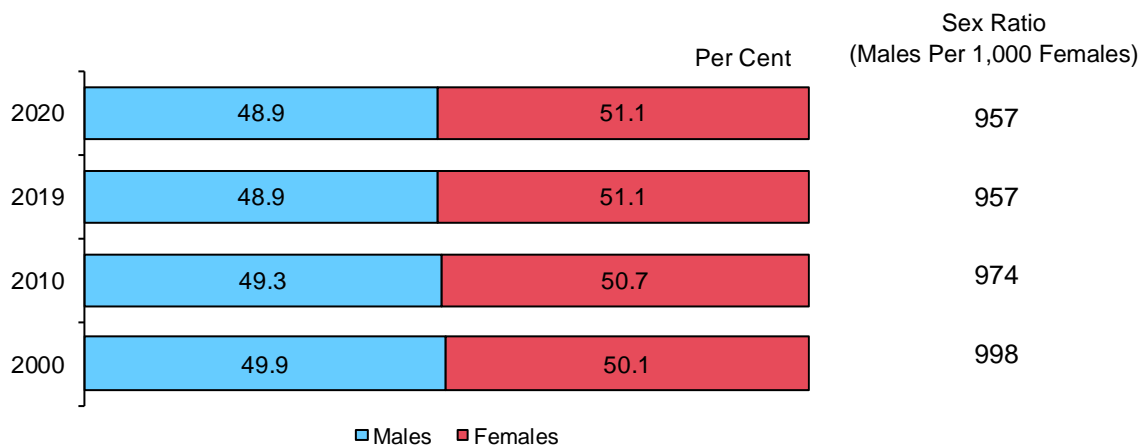
Chart 1.4 Ethnic Composition of Resident Population



Sex Composition

Among the resident population, the number of females continued to be higher than males. The sex ratio was 957 males per 1,000 females as at end-June 2020 (Chart 1.5).

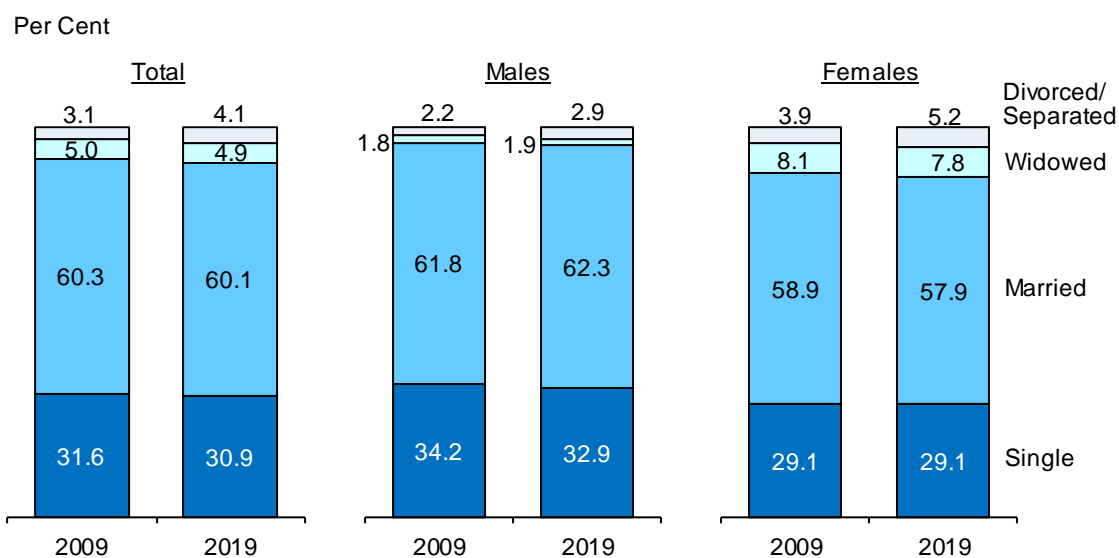
Chart 1.5 Sex Composition of Resident Population



Marital Status

The distribution of the resident population aged 15 years and over by marital status was largely similar in 2009 and 2019. In 2019, married persons continued to form the largest group at 60.1 per cent followed by single (or never married) persons at 30.9 per cent (Chart 1.6). Persons who were widowed and divorced or separated made up 4.9 per cent and 4.1 per cent respectively.

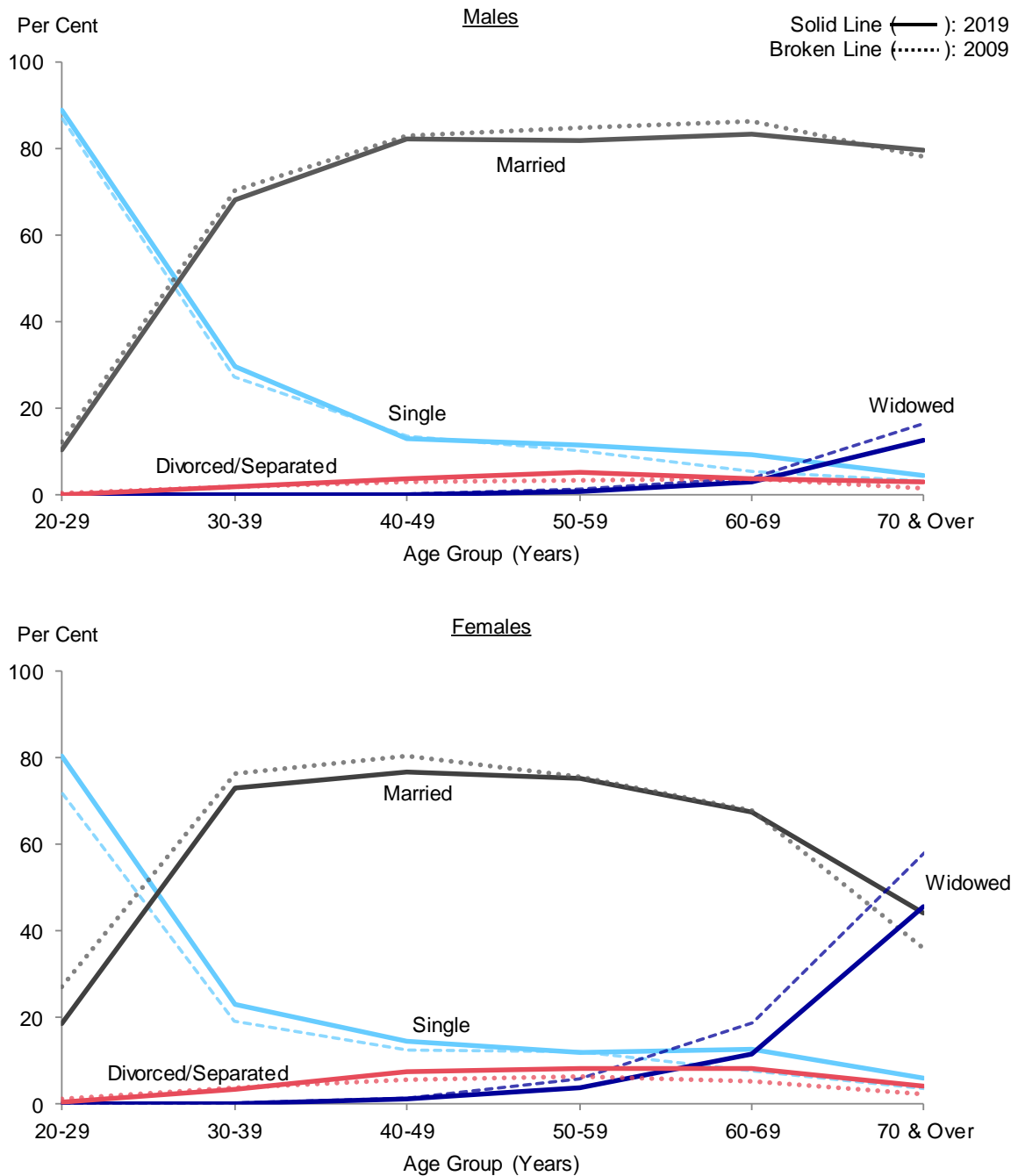
Chart 1.6 Marital Status of Resident Population Aged 15 Years and Over by Sex



The marital distribution among the resident population varied across age groups. Those in the younger ages of 20-29 years were predominantly single while those aged 30-69 years were predominantly married (Chart 1.7).

In line with their longer life expectancy, females across all age groups had larger shares of widowed persons compared to males, especially among older persons aged 70 years and over.

Chart 1.7 Distribution of Marital Status Among Resident Population by Selected Age Group and Sex

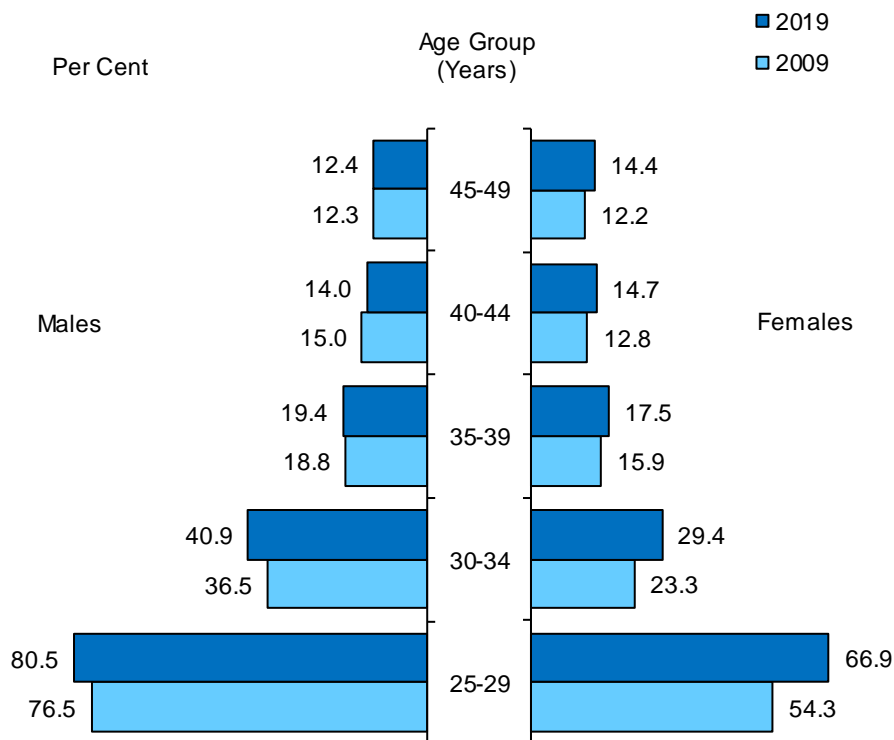


Proportion of Singles

Less than one in five among the resident population aged 35-49 years in 2019 were single, close to the proportions a decade ago. (Chart 1.8).

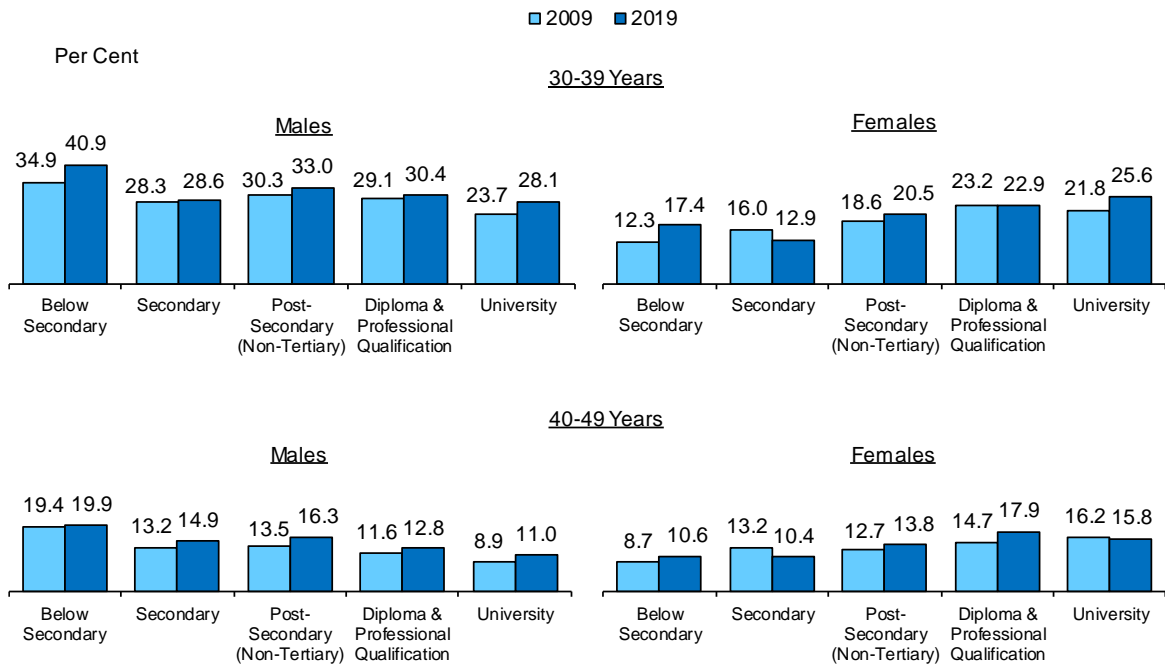
For younger residents aged 25-34 years, singlehood rose between 2009 and 2019. In 2019, the proportions of singles among males aged 25-29 years and 30-34 years were 80.5 per cent and 40.9 per cent respectively. For females, the proportions were 66.9 per cent and 29.4 per cent respectively.

Singlehood was more prevalent among males with lower educational qualifications and females with higher educational qualifications. In 2019, the proportion of singles among males aged 40-49 years with below secondary qualifications was 19.9 per cent, almost double the 11.0 per cent among those with university qualifications (Chart 1.9). On the contrary, the proportion of singles among females aged 40-49 years with below secondary qualifications was 10.6 per cent, lower than the 15.8 per cent among those with university qualifications.

Chart 1.9 Proportion of Singles Among Resident Population by Selected Age Group, Sex and Highest Qualification Attained



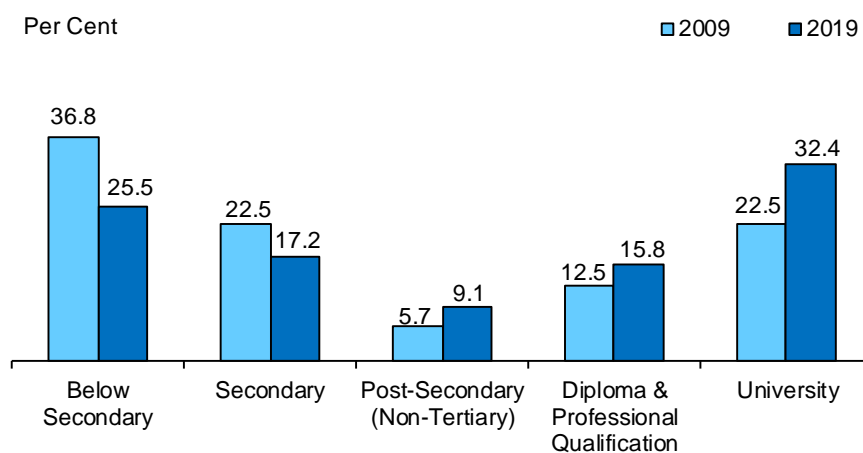

Education Profile¹

Among residents aged 25 years and over in 2019, 57.3 per cent had at least post-secondary qualifications, higher than the proportion of 40.7 per cent in 2009 (Chart 1.10).

This was mainly due to the higher proportion of university graduates, which rose from 22.5 per cent to 32.4 per cent between 2009 and 2019. During the same period, the proportion with diploma & professional qualifications also increased from 12.5 per cent to 15.8 per cent.

Chart 1.10 Highest Qualification Attained of Resident Population Aged 25 Years and Over



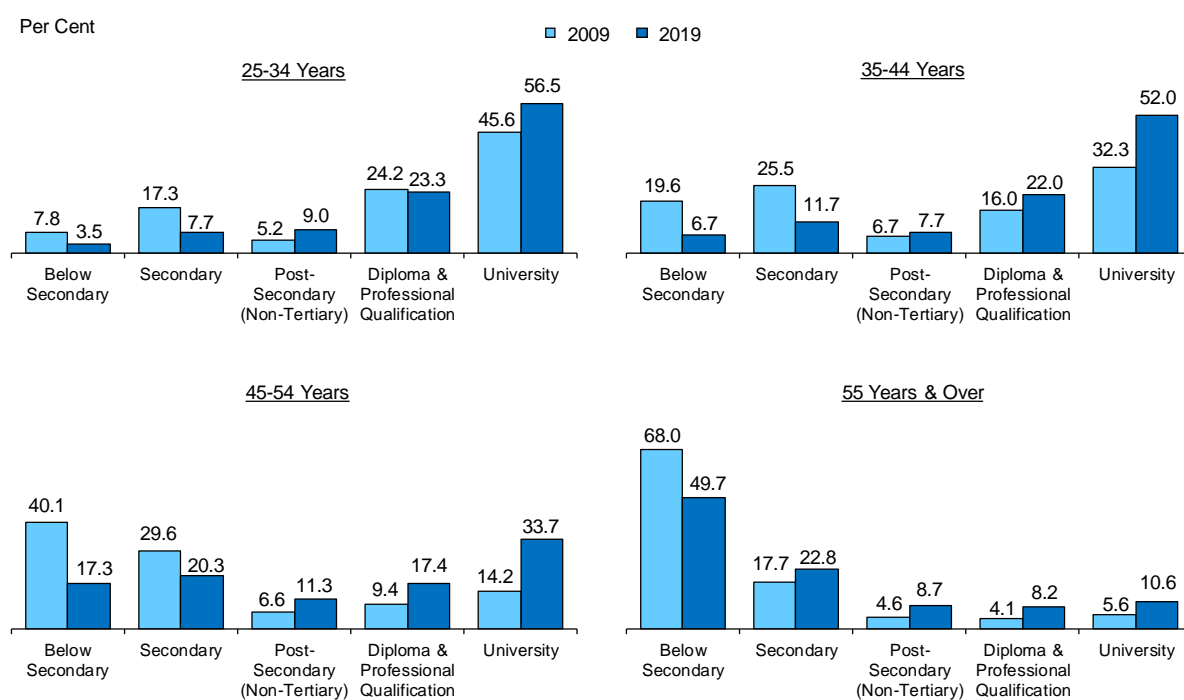

The proportion of residents with university qualifications increased over the decade across all age groups (Chart 1.11).

In 2019, university graduates made up 56.5 per cent of the residents aged 25-34 years, rising from 45.6 per cent in 2009. This more than offset the slight decrease in the proportion of diploma & professional graduates, which fell from 24.2 per cent in 2009 to 23.3 per cent in 2019.

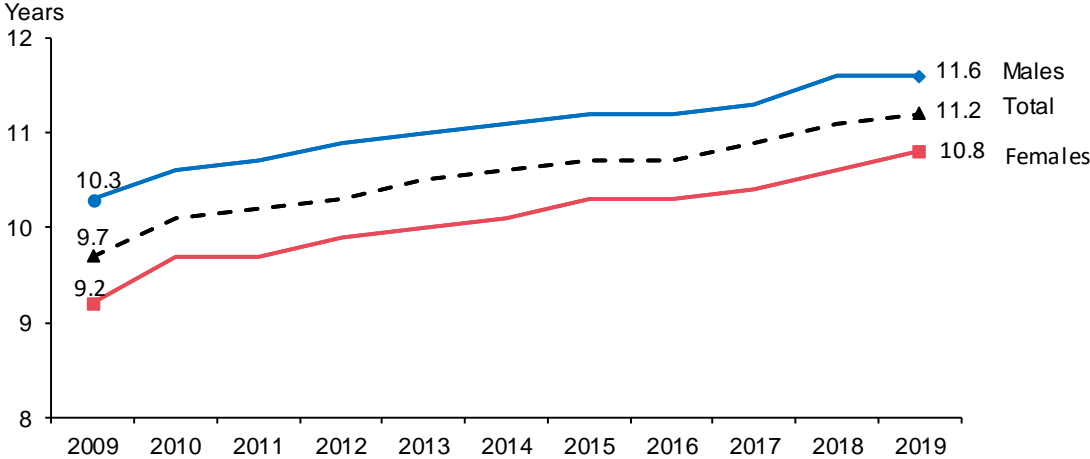
Residents aged 35-44 years and 45-54 years showed the largest increase in the proportion of university graduates from 2009 to 2019, with the former increasing by 19.7 percentage-points (from 32.3 per cent to 52.0 per cent) and the latter by 19.5 percentage-points (from 14.2 per cent to 33.7 per cent).

With a higher proportion of residents attaining higher levels of qualification, the average number of years of schooling among residents consequently rose over the decade from 9.7 years in 2009 to 11.2 years in 2019 (Chart 1.12).

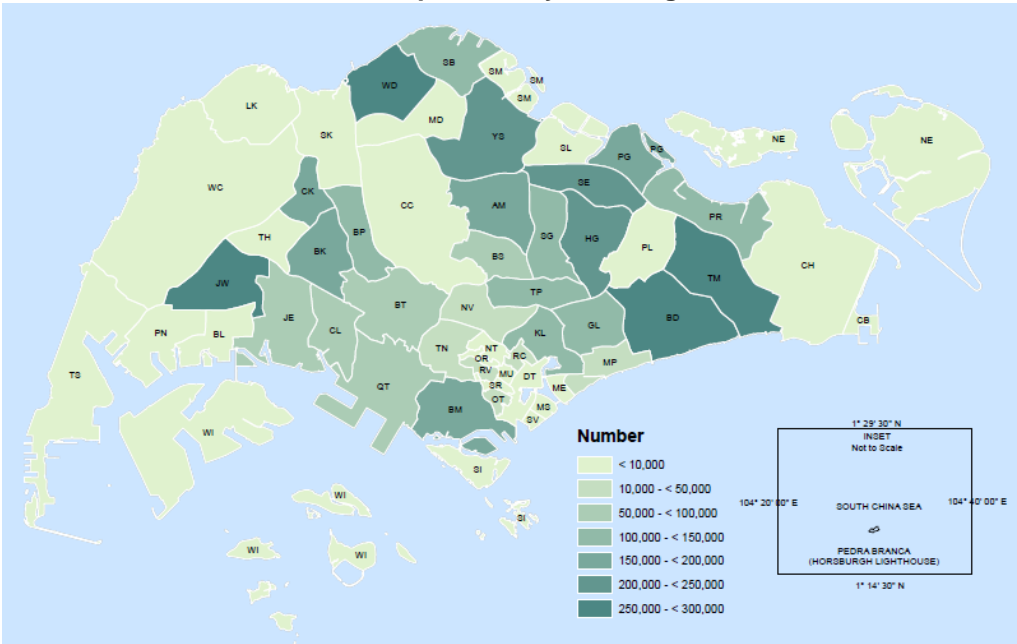
Chart 1.12 Mean Years of Schooling Among Resident Population Aged 25 Years and Over by Sex



Geographical Distribution

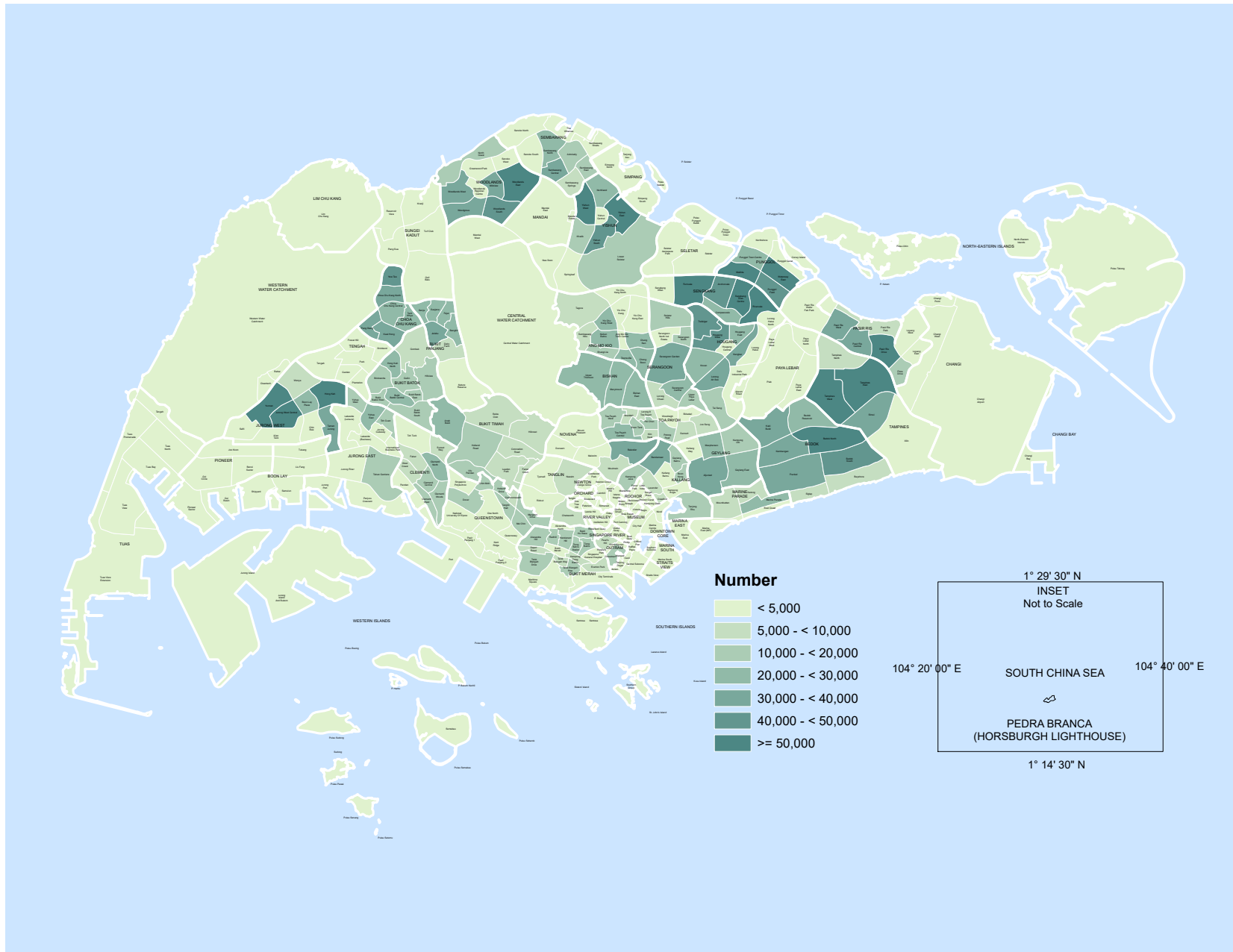
As at end-June 2020, 52.4 per cent of the 4.04 million residents in Singapore were concentrated in the top 9 planning areas² (Chart 1.13). There were four planning areas with more than 250,000 residents, namely Bedok, Jurong West, Tampines and Woodlands. Bedok had the highest number of residents of any planning area, with 276,990 residents.

In 2020, Outram, Sungei Kadut, Rochor, Bukit Merah, Ang Mo Kio, Queenstown, Kallang, Toa Payoh and Clementi had the highest proportions of residents aged 65 years and over (Chart 1.15). For each of these areas, approximately one in five residents were aged 65 years and over.

In comparison, relatively newer estates had a higher proportion of children aged below 5 years. In 2020, Punggol had the highest proportion of children aged below 5 years at 9.3 per cent (Chart 1.16). Nine other planning areas each had at least 5.0 per cent of residents aged below 5 years.

Chart 1.15 Proportion of Resident Population Aged 65 Years and Over by Planning Area, June 2020

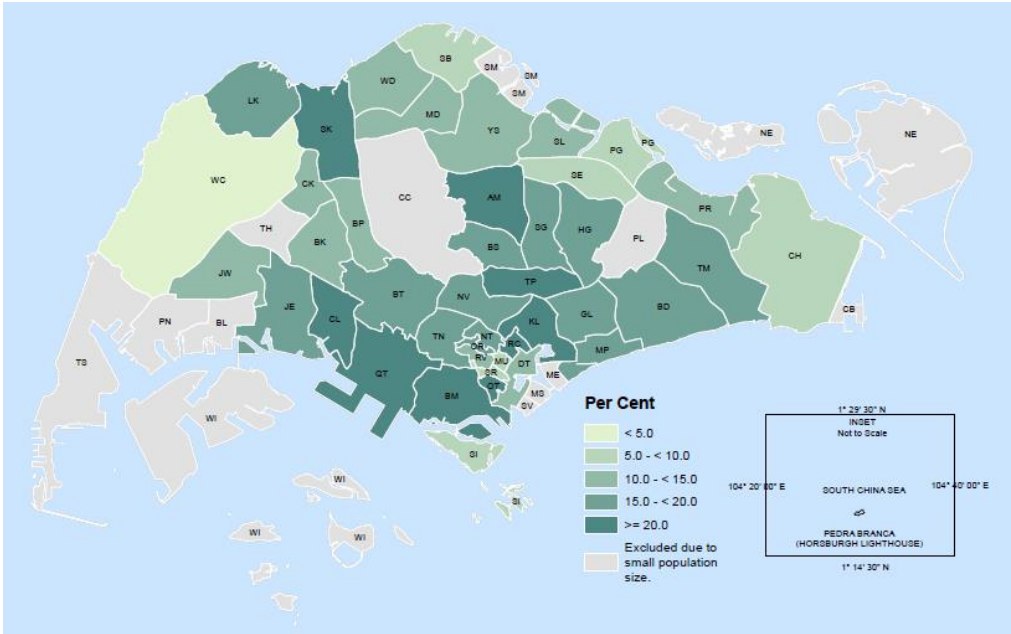
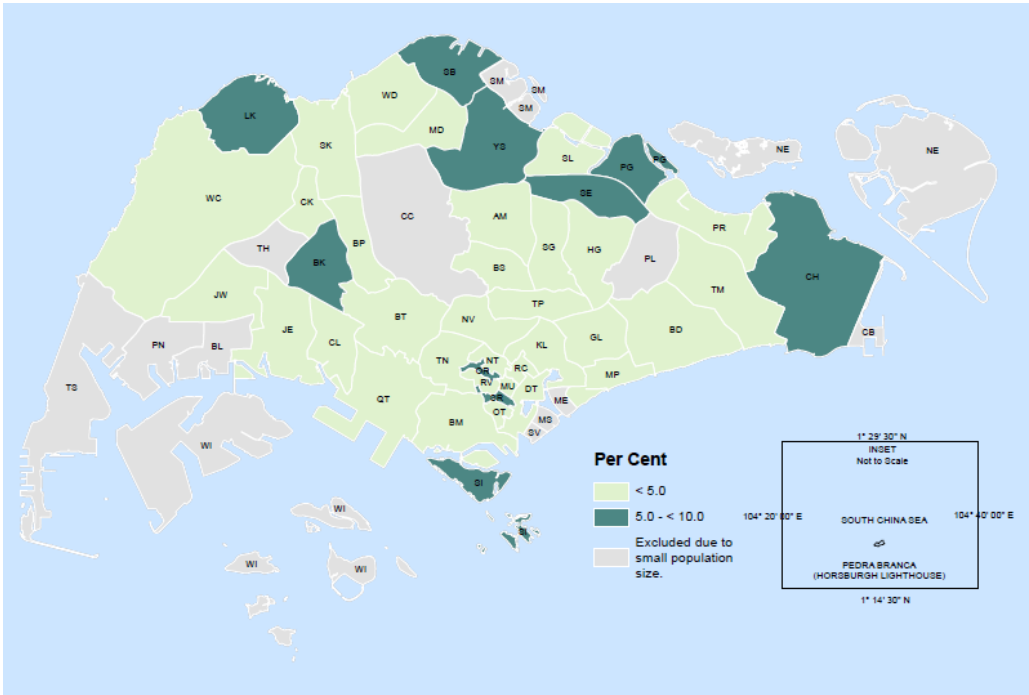
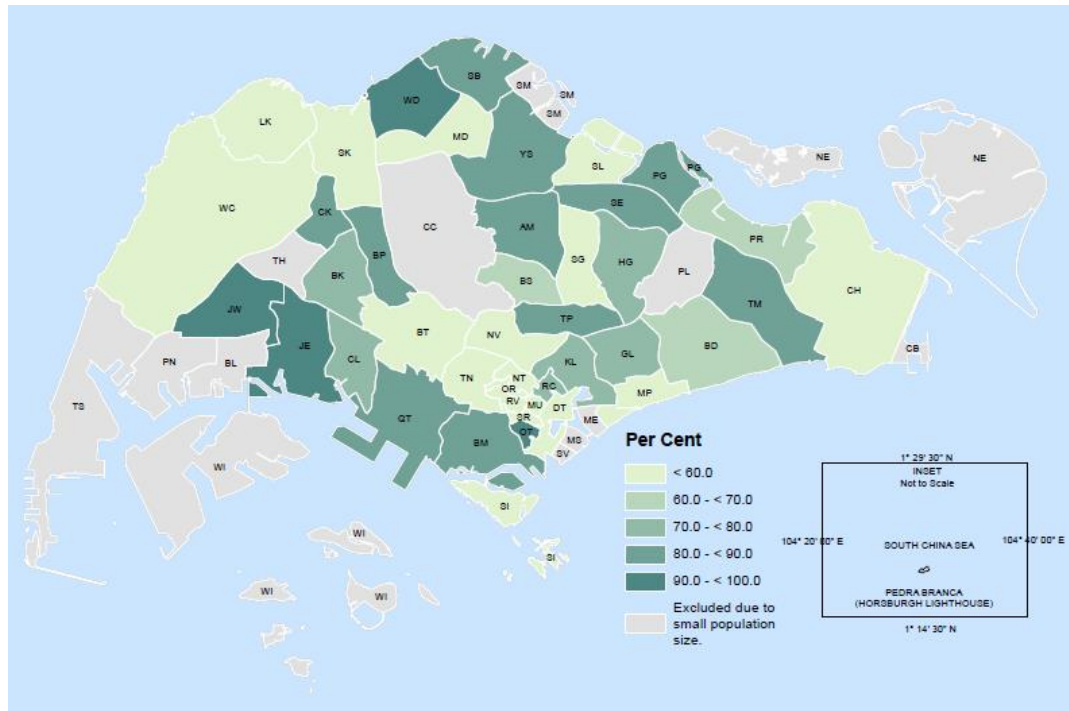


Chart 1.16 Proportion of Resident Population Aged Below 5 Years by Planning Area, June 2020



An estimated 3.15 million residents, or approximately four in five residents, resided in HDB flats in 2020 (Chart 1.17). There were four planning areas where 90 per cent or more were staying in HDB flats. Outram ranked first amongst planning areas with the highest proportion of HDB dwellers, followed by Woodlands.

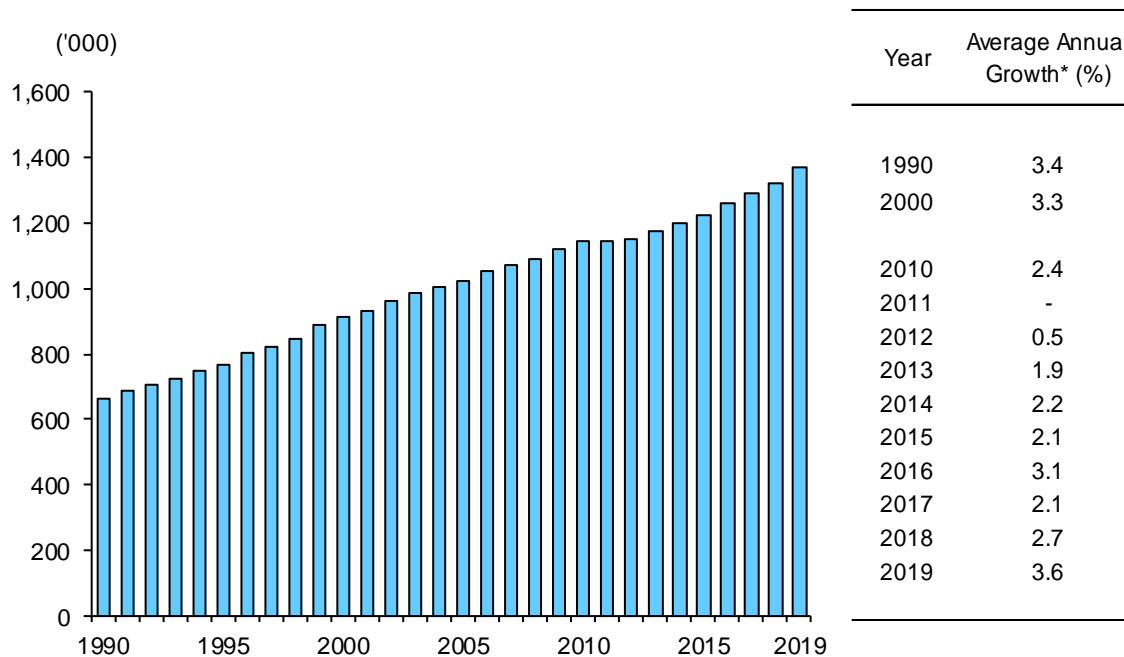

Chapter 2 Households and Housing

Resident Households

The number of resident households grew 3.6 per cent from 2018 to 1.37 million in 2019 (Chart 2.1).

Household

A household refers to (i) a group of two or more persons living together in the same house and sharing common food or other essential arrangements for living; or (ii) a person living alone or a person living with others but having his own food or other essential arrangements for living. Although persons may be living in the same house, they may not be members of the same household.

A resident household refers to a household where the household reference person is a Singapore citizen or permanent resident.

The household reference person may refer to the oldest member, the main income earner, the owner-occupier of the house, the person who manages the affairs of the household, or the person who supplied the information pertaining to other members.

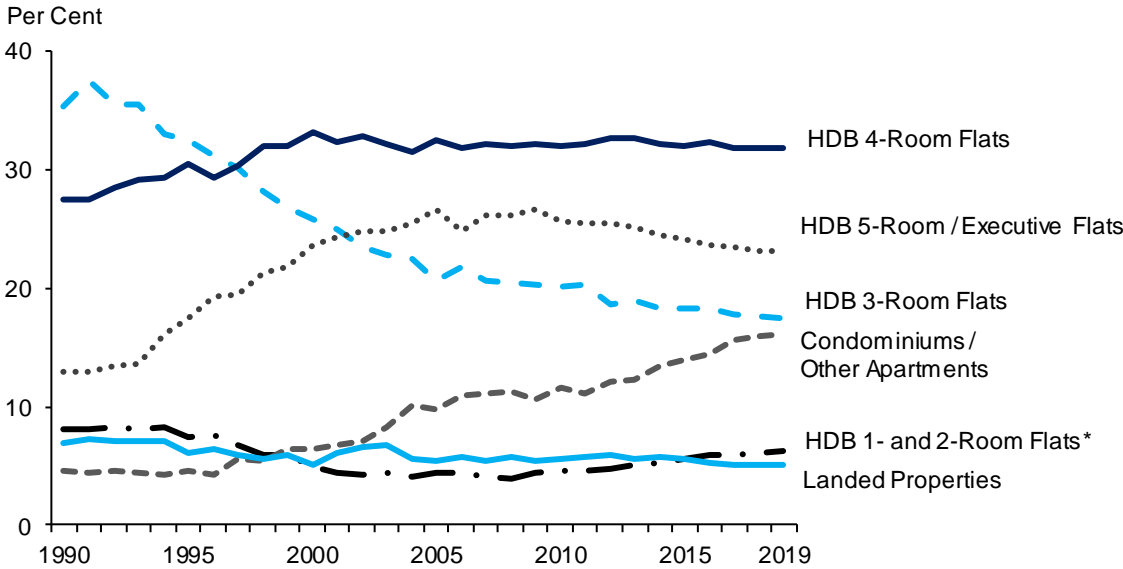
Prior to Census of Population 2020, survey respondents were asked to identify the 'head of household'. The identified person is used as the reference person to determine relationships between household members. In Census of Population 2020, the term 'head of household' has been replaced with 'household reference person'.

Type of Dwelling

The Housing and Development Board (HDB) 4-room flat continued to be the most common type of dwelling, housing 31.8 per cent of resident households in 2019 (Chart 2.2). The next two largest groups were those staying in HDB 5-room & executive flats and HDB 3-room flats, which formed 23.1 per cent and 17.5 per cent respectively. Another 6.2 per cent lived in HDB 1- & 2-room flats.

While the proportion of resident households living in condominiums & other apartments made up only the fourth largest group in 2019, that proportion has been increasing over the past two decades from 6.3 per cent in 1999 to 10.5 per cent in 2009 and 16.2 per cent in 2019. The proportion of those living in landed properties remained relatively stable at 5.0 per cent in 2019.

Home Ownership

In 2019, 1.24 million resident households, or 90.4 per cent, owned their homes (Table 2.1). Ownership has remained high with more than 9 in 10 resident households owning their homes since 2012.

Tenancy of Household

Tenancy refers to the survey-reported tenure status of the household with respect to the dwelling in which the household members live in.

“Owner-Occupied” refers to a household where the household reference person and/or any other member(s) in the household owns the dwelling unit. This includes those which are fully paid-up as well as those with outstanding housing loans.

“Rented” refers to a household where the household reference person and/or any other member(s) in the household rents whole or part of the dwelling unit.

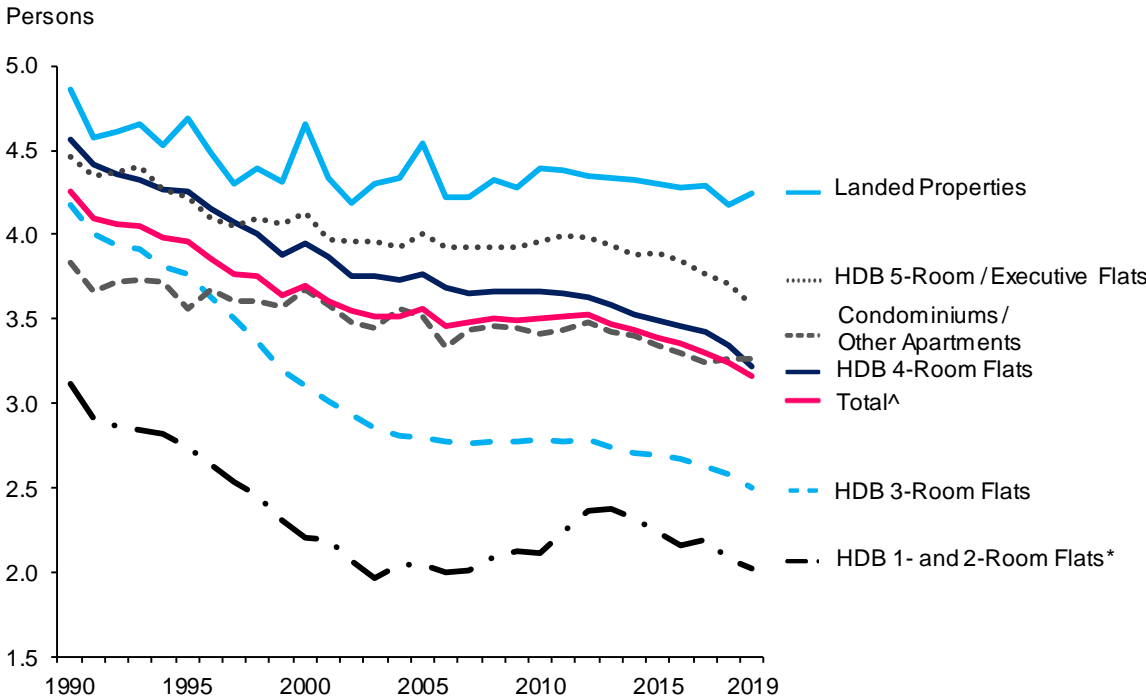
“Others” refer to a household where the household reference person and/or any other member(s) in the household occupies whole or part of the dwelling unit without charge (provided free by other persons (e.g., employers, relatives, friends, or any other persons)).

Household Size

The average household size among resident households decreased from 3.53 persons in 2012 to 3.16 persons in 2019 (Chart 2.3).

Resident households with larger family sizes tend to live in bigger houses such as landed properties or HDB dwellings with more rooms. In 2019, the average household size among those staying in landed properties was the largest at 4.24 persons, followed by 3.58 persons for those staying in HDB 5-room & executive flats. The smallest average household size was at 2.02 persons for those living in HDB 1- & 2-room flats.

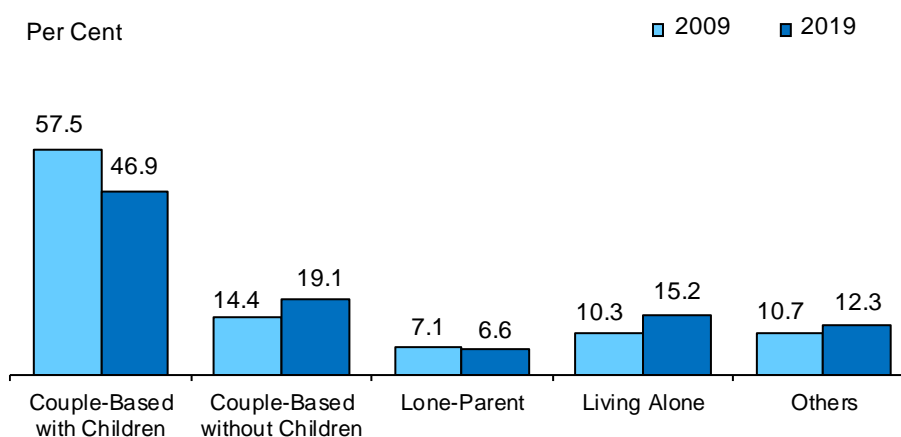

Household Living Arrangement

While couple-based with children households continued to be the most common living arrangement among resident households, the proportion of such households declined from 57.5 per cent in 2009 to 46.9 per cent in 2019 (Chart 2.4).

In contrast, the proportions rose for couple-based households without children (from 14.4 per cent to 19.1 per cent) and one-person households (from 10.3 per cent to 15.2 per cent) over the past decade.

Household Living Arrangement

Couple-based households refer to households with a married household reference person and spouse. This category is further split into those living with children and without children.

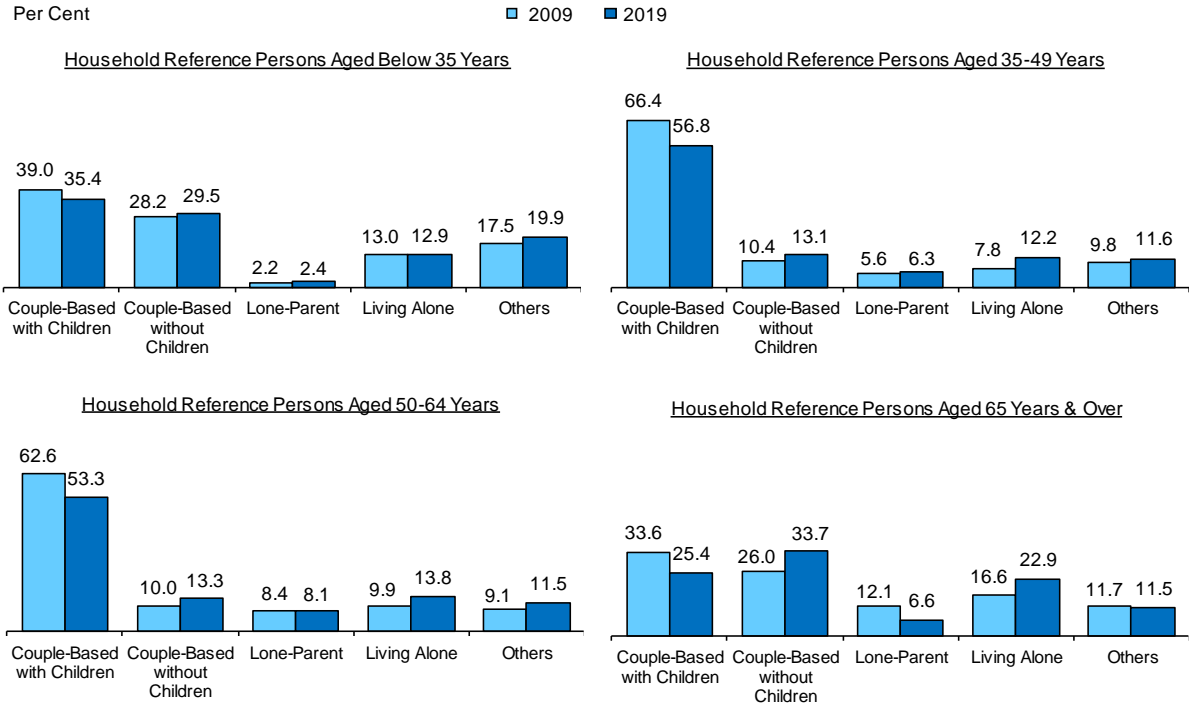
Lone-parent households refer to households whose household reference person is never-married/widowed/divorced/separated and living with children aged below 16 years or never-married children.

Living alone households refer to one-person households. Examples include single persons living alone, or ever-married persons who are living alone as their children have grown up and moved out from the parental home.

Despite a decline in share over the past decade, couple-based households with children remained the most prevalent among households with household reference persons aged below 65 years. In 2019, such households constituted 35.4 per cent among reference persons aged below 35 years, 56.8 per cent among reference persons aged 35-49 years, and 53.3 per cent among reference persons aged 50-64 years (Chart 2.5). This reflects the different stages of the life cycle at which married couples set up families and raise children.

Among elderly household reference persons aged 65 years and over, couple-based households with children formed a lower proportion (25.4 per cent in 2019) as compared to younger household reference persons. Conversely, the share of couple-based households without children and one-person households were higher compared to younger household reference persons. This trend corresponds to the life cycle stage of grown up children leaving their parental homes or the passing away of one spouse.

Chart 2.5 Resident Households by Age Group of Household Reference Person and Household Living Arrangement



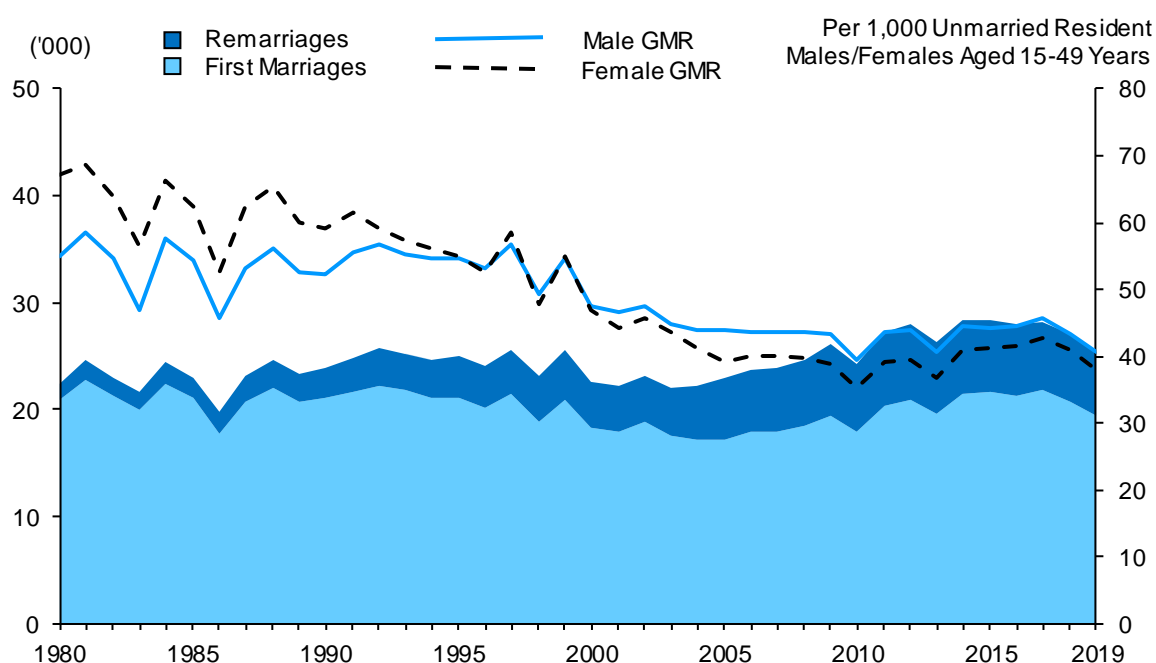
Chapter 3 Family Formation and Dissolution

Marriages

A total of 25,434 marriages were registered in 2019, 5.8 per cent lower than the 27,007 marriages registered in the year before (Chart 3.1). Despite the decline in 2019, the annual average number of marriages registered in the last five years (27,389) was higher than the annual average registered between 2010 and 2014 (26,844).

Among the marriages registered in 2019, about three quarters or 19,356 were first marriages where neither party had previously been married.

Total Marriages and Divorces

Statistics on marriages comprise civil marriages registered under the Women's Charter and Muslim marriages registered under the Administration of Muslim Law Act. They are obtained from records maintained by the Registry of Marriages and the Registry of Muslim Marriages.

Statistics on divorces and annulments are obtained from records maintained by the Family Justice Courts and Syariah Court. The records on revocation of divorces are obtained from the Registry of Muslim Marriages. Separations that do not confer on the parties the right to remarry are not covered.

The general marriage rate declined between 2009 and 2019. For males, the rate was 40.7 marriages per thousand unmarried males aged 15-49 years in 2019, down from 43.4 in 2009. The rate for females in 2019 was 37.9 marriages per thousand unmarried females aged 15-49 years, down from 38.9 a decade ago.

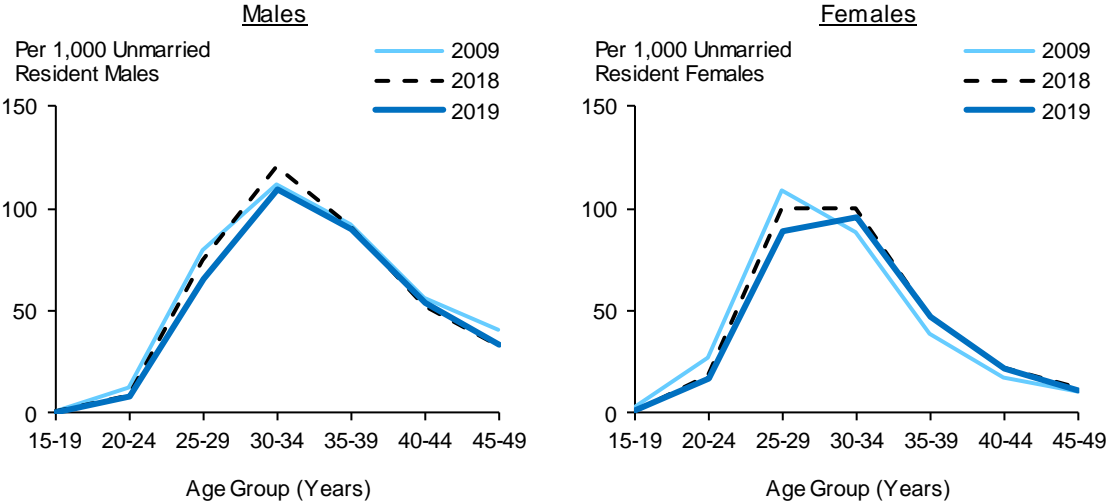
General Marriage Rate

The rate is defined as the number of marriages registered among persons aged 15-49 years during the year, out of every thousand unmarried population in the same age group.

Age-Specific Marriage Rate

In 2019, marriage rates were the highest among males and females aged 30-34 years (Chart 3.2). This is a shift from the peak age group of 25-29 years for females marrying a decade ago. Compared to 2009, the 25-29 years age group registered the largest decline for both males and females.

Age-Specific Marriage Rate

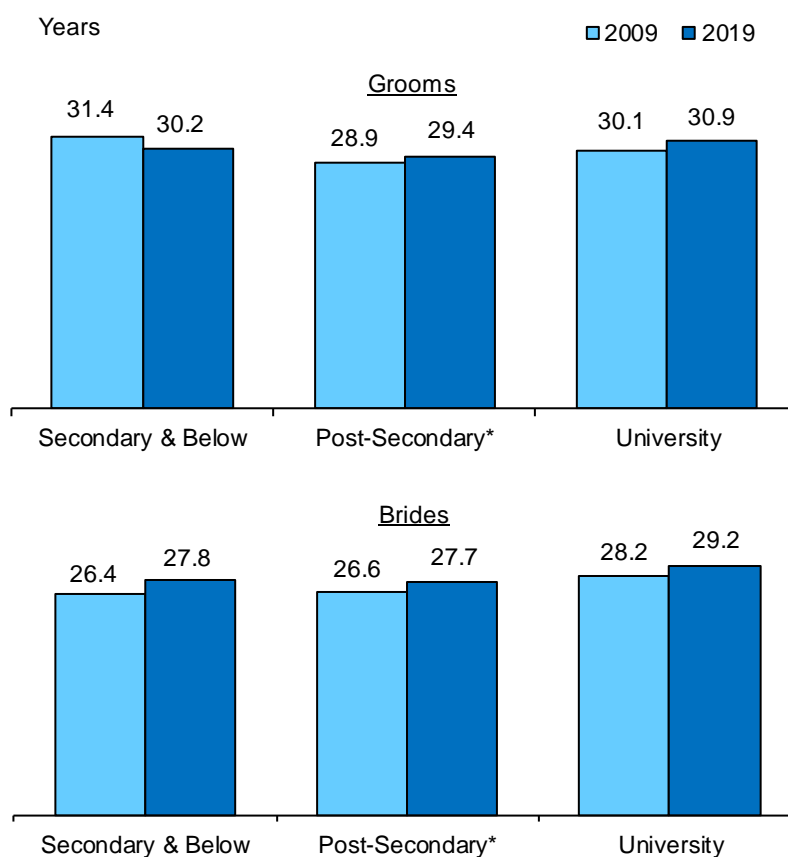
It is defined as the number of marriages registered within a specific age group during the year, out of every thousand unmarried population in the same age group.

Median Age at First Marriage

Compared to 2009, the median age at first marriage in 2019 was higher for brides across all educational groups (Chart 3.3). For grooms, apart from those with secondary and below qualification, the median age at first marriage in 2019 was higher for other educational groups.

Comparing across educational groups, grooms and brides with university qualifications had the highest median age at first marriage at 30.9 years and 29.2 years respectively in 2019.

Chart 3.3 Median Age at First Marriage of Grooms and Brides by Educational Qualification



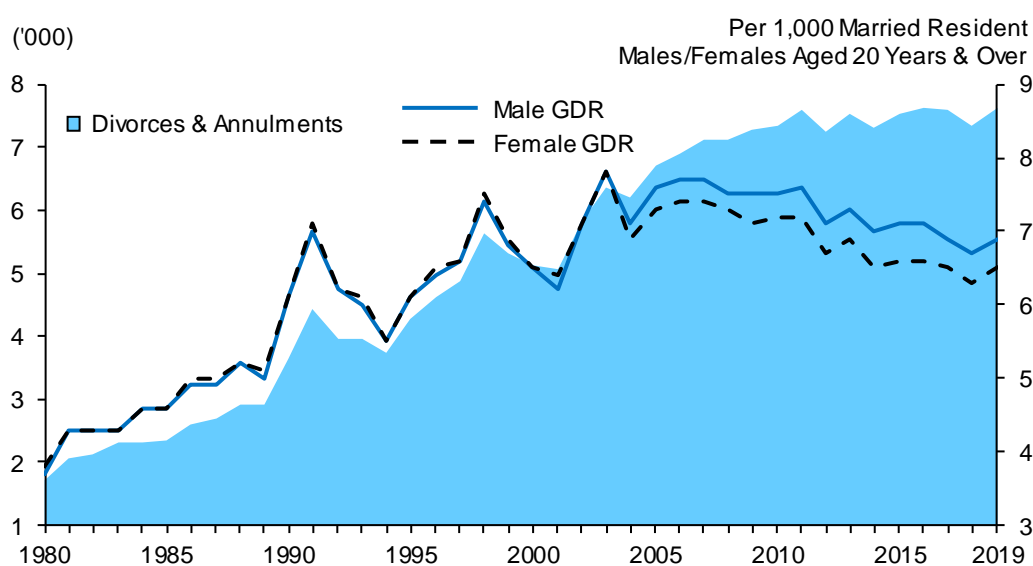

Marital Dissolutions

There was a total of 7,623 marital dissolutions in 2019, an increase of 3.8 per cent from the previous year (Chart 3.4). Between 2015 and 2019, the annual average number of marital dissolutions was 7,536, higher as compared to 7,402 in the preceding five-year period.

The general divorce rate declined for both males and females over the past decade. There were 6.9 male divorcees for every thousand married males aged 20 years and over in 2019, down from 7.5 in 2009. For females, the rate was 6.5 female divorcees for every thousand married females aged 20 years and over in 2019, down from 7.1 in 2009.

General Divorce Rate

The rate is defined as the number of divorces and annulments granted to married persons aged 20 years and over during the year, out of every thousand married population in the same age group.

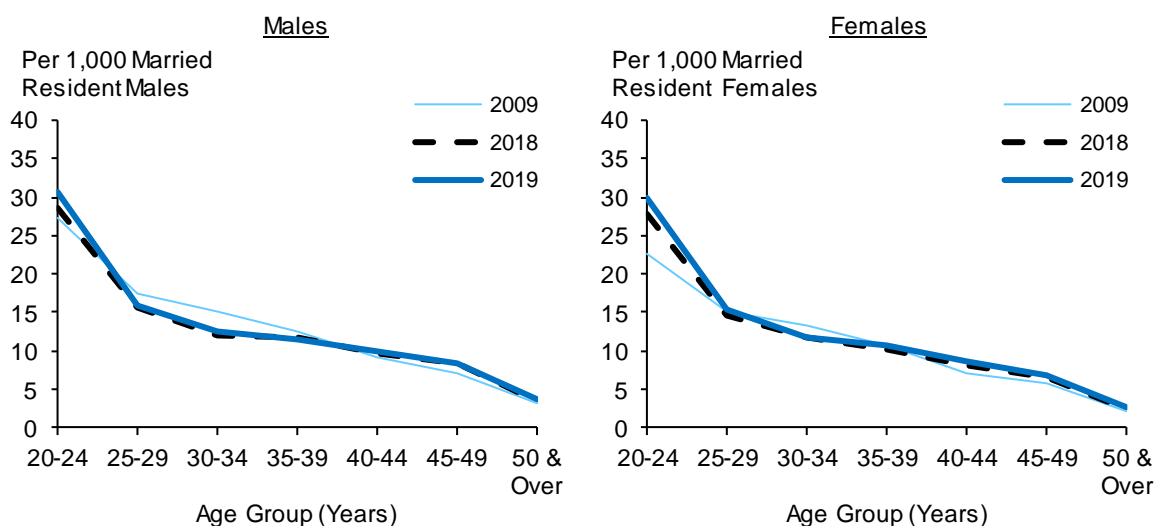
Annulment

This refers to the invalidation of a marriage. Parties whose marriages have been annulled are conferred the status of never having been married to each other.

Age-Specific Divorce Rate

Marital dissolutions continued to be more prevalent among the younger age groups (Chart 3.5). For the older age groups, divorce rates in 2019 were largely comparable to a decade ago.

Chart 3.5 Age-Sex Specific Divorce Rate



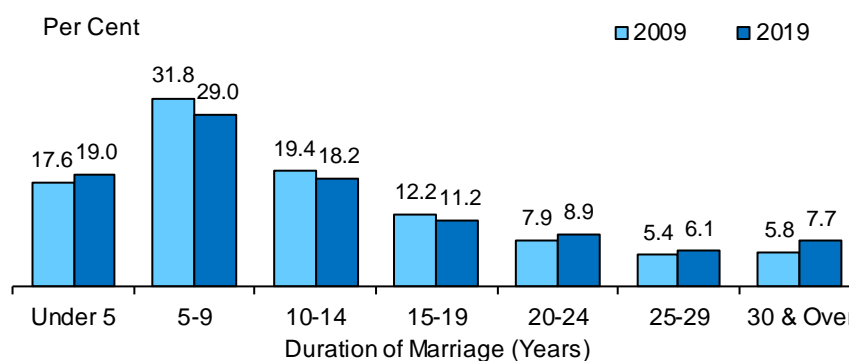
Age-Specific Divorce Rate

It is defined as the number of divorces and annulments granted to a specific age group during the year, out of every thousand married population in the same age group.

Marriage Duration of Divorcing Couples

The median duration of marriage for divorces in 2019 was 10.4 years, slightly longer than the 10.1 years in 2009. Couples with marriage duration of 5 to 9 years continued to account for the largest share of all divorces, although its share fell from 31.8 per cent in 2009 to 29.0 per cent in 2019 (Chart 3.6). In contrast, the share of divorces with marriage duration of 20 years or longer increased over the same period.

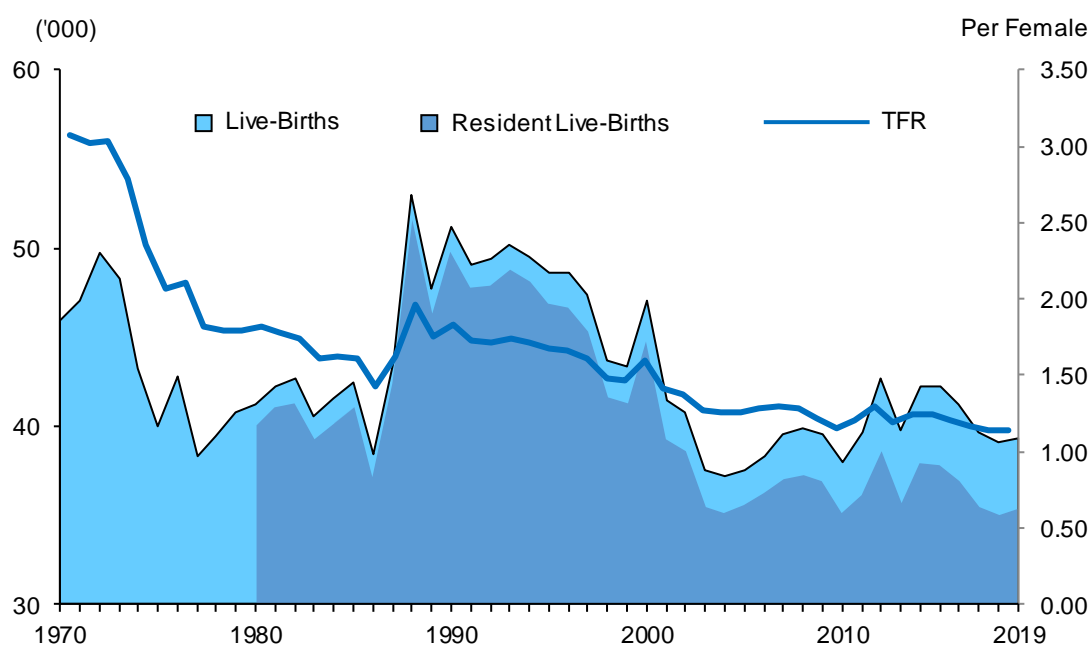
Chapter 4 Fertility

Births and Fertility Rate

There were 39,279 live-births in 2019, an increase of 0.6 per cent from the 39,039 live-births in 2018 (Chart 4.1). Similarly, the number of resident births (i.e. births with at least one parent who is a Singapore citizen or permanent resident) also rose by 0.8 per cent from 35,040 in 2018 to 35,330 in 2019. The yearly average number of resident births over the last five years fell to 36,110 as compared to 36,719 from the preceding 5 years.

Singapore's resident total fertility rate (TFR) remained at 1.14 births per female in 2019, the same as 2018.

Live-Births

Statistics on live-births are obtained from records maintained by the Registry of Births and Deaths. The statistics refer to all live-births occurring within Singapore and its territorial waters as registered under the Registration of Births and Deaths Act (Chapter 267), and are compiled based on date of occurrence.

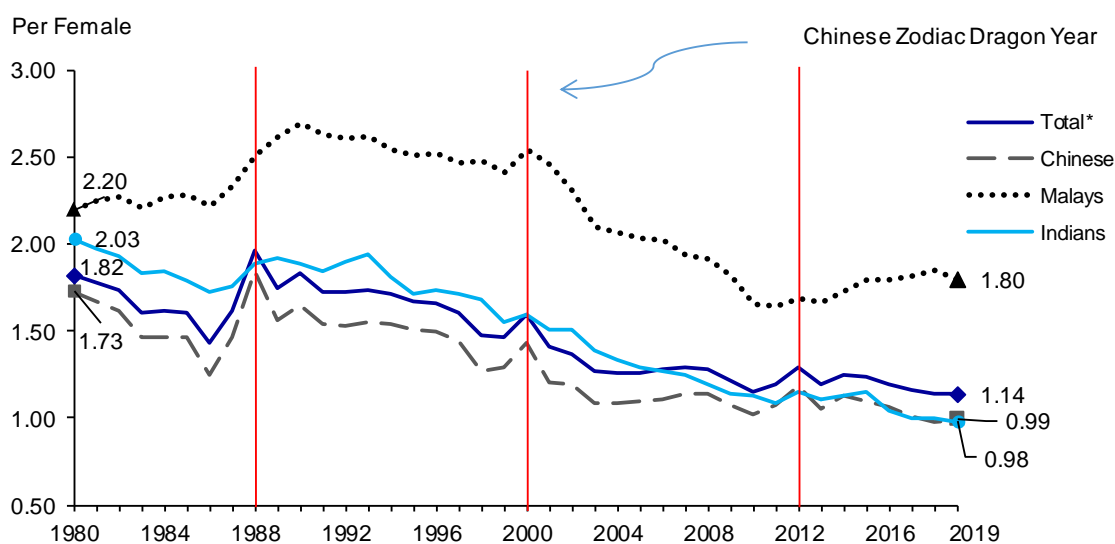
Total Fertility Rate

The rate refers to the average number of live-births each female would have during her reproductive years if she were subject to the prevailing age-specific fertility rates in the population in a given year. More details are available in the infographic [here](#).

Ethnic Differentials in Fertility

In 2019, the resident TFR rose for the Chinese and fell for the Malays and Indians (Chart 4.2). The TFR remained the highest for the Malays at 1.80 births per female in 2019, followed by 0.99 for the Chinese and 0.98 for the Indians.

Chart 4.2 Total Fertility Rate by Ethnic Group



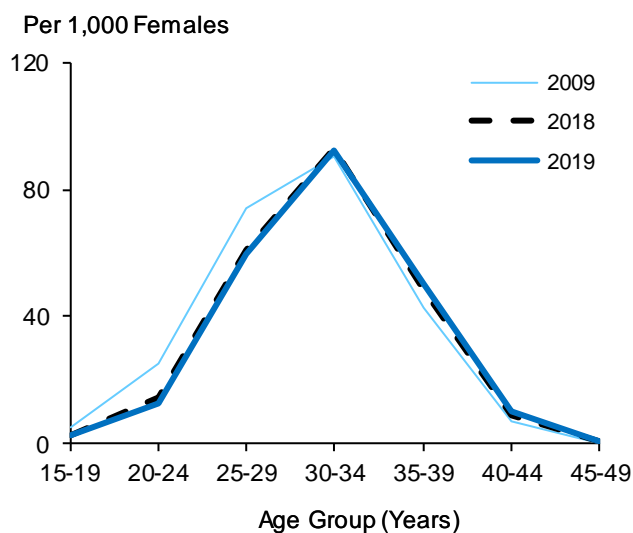

Age-Specific Fertility Rate

Resident fertility rates for females in 2019 remained similar to 2018 across all age groups (Chart 4.3).

Compared to a decade ago, age-specific fertility rates fell for those aged below 35 years in 2019, and rose for those aged 35 years and over. Fertility rate has been the highest among females aged 30-34 years compared to the other age groups since 2002.

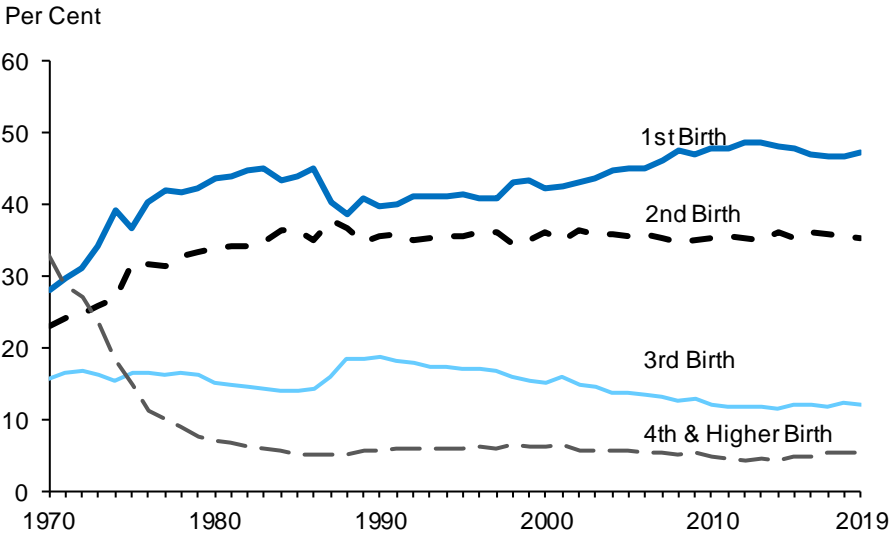
Chart 4.3 Age-Specific Fertility Rate



Births by Birth Order

First order births continued to make up the largest proportion of total live-births in 2019, rising from 46.6 per cent in 2018 to 47.2 per cent in 2019 (Chart 4.4). It is the first time the proportion of first order births has rebounded since declining year on year from 48.6 per cent in 2013. Second order births made up 35.3 per cent, while third and higher order births constituted the remaining 17.4 per cent in 2019.

Chart 4.4 Proportion of Births by Birth Order

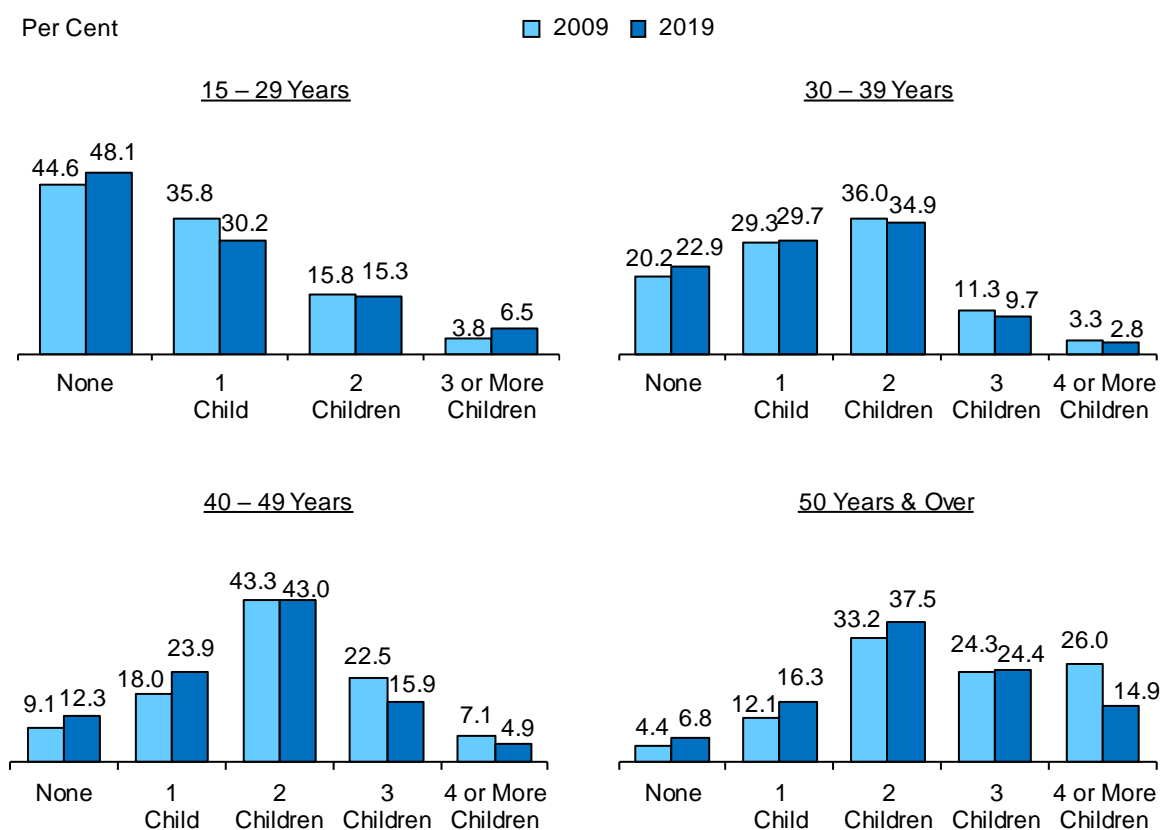


Number of Children Born

Among resident ever-married females aged 30 years and over in 2019, those with two children continued to form the mode. Specifically, 34.9 per cent among those aged 30-39 years, 43.0 per cent among those aged 40-49 years and 37.5 per cent among those aged 50 years and above had given birth to two children (Chart 4.5).

In general, the proportion of those with three or more children saw a decline over the last decade. Among resident ever-married females aged 40-49 years, the share of those with three or more children fell from 29.7 per cent in 2009 to 20.8 per cent in 2019. At the same time, those with only one child increased from 18.0 per cent in 2009 to 23.9 per cent in 2019 while the proportion of those who have never given birth also rose from 9.1 per cent to 12.3 per cent over the same period.

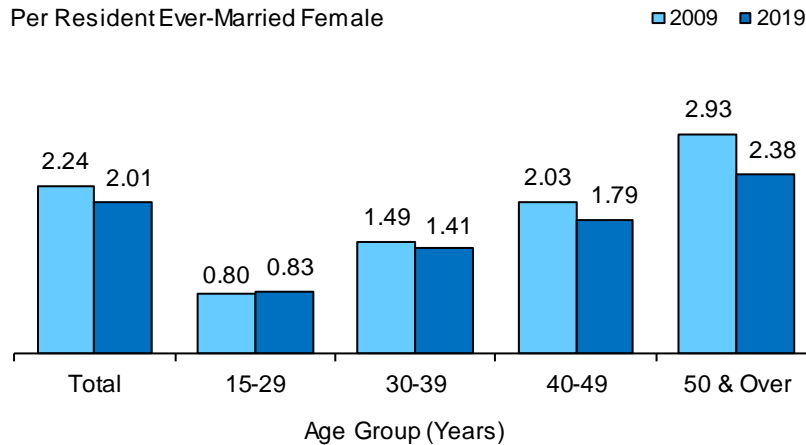
Chart 4.5 Resident Ever-Married Females by Age Group and Number of Children Born

The average number of children born to resident ever-married females aged 40-49 years fell from 2.03 in 2009 to 1.79 in 2019 (Chart 4.6).

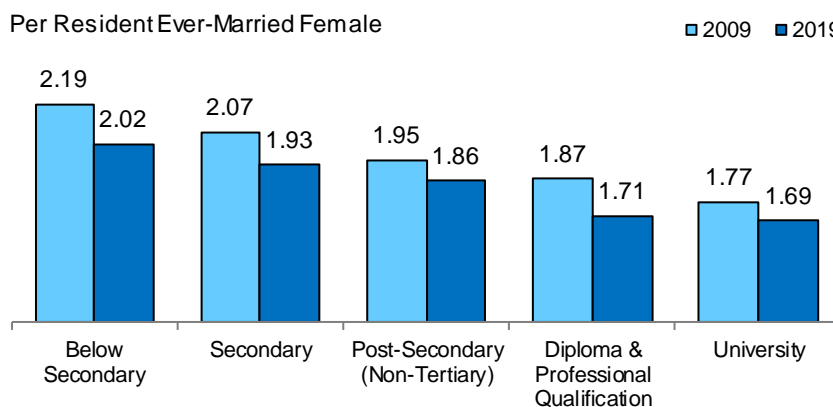
Chart 4.6 Average Number of Children Born by Age Group of Resident Ever-Married Females

Among resident ever-married females aged 40-49 years, those with higher educational qualifications generally had fewer children than those with lower qualifications (Chart 4.7).

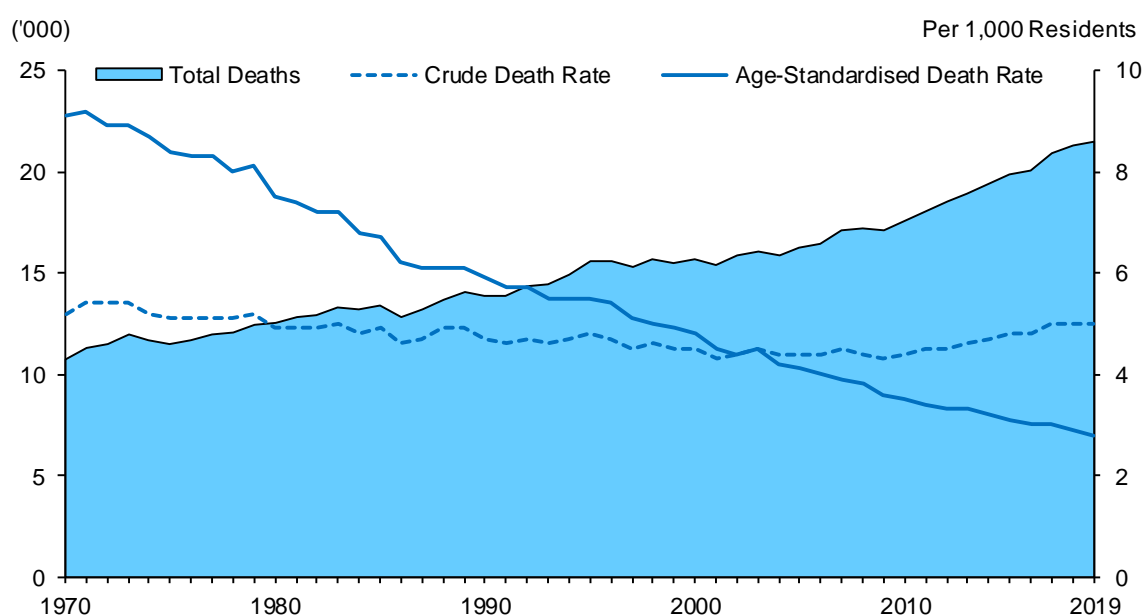
Chapter 5 Mortality

Deaths and Death Rates

As the population continues to age, the number of total deaths rose from 21,282 in 2018 to 21,446 in 2019 (Chart 5.1). The resident crude death rate remained at 5.0 deaths per 1,000 residents.

Reflecting the improvements in health and mortality, the resident age-standardised death rate³ which takes into account the population age structure, continues to decline from 2.9 deaths per 1,000 residents in 2018 to 2.8 deaths in 2019. The age-standardised death rate has been on a downward trend since 1970.

Deaths and Death Rates

Statistics on deaths are obtained from records maintained by the Registry of Births and Deaths. The statistics refer to all deaths occurring within Singapore and its territorial waters as registered under the Registration of Births and Deaths Act (Chapter 267), and are compiled based on date of registration.

Crude death rate refers to the number of deaths per thousand population. Age-standardised death rate is another summary indicator of mortality that removes effects of age structure variations in the population over time.

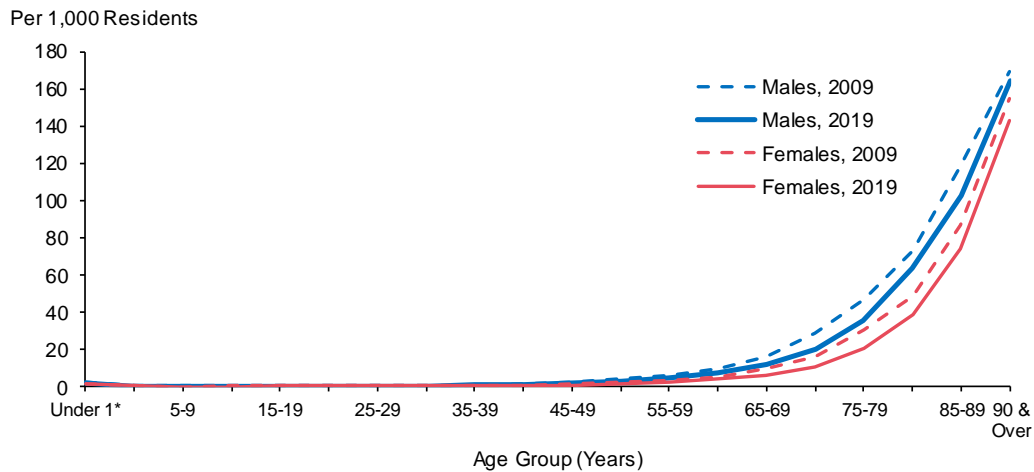

Age-Specific Death Rate

In general, resident females had lower death rates than resident males (Chart 5.2). As compared to a decade ago, age-specific death rates were lower for most age groups in 2019 for both resident males and females.

Chart 5.2 Age-Specific Death Rate

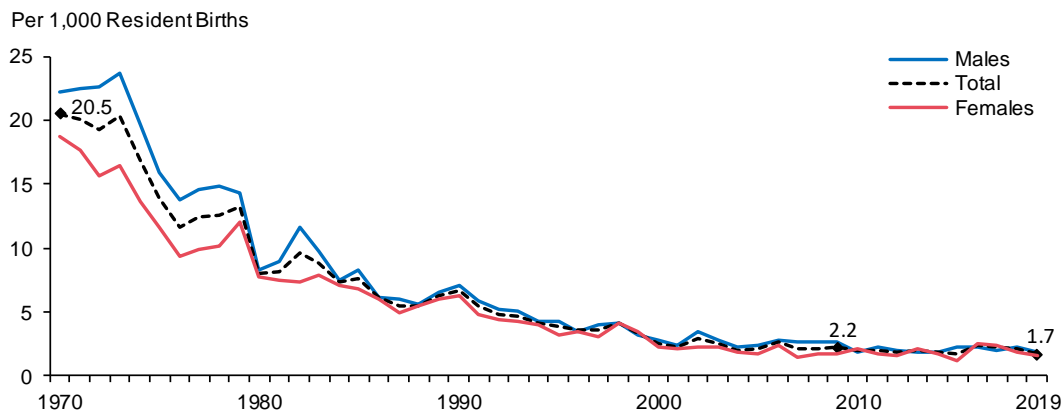

Infant Mortality Rate

The infant mortality rate remained stable over the last decade, at 2.2 infant deaths per 1,000 resident live-births in 2009 to 1.7 in 2019 (Chart 5.3).

Infant Mortality Rate

The rate refers to the number of deaths of children under one year of age per thousand live-births. Along with life expectancy, it is one of the most widely used indicators of the population's health status.

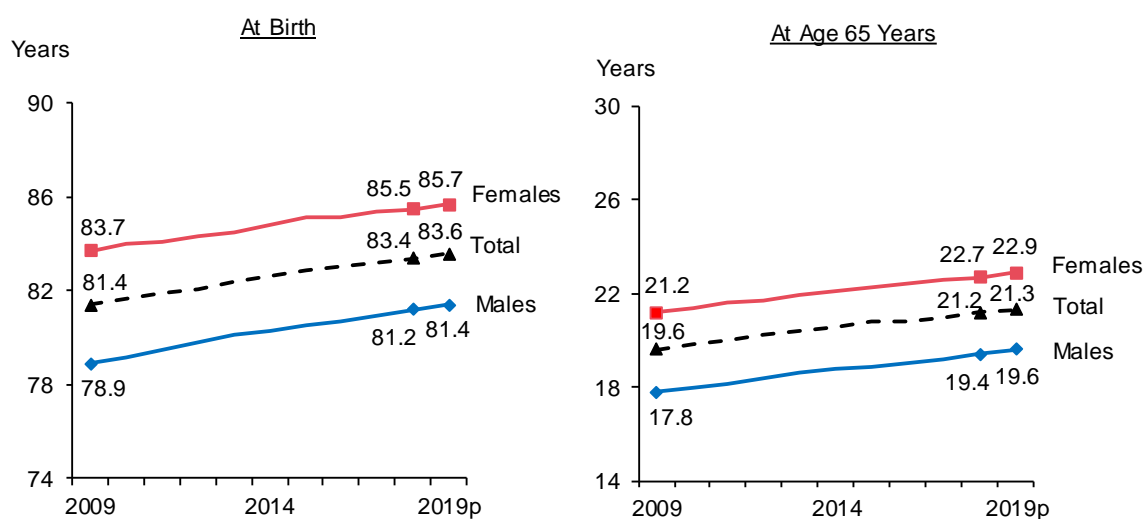

Life Expectancy

Compared to 10 years ago, Singapore residents can expect to live longer. Life expectancy at birth for residents continued to rise over the decade from 81.4 years in 2009 to 83.6 years in 2019 (Chart 5.4). Females continued to have longer life expectancy than males, with a difference of 4.3 years in 2019.

Similarly, life expectancy at age 65 years also improved, from 19.6 years in 2009 to 21.3 years in 2019. Life expectancy at age 65 years was 22.9 years for resident females, 3.3 years longer than that of resident males at 19.6 years.

Life Expectancy

It refers to the average number of additional years which a person at a specific age (such as at birth or age 65 years) could expect to live, if he or she were to experience the age-specific mortality rates of the reference period throughout his/her life. It does not take into account future changes in mortality. The life expectancy gives an indication of the average longevity of the population, but does not necessarily reflect the longevity of an individual.

This single indicator is commonly used to sum up the mortality experience of a population, taking into account the population's age and sex structure.
