Property Description

Set up through the munificence of the Knight de Tencin who donated his book collection in 1763. Designed by Stefano Ittar in 1786 in the Neo-Classical style, and is the last important building to be built by the Knights. The symmetrical façade is characterized by having the Doric order in the ground floor level and the Ionic in the piano notabile. The first floor is supported by a vaulted loggia. The façade of the first floor level is characterized by a two pairs of rectangular windows on each side of the balcony, and 2 sets of oval windows above them. Above the central doorway is a balustraded balcony supported by a pair of double Doric columns, which are in turn paired by 2 pairs of Ionic columns which frame the entrance to the balcony, above which there is a triangular pediment at parapet level. A cornice runs around the whole building below the balustraded parapet. A grand entrance vestibule leads to a spacious flight of stairs that leads to the main hall. The motifs in the ceiling of the loggia and the stucco-line decoration in the entrance hall and staircase were innovative and far removed from the Baroque style.


