HEAD WOMEN'S BASKETBALL COACH



SANTOS ATKINSON

Danielle Santos Atkinson is entering her second season at the helm of the Hofstra women's basketball program in 2020-21. Santos Atkinson was announced as the 12th coach in Hofstra women's basketball history on April 13, 2019.

A dynamic coach who has spent time as an assistant coach in the Atlantic Coast Conference, Southeastern Conference, Missouri Valley Conference and the Colonial Athletic Association, Santos brings a total of 14 years of Division I coaching experience back to Hofstra, where she spent four seasons as an assistant coach from 2006 to 2010. Santos' career arc includes stops at the University of Pittsburgh, Florida State University, the University of Kentucky, Illinois State University, and Hofstra.

Santos has experienced incredible success everywhere she has been in her career with six NCAA Tournament appearances and four WNIT appearances. She has appeared in the Elite Eight three times and made a pair of Sweet 16 appearances in the NCAA Tournament.

Santos furthered her coaching acumen this past year as she accepted the role as associate head coach at Pittsburgh. The Panthers took an immediate step forward as Pittsburgh increased their win total and the new staff brought about a culture change to the program that has a bright future ahead of it.

Santos' career would skyrocket during a tremendous four-year stint at Florida State where she served as the recruiting coordinator for a program that compiled 111 wins and a winning percentage of .810, while winning 25-or more games and going to the NCAA Tournament in all four campaigns. The Seminoles made two Elite Eight appearances, a Sweet 16 appearance and advanced to the second round as well. Her astute recruiting ability saw

Florida State have two recruiting classes ranked in the top five nationally and six student-athletes that she assisted in developing earned All-America honors and numerous Atlantic Coast Conference accolades. The Seminoles high-powered offense ranked in the top 25 nationally in scoring offense in three separate seasons and the team set a program record with 32 wins in 2014-15.

Santos spent the 2012-13 and 2013-14 season at Kentucky and served as the defensive coordinator for the Wildcats during her tenure in Lexington. Kentucky's 2013 recruiting class was ranked fifth nationally and on the court, the Wildcats advanced to the Sweet 16 her first year and followed that up with an Elite Eight appearance in her second go-around.

At Illinois State, Santos paid immediate dividends as both seasons saw the Redbirds advance to the WNIT, including a semifinal appearance in 2010-11. During her two years, Illinois State posted 43 triumphs and Santos aided in the development of seven award winners from the Missouri Valley Conference.

During her previous stop at Hofstra, Santos was part of a pair of 20-win seasons and the Pride earned two bids to the WNIT. The 2006-07 squad advanced to the WNIT Quarterfinals and set the program's NCAA Division I mark with 26 victories. She assisted in all aspects of the program and played a strong role in the recruitment and development of four all-conference performers and five CAA All-Rookie selections.

Santos has been quite active on the national level as it relates to professional development. She has taken part in the Women's Basketball Coaches Association Women's Coaches NEXT UP Program, the Villa 7 Leadership Conference, Next Chair, A Step Up Assistant Coaches

Symposium, NCAA/BCA Achieving Coaching Excellence Program, Coaching U Live Conference, and the NCAA Women's Coaches Leadership Academy.

Santos had a strong career as a student-athlete at the University of Florida from 2002 to 2006. The Gators made three postseason appearances during her career, including NCAA Tournament appearances in 2003-04 (second round) and 2005-06. A 2004 CoSIDA Academic All-District selection, Santos finished her career with 831 points, 265 assists, 162 steals, and 80 three-pointers. She ranks in the top 20 all-time at Florida in assists and three-pointers. Santos earned SEC Academic Honor Roll accolades four times and was a 2005 Arthur Ashe Jr. Scholar-Athlete. She was also a member of the Alpha Lambda Delta Honors Society, National Collegiate Honors Society and Phi Eta Sigma Academic Honors Society. Santos is also a proud member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority Inc.

Santos earned her bachelor of science degree in exercise and sport sciences/sport management with minors in business administration and education from Florida in 2006.

Santos is a member of the Wheeler (GA) High School Athletic Hall of Fame, where she graduated from in 2002.

Santos and her husband, Cleveland, have two daughters, London and Madison.

ASSISTANT COACH



CAMILLE COLLIER

Camille Collier is entering her second season as an assistant coach for the Hofstra women's basketball team ahead of the 2020-21 season. In addition to her coaching duties, Collier also serves as Hofstra's recruiting coordinator.

Collier joined the Hofstra women's basketball program after spending two seasons as an Assistant Coach at Radford University. In her first two seasons with the Highlanders, Collier helped the team to a 50-15 overall record, the best two-year mark in program history.

Radford put together one of the greatest campaigns in program history in 2018-19, going 26-6 overall and 17-1 in Big South play, clinching the regular season title and top seed in the Big South Tournament. Collier and the Highlanders went on to win the Big South Championship and earn a bid to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in 23 years. One season earlier, Collier's first season with Radford, was also a historic one as the Highlanders posted a 24-9 overall record while going 15-3 in conference play. Radford made its second-straight WNIT appearance and defeated Big Ten foe, Penn State for its third postseason win in program history.

Prior to her stop at Radford, Collier spent four seasons as an Assistant Coach at Jacksonville. In the spring of 2016, she was elevated to recruiting coordinator. Prior to her promotion, Jacksonville claimed its first-ever Atlantic Sun Conference Championship while appearing in the NCAA tournament.

A former standout at Wake Forest, Collier wrapped up her playing career in 2012, helping the Demon Deacons to a 20-win season while reaching the second round of the WNIT. She was named to the Atlantic Coast Conference All-Academic Team as a freshman when she led ACC

rookies with her 8.2 scoring average and also earned a spot on the ACC Honor Roll two other times. After finishing her career as a Demon Deacon, Collier served as a graduate assistant coach at Georgia State.

A native of Washington, D.C., Collier earned a bachelor's degree in sociology from Wake Forest in 2011 and a master's degree in education in 2012.





ASSISTANT COACH



AARON SWINSON

Aaron Swinson joined the Hofstra women's basketball coaching staff in November 2020 and is entering his first season with the Pride in 2020-21.

Swinson is a highly experienced coaching professional with nearly three decades of experience playing and coaching high levels of basketball. Swinson arrives at Hofstra from Northwestern State University in Natchitoches, Louisiana, where he began his tenure with the Lady Demons in September 2018 as an Assistant Coach. Following the 2018-19 season, Swinson was promoted to an Associate Head Coach and was eventually named Interim Head Coach this past January.

Swinson's collegiate coaching career began at the University of Tulsa in 2005 when he spent six years as an assistant on the Golden Hurricanes staff. Following his tenure in Oklahoma, Swinson served as an assistant coach at the University of Cincinnati for five seasons before moving on to an assistant coaching role for two years at Prairie View A&M University in Texas.

In addition to 15 years of Division I women's basketball coaching experience, Swinson brings both professional coaching experience and varsity head coaching experience to Hofstra. Swinson's coaching career began overseas as he spent time as an assistant men's basketball coach with Los Barrios B-Team in Spain. Following his first coaching assignment, Swinson moved back to the United States and was the varsity head coach at Holland Hall Preparatory School in Tulsa, directing both the upper- and middle-school girls basketball programs. He returned to the professional ranks in 2007, spending one season as an assistant head coach with the Tulsa 66er's (now Oklahoma City Blue), the NBA G League team for the Oklahoma City Thunder.

Professional development has been important to Swinson as well, as he participated in the 2016 Women's Basketball Coaches Association's Center for Coaching Excellence, was part of the Black Coaches Association's Achieving Coaching Excellence Program and participated in the Minority Coaches Leadership Development seminar.

Swinson was a three-year letterman and two-year starter for the men's basketball program at Auburn University. A two-time captain and two-time All-SEC honoree, Swinson scored 1,368 career points (t-17th in Auburn history), while his 16.9 points per game ranks eighth all-time. Swinson finished his career shooting 60.9 percent from the field, trailing only Charles Barkley on Auburn's all-time list.

Following his storied career at Auburn, Swinson played professional basketball for 11 years. Swinson joined the Phoenix Suns before he was drafted in the first round of the Continental Basketball Association draft by the Yakima Sun Kings. He was named to the All-Rookie First Team and was named the team's most valuable player before moving on to play 12 seasons internationally in Italy, Spain, France and Argentina.

A native of Brunswick, Georigia, Swinson earned his undergraduate degree in Adult Education in 2005, and eventually went on to receive his M.A. in Criminal Justice at the University of Cincinnati in 2014. Swinson is married to his wife, Charlene. He has four children, Charles, Jada, Randall and Erin, and one grandchild, Sorverik.





ASSISTANT COACH




MIKE WEST

Mike West is entering his second season as an assistant coach for the Hofstra women's basketball team ahead of the 2020-21 season.

West arrived at Hofstra after spending four seasons at the helm of the Division II Chestnut Hill College women's basketball program. Under his watch, the Griffins recorded a 56-54 record that included three-straight Central Atlantic Collegiate Conference (CACC) appearances. In addition, West mentored five All-CACC performers and three-straight CACC Rookies of the Year including Jaeda Wildgoose, who became the program's all-time leading scorer upon the exhaustion of her eligibility.

Prior to Chestnut Hill, West spent time as an Assistant Coach for the Lady Rams of Jefferson College (Philadelphia University) since 2011, and aided head coach Tom Shirley, the current second-winningest coach in NCAA Division II, to three 20-win seasons, a 2014-15 CACC Championship appearance, and 2015 NCAA Division II East Region tournament berth.

West graduated in 2006 with a degree in History from Lebanon Valley College, where as a Mid-Atlantic Athletic Conference All-Academic team representative, helped the Dutchmen to an East Coast Athletic Conference (ECAC) Southeast Regional Championship and an NCAA Division II Tournament second-round appearance in 2005.

Keenah Lambert is entering her second season as Hofsta's director of women's basketball operations in 2020-21.

Lambert arrived in Hempstead after serving as the director


of women's basketball operations at the University of Rhode Island for one season. Before spending time with the Rams, Lambert spent three seasons with the Florida State University men's basketball program, working as the special assistant to head coach Leonard Hamilton. While at Florida State, the Seminoles appeared in the NCAA tournament in back-to-back seasons, highlighted by an Elite Eight appearance in 2018.

In her roles, Lambert facilitates many off-the-court functions and activities including community service and team bonding activities. In addition, she coordinated travel arrangements and managed business relationships with several travel companies and restaurants.

Outside of college athletics, Lambert spent a time as a coordinating production assistant at ESPNU after also working with the Dallas Cowboys and Dallas Mavericks in team/game operations.

Mike Jagacki is entering his second season as video coordinator for the Hofstra women's basketball program in 2020-21.

Jagacki is responsible for planning, editing, producing, and compiling all video packages utilized for scouting, recruiting, practices, game preparation, and promotional materials.

Jagacki came to Hofstra following a stint at Combine Academy in Lincolnton, North Carolina, where he was the men's associate head coach for one season. He helped lead the program to 48 overall wins, including several nationally ranked programs. Prior to Combine Academy,

Jagacki spent time as the varsity assistant coach and JV boys basketball coach at Middlesex High School in Middlesex, New Jersey, for four seasons. Jagacki is also the owner of TrueHoops AAU Basketball, and has worked several basketball camps up and down the East Coast.

Jagacki is the creator of Lockdown Defense which can be found on YouTube. His channel, Coach Mike, has more than 17,000 subscribers combining for nearly 2.5 million views. He is also the author of a forthcoming book, Lockdown Defense: Developing Elite Defenders, which will be released in the coming months.

Jagacki graduated cum laude from Rutgers University in 2016 with dual bachelor's degrees in psychology and journalism.

Bria Jackson is entering her second season as a graduate assistant for the Hofstra women's basketball team

ahead of the 2020-21 season.

Jackson came to Hofstra by way of Queens College where she served as an assistant coach for three seasons. At Queens, Jackson was responsible for player development and on-court instruction while assisting with video breakdown, scouting reports, compliance, travel logistics, academic monitoring, and fundraising.

Jackson also spent time with the City University of New York Athletic Conference as a championship and special events assistant where she helped manage championship events, ticketing, social media, and other day-to-day operations. Jackson also works as a youth mentor with Big Apple Basketball, which supports young people in their athletic, educational, professional, and life skill development.

Jackson earned her degree in sociology at Queens College in 2013. She was a women's basketball standout for the Knights and was named an Honorable Mention All-American in addition to earning Daktronics All-Region First Team, Metropolitan Basketball Writers Association First Team, and East Coast Conference First Team honors . She led the ECC in scoring and assists in 2013 (20.0 ppg and 4.5 apg) and currently holds the Queens College and ECC single-game scoring record with 49 points against Bowie State on Dec. 29, 2012.





BASKETBALL PRACTICE FACILITY


The Hofstra Basketball Practice Facility allows both the Hofstra men and women's basketball programs around-the-clock access as they train and develop their student-athletes to compete for Colonial Athletic Association and NCAA Tournament berths.

The 14,000-square foot practice facility is located in the north end of the David S. Mack Physical Education Center and features a new court with eight baskets, a sound system, a filming system with smart TV for video, signage and graphics. The year-round, dedicated basketball facility also houses an athletic training area that includes cardio equipment.

The facility includes banners commemorating both programs retired jerseys, wall graphics representing the postseason appearances of each team and information on the many professional athletes each squad has produced. There are also graphics celebrating the great history of both Hofstra Basketball programs.

The practice facility floor is an exact match of the main floor of the David S. Mack Sports and Exhibition Complex.










DAVID S. MACK SPORTS AND EXHIBITION COMPLEX



On January 2, 2000 the Hofstra basketball programs moved into the 4,223-seat Hofstra Arena, which was renamed the David S. Mack Sports and Exhibition Complex in 2006.

Construction of the \$15 million, 93,000 square-foot facility began in the fall of 1998 and was completed in December 1999. The Complex houses the Hofstra basketball and wrestling teams, and hosts commencements, exhibitions, trade shows, concerts, and other special events.

"Mr. Mack has been extremely generous to Hofstra over the years, and the David S. Mack Sports and Exhibition Complex will serve as just the latest reminder on our campus of that generosity," said Hofstra University President Stuart Rabinowitz, referring to the David S. and Sondra Mack Student Center and Mack Hall, which houses the University Club, the David S. Mack Physical Education Center and the Mack Fitness Center.

In September 2016 the Mack Sports Complex hosted the Presidential Debate between Hillary Clinton and Donald Trump. It was the third consecutive election cycle that Hofstra hosted a debate in the Mack Sports Complex following the 2012 debate between President Barack Obama and Republican nominee Mitt Romney and the 2008 debate between Obama and John McCain. The Mack Sports Complex has also hosted performances by NBC Late Night talk show host and comedian Jimmy Fallon, comedians Louis C.K., and Aziz Ansari, musical artists Justin Bieber and 3 Doors Down, as well as the 2010 and 2018 New York Gubernatorial Debate.

The Mack Sports Complex includes full-chair back seating for spectators in an arena configuration. The airconditioned facility is equipped with a state-of-the-art LED video boards, a new sound system, men's and women's locker rooms, a media

room, an athletic training room, a large weight room, dressing rooms for stage events, four concession stands, five ticket windows, six luxury boxes and offices for Hofstra's athletic administration and basketball staffs.


