## St. Joseph Mercy Chelsea receives COVID-19 vaccine, administers first vaccinations

On December 23, St. Joseph Mer-Chelsea received and administered its first shipment of the FDA-approved Moderna COVID-19 vaccine.

The hospital received 1,700 doses, joining six other Trinity Health Michigan hospitals that have begun administering COVID-19 vaccines to front line workers.

The vaccines are administered being on a voluntary basis to health care per-

sonnel who meet the CDC-defined criteria of direct patient care to COVID-19 patients, including those working on the COVID units, Intensive Care Unit, and Emergency Department. Employees who work in those departments are being given the opportunity to continued on page 6




Jeff graduated from Jackson High




