CALL TO ORDER

Pursuant to notice duly posted, Mayor Riley H. Rogers called the Special Meeting of the Board of Trustees to order in the New Village Hall at 6:42 p.m.

OLD BUSINESS

A. Ordinance No. 19-023

Levying Taxes for General and Corporate Purposes for the 2019 Tax Year Beginning May 1, 2019 and ending April 30, 2020 for the Village of Dolton

Trustee House explained that the county requires each municipality to pass an annual property tax levy ordinance. The tax levy to be voted on this evening reflects a 0 percent increase in the levy for operating expenses and a 0 percent increase in the tax levy to adjust for possible loss in collections of tax revenue. This means that the village will operate at the same tax level.

Trustee Henyard wanted it in the record that she is happy the trustees listened to her in deciding not to increase the tax levy.

Trustee Denton said that she had been concerned about a possible increase in property taxes but said that now that the proposed ordinance is before the board she has a better understanding.

Mayor Rogers commented that everyone is reluctant to raise taxes but that means that the village will have to operate more efficiently as long as it can without increased tax revenues. He noted that if the board of trustees does not pass an annual tax levy, it would receive no property tax revenues.
