Ashley Baker is the Director of Public Policy at the Committee for Justice. Her focus areas include the Supreme Court, regulatory policy, antitrust, and judicial nominations. Her writing has frequently appeared in *Fox News*, *USA Today*, *The Boston Globe*, *Law360*, *The American Spectator*, and many other publications. She has testified before the United States Senate on the topic of antitrust law.

She is also the founder of the Alliance on Antitrust. The Alliance on Antitrust is a coalition of more than two dozen conservative organizations and individuals defending the consumer welfare standard and the rule of law while fostering a greater understanding of the issues and arguments at the core of the antitrust debate.

Ashley is an active member of the Federalist Society, where she serves as a member of both the Regulatory Transparency Project's Antitrust & Consumer Protection and Cyber & Privacy working groups, and as a member of the Republican National Lawyers Association, she has served as a speaker on the Supreme Court and the federal judiciary. Ashley also serves as an official observer on the Uniform Law Commission's drafting committee on the Collection and Use of Personally Identifiable Data.

As an expert on the judicial nomination process, Ashley worked closely on the efforts to confirm Justices Neil Gorsuch, Brett Kavanaugh, and Amy Coney Barrett, in addition to the confirmations of several other key federal judges.

Prior to joining the Committee for Justice in January 2017, Ashley was a fellow at the R Street Institute and FreedomWorks Foundation where she worked on issues related to the Supreme Court, regulatory reform, and consumer protection, with a focus on the technology and financial sectors. Ashley previously worked in the private sector at Merrill Lynch and interned for former Rep. Sue Myrick (NC-09).

Most of Ashley's work is at the intersection of the courts, regulation, and technology. Ashley engages in policy analysis and outreach on legislation and regulations related to these issues by writing op-eds, letters to Congress for committee hearings, and regulatory comments to a broad array of executive agencies including the FTC, NTIA, FCC, EPA, DOL, SEC, and the DOJ Antitrust Division. She also conducts CFJ's external affairs and outreach efforts.
