## The Presentation

*The congregation is seated. The presenters: The Venerable Godfrey Maweje, Stephen Kennedy, The Very Reverend Mike Sinclair, Dae-Lynn Reimer, Stephanie Hall, Jack Manfield and the bishop-elect gather and face the Archbishop who is seated at the chancel steps.*

*Presenters* Gregory, bishop in the church of God, the clergy and people of the Diocese of Qu'Appelle, trusting in the guidance of the Holy Spirit, have chosen Helen Jane Kennedy to be a bishop and chief pastor. We therefore ask you to lay your hands upon her and in the power of the Holy Spirit to consecrate her a bishop in the one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church.

*The archbishop then directs that testimonials of the election be read. The Certificate of Election will be read by the Diocesan Chancellor or Diocesan Designate. When the reading of the testimonials is ended, the archbishop requires the following promise from the bishop-elect.*

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, I, Helen Jane Kennedy, chosen bishop of the Church and see of Qu'Appelle, solemnly declare that I do believe the holy scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be the word of God, and to contain all things necessary to salvation; I do solemnly promise to conform to the doctrine, discipline and worship of the Anglican Church of Canada; and I do pledge myself to render due obedience to the Metropolitan of the Ecclesiastical Province of Rupert's Land and to his successors. So help me God, through Jesus Christ.

*The bishop-elect then signs the above declaration in the sight of all present. The witnesses add their signatures.*

*Musical Interlude*

*All stand, the archbishop then asks the response of the people in these or similar words.*

Brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus, you have heard testimony that Helen Jane Kennedy has been duly and lawfully elected to be a bishop in the Church of God to serve in the Diocese of Qu'Appelle. You have been assured of her suitability and that the Church has approved her for this sacred responsibility. Nevertheless, if any of you know any reason why we should not proceed, let it be made known.

*If no objection is made, the archbishop continues*

*Archbishop* Is it your will that we ordain Helen a bishop?

*People* **It is.**

*Archbishop* Will you uphold Helen as bishop?

*People* **We will.**

## **The Examination**

*All now sit except the bishop-elect, who stands facing the bishops. The archbishop addresses the bishop-elect.*

Helen, the people have chosen you and have affirmed their trust in you by acclaiming your election. A bishop in God's holy Church is called to be one with the apostles in proclaiming Christ's resurrection and interpreting the Gospel, and to testify to Christ's sovereignty as Lord of lords and King of kings.

You are called to guard the faith, unity, and discipline of the Church; to celebrate and to provide for the administration of the sacraments of the new covenant; to ordain priests and deacons, and to join in ordaining bishops; and to be in all things a faithful pastor and wholesome example for the entire flock of Christ.

With your fellow bishops you will share in the leadership of the Church throughout the world. Your heritage is the faith of patriarchs, prophets, apostles, and martyrs, and those of every generation who have looked to God in hope. Your joy will be to



follow him who came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many.

Are you persuaded that God has called you to the office of bishop?

*Answer* I am so persuaded.

*The following questions are then addressed to the bishop-elect by one or more of the other bishops.*

*Bishop* Will you accept this call and fulfil this trust in obedience to Christ?

*Answer* I will obey Christ, and will serve in his name.

*Bishop* Will you be faithful in prayer, and in the study of holy scripture, that you may have the mind of Christ?

*Answer* I will, for he is my help.

*Bishop* Will you boldly proclaim and interpret the gospel of Christ, enlightening the minds and stirring up the conscience of your people?

*Answer* I will, in the power of the Spirit.

*Bishop* As a chief priest and pastor, will you encourage and support all baptized people in their gifts and ministries, nourish them from the riches of God's grace, pray for them without ceasing, and celebrate with them the sacraments of our redemption?

*Answer* I will, in the name of Christ, the shepherd and bishop of our souls.

*Bishop* Will you guard the faith, unity, and discipline of the Church?

*Answer* I will, for the love of God.

*Bishop* Will you share with your fellow bishops in the government of the whole Church; will you sustain your fellow presbyters and take counsel with them;

will you guide and strengthen the deacons and all others who minister in the Church?

*Answer* I will, by the grace given me.

*Bishop* Will you be merciful to all, show compassion to the poor and strangers, and defend those who have no helper?

*Answer* I will, for the sake of Jesus Christ.

*All stand. The archbishop then says,*

Helen, through these promises you have committed yourself to God, to serve his Church in the office of bishop. We therefore call upon you, chosen to be a guardian of the Church's faith, to lead us in confessing that faith.

*Bishop-elect* We believe in one God,  
*All* **the Father, the Almighty,  
maker of heaven and earth,  
of all that is, seen and unseen.  
We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,  
the only Son of God,  
eternally begotten of the Father,  
God from God, Light from Light,  
true God from true God,  
begotten, not made,  
of one being with the Father.  
Through him all things were made.  
For us and for our salvation  
he came down from heaven:  
by the power of the Holy Spirit  
he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary,  
and was made man.  
For our sake he was crucified**

**under Pontius Pilate;  
he suffered death and was buried.  
On the third day he rose again  
in accordance with the scriptures;  
he ascended into heaven  
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.  
He will come again in glory  
to judge the living and the dead,  
and his kingdom will have no end.  
We believe in the Holy Spirit,  
the Lord, the giver of life,  
who proceeds from the Father.  
With the Father and the Son  
he is worshipped and glorified.  
He has spoken through the prophets.  
We believe in one holy catholic  
and apostolic Church.  
We acknowledge one baptism  
for the forgiveness of sins.  
We look for the resurrection of the dead,  
and the life of the world to come. Amen.**

## **The Consecration of the Bishop**

*All remain standing, except the bishop-elect, who kneels before the archbishop. The other bishops stand to the right and left of the archbishop. The archbishop says,*

The scriptures tell us that our Saviour Christ spent the whole night in prayer before he chose and sent forth his twelve apostles. Likewise, the apostles prayed before they appointed Matthias to be one of their number. Let us, therefore, follow their examples, and offer our prayers to Almighty God before we ordain Helen for the work to which we trust the Holy Spirit has called her.

*The people kneel.*

Give your people grace to hear and receive your word, and to bring forth the fruit of the Spirit.

**Hear us, good Lord.**

Bring into the way of truth all who have erred and are deceived.

**Hear us, good Lord.**

Strengthen those who stand; comfort and help the fainthearted; raise up the fallen; and finally beat down Satan under our feet.

**Hear us, good Lord.**

Give us true repentance; forgive our sins of negligence and ignorance, and our deliberate sins; and grant us the grace of your Holy Spirit, to amend our lives according to your holy word.

## The Ordination Prayer for a Bishop

*The archbishop stands with the bishops who assist him, the bishop-elect kneeling before him; he stretches out his hands toward her, and begins this Prayer of Consecration.*

We praise and glorify you, almighty Father, because you have formed throughout the world a holy people for your own possession, a royal priesthood, a universal Church. We praise and glorify you because you have given us your only Son Jesus Christ to be the Apostle and High Priest of our faith, and the Shepherd of our souls. We praise and glorify you that by his death he has overcome death; and that, having ascended into heaven, he has given his gifts abundantly to your people, making some, apostles; some, prophets; some, evangelists; some, pastors and teachers; to equip them for the work of ministry and to build up his Body. And now we give you thanks that you have called this your servant to share this ministry entrusted to your Church.

*Here the archbishop and other bishops lay their hands on the head of the bishop-elect, and the archbishop says,*

Send down your Holy Spirit upon your servant Helen, whom we consecrate in your name to the office and work of a bishop in the Church.

*The archbishop then continues, with hands extended, the deacons holding the book of gospels above the bishop.*

Almighty Father, fill this your servant with the grace and power which you gave to your apostles, that she may lead those committed to her charge in proclaiming the gospel of salvation. Through her increase your Church, renew its ministry, and unite its members in a holy fellowship of truth and love. Enable her as a true shepherd to feed and govern your flock; make her wise as a teacher, and steadfast as a guardian of its faith and sacraments. Guide and direct her in presiding at the worship of your people. Give her humility, that she may use her authority to heal, not to hurt; to build up, not to destroy. Defend her from all evil, that, as a ruler over your household and an ambassador for Christ, she may stand before you blameless, and

finally, with all your servants, enter your eternal joy. Accept our prayers, most merciful Father, through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom, with you and your Holy Spirit, belong glory and honour, worship and praise, now and for ever. **Amen.**

## **The Vesting and Presentations**

*The archbishop anoints the hands and forehead of the new bishop with Chrism in the sign of the cross saying:*

God has brought you to lead the priesthood of all believers as High Priest. May he pour out on you the mystical oil of anointing and the power of the Holy Spirit, to enrich you with spiritual blessings. May Jesus preserve you to lead and sanctify the Christian people and to offer spiritual sacrifices to God.

*The new bishop is now vested according to the order of bishops. At this time, symbols of office will be presented. The pectoral cross is presented by Jim Fuller with these words:*

Receive this cross as a sign that you share in the inheritance of all the apostles: to preach the gospel of Christ crucified for all the world, to the end of time.

*The Episcopal ring is presented by The Right Reverend Geoff Woodcroft with these words:*

Receive this ring, a sign of love and fidelity. And guard and protect the Bride of Christ, the holy church.

*A cope is presented to the new bishop by The Right Reverend William Cliff with the following words:*

Receive this cope, and may you be clothed with righteousness that you might walk with the Lord all your days.

*The mitre is presented to the new bishop by The Right Reverend William Cliff with these words:*

Receive this mitre as a sign that the Holy Spirit has been poured out upon you, and wear it as the Spirit's emblem, the mark of the servant of all.



*The archbishop presents a bible, saying,*

Receive the holy scriptures. Feed the flock of Christ committed to your charge, guard and defend them in his truth, and be a faithful steward of his holy word and sacraments.

*The Primate of Canada will present a pastoral staff to the new bishop, saying,*

Receive this staff as a sign of your pastoral office; keep watch over the whole flock in which the Holy Spirit has appointed you to shepherd the Church of God. Encourage the faithful, restore the lost, build up the body of Christ; that when the Chief Shepherd shall appear, you may receive the unfading crown of glory.

*The archbishop, accompanied by the Dean and the Chancellor conducts the newly consecrated bishop to the Cathedra and, seats her, the Dean says the following:*

In the name of this Cathedral Church and on behalf of the people of this Diocese, I install you, Helen Jane Kennedy in the chair appointed to your office. May the Lord stir up in you the flames of holy charity and the power of faith which overcomes the world.

*The archbishop presents to the people the new bishop, saying,*

I present Helen Jane Kennedy, bishop in the Church of God.

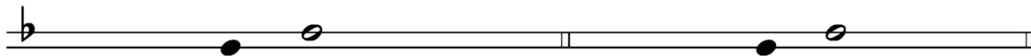

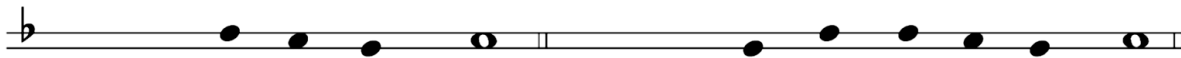
## Prayer over the Gifts

## Eucharist Prayer 3



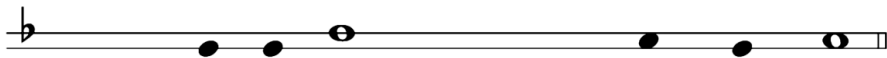

and his blood of the new covenant.

may be sanctified by the Holy Spirit.

where you dwell with all your sons and daughters;

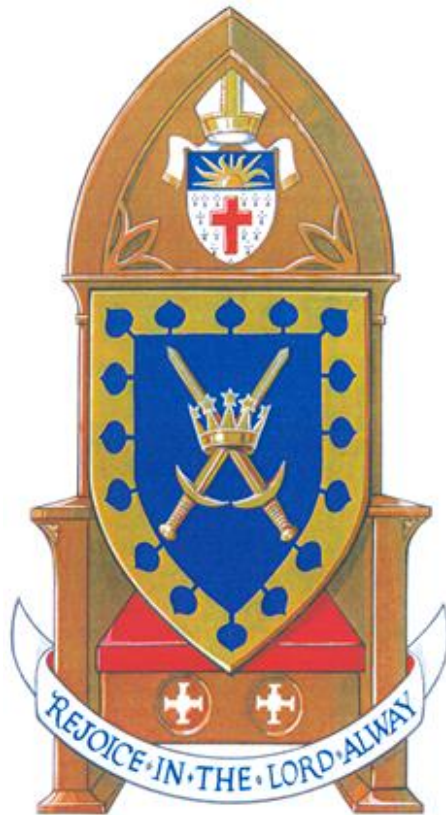
