The Canterbury (Parishes) Order 1995

Made 18 December 1995

Coming into force 5 January 1996

Whereas the Local Government Commission for England, acting pursuant to section 15(4) of the Local Government Act 1992(a), has submitted to the Secretary of State a report on its review of the county of Kent, together with its recommendations:

And whereas the Secretary of State has decided to give effect to the recommendation that a new parish should be constituted for the unparished area of Herne and Broomfield:

Now, therefore, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by sections 17(b) and 26 of the Local Government Act 1992, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:

Citation, commencement and interpretation

- 1. (1) This Order may be cited as the Canterbury (Parishes) Order 1995 and shall come into force on 5 January 1996.
- (2) In this Order "map" means the map prepared by the Department of the Environment, marked "Map of the Canterbury (Parishes) Order 1995", and deposited in accordance with regulation 27 of the Local Government Changes for England Regulations 1994(c)

Creation of new parish

2. In the city of Canterbury(d), there shall be created a new parish of Herne and Broomfield consisting of the unparished area marked El on the map.




This Order creates a new parish of Herne and Broomfield in the city of Canterbury. A map forming part of this note gives a general guide to the areas affected.
