They love their Nelson College singlets that they designed (with a little bit of help from Alethea).



Immunise against meningococcal disease

Protects you when living closely with others

Young people living closely together in places like boarding school hostels or tertiary education halls of residence need to be immunised to protect against meningococcal disease.

Meningococcal disease can be life-threatening. Vaccines are available to protect against it.





Key Points

- A serious bacterial infection that can become deadly in just a few hours.
- 2. Teenagers and young adults living closely together are at higher risk.
- One dose of vaccine protects against four out of five strains of meningococcal disease. It's FREE for 13 to 25 yearolds living in boarding school hostels, tertiary education halls of residence, military barracks or prisons.
- A vaccine is available to protect against meningococcal B - it's not free, but is highly recommended for those living closely together.

Aged 15-30? Get immunised against measles to protect your whānau, community and future generations from harm. It's free at GPs and participating pharmacies. Measles is a serious disease that can make you very sick. It's about 8 times more contagious than COVID-19 so spreads fast.

Getting immunised is the best way to protect you, your whānau and community from catching and spreading measles.

Not sure if you're already immunised against measles? Lots of people aged between 15 and 30 years didn't get fully immunised when they were children. This puts you at risk of catching and spreading measles.

Ask your doctor, parent or caregiver if you had two doses of the MMR vaccine as a child. If you don't know, it's best to get immunised. It's safe to have an extra dose of the MMR vaccine.
