## MOSES.

*Sphagnum fimbriatum* Wils. var. *laxifolium* W. near Aintree (59), Dec. 1918, W.T. "An interesting form with very large stem-leaves (1·4 x 0·9 at base of leaf); otherwise this slender plant with remote branching agrees fairly well with var. *laxifolium*." W.R.S. Arncliffe Wood, Eskdale (62), Aug. 1916, P.G.M.R. det. W. Ingham and J. A. Wheldon. "Mr. Sherrin prefers to call it var. *validus* Card. f. *spectabile*, W. subf. *anocladum*, Est et Fax." Mr. Sherrin's note runs as follows:—"In the well-formed plants the branch leaves measure as much as 1·95, the stem leaves 1·3 by 0·8 at the base. I certainly think this is a form of the var. *validus* approaching the var. *robustum* rather than the var. *laxifolium* which is a much smaller plant with distant branching," while Mr. Wheldon speaks of the plant as "one of those intermediate plants which one can hardly place under any of Warnstorff's varieties without straining some character. In placing it under var. *laxifolium* I was guided by the size of the leaves chiefly and the slender branches, the slenderness being due simply to lax arrangement of the leaves on the branches. Your plant (some of it) is slightly more robust than the specimens I had but the leaves still remain too small for *validus*."
