# Proposal to encode the SANDHI MARK for Bengali

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#### **1** Introduction

This is a proposal to encode a new character in the Bengali block. The details of the character are given below. Glyph Code Character name


#### **2** Description

The sandhi mark is used in many Sanskrit manuscripts of Bengali script to show external Sandhi. The following section from the manuscript *Stavamāla* demonstrates the use of the sandhi mark.



In this excerpt the sandhi mark occurs in the phrase Stābamālānujībena. Here vowel sandhi occurs between the words Stābamālā and anujībena ( $\bar{a}+a\rightarrow\bar{a}$ ).


Sandhi mark is also sometimes used to indicate the fusion of a bare consonant and a vowel. An example is shown in following manuscript of *Bhāgavatāṣṭakam* between the words bhāgabatān, imān and anulabam.



## **3 Representation**

The sandhi mark is written after an orthographic syllable in order to indicate that the syllable represents a word boundary that is affected by sandhi.

The sandhi mark is closely related to 111C9 SHARADA SANDHI MARK in its behavior and function. Similar to Sharada, in Bengali too the sandhi mark is not intended for specifying linguistic syllables. Therefore, it does not delimit correct morphological boundaries. This is elucidated in below manuscript.



Here, sandhi mark is used after ni and na. However the actual linguistic word boundaries of the phrase are bhāgabatān imān anulabam. The sandhi marks should be positioned equidistant between the two surrounding syllables.




Figure 1. A manuscript from *Bhāgavatāstakam* showing the use of sandhi mark.




Figure 2. A manuscript from Stābamālā showing the use of sandhi mark.(from <sup>1</sup>)
