Class	Anticholinergic
Presentation	Tablet: 10mg Ampoule: 20mg/mL
Storage	Store at room temperature, below 25°C
Dose	<u>Gastrointestinal spasm:</u> Oral: 10 - 20mg 3 to 4 times a day IM/IV Injection: 20 - 40mg up to every 30 minutes.
