

## InsiderAdvantage National Survey March 2022

March 7-8; 750 Likely Voters; Margin of Error 3.6%

1. What is your opinion of the job performance of President Joe Biden?

Approve: 42%

Disapprove: 54%

No Opinion/Undecided: 4%

2. If the election were held today, which party would you prefer have control of Congress?

Democrats: 40%

Republicans: 48%

No Opinion/Undecided: 12%

3. What do you believe the president, Congress and the American people should do to lower rapidly increasing prices for gasoline?

The executive orders establishing restrictions on oil drilling and excavation in the U.S. created by President Biden should be reversed and the XL Pipeline should be built: 64%

We should rely on countries like Saudi Arabia and Venezuela to supply oil to the U.S.: 5%

We as individuals should all stop driving combustion automobiles that rely on gasoline and should soon begin the process of purchasing our own and electric car or truck: 19%

No Opinion/Undecided: 12%

3.How much is rising inflation in the cost of goods and services impacting you and your family?

Significantly: 85%

Insignificantly: 14%

No Opinion/Undecided: 1%

4.Do you approve or disapprove of President Biden's handling of the war in the Ukraine?

Approve: 36%

Disapprove: 46%

No Opinion/Undecided: 18%

Brief Analysis by InsiderAdvantage Founder and Chairman Matt Towery:

- Younger voters continue to drift away from Biden and Democrats in general; Seniors, who were once the GOP's base continue to give Democrats and Biden a slight edge.
- The shift way from Biden and Democrats among African American voters continues to be unusually strong (in the mid-thirty percentile range).
- There is virtually no support for a significant or quick move towards electronic vehicles from traditional

gasoline/combustion engine powered vehicles and there is overwhelming support to return to allowing drilling and excavation in the U.S., combined with resuming the Keystone Pipeline.

- A vast majority of voters are now feeling the impact of inflation with an astounding 95% of younger voters stating that the impact of inflation on them is “significant.”
- The final verdict is not in as to how voters feel about President Biden’s handling of the Ukraine. Currently voters disapprove of his performance on this issue by ten points, but there remains an unusually high percent of undecideds. That could move towards Biden should he be viewed as having taken moves that result in a more positive outcome, or it could drag him down further (in his overall approval) should undecideds start to sour on his efforts.
