I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

Severe Tropical Storm (STS) "Egay", developed inside the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) on 02 July 2015 and exited the PAR on 07 July 2015, and Typhoon "Falcon", entered the PAR on 07 July 2015 and exited on 10 July 2015, enhanced the Southwest Monsoon which brought moderate to occasionally heavy rains over Luzon and Visayas especially over the western sections.

The southwest monsoon triggered the occurrence of flooding in several areas in Regions I, III, and NCR. Subsequently, landslide incidents was reported in Regions III, NCR, and CAR as the Southwest Monsoon continues to be experienced in Ilocos, Cordillera, Benguet, Zambales, Bataan, Pangasinan, Metro Manila, Cagayan Valley, and Central Luzon to date.

II. EFFECTS

1. Affected Population (Tab A)

- a. A total of <u>8,611 families / 41,029 persons</u> were affected in Regions III, IV-A, NCR, and CAR.
- b. Population served inside 7 evacuation centers: 44 families / 172 persons.
- c. Population served outside evacuation centers in Region III: 62 families / 315 persons.

2. Casualties (TAB B)

A total of 16 persons were reported dead in Region I, III, IV-A, IV-B, CAR, and NCR. Eleven (11) were reported injured in Region VI and CAR while four (4) are still missing in Region I.

3. Incidents Monitored (TAB C)

A total of **25** incidents were monitored – eleven (11) drowning, six (6) landslide, (5) collapsed structures, one (1) maritime, one (1) tornado, and one (1) fallen debris.

4. Suspension of Classes / Work

By virtue of Memorandum Circular No. 78, s. 2015, the Office of the President declared suspension of work in government offices in Metro Manila effective at 3:00 PM, 09 July 2015.

5. Flooded Areas / Roads (Tab D)

- a. A total of seven (7) road sections in La Union, Bulacan, Benguet, and Oriental Mindoro were reported closed to traffic due to flooding, landslide, and mudflow.
- b. Flooding in Valenzuela City was reportedly subsided.

c. Flooding of different depths still persist in Regions I and III.

6. Damages

Damaged Houses

a. A total of seven (7) totally damaged houses was reported in Bataan and Bulacan: one (1) in Dinalupihan, Bataan; one (1) in Pulilan, Bulacan; and five (5) in San Jose Del Monte, Bulacan.

Damaged Roads and Bridges

- a. RGV Road in Barangay San Nicolas, Naujan, Oriental Mindoro was eroded due to heavy rains.
- b. Tulariquen detour road and bridge approach located along Puerto Princesa North Road (PPNR), Barangay Tulariquen, Roxas, Palawan were washed-out due to strong river current brought about by heavy rains.

Cost of Damages to Agriculture (Tab E)

a. Region III sustained a total of ₱3,897,888.00 cost of damage in rice and corn.

7. Cost of Assistance

A total of ₱3,714,894.00 worth of relief assistance was provided in NCR and Region III:

III. DISASTER PREPAREDNESS (Tab F)

RDRRMCs I, II, III, IV-A, IV-B, and CAR conducted Pre-Disaster Risk Assessment (PDRA) for Typhoon Falcon, Southwest Monsoon (Habagat), and Typhoon Nangka on 10 July 2015.

IV. DISASTER RESPONSE

MMDA lifted the Number Coding Scheme in all cities and municipality of Metro Manila on 10 July 2015 and advised the public that the Pasig River Ferry System suspended their operation due to zero visibility caused by heavy rains.

A. CAMP COORDINATION AND CAMP MANAGEMENT

- 1. A total of 44 families / 172 persons are still inside 7 evacuation centers in Regions III, IV-A, CAR, and NCR.
- 2. CDRRMO San Pedro conducted pre-emptive evacuation of 12 families / 30 individuals residing along Barangay Estrella, San Pedro City, Laguna and are taking shelter at the Barangay Estrella Hall Compound.
- 3. CDRRMO Malabon evacuated the families in Barangay Tinajeros and Potrero to the designated evacuation centers.

B. LOGISTICS

- 1. Installed warning signs on affected road sections in Region I and CAR.
- 2. PDRRMC Bulacan's Provincial Engineer's Office (PEO) dispatched one (1) tenwheeler truck to Tabing Ilog, Marilao to transport stranded commuters.

- 3. OCDRC VII coordinated with Central Command-AFP, 2nd Air Division, and Naval Forces Central for the requested Huey helicopter for the transport of cadaver of the Korean National from San Francisco to Naval Forces Central, Lapu-Lapu City.
- 4. OCD V provided Fuel and Other Liquid (FOL) to OCD V personnel for possible assessment augmentation.
- 5. OCD V provided Fuel, Oil, and Lubricant (FOL) for RDRRMC Response Assets to be used for assessment operations.
- 6. OCD V rented one (1) van prepositioned at OCD V Regional Disaster Management Operations Center (RDMOC).
- 7. DRRMO Malabon multicab, rescue truck, and tow truck vehicle proceeded to Barangay Hulong Duhat to evacuate ten (10) families.
- 8. PRC-Bulacan dispatched one (1) steel boat to Meycauayan.
- 9. PEO Bulacan dispatched one (1) ten-wheeler truck to Camalig, Meycauayan.
- 10. LGU of Floridablanca conducted sandbagging operations for breached secondary dike of Caulaman River.
- 11. PDRRMC Bulacan's PEO dispatched one (1) ten-wheeler truck to Obando and Meycauayan to provide transportation assistance.
- 12. The 7th Infantry Division, AFP, augmented at OCD III OpCen on 10 July 2015 and conducted lay outing of Harris Radio Manpack and Harris Handheld Radio to establish communication contact to Tactical Operations Command (TOC), 702nd and 703rd Infantry Brigades and Battalions for disaster SAR operations.
- 13. OCD CAR provided augmentation of fuel and other logistical requirements to Cordillera RDRRMC Response Cluster members.

C. SEARCH, RESCUE, AND RETRIEVAL

- Naval Forces Central, AFP, transported the two (2) injured Korean nationals to Lapu-Lapu City via Naval Forces Central Visayas PG-372 (BRP Alfredo Peckson). The two (2) divers are at the University of Cebu-Medical Hospital for further treatment.
- 2. The 2nd Air Division, AFP deployed a Huey helicopter for search and rescue operations in Cebu.
- 3. PDRRMC Bulacan provided one (1) outboard motor to Baliwag Rescue Team for retrieval operation and two (2) paddles to PRC-Bulacan.
- 4. On 10 July 2015, PDRRMC Bulacan provided one (1) outboard motor to Baliwag Rescue Team for retrieval operations and two (2) paddles to PRC-Bulacan. PEO dispatched one (1) ten wheeler truck to Camalig, Meycauayan.
- 5. CDRRMC Baguio City, Baguio City and Tuba Fire Station, Police Station 8, EMS Baguio, Baguio-Benguet Public Information and Civic Action Group (BB-PICAG), 911 On Call, PRC Baguio Chapter, DPWH CAR, AFP, TOG 1, and 106th Reserved CDC responded to the landslide incident which caused a tree to fall and hit a passenger jeepney and a van along Wabac Road, Camp 6, Kennon Road, Baguio City.
- 6. BDRRMC Itogon conducted retrieval operations in Calhorr, Ampucao, Itogon, Benguet.

D. FOOD AND NON-FOOD

- CSWDD Malabon distributed hot meals and provided other necessary things to the evacuees in the evacuation centers.
- 2. LGU Magsaysay, Occidental Mindoro provided three (3) cavans of rice and three (3) boxes of sardines to Barangay Alibog, Magsaysay Occidental Mindoro.
- 3. DSWD III provided food and non-food items to affected families in Bulacan and Zambales worth PhP1,271,000.00 and PhP9,000.00 successively.

E. EMERGENCY TELECOMMUNICATION

- 1. OCDRC IV-A mobilized the Emergency Telecommunication Equipment (ETC) Satellite Phones in Camp Vicente Lim, Barangay Mayapa, Calamba City, Laguna.
- 2. DOH IV-A issued radio equipment to key personnel for ease of communication.
- 3. OCD CAR deployed mobile ETC equipment for basic office services catering all clusters on duty at the Response Cluster Hub.

F. HEALTH

- 1. DOH III conducted medical check-up and provided medications for evacuees in Barangay Bayanihan, Dinalupihan, Bataan.
- 2. DOH IV-A distributed PhP3,000,000.00 worth of medicines and supplies to CALABARZON Provinces.
- DOH III provided medical assistance to 24 persons in Barangay Bayan-Bayanan, Dinalupihan, Bataan and distributed Doxycycline in the Municipalities of Castillejos, Subic, and San Narciso in Zambales and Marilao and Meycauayan in Bulacan.

G. CLEARING OPERATIONS

- 1. PDRRMC Tarlac dispatched DART/EMS on 10 July 2015, 6:26 AM to conduct clearing operations of uprooted acacia tree obstructing / blocking the road along McArthur Highway, Sepung Calzada Section, Brgy. Salapungan, Tarlac City causing heavy traffic.
- 2. PDRRMC Pampanga in the Municipality of Guagua, portions of Brgy. San Antonio and Brgy. San Jose are conducting clearing of canals and creeks.
- 3. DPWH CAR conducted road clearing operations along View deck to Camp 7, Kennon Road.

- a. Alerted all district operations center.
- b. Placed all WASAR Teams on standby for possible response mobilization.
- c. Coordinates with local leaders, disseminated warning to discourage fisherfolks and other small sea vessels from venturing out the sea given the threat of big waves.

Coast Guard District Northeastern Luzon (CGDNELZN)

a. Observes heightened alert status 24/7 manning of respective command centers and closely monitoring for possible maritime incidents within their AOR.

- b. Continuously disseminates latest weather bulletins and gale warnings. Coordinates to all Stations, Sub-Stations, fisherfolks, and Barangay Captains along coastal areas within their AOR, and advised all small motor banca/ fishing banca not to venture out at sea.
- c. Placed Deployable Response Group (DRG) on standby alert and ready for deployment as the need arises.

Coast Guard District Southern Tagalog (CGDSTL)

Coast Guard District Palawan

- a. On heightened alert and placed all disaster response groups on standby for deployment.
- b. Prohibited small crafts from venturing out of the sea.
- c. Advised all stations and substations to ensure strict implementation of guidelines on the movement of vessel during inclement weather.

17. Metropolitan Manila Development Authority (MMDA)

a. Advised the public that the Pasig River Ferry System suspended its operations on 09 July 2015 due to zero visibility caused by heavy rains.
