
TIGER FOOTBALL COACHES.

Princeton Selects Bluethenthal and Andrews to Drill Eleven.

PRINCETON, N. J., April 14.—Arthur Bluethenthal and W. Gresham Andrews, members of Princeton's football eleven last Fall, have been selected as the active field coaches during the football campaign in Tigertown next Fall. This will be the first time in many years that the Tiger eleven has been intrusted to men who have just been graduated from college, but the new policy has a heavy string to it, because of the fact that a Graduate Advisory Committee will superintend their work.

Bluethenthal has been the Tiger centre for the last three years, and the graduate coaches say that he knows more about that position than any other man who has worn the Orange and Black. Andrews had his first year in 'Varsity football last Fall, when he played an end.

It is understood that Logan Cunningham, head field coach for the last two years, was asked to return, but declined because of business duties. Ross C. McClave, '03, will again act as Chairman of the Graduate Advisory Committee, with full control over the campaign. The committee consists of Phil King, '03; Knowlton Ames, '90; D. G. Herring, '07, and Barclay Farr, '12. These men have been on the field regularly in recent years and are in close touch with the football situation here.
