



1. HEAVY SNOW in SOUTH DAKOTA and MINNESOTA on March 3-5, 1984

A snowstorm dropped up to 20 inches of wet, heavy snow over the southern half of Minnesota and extreme eastern South Dakota on March 3rd through the 5th. Strong northwest winds of up to 40 mph accompanied the storm, causing many roads to be closed due to drifting snow. ---Data supplied by NWSFOs at Sioux Falls, South Dakota and Milwaukee, Wisconsin; and by the Minnesota State Climatology Office.


2. LOW PRESSURE SYSTEM over the EASTERN U.S. on March 28-29, 1984


A strong low pressure system intensified over the eastern U.S. on March 28th and 29th producing a wide variety of severe weather throughout the region. The storm was responsible for an outbreak of tornadoes in the Carolinas, strong gusty winds in New England, new all-time, low pressure records for many stations, a microburst in Massachusetts, heavy snow in the mountains of New York and Pennsylvania, and coastal erosion and flooding along the eastern seaboard to name a few. Some of these events are featured on the following pages.

2a. TORNADO OUTBREAK in the CAROLINAS on March 28, 1984


During a 6-hour period in the late afternoon and early evening of March 28th, a strong line of thunderstorms produced 22 tornadoes in North and South Carolina. Of the 22 tornadoes, 7 were F4 in strength, 5 F3, 7 F2, and 3 were F1. The path lengths varied from less than a mile to 45 miles, and totaled 310 miles. The longest tornado path (#11, McColl Tornado) was also the widest, with a mean width of 1.5 miles and maximum width of 2.5 miles. Many of the paths followed each other along lines indicating that the tornadoes were of a family type (spawned one after another by the same parent thunderstorm). One tornado (#16, Snug Harbor) began as a waterspout over Albemarle Sound. In South Carolina the tornadoes were accompanied by 3 large downburst areas, each producing F1 damage.

The total number of deaths for the two states from these tornadoes was 57, 21 of which (37%) occurred in mobile homes. 1,248 people were injured.

























2b. RECORD LOW PRESSURE at BALTIMORE, MD




2c. HIGH WINDS at MILTON, MA


on March 29, 1984

High winds produced a peak gust of 82kts* (95mph) from the ENE at Blue Hill Observatory near Boston, MA. A second anemometer at the site recorded a 108mph gust. ---Trace from Blue Hill Met. Obs., Milton, MA. * +4kts correction factor.

As the major cyclone moved northeastward over the Atlantic on March 29th, a thunderstorm produced a microburst at Southborough, MA. It felled 4 to 5 acres of red pine trees, either uprooting them or shearing them off at a height of about 20 feet off the ground. Most of the trees fell toward the southwest.










3. HEAVY SNOW in NEW ENGLAND on March 13-14, 1984

On March 13th and 14th a strong winter storm moved up the east coast and dumped up to 3 feet of snow on New England. Heaviest amounts were recorded at the higher elevations in Vermont, New Hampshire and Maine. Telos Lake, Maine, about 100 miles north of Bangor, received the maximum amount of 36 inches. ---Data supplied by NWSFOs at Portland, Maine; Boston, Massachusetts; and Albany, New York.











4. TORNADOES in ARKANSAS on March 15, 1984

On March 15th, two F4 tornadoes struck north-central Arkansas, killing 7 people and injuring 25. The first carved a 48 mile path through mostly mountainous terrain, but destroyed the Highway 16 bridge over Greers Ferry Lake. The second caused heavy damage as it passed through the town of Fisher. ---Map and all photos by A. B. Lee and M. L. Harrison, NWSFO Little Rock, AR. 





5. SNOW and ICE STORM in the CENTRAL PLAINS on March 18-20, 1984

A severe winter storm brought heavy snow and a thick coat of ice to portions of the Central Plains on March 18th to the 20th. Up to 20 inches of snow fell in Colorado, Nebraska and Kansas, while ice from freezing rain accumulated in eastern Kansas and northeastward in Missouri and Iowa. ---Data supplied by NWSFOs at Topeka, Kansas and Omaha, Nebraska; and by the Colorado Climate Center.







The Boston Edison Power Co., serving this area, reported that up to 150,000 Customers were without electric power at the height of the storm. The area hit especially hard included: Needham, Wellesley, Newton W. Roxbury, Dedham, Canton, Stoughton, Walpole, and Westwood. Many people went without power in this area for up to three to five days after the storm. For the power company it meant bringing in out-of-state repair crews to help out. Residents without heat, in some cases, were forced out of their homes. <u>Definition of Fujita Tornado Scale (F scale)</u>

- (FO) Gale tornado (40-72 mph): Light damage Some damage to chimneys; break branches off trees; push over shallow-rooted trees; damage sign boards.
- (F1) Moderate tornado (73-112 mph): Moderate damage The lower limit (73 mph) is the beginning of hurricane wind speed; peel surface off roofs; mobile homes pushed off foundations or overturned; moving autos pushed off the roads.
- (F2) Significant tornado (113-157 mph): Considerable damage Roofs torn off frame houses; mobile homes demolished; boxcars pushed over; large trees snapped or uprooted; light-object missiles generated.
- (F3) Severe tornado (158-206 mph): Severe damage Roofs and some walls torn off well-constructed houses; trains overturned; most trees in forest uprooted; heavy cars lifted off ground and thrown.
- (F4) Devastating tornado (207-260 mph): Devastating damage Well-constructed houses leveled; structure with weak foundation blown off some distance; cars thrown and large missiles generated.
- (F5) Incredible tornado (261-318 mph): Incredible damage Strong frame houses lifted off foundations and carried considerable distance to disintegrate; automobile-sized missiles fly through the air in excess of 100 m; trees debarked; incredible phenomena will occur.
- (F6-F12) (319 mph to Mach 1, the speed of sound): The maximum wind speeds of tornadoes are not expected to reach the F6 wind speeds.

CLIMATE PUBLICATIONS AVAILABLE FROM THE NATIONAL CLIMATIC DATA CENTER, ASHEVILLE. N.C.

COMPARATIVE CLIMATIC DATA

Presents tables of monthly and annual averages, totals or extreme climate conditions for approximately 300 major population centers. This publication is particularly helpful for comparing temperature, rainfall, snowfall, wind velocities, sunshine, cloudiness and relative humidities for the principal cities. The cities are listed alphabetically by state in two sections: observed data and climatological normals. This is an annual publication.

STORM DATA

Monthly issue presents a chronological listing, by states, of occurrences of storms and unusual weather phenomena, together with data on the paths of individual storms, deaths, injuries, and estimated property damage, and a brief narrative description of each event. A new section in the bulletin entitled "OUTSTANDING STORMS OF THE MONTH" highlights severe weather and includes descriptive photographs of storms, their tracks, and analyzed maps. The December issue includes annual

MONTHLY CLIMATIC DATA FOR THE WORLD

Contains monthly means of temperature, pressure, precipitation, vapor pressure and sunshine for about 2,500 surface data stations worldwide. Also contains monthly mean upper air temperatures, dew point depressions and wind velocities for ten standard levels.

LOCAL CLIMATOLOGICAL DATA


Published monthly for each firstorder station. Presents daily maximum and minimum temperatures, degree day data, precipitation, station pressures, wind statistics, sunshine and sky cover data, as well as 3-hourly data for certain parameters. An annual issue is available summarizing monthly data and including up to 40 years record, and featuring a narrative climatological summary and history of the station.

CLIMATOLOGICAL DATA

Published monthly for each state. Gives daily temperature and precipitation records, and monthly averages and totals, with departures from normal when available. Also derived statistics such as heating and cooling degree days, counts of days equaling or exceeding given temperature and precipitation thresholds, extremes, etc., are published for cooperative and first-order stations. Evaporation and soil temperature data are given for reporting stations. Seasonal snowfall, heating and cooling degree day tables included in selected tables. Annual summary also available.

HOURLY PRECIPITATION DATA

Monthly issue presents daily, hourly and maximum short duration data for the recording gage stations for each state except Alaska. The annual issue tabulates monthly and annual totals and annual maximum precipitation data by selected time categories.
