1. Total quota for Artistic Swimming:

NOCs qualified in both the team and duet competitions may enter a maximum of eight (8) athletes.

3. Type of allocation of quota places:

Quota places are allocated to the NOC(s).



C. ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

Compliance with the Olympic Charter and other relevant rules

All athletes must respect and comply with the provisions of the Olympic Charter currently in force, including but not limited to Rule 41 (Nationality of Competitors) and Rule 43 (World Anti-Doping Code and the Olympic Movement Code on the Prevention of Manipulation of Competitions).

Only those athletes who respect and comply with the Olympic Charter, the World Anti-Doping Code and the Olympic Movement Code on the Prevention of the Manipulation of Competitions, including the conditions of participation established by the IOC, plus the rules of IJF, may participate in the Olympic Games Paris 2024.

Age requirements

To be eligible to participate in the Olympic Games Paris 2024, athletes must be born on or before 31 December 2009 ([AS 3 Rules](#)).

Additional IF Eligibility Criteria:

Only the athletes who are eligible to participate at the official FINA competitions, in accordance with the [FINA Rules GR2.5](#), are entitled to participate in the Olympic Games Paris 2024.

D. QUALIFICATION PATHWAY

D.1 QUOTA PLACES

The qualification events are listed in hierarchical order of qualification:

Team Qualification: 10 teams

Number of Team Quota Places	Qualification events
5 teams (40 athletes)	<p>FINA Rule BL 9.3.9.5.1 – Teams</p> <p>Continental Championships/host country</p> <p>The highest placed NOC in each of the five (5) Continental Championships will each obtain a quota place except for the host country NOC which will be the representative of the European Continent.</p>



<p>2 teams (16 athletes)</p>	<p>20th FINA World Championships 2022 Fukuoka (JPN) – (to be held in July 2023):</p> <p>The two (2) highest placed NOCs from the 20th FINA World Championships 2023, based on the combined results of the free and technical routines will obtain a quota place. Should one or both of the NOCs already be qualified through the Continental Championships, the next one (1) or two (2) highest placed NOCs at the 2023 FINA World Championships will obtain a quota place.</p>
<p>3 teams (24 athletes)</p>	<p>Olympic Games Qualification Tournament 2024 (ASOGQT)</p> <p>The three (3) highest placed NOCs at the Olympic Games Qualification Tournament in Artistic Swimming in the year of the Olympic Games and not yet qualified, will each obtain one (1) quota place.</p> <p>Should a qualified team chose not to use the allocated quota place, the next highest ranked team at the ASOGQT will obtain a quota place. (see point F)</p>

These 3 phases are held in chronological order and are not interchangeable.

Duet Qualification: 18 duets (including 10 through team qualification)

<p>Number of Duet Quota Places</p>	<p>Qualification events</p>
<p><u>Stage 1:</u> 10 duets</p>	<p>FINA Rule BL 9.3.9.5.2 – Duets</p> <p>Team qualification: The ten (10) NOCs qualified for the team competition (including the host country) will automatically qualify one (1) duet.</p>
<p><u>Stage 2:</u> 5 duets</p>	<p>Continental Championships/Host Country</p> <p>Subject to the respect of the maximum number of quota per NOC as outlined in section B above, the highest placed NOC in each of the five (5) Continental Championships will each obtain a quota place, except for the host country NOC which will be the representative of the European Continent.</p> <p>Should the highest ranked eligible duet already be qualified through the team the next highest ranked duet from the Continental qualifying event will obtain a quota place in this phase only.</p> <p>Should any continental vacancies occur, the quota will revert to stage 3 and be filled in accordance with the rankings of the ASOGQT.</p>



<p><u>Stage 3:</u> All remaining quota</p>	<p>Olympic Games Qualification Tournament 2024 (ASOGQT)</p> <p>All remaining quotas to the maximum total number of 18 duets will be qualified through the Artistic Swimming Olympic Games Qualification Tournament (ASOGQT). Should a duet be qualified through the team qualification during the ASOGQT, only the rankings of the ASOGQT will be used to determine the next eligible duet. Not exceeding the total quota of 96 athletes.</p> <p>Only the rankings of the ASOGQT will be considered for remaining reallocations without any reference to continental qualifications.</p>

All stages are to be held in chronological order and separately. They are not interchangeable. After the end of stage 2, the only rankings considered are those of the ASOGQT.

D.2 HOST COUNTRY PLACES

The host country will have the right to enter one (1) team and one (1) duet in the Olympic Games whilst respecting the maximum number of quota per NOC as outlined in section B.

E. CONFIRMATION PROCESS FOR QUOTA PLACES

E.1 CONFIRMATION OF QUALIFICATION PLACES

Following each qualification event, FINA will publish the results on its website (www.fina.org) and inform the respective NOCs of their allocated quota places.

The NOCs will then have two (2) weeks to confirm if they wish to use these quota places, as detailed in paragraph **H. Qualification Timeline**.

E.2 CONFIRMATION OF HOST COUNTRY PLACES

The host NOC/NF has to confirm the use of the allocated quota places to FINA two (2) weeks after the end of the qualifying tournament.



F. REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

F.1 REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

Should an NF/NOC not enter a qualified team or duet, the unused quota place(s) will be reallocated to the next highest placed eligible duet(s) (FINA Rule BL 9.3.9.5.2) or team (FINA Rule BL 9.3.9.5.1), not yet qualified, from the Olympic Games Qualifying Tournament 2024.

F.2 REALLOCATION OF UNUSED HOST COUNTRY PLACES

Should the host country NOC decide not to enter a qualified team or duet, the unused quota place(s) will be reallocated to the next highest placed duet (FINA Rule BL 9.3.9.5.2) or team (FINA Rule BL 9.3.9.5.1), not yet qualified, from the Olympic Games Qualifying Tournament 2024.

G. REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

G.1 AP ALTERNATE ATHLETES

Ap alternate athletes are non-competing athletes, and are not included within the athlete's quota as described in Paragraph **B. Athletes Quota**. More detailed information about entitlements and quotas can be found in the '*Accreditation at the Olympic Games – Users Guide*'. Ap alternate athletes can only become competing athletes as per the conditions outlined in the '*IOC/Tokyo 2020 Late Athlete Replacement policy*'.

Eligibility:

Ap alternate athletes must comply with the same eligibility rules as competing athletes as described in above paragraph **C. Athlete Eligibility**.

Quota:

Each qualified team is entitled to 1 (one) Ap alternate athlete.
