JOHN BLUEM HEAD COACH

18TH SEASON, HARTWICK '75

The most successful era in Ohio State soccer began 17 years ago when head coach John Bluem took over the reins of a program that had finished above .500 just twice in the previous decade. In his first season, Bluem took that team to an 11-7-2 record and its first appearance in a Big Ten title game, accomplishments that would serve as merely a preview of what was to come.

Since then, the list has continued to be nothing short of impressive: four Big Ten titles, 15 Major League Soccer draft picks and all eight of Ohio State's appearances in the NCAA tournament, including four in the last six years and the 2007 College Cup.

Now in his 18th season with the Buckeyes in 2014, the three-time Big Ten Coach of the Year is coming off a 5-8-5 season in 2013 that ended with four players earning All-Big Ten honors and one Academic All-American - the first in program history.

A 2002 entrant into the Hartwick College Hall of Fame, Bluem is Ohio State's all-time wins leader with a 171-126-48 (.573) record in Columbus. His career record, which includes six seasons at Fresno State, stands at 257-153-60 for a .618 winning percentage and a Top 35 position among active NCAA coaches in both number of victories and percentage.

In 23 seasons as a collegiate head coach, Bluem's teams have won at least 10 games 18 times - 12 at Ohio State - and he has taken his teams to the NCAA tournament in 12 seasons. In addition to his 2007 College Cup squad, his 1996 Fresno State team advanced to the NCAA quarterfinals and his 2004 OSU squad went to the Round of 16. Bluem also has guided Buckeye teams to the postseason in 2000, 2001, 2005, 2008, 2009 and 2010.

Under Bluem, Ohio State won outright Big Ten championships in 2000, 2007, 2009 and won a share of the league regular-season title in 2004, while taking the tournament crown in 2007 and 2009. In six of the last seven years, the Buckeyes have finished either first or second in the league's regular-season race in a conference that is annually in the Top 3 of the RPI league index. For this, he has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year three times (1999, 2004 and 2009), the most of any active conference coach, bringing his career total conference coach of the year honors to six.

SEASON-BY-SEASON

The 2012 Buckeyes completed a disappointing season with a 6-10-3 record, finishing seventh in the Big Ten. Bluem and Ohio State extended their streak to three years of having a player selected in the MLS draft when Chris Hegngi was taken by Portland in the supplemental draft.

The Buckeyes wrapped up the 2011 campaign 10-7-2 overall record and a 4-2-0 mark in the Big Ten, tying for second. It is the seventh time in eight years they have finished among the Top 2 teams at the end of the regular season and the 12th in which a Bluem-led team has earned double-digit victories.

Bluem's 2010 squad accomplished a feat no previous OSU team had done, earning a fourth-consecutive trip to the NCAA Tournament assuring seniors Matt Gold, Sam Scales and Konrad Warzycha the honor of being the first four-year class to do so. The Buckeyes ended the campaign with an 11-6-3 mark and a 4-2-0 record in the Big Ten, earning a No. 16 seed in the postseason where they advanced to the third round before falling to eventual national runner-up and top-seeded Louisville.

Though the campaign ended abruptly in the second round of the NCAA Tournament, the 2009 season remains one of the best in Buckeye history. It was the first time an OSU team captured both the regular-season and tournament championships in the Big Ten, defeating the likes of Indiana twice along the way, to set up a No. 4 seed for the NCAA Tournament. At 12-5-4, Bluem posted his 10th season with at least 10 wins in Columbus and, with a 5-0-3 mark to open the season, had the longest undefeated start in 57 years of Ohio State soccer.

The 2008 season may have felt like a letdown after the historical 2007 campaign, but with a final record 9-9-3, Bluem marked his 10th OSU squad to finish at or above .500 in the previous 12 years. The Buckeyes also made their third appearance in the NCAA Tournament in the last four years, advancing to the second round before falling to Akron in double overtime.

In 2007, Ohio State went 17-4-5 overall, shut out Indiana twice, won its second Big Ten championship and won three NCAA tournament games at home to advance to the College Cup, where a 1-0 win over Massachusetts extended the Buckeyes' unbeaten streak to 15 games. A 2-1 loss to

No. 1 Wake Forest in the national title game ended the string, but Bluem had taken Ohio State to the national stage like never before.

Following the record-breaking season, junior Roger Espinoza signed with Generation adidas and was selected in the first round and senior Eric Brunner went in the second round. Xavier Balc was later selected in the supplemental draft.

Bluem's 2006 Ohio State squad finished with a final RPI of No. 28 and advanced to the Big Ten championship game, but the Buckeyes were surprisingly not selected for the NCAA tournament. As usual, Bluem had Ohio State playing its best soccer at the end of the season, as the Buckeyes went 8-2-1 in their last 11 games on their way to the league title game at home in Jesse Owens Memorial Stadium.

In 2005, the Buckeyes were 11-8-2 overall and finished second in the Big Ten regular-season standings, ahead of two-time defending national champion Indiana. Ohio State was sent to No. 18 Santa Clara for the first round of the NCAA tournament, where the Buckeyes' season ended with a hard-fought 1-0 loss. During the season, OSU was ranked as high as No. 11 in the nation and No. 3 in the region.

The 2004 season was one of Ohio State's best in the 56 years of the program. The Buckeyes won a share of the Big Ten regular-season title with a 5-1-0 record and went three rounds deep in the NCAA tournament, hosting and beating No. 11 Memphis in the first round and winning at No. 9 Notre Dame in the second round. In the MLS supplemental draft, Big Ten Player of the Year Justin Cook was selected by Chicago and teammate Sammy Tamporello was picked by Dallas.

In 2003 the Buckeyes ranked third in the Big Ten with 1.16 goals-allowed average. Though Ohio State posted a 4-12-4 record that season, the Buckeyes' strength of schedule was ranked as the eighth-toughest in the nation at the end of the season.

In 2002, Bluem's Buckeyes narrowly missed what would have been their third-consecutive trip to the NCAA tournament. Ohio State went 11-7-1 overall and 3-3 in the Big Ten. The season was highlighted by a six-game winning streak, while six of OSU's seven losses were decided by just one goal.

In addition, seniors Jake Traeger and Andy Rosenband were selected in the 2003 MLS Draft. Rosenband was chosen as the 52nd overall pick in the sixth round by Dallas. Traeger also was selected in the sixth round by the Columbus Crew at No. 58. They were the first-ever Buckeyes selected in the MLS Draft.

The 2002 season also was highlighted by a prestigious personal achievement for Bluem, who was inducted into the Hartwick College Hall of Fame. A starting stopper for Hartwick from 1972-74, Bluem helped the Hawks compile a 30-9-7 overall record and make three trips to the NCAA tournament, including a third-place finish in 1974.

In 2001, the Buckeyes earned their second-consecutive bid to the NCAA tournament with their first at-large berth as OSU finished with a 10-7-2 overall record. That season Bluem also led his team to its then-highest ranking in program history, a No. 10 ranking in the NSCAA poll.



The 2000 campaign was one of many firsts for OSU soccer--its first Top 25 national ranking, first Big Ten championship and first trip to the NCAA tournament. Ohio State was ranked as high as No. 12 in the NSCAA Top 25 poll and No. 1 in the NSCAA Great Lakes region poll, landing a spot among the Top 25 for an impressive seven consecutive weeks and finished the year at No. 18. The Buckeyes finished 12-5-4 overall and earned Ohio Team of the Year accolades.

Ohio State captured its first Big Ten championship Nov. 11, 2000, in front of the home crowd at Jesse Owens Memorial Stadium, defeating Penn State, 3-2, in overtime. In the Big Ten semifinal round, the squad defeated two-time defending national champion and ninth-ranked Indiana, 1-0, for the first time in 45 years. The Buckeyes earned an automatic bid to the NCAA tournament for their first NCAA appearance and Bluem's fifth. Ohio State fell to Creighton, 1-0, in the first-round match, also held at Jesse Owens Memorial Stadium.

In 1999, Bluem guided the Buckeyes to an 11-8-0 record and a second-place regular season tie with Penn State in the Big Ten at 3-2. The winning ways of 1999 erased an 8-9-3 finish in 1998, when Ohio State finished third in the regular-season standings. Senior goalkeeper Jon Lowery, who had been the Buckeyes' first first-team All-Big Ten selection, repeated the honor along with three of his teammates.

In 1997, Bluem became the ninth head soccer coach at Ohio State and wasted no time in recharging the Scarlet and Gray program. He guided one of the youngest teams in school history to an 11-7-2 (3-1-1 in Big Ten) record and the Buckeyes made it to the championship game of the Big Ten tournament for the first time, coming away with a runner-up finish.

PRIOR TO OHIO STATE

At Fresno State, Bluem averaged 14 wins per season and qualified for NCAA postseason play in four of his six years as mentor. His 1996 squad posted a 17-5-1 record, won the first Western Athletic Conference title and advanced to the quarterfinals of the NCAA tournament, ending the season with a No. 7 national ranking.

After his collegiate career as a fullback at traditional soccer power Hartwick College in Oneonta, N.Y., Bluem was drafted by Tampa Bay Rowdies of the North American Soccer League, a team that went 16-6 and won the Soccer Bowl his first year. He played for two seasons with Tampa Bay.

Bluem earned his master of arts in physical education from the University of Akron in 1984. He received his bachelor of science in secondary education from Ohio State in 1980 after completing a bachelor of arts degree in history from Hartwick College in 1975.

The 60-year-old Syracuse, N.Y., native lives in Columbus with his wife, Bethany, and has a son, William, a graduate of Ohio State, and daughter, Amy, a senior at Ohio University.

FRANK SPETH ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH
16TH SEASON, FRESNO STATE '93



The coaching relationship between Ohio State head coach John Bluem and associate head coach Frank Speth spans nearly 2,500 miles and the last 20 years. The pair first teamed up in 1993 at Fresno State and have been together almost ever since, including the last 15 seasons in Columbus.

A former collegiate and professional soccer player, Speth has been coaching at all levels of amateur soccer for 30 years. His playing and teaching experience allow him to work with various positions in training as well as provide enterprise in the recruitment of student-athletes.

Since Speth's arrival at Ohio State in 1999, the Buckeyes have won at least 10 games in 10 of his 13 seasons and made all eight of the program's NCAA Tournament appearances, including the run to the College Cup in 2007 and the Big Ten regular-season and tournament championships in 2009.

"Frank has been with me for a long time," John Bluem, Ohio State head coach, said. "He is a great trainer of players. In practice sessions he thrives on that and enjoys it. Frank is demanding and makes the guys work hard and they are productive and become better players. He is also very motivational with the players and is willing to put in the extra time to make them better players."

Speth came to Ohio State from his native Illinois, where he was director of coaching for the Illinois Youth Soccer Association from 1996-98. While there, he oversaw the state's Olympic Development Program and coordinated the Coaching Education Program.

Speth and Bluem have a long-standing relationship. From 1993 until the end of the 1995 season, Speth served as an assistant coach at Fresno State under Bluem. All three years saw the Bulldogs prosper, as they finished first in the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation conference three-consecutive times and compiled a 43-13-6 (.694) overall record. In 1994, Speth helped guide Fresno State to a No. 3 national ranking and 10-consecutive wins, both school records.

Prior to joining the staff at Fresno State, Speth was head coach of the Clovis West High School boys' soccer team in Fresno from 1990-93. Under his guidance, the Golden Eagles were 46-22-6, won two conference championships and advanced to the 1993 Central Valley Final Four.

A native of Chicago, Speth played collegiate soccer at Illinois State from 1979-82 and was named All-Midwest Region as a senior. After he exhausted his eligibility, he played professionally in the Major Indoor Soccer League (MISL) with Chicago and Memphis reserve teams and also in the American Indoor Soccer Association (AISA) with Kalamazoo and Milwaukee.

Speth's coaching career began at Illinois State, where he served as an assistant coach in 1983 and as the interim head coach in 1984. After retiring from professional soccer, Speth enrolled at Fresno State, where he graduated in 1993 with a degree in German.

Speth and his wife Cindy reside in Worthington. They are the parents of two daughters - Melissa, 34, and Whitney, 27.



IAN GORDONA ASSISTANT COACH

FIRST SEASON, OHIO STATE '03



John Bluem, head coach of the Ohio State men's soccer team, announced the hiring of Ian Gordona to the position of assistant coach on May 5, 2014. Gordona joins the staff of Bluem and associate head coach Frank Speth after two years as an assistant at Michigan.

"We are delighted to have Ian join the staff," Bluem said. "He is an excellent young coach, tremendous motivator and fantastic recruiter. He is a remarkable evaluator of young talent and will lead the way in our future recruiting efforts. He has incredible work ethic and will provide a strong role model for our student athletes."

Gordona replaces Taly Goode, who spent the last four seasons as the assistant coach with the Buckeyes. Ian will assume the role of Recruiting Director, and will assist in other areas.

"It's an honor and privilege to have the opportunity to be a part of The Ohio State University and the athletic department," Gordona said. "I feel fortunate and humbled to have the opportunity to work with the men's soccer program under the direction of coach Bluem and coach Speth, as well as learn from the minds of the other great coaches this university has within its athletic department. My desire is to help build this program back to national prominence."

Prior to his two years at Michigan, Gordona spent the past four-plus years as a recruiting liaison and academy coach with the MLS's Columbus Crew Youth Development Program. He scouted and coached the top professional prospects in the United States. In addition, he was responsible for recruiting, training and developing student-athletes and was in continuous contact with the players and their families about their future endeavors. He contacted and connected with collegiate programs throughout the U.S. for recruiting purposes.

Gordona lived in Connecticut for five years after graduating from Ohio State in June of 2003 with a bachelor's degree in history. He held two positions in the soccer industry during his time in Connecticut, working as an activities coordinator/head coach with the Oakwood Soccer Club (2003-08) and holding an assistant coaching position at Manchester Community College (2004-08).

At Oakwood, Gordona organized tournaments for more than 200 teams and was responsible for recruiting, training and caring for 300 premier soccer players. He coached the boys U-11 and U-18 academy teams at the club.

Gordona was an assistant coach at Manchester for three-plus years, participating in all phases of coaching, training, recruiting and management of the soccer program. The Cougars reached the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) Division III Men's Soccer Tournament quarterfinals three straight seasons while Gordona was with the program.

He earned the Connecticut Junior Soccer Association's Thomas E. Krusewski Memorial Award in 2007 as the top young soccer coach in the state of Connecticut.

Gordona has a USSF National B License. He has coached 113 All-Americans, 66 Youth National Team players, 51 professionals and six National Players of the Year and won four national championships in 10 years.

A Rocky Hill, Conn., native, Gordona was inducted into the Rocky Hill Hall of Fame in 2007. In addition, he is a published writer and poet, and was a 2003 USA Today national essay contest winner.

DAMIEN JEPSON VOLUNTEER DIRECTOR OF OPS

FIRST SEASON, SUNY IT '08

Damien Jepson is in his first season serving as Volunteer Director of Operations for the Buckeyes program.

Jepson will provide administrative support to the coaching staff in the daily operations of the Buckeyes program. Duties include match analysis, team video, alumni relations, and help with camps and clinics.

Prior to joining the Buckeyes, Jepson was the head men's soccer coach at the State University of New York (SUNY) at Adirondack junior college since 2010. During his four seasons at the head of the program, which had averaged less than three wins per season over the previous 25 seasons, Jepson completely rebuilt the program into a NJCAA national power. During these four seasons his players broke every team and individual record in the existence for the 35-plus year program. His 42 career wins and .700 career winning percentage stand as program best. In 2012, Jepson was named Mountain Valley Conference Coach of the Year, as well as NJCAA Region III Coach of the Year. His final season in 2013 produced the programs first ever NJCAA Region III Championship, and the team advanced as far as the National Quarterfinal game where they fell 3-1 to eventual National Champions Herkimer CCC. Jepson's team finished ranked #5 in the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) National Poll, had two players named to the NSCAA Junior College All-America team, and Jepson a nominee for NSCAA National Junior College Coach of the Year.

A Saratoga Springs, NY native, Jepson played two years of junior college soccer before playing his final two seasons of eligibility at NCAA D-III SUNY Institute of Technology (SUNY IT), coached by former Ohio State standout Peterson Jerome. While a student-athlete, Jepson also served in the US Air Force Reserves. Jepson graduated from SUNY IT in 2008 with a degree in Business Administration, and is currently finishing his Master's degree in Sport Management through SUNY Cortland. Jepson is also studying for the United States Soccer Federation (USSF) National "C" License.

MATT GOLD UNDERGRADUATE ASSISTANT

SECOND SEASON, OHIO STATE LETTERWINNER 2007-10

Matt Gold returns to Ohio State as an undergraduate assistant coach after three seasons of playing professionally, the last with the Charlotte Eagles of the USL. Gold will complete his bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering while assisting with coaching and administrative duties with the men's soccer program.

A two-time team captain, Gold started in 80 of 82 career games in 2007-10 and contributed three goals and six assists over the course of his career. An aggressive central midfielder, he averaged more minutes over the course of his four seasons than any other field player. He was a Second Team All-Big Ten honoree as a senior, following a first-team selection in the previous season.

Gold was part of one of the most successful classes in Ohio State history, starting his career with a trip to the national championship game as a freshman and going on to capture Big Ten tournament titles in two of his last three years and the first outright regular-season title in 2009.

MATT LAMPSON VOLUNTEER COACH

FIRST SEASON, OHIO STATE LETTERWINNER 2009-11

One of the top goalkeepers' in Ohio State history, Lampson returns to the program this fall as a volunteer coach working with the Buckeye goalkeepers.

A current member of the Columbus Crew, Lampson was selected to the 2014 MLS Homegrown Game this past summer and was named the Crew's Humanitarian of the Year honoree in 2013, while making 13 starts in goal.

The native of Hilliard and graduate of St. Charles Preparatory School, Lampson made 55 starts for the Buckeyes and posted an impressive 0.86 goals-against average from 2009-2011. Lampson recorded 24 career shutouts, which ranks second on the school's all-time list. While at OSU, Lampson earned a series of accolades including All-Big Ten First Team (2010), All-Big Ten Second Team (2009, 2011), All-Great Lakes Region First Team (2010), Big Ten co-Freshman of the Year (2009), eight Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week honors, and All-Big Ten Fall Academic Team (2011).
