

# CARNEGIE PRIZES COME HERE.

**Palmer & Hornbostel Win Competition  
for Architects of Technical Schools.**

PITTSBURG, Oct. 26.—The Committee on Carnegie Technical Schools at its meeting to-day awarded the prize of the competition to Palmer & Hornbostel of New York, who were appointed architects. Second place in the competition was secured by George B. Post of New York, one of the specially invited competitors.

The third, fourth, and fifth ranks, with awards of \$1,000 each, were secured by Wood, Donn & Deming and Corbett & Pell of Washington and New York, (associated;) Cram, Goodhue & Ferguson, Boston and New York, and Newman & Harris, Philadelphia.

The technical schools when completed will cover an area of thirty-two acres, and will represent an expenditure of \$5,000,000. Work on the buildings will begin as soon as the working plans can be prepared.
