





Director General's Message



Embraced Shahadat on 8 October 2005 during Earthquake Operation at Bagh (AK). The officer who went beyond the call of duty to alleviate the pain of the affected. He valued humanitarianism more than life and was a popular figure. He left three children and a wife.

Naib Subedar Muhammad Saleem (Shaheed)

Embraced Shahadat on 8 October 2005 during Earthquake Operation at Bagh (AK). He sacrificed his life at the age of mid 40s. Sepoy Muhammad Niaz (Shaheed)






Mandate and Area of Responsibility (AOR)


Being a premier organisation with the basic task of elimination of the menace of Narcotics from Pakistan in particular and the region in general, the detailed mandate of ANF is:-

- To inquire, investigate and prosecute all offences related or connected with intoxicants, narcotics and precursors.
- Survey and monitoring of poppy cultivation and its eradication.
- Trace, freeze and dispose assets connected to drug crimes.
- Coordinate with all law enforcement agencies (LEAs) on drug issues and arrange training of own and other LEAs.
- Provide assistance and advice to other LEAs.
- Maintain liaison with all national and international narcotics control authorities/ organizations and represent Pakistan in conferences and seminars.
- Perform any other related functions which may be assigned by the Federal Government.

Drug Supply Reduction Activities - 2012

General

Pakistan is located in a region that has high threat of opiate and cannabis production and trafficking, besides facing the emerging problem of synthetic drugs. Afghanistan is the source of more than 90 percent of the world's opium and it is also a significant cannabis producer – much of it is harvested in Provinces bordering Pakistan. Consequently making Pakistan vulnerable to trafficking of opium, heroin and cannabis. Domestically in Pakistan the area of opium poppy cultivation in 2011 dropped to 362 hectares from 1,415 hectares after the successful eradication of 1,053 hectares. Significantly, this is the first time since 2002 that the quantity of poppy harvested is below 1,000 hectares, hence, Pakistan has attained the status of "POPPY FREE COUNTRY". Given the existing law and order situation in the country, this level of eradication, the highest in recent years, is a significant achievement for the Anti Narcotics Force (ANF).

Despite challenges of anti terrorist operations, law and order situation and manpower constraint. Pakistan has made very impressive contributions in fighting the menace of drug and has continuously emerged as one of the world's leading country in seizures of heroin and morphine.

Drugs Routes and Trends

Countries neighbouring Afghanistan remain to be the victim of drug transit. Drug traffickers keep changing their modus operandi and drug routes to bypass the law enforcement agencies. Pakistan and Afghanistan share approximately 2,500 km of borders. Border areas of Pakistan and Afghanistan practice same culture and traditions, and are identical in outlook. Two major provinces of Pakistan, i.e. KPK and Balochistan, are contagious with Afghanistan. Trafficking routes depend much on the reading of drug traffickers about the activities of law enforcement agencies and the policies of the Governments. Drug traffickers being wary of law enforces keep changing routes, modalities, mode and use new methods of concealment. The delineation of the trafficking routes is never absolute, rather it keeps on changing with change in readings of traffickers.

Concealment Methods

Concealment in vegetable (bitter gourd), decoration stones, cart pillars, registers, toy cars, iron stools, soap bars, oil tankers, secret cavities of vehicles, wheels and handle grips of suitcases, baby jackets, spinal elevators (surgical equipments), rice bags, books, match boxes, deep fryer machine, pizza maker machine, cooking range, lady purses, TNT packing cartons, silicon bond tubes, shin guards, carpets, capsules and leather jackets.

Opiates Seizures

ANF as a premier drug law enforcement agency (LEA) is continuously striving to eliminate the menace of drug trafficking. 2012 has been a land mark year with regards to opiates seizures in Pakistan. During the year **4,245 kg opium**, **1,368.75 kg morphine** and **12,660.993 kg heroin** was seized by ANF and other LEAs of Pakistan which are 27%, increase, 210% decrease and 73% increase respectively as compared to 2011. In addition to these domestic seizures, ANF also shared intelligence regarding drug trafficking with law enforcement agencies of other countries which led to seizure of **666.27 kg heroin** in their respective countries. A comparison of opiates seizures of 2011 and 2012 is given in the table below.





Year Wise Seizures of Opiates in Pakistan since 2003




Significant Narcotics Seizures – 2012

Hashish Seizures – 2012

Pakistan's hashish seizures remained encouraging throughout the last decade. It remained at leading positions of hashish seizure in the region and in the world. During current year, Pakistan's seizures of the hashish were **166,026 kg**, however important seizures include **9,863.66 kg** at Karachi sea port on 30 January 2012, **6,888 kg** at Karachi sea port on

5 June 2012 and **4,147 kg** at toll plaza Karachi on 21 May 2012. Year-wise seizures of hashish since 2003 are reflected in graph given below:



<u>Seizures of Cocaine – 2012.</u> 8.665 kg cocaine was seized during the year 2012, details are as following:-

- On 8 March 2012, ANF Rawalpindi Seized 0.800 kg Cocaine and arrested two accused.
- On 11 June 2012, ANF Karachi Seized 1.125 kg Cocaine and arrested one accused.
- On 13 August 2012, ANF Karachi intercepted a consignment of carpets destined to Cameroon and seized 4.180 Kg Cocaine.
- On 11 December 2012, ANF Karachi seized 1.00 kg cocaine and arrested one accused.
- On 13 December 2012, ANF Karachi seized 1.560 kg cocaine and arrested two accused.



Comparison Opium, Morphine Base, Heroin and Hashish 2011/2012

The quantities of drugs seized widely fluctuate from year to year depending upon demand and modus operandi of drug traffickers. As compared to year 2011, year 2012 witnessed 27% increase in Opium, 210% decrease in Morphine base and 73% increase in Heroin, while the Hashish seizures reflect decrease by 8%. The comparison of drug seizures in Pakistan during 2011 and 2012 is shown on next page.

Involvement of Foreign Nationals in Drugs Trafficking

ANF undertakes strict scrutiny of foreign nationals traveling to and from Pakistan for the purpose of narcotics trafficking. Consequent to such measures during 2012, total of **31 foreigners** of different nationalities with **192.42 kg heroin**, **3102.9 kg hashish and 1.4 kg opium** were arrested from various locations. Highest number of foreign nationals arrested were Nigerian and British. Tables below reflect continent and nationality wise breakdown of the foreign nationals arrested and drugs seized during 2012.

Drugs Trafficking Through Parcels/ Letters

Drugs trafficking through postal letters and parcels to various destinations remains one of the favorite method of drug traffickers. ANF strives very hard to thwart the efforts of drug trafficking through this mode. In this regard, close liaison and coordination is done with different courier and mailing companies. Table provides statistics and the magnitude of drug smuggling from Pakistan to the outside world during 2012, through this mode.

Seizures of Precursors

Following precursor seizures were made by ANF during the year 2012:-

- On 5 March 2012, ANF Quetta Seized 4,030 kg Poppy Straw and arrested three accused.
- On 10 April 2012, ANF Karachi intercepted a consignment destined to Singapore and Malaysia and seized 88.31 kg diazepam and 117.51 kg miscellaneous psychotropic tablets.
- On 6 May 2012, ANF Lahore seized 0.07 kg Acetic Anhydride and 600 kg Sulphuric Acid and arrested one accused.
- On 23 July 2012, ANF Rawalpindi intercepted a consignment destined to Philippine and seized 176,835 tablets / Injections of controlled drugs.
- On 25 July 2012, ANF Karachi seized 0.055 kg Onax tablets, 0.2 kg Watson and 0.012 kg OC tablets and arrested one accused.
- On 1 October 2012, ANF Lahore seized 614 Ecstasy tablets and arrested one accused.

Prosecution of Drugs Cases

Six special courts for speedy trial of narcotics offences established in country are proving very effective. In order to ensure effective prosecution, ANF had put in concerted efforts during 2012. To this end, following measures were taken during 2012:-

- ANF endeavoured for speedy trial of cases by ensuring attendance of witnesses and coordination with special judges, prosecutors and concerned officials.
- By pursuing a comprehensive prosecution strategy, 603 cases at trial courts and 530 appeals in high courts were disposed off during 2012 thus, reducing the number of pending cases.
- ANF registered 693 drug cases during the year 2012. By good management, it has ensured timely submission of challans of all the cases in the concerned courts.
- Statistics given in Table below speak of the success of ANF in achieving an encouraging conviction rate of 89% during 2012.

According to "Control of Narcotics Substances Act 1997", acquisition of assets through drug proceeds is a crime. ANF traces, freezes, forfeits and confiscates all illegitimate assets of the drug traffickers. The accused can be awarded 5-14 years of imprisonment besides forfeiture of their assets. ANF is making concerted efforts for prosecution of important asset cases. So far, assets worth **Rs. 5,193.76 (million) (US\$ 53.5439 million)** have been frozen. Tables given below reflect the achievement of ANF in this regard.

Drugs Burning Ceremony

To commemorate the International Day against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking, drug burning ceremonies were held under ANF on 26 June 2012 at four places, i.e. Rawalpindi, Lahore, Karachi and Quetta. At Rawalpindi Parliamentary Secretary, Ministry of Narcotics Control, Mr. Syed Inayat Ali Shah was the chief guest of the ceremony. Director General ANF Major General Malik Zafar Iqbal, high ranking officials from law enforcement agencies, civil administration, diplomats, drug liaison officers of number of countries, media representatives, social workers and representatives of non governmental organizations were also present on the occasion.

While addressing the gathering, Mr. Syed Inayat Ali Shah, Parliamentary Secretary, Ministry of Narcotics Control, reiterated the commitment of Government of Pakistan to fight against the menace of drugs. He appreciated the efforts and commitment of ANF in its fight against drugs and drug abuse. He further stated that the volume of narcotics being burnt in the ceremony speaks of ANF's commitment to the noble cause.

A total of **30 tons** of drugs to include **Heroin, Hashish, Opium and Morphine** etc were burnt during the drug burning ceremony at Rawalpindi and a total of **128 tons** were burnt at all four locations with approximate value of Rs. **4,500 million**. Detail is as under:-

ANF, as a premier drug law enforcement agency is striving hard for eliminating the menace of drugs from Pakistan. It is contributing significantly in preventing drug trafficking to various parts of the world. It also coordinates the counter narcotic strategies of other LEAs through Inter Agency Task Force (IATF). Pakistan has successfully been able to destroy 1,053 hectares of poppy crop out of 1,415 hectares of reported cultivation. Seizure data of ANF and other LEAs enunciated in aforementioned paragraphs reflect our resolve to combat the menace of drugs. As a shared responsibility, world community need to reciprocate our efforts by providing assistance in the field of technology, human resource development and provision of funds for reward money.

Inter Agency Task Force (IATF)

ANF is premier LEA of Pakistan engaged in counter narcotics task at strategic level. Number of other LEAs have also been empowered by government to undertake counter narcotics duties. In order to launch joint effort against drug, in February 2010, Prime Minister of Pakistan directed Ministry of Narcotics Control to establish IATF under the Chairmanship of DG ANF and senior representatives of all drugs LEAs as members. In pursuance of Prime Minister's directive, IATF has been established with following objective and scope:-

Objective

To maximize effectiveness of Anti Narcotics Policy of the Government of Pakistan through coordinated implementation of the Counter Narcotics Enforcement Strategy with a view to making Pakistan a drug free state.

Scope

- The task force members will meet on quarterly basis.
- Assess the performance of all LEAs.
- Coordinate efforts and resources, with a view to implementing the strategy.

Poppy Eradication Campaign - 2012

Pakistan is cited as success story for having earned the status of "Poppy Free Country in 2001 – 2002" through the adoption of multi-pronged strategy based on international assistance, focusing on alternative livelihood, development programmes and crop destruction campaign. However, the following years witnessed resumption of poppy cultivation in the traditional and non-traditional areas of KPK, Baluchistan and Sindh, much to the detriment of the country's hard earned status. During most of the years of the decade (2003-2009) poppy crop which could not be destroyed in Pakistan remained around 1,500 – 2,000 hectares per year. Annual poppy cultivation reported and destroyed during these years is as follows:-

Mechanism for Tracing, Identification and Reporting

A comprehensive mechanism of tracing, identification and reporting of poppy cultivation has been formulated which includes:-

Monitoring Teams

Monitoring teams for KPK and Balochistan Province have been constituted under the Chairmanship of Additional Secretary Home. Other members of the committee include Representative of ANF, Governor's Secretariat, SDU, Narcotics Affair Section (US Embassy) and MoNC.



Ground Monitoring

The monitoring teams make two ground surveys, first in November – January and second in February – March to trace, identify and report poppy cultivation to quarters concerned and asks the local administration for its destruction.

Aerial Surveys

At least two aerial surveys are conducted, one in the month of February and the other in the month of March. These are basically conducted to know the extent of poppy cultivation in those areas that are not accessible by roads. Besides these surveys, it serves the purpose to know the exact stage of poppy crop and accordingly the local administration is asked to take steps.

Verification of Destruction

The monitoring team visits poppy growing areas to verify the veracity of destruction claimed by local administration. This process starts from February till end May.

Poppy Free Status

Pakistan has been striving very hard since the year 2002 to acquire the same status of Poppy free country as of year 2001. Due to law and order situation, especially in FATA, we remained unsuccessful to achieve the desired standard. In the light of National Anti Narcotics Policy 2010 and due to concerted efforts of ANF in year 2011,1,053 hectares of poppy crop were successfully destroyed in the country. Balance of 362 hectares especially in the inaccessible area of FATA remained a challenge, but it is appreciated that due to concrete efforts taken by ANF with assistance of other LEAs, it will be controlled in next Poppy season. In the light of UNODC bottom line of less than 1,000 hectares for declaring a state as Poppy Free Pakistan claim to have achieved this land mark of being a Poppy Free State for year 2011/2012.

Hajj Operation - 2012

The Hajj Operation for the year 2012 was conducted from **18 September to 22 October 2012**. Like previous years ANF in collaboration with CAA, Customs, PIA and Airport Security Force took comprehensive measures at Hajji Camps at Airports to prevent flow of narcotic drug to Kingdom of Saudi Arabia through Hajj flights. These measures included strict vigilance through effective surveillance/intelligence, foolproof enforcement by 100 percent checking of pilgrims / their baggage and awareness campaign. ANF screened **485** flights and **136,328** pilgrims before taking off from various airports of the country.





Drugs Demand Reduction Activities - 2012

All countries are affected by the devastation of drug abuse and its illicit trafficking. The victims of this menace need special care and attention from members of all walks of life. All sectors of society are adversely affected by this peril and hence necessitate the need of continuous drug demand reduction activities. Demand reduction refers to efforts aimed at reducing public desire for illegal and illicit drugs. The media explosion has shrunken the world into village in real sense. Along with its positive contributions, it has some negative aspects as well, especially for the youth as it has raised their level of aspiration, ambition and their tendency to experiment that may lead them to drug abuse. It may be an expression of their revolt against established authority, a way of gaining recognition in their group or they may just not be able to "SAY NO TO DRUGS" when offered.

In this regard ANF is continuing its efforts to create awareness amongst the masses especially the youth through print / electronic media and by involving different CBOs, GOs and NGOs. A summary covering awareness activities performed by ANF during the year 2012 is as follows.

A complete team of professionals is working at MATRC Islamabad, Quetta and Karachi, which are being managed by ANF and are committed day and night to generate their maximum output. Due to their untiring efforts, these centres have treated and rehabilitated 1,293 addicts during the year 2012.

Detoxification Ward at Adyala Jail Rawalpindi

As a special initiative of drug free prisons, ANF on the directions of Prime Minister of Pakistan has established a 10 bedded detoxification ward in the existing hospital of Adyala Jail Rawalpindi for the addict prisoners. During the year 2012, 275 drug addict prisoners have been detoxified.

Harm Reduction

Apart from treatment, ANF also has its essential focus on prevention / harm reduction to reduce the risk factors amongst the injecting drug users (IDUs) and helping addicts and their families to control the epidemic of HIV/AIDs, HCV, TB and other blood borne diseases. In this regard three Drop-in-Centres have been established at Islamabad, Karachi and Quetta for 'injecting drug users' where they are provided with necessary first aid to protect them from harmful effects of addiction and also guide their families how to control HIV/AIDs, HCV, TB and other blood borne diseases.





INTERNATIONAL, REGIONAL AND BILATERAL COOPERATION IN NARCOTICS CONTROL





International, Regional and Bilateral Cooperation in Narcotics Control

Opiates originating in Afghanistan is an ominous peril for many regions of the world. Its illicit trade has extreme detrimental impact on economic and social development, governance, political stability and security situation in Afghanistan and its immediate neighbours. The response to global threat from Afghan opiates requires international cooperation.

Pakistan is acting as a front line state in combating the menace of drugs. Government of Pakistan has taken a number of initiatives to control spread and trafficking of illicit narcotics. However, Pakistan cannot fight this menace alone, therefore, international cooperation is important pillar of Pakistan's strategy against drugs.

Drug problem is an international phenomenon that needs to be tackled collectively as a common and shared responsibility. Pakistan has not only participated in all international forums/meetings against the menace of illicit drug but foster efforts to enhance regional and international cooperation through number of bilateral and multilateral forums.

Government of Pakistan has signed bilateral agreements/MOUs with 32 countries to make joint efforts for control of drug trafficking and precursor chemicals.

Major International Cooperation Activities – 2012

During 2012, Pakistan not only participated in all important forums / meetings on drug control but also explored new vistas of cooperation with other countries at bilateral level.

■ The 55th Session of Commission on Narcotics Drugs (CND)

Pakistan's delegation led by Secretary Ministry of Narcotics Control visited Vienna, Austria to attend 55th Session of CND 12-16 March 2012. Pakistani delegation emphasized on some key areas of thrust based on our geographical location, issues confronting us in the recent past and expectations of the international community. The delegation also made an impact by meeting all the influential officials of the UNODC including Executive Director, Mr. Sandeep Chawala, Director Davison for



Policy Analysis and Public Affairs and Mr. Rosen Popov, Chief Precursor Control Section, INCB for meaningful interaction and professional exchange.

Reconvened 55th Session of Commission on Narcotics Drugs (CND)

A Pakistani delegation led by Mr. Khurshid Anwar, Ambassador, Permanent Representative, Permanent Mission to UN, Vienna attended the Reconvened 55th Session of CND held in Vienna, Austria from 6-7 December 2012. The meeting highlighted the following points:-

- Drug prevention as a means to curb the world drug problem within the framework of a scientific evidence approach.
- Importance of international cooperation, coordination and funding to promote relevant activities and programmes on all aspects of alternative development in support of the drug control regime established by the three international drug control conventions, within a broader international framework.

• Importance of further strengthening the operational implementation of treaty-based provisions on international cooperation including countering money-laundering and preventing the illicit cross-border movement of cash and monetary instruments.

International Drugs Enforcement Conference (XXIX)

A delegation led by Brigadier Akhtar Mahmood, Ex Director Headquarter attended the International Drug Enforcement Conference held in Bali, Indonesia on 12-14 June 2012.

Paris Pact Initiative

3rd Ministerial Meeting of the Paris Pact Initiative was held in Vienna, Austria on 16 February 2012. A delegation led by Secretary Zafar Abbas, Ministry of Narcotics Control accompanied by Major General Syed Shakeel Hussain, Ex Director General ANF participated in this meeting. The meeting highlighted the modalities in combating illicit trade of opiates originated in Afghanistan that includes detecting and blocking of financial flows linked to Afghan drug trafficking diversion of precursor chemical.

HONLEA

A delegation led by Major General Malik Zafar Iqbal, Director General ANF and Joint Secretary, Ministry of Narcotics Control participated in the 36th Meeting of HONLEA held in Bangkok, Thailand from 30 October to 2 November 2012. The forum focuses on illicit drug trafficking trends, regional and sub-regional cooperation efforts, joint investigation, law enforcement training and sharing of information among regional countries.



9th DG Level Talks

A delegation led by Major General Malik Zafar Iqbal, Director General ANF attended the 9th Director General level talks between NCB India and ANF Pakistan from 5-6 December 2012. Both sides agreed to continue sharing of actionable intelligence and adopt a coordinated strategy to prevent cross-border drug trafficking.



Triangular Initiative (TI)

- Three meetings were held, under the TI countries (Afghanistan, Iran and Pakistan) in Tehran from 16-18 December 2012.
- A delegation led by Mr. Javed Iqbal, Secretary, Ministry Narcotics Control accompanied by Major General Malik Zafar Iqbal, Director General ANF attended the 2nd TI Counter Narcotics Intelligence Official Meeting, 9th SOM and 6th TI Ministerial Meeting. Mr. Yuri Fedotove, Executive Director UNODC also attended the meeting. All the members agreed to further strengthen TI and improve its effectiveness by enhancing legal cooperation in drug related matters, within the respective country's legislative framework. It was also agreed to make operation of the Joint Planning Cell (JPC) more effective inter alia by sharing drug intelligence through JPC and conducting coordinated operations based on sharing intelligence.

 Regional Ministerial Conference Pakistan hosted Regional Ministerial Conference on Counter Narcotics at Islamabad on 12-13 November 2012.






Foreign Nationals Arrested in Pakistan 2008-2012


Project - Drugs Free City Lahore September 2010 to December 2012

On the direction of the Prime Minister of Pakistan to the Ministry of Narcotics Control to make Lahore a Drug Free City, an essential ingredient of National Anti Narcotics Policy 2010, the ANF conceived and developed this Project in March, 2010. In April 2010, the Chief Minister Punjab approved the project and consented to share 40% of the total cost. Subsequently, PC-1s of the Project (Federal and Provincial) of Rs. 60 million and Rs. 38.228 million were prepared and approved in September 2010 and August 2011 respectively by the respective governments. After the approval of the Action Plan and Targets for 2011 by the Project Steering Committee in December 2010, the Project was formally launched in January 2011. Ministry of Narcotics Control is sponsoring and Anti Narcotics Force is the Executing Agency of this project.

Strategy

To achieve the goal, a multi-pronged strategy was conceived which had the following facets:

- Drug Supply Reduction through effective policing and enforcement of drug laws.
- Drug Demand Reduction through creating mass awareness against drug abuse, targeting youth and labour.
- Treatment of drug addicts as per International Health Protocols.



 Publicity and projection of the concept, the goal and public awareness through print and electronic media.

Performance

On 31 December 2012, the Project completed 2 ½ years of its life on papers while 2 years of actual working after its launching in January 2011. Following is the performance of this Project under various fields/areas during the two years of its actual working, i.e. 2011 and 2012.

Law Enforcement





Training in ANF

Training is an important tool which helps in inculcating the sense of team work, team spirit, and counter fighting in the field of drug law enforcement. In order to improve the capacity and quality of human resource, ANF Academy (ANFA) is continuously engaged in imparting training to members of its force as to the development of training facilities and conduct of various training



activities. The year 2012 started with the critical review of the training activities of 2011 so as to identify the strengths and weaknesses in training conducted during 2011. To evaluate our training performance, all Regional Directorates and other LEAs were consulted. Based on their input and training needs, the training activities for year 2012 were conducted for 662 students.

With the pledge of quality training; aims, objectives and syllabus of various courses have been revised to make it compatible with the operational needs.

Mission

Identify and meet the training needs of ANF and other LEAs in the field of counter narcotics and precursor chemicals by conducting systematic training programmes.

Objectives

- Enhance drug law enforcement capabilities of ANF and other LEAs through systematic training programmes.
- Provide necessary skills and knowledge required to conduct strategic level drug interdiction, investigation and prosecution.
- Enhance inter agency cooperation through joint training.
- Promote leadership in pursuit of excellence.
- Organize career progression courses for ANF personnel.
- Arrange and coordinate training of newly enrolled / inducted officials of ANF.
- Development of management skills for effective and efficient human resource utilization.
- Conduct research in the field of narcotics and narcotics related law enforcement.
- Promote international cooperation through training collaboration.

Type of Courses Run

- Basic Training for New Inductees. For all ANF officials at the time of induction.
- Career Progression Courses. As per the ANF's Appointment, Promotion and

Transfer Rules, these are mandatory courses which are prerequisite for promotion to various ranks.

- Capacity Building/Specialist. In order to develop capacity in various fields, these specialized courses are planned for ANF and other LEAs.
 - Information Handling Course
 - Surveillance Course
 - Intelligence Course
 - Interview and Interrogation Course
 - Cyber Crime and Finger Print Course
 - Accounts Workshops
 - Drug Demand Reduction Workshops
- Orientation Course. For all the officials joining ANF on deputation.

Under Progress Training

In addition to above, two basic recruits' trainings of six months duration as a major activity are underway in which 64 newly inducted Assistant Director / Inspector / Sub Inspector and Assistant Sub Inspector / Constable are under training. The training started on 5 November 2012 and will complete in 1st week of May 2013.

International Efforts and Sponsored Training Activities

International community is assisting ANF by providing aid in the shape of technical equipment as well as providing trainers in some cases for conducting training at ANFA. During the year 2012, various international courses / workshops were held which were sponsored by UNODC and Colombo Plan. Furthermore, many dignitaries from international community visited ANFA to see the academic facilities and sharing of joint efforts against the menace of drug through quality training.





