NOTICE is hereby given that at a Special Meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers, Perth, on Thursday, the 28th day of June, 1917, at 10.30 a.m.,

His Excellency the Governor having received and accepted the resignation of the Hon. Frank Wilson, C.M.G., as Premier, and the Hon. H. B. Lefroy having submitted a list of the new Ministry which His Excellency had approved of as follows, viz.:—

1. The Hon. H. B. Lefroy, C.M.G., M.L.A., Premier and Minister for Lands and Agriculture.
2. The Hon. H. P. Colebatch, M.L.C., Colonial Secretary and Minister for Education.
3. The Hon. W. J. George, M.L.A., Minister for Works and Trading Concerns and for Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage.
4. The Hon. R. T. Robinson, M.L.A., Attorney General and Minister for Industries and Woods and Forests.
5. The Hon. J. Gardiner, M.L.A., Colonial Treasurer.
6. The Hon. J. Scaddan, M.L.A., Minister for Mines and Railways.
7. The Hon. F. E. S. Willmott, M.L.A., Minister without Portfolio.
8. The Hon. C. F. Baxter, M.L.C., Minister without Portfolio.
9. The Hon. C. A. Hudson, M.L.A., Minister without Portfolio.

The oaths of allegiance and office were then administered by His Excellency the Governor to the Hon. H. B. Lefroy, the Hon. H. P. Colebatch, the Hon. W. J. George, and the Hon. R. T. Robinson. These members then took their seats at the table as Ministers in lieu of and in immediate succession to the offices held by them in the previous Ministry.

His Excellency then administered the oaths of allegiance and office and the oath required to be taken on appointment as members of the Executive Council to the Hon. James Gardiner, M.L.A., and the Hon. John Scaddan, M.L.A., who thereupon took their seats at the table as Colonial Treasurer, and Minister for Mines and Railways, respectively.

His Excellency afterwards administered the oaths of allegiance and the oath required to be taken on appointment as Members of the Executive Council to the Hon. F. E. S. Willmott, the Hon. C. F. Baxter, and the Hon. C. A. Hudson.

The Council afterwards adjourned.
