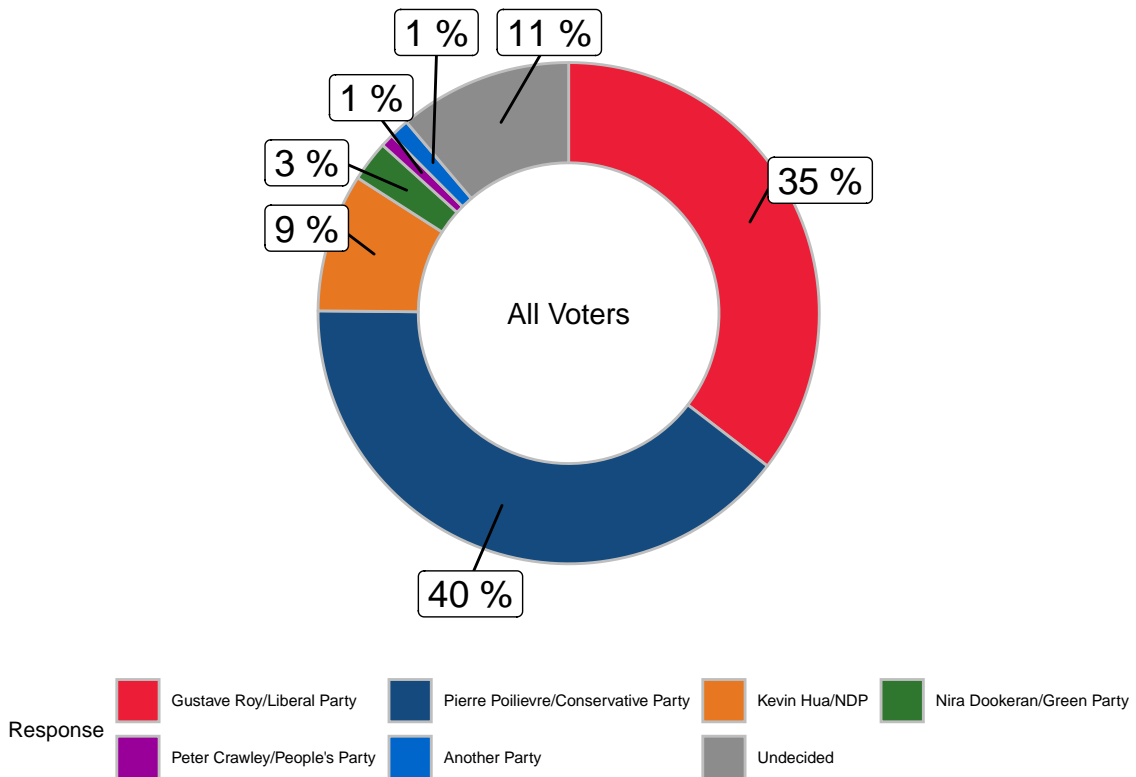
Methodology

The analysis in this report is based on results of a survey conducted from Monday, June 13th to Tuesday, June 14th, 2022, among a sample of 555 adults, 18 years of age or older, living in Carleton. The survey was conducted using automated telephone interviews (Smart IVR). Respondents were interviewed on landlines and cellular phones. The survey is intended to represent the voting population in Carleton.

The margin of error for the poll is +/- 4.2% at the 95% confidence level. Margins of error are higher in each subsample.

If the Federal election were held today, how would you vote? (all voters)





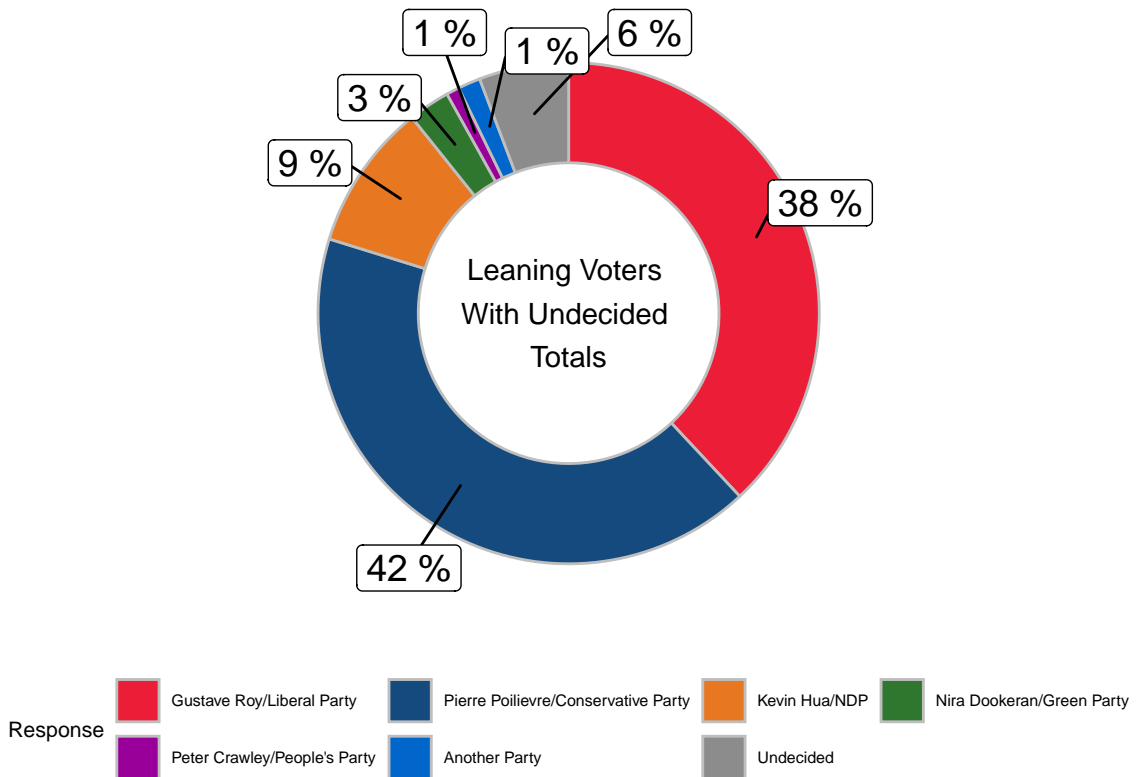

If the Federal election were held today, how would you vote? (leaning voters with undecided totals)





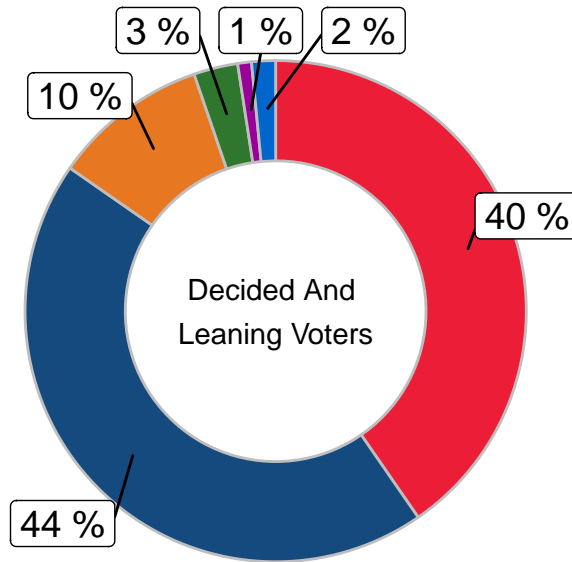

If the Federal election were held today, how would you vote? (decided and leaning voters)





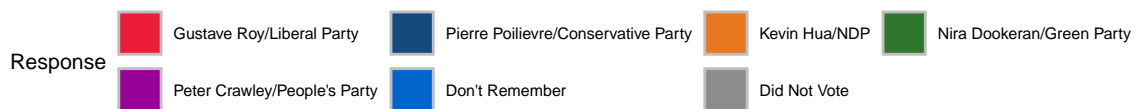
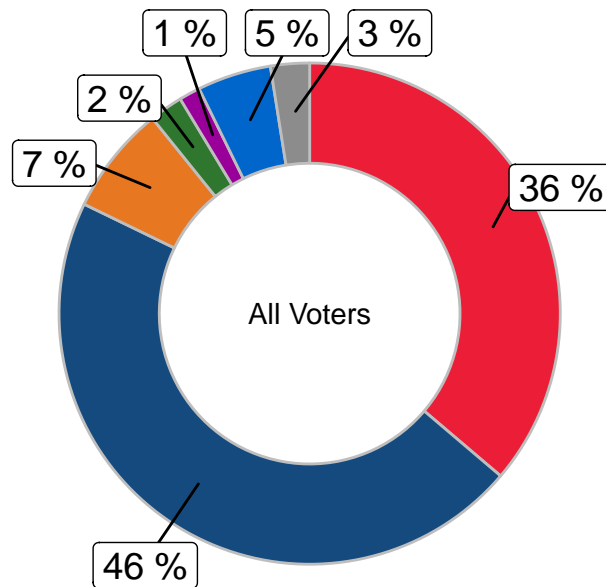

How did you vote in the last Federal Election? (all voters)





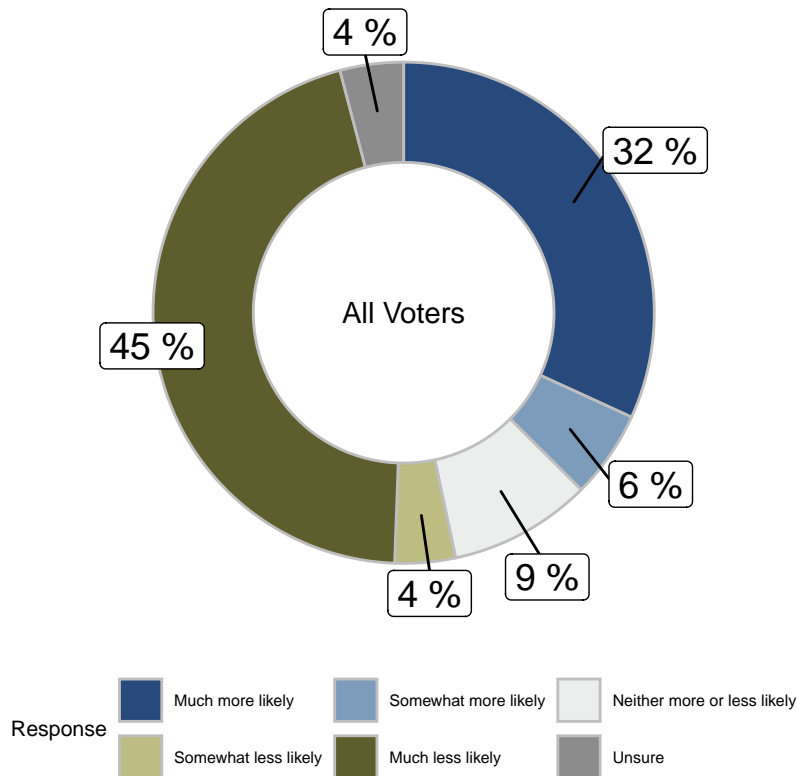

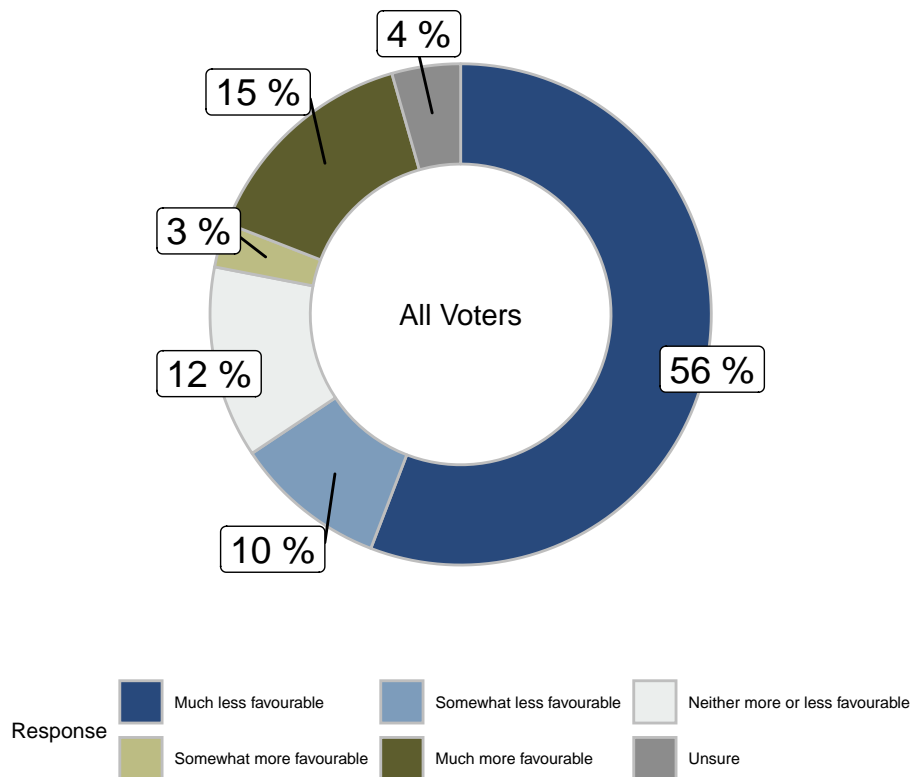
