

- The information is published annually in a 3 volume Handbook and is accessible through the WHED portal (www.whed.net). IAU Members benefit from advanced access to the portal.
- The information is used as a reference for higher education institutions worldwide by a large variety of users from students to heads of institutions as well as corporate HR.
- IAU counts on all institutions to provide information to ensure the constant accuracy and quality of information.










Information clearing house International Association of Universities




Thematic priorities



Internationalization

- Global Surveys on internationalization of higher education undertaken since 2013, providing unique data on trends and developments. 4th edition will be based on responses from 1300+ institutions from 131 countries. The 4th Global Survey report entitled: Growing expectations, fundamental values was published in April 2014. Members benefit from a preferential rate.
- Re-thinking internationalization: with a number of experts, IAU develops
 policy statements highlighting the advantages of internationalization as
 well as the possible adverse effects it can bring. IAU advocates for HEIs to
 create a just and inclusive global higher education space.
- IAU Members can benefit from the Internationalization Strategies Advisory
 Service (ISAS) at a preferential rate, taking advantage from experts ready to
 assist them in clarifying and refining their institutional internationalization
 strategy. Services are tailored to specific needs and contexts.





Thematic priorities



Equitable access and success

- IAU experts from Members developed the Policy statement: Equitable
 Access, Success and Quality in Higher Education to advocate for the
 importance of these twin objectices at the global level.
- Moving from policy to action, IAU designed an Institutional Self-Study
 Instrument to enable institutions to examine their policies and programs
 for improving equitable access and success for learners from marginalized
 groups. A pilot project served to test the approach and instrument in 2010.
- 28 IAU Member institutions undertook a self-study exercise in 2013. IAU prepared a summary report on equitable access and success policies and programmes as background for an IAU Workshop held during the first World Congress on Access to Postsecondary Education 2013.





Thematic priorities



Sustainable Development (HESD)

- The Kyoto declaration on Sustainable development (SD) was adopted in 1993. Since then the Association has developed projects, taken part in international or regional initiatives and regularly organized events to foster universities' roles in promoting sustainable development.
- IAU partners with various actors, international organization and other bodies from around the world to build synergies aiming at developing solutions for the future. IAU sits on panels and reference groups at UNESCO, UNU, UNEP, contributes to the development of RCEs and more. Its activities will inform the UNESCO World Conference on Education for Sustainable Development.
- The IAU Portal on HESD (<u>www.iau-hesd.net</u>) is a collaborative platform mapping, centralizing and disseminating information on activities and actions promoting sustainable development undertaken by HEIs around the world with a view to share experience and lessons learned.







Thematic priorities



HE for Education For All (HEEFA)

- IAU raises awareness on the role higher education can play and advocates for better inclusion of the sub-sector in EFA (a UN initiative led by UNESCO) in order to offer quality education to all children, youth and adults.
- IAU organizes local capacity building workshops to inform the higher education community about EFA and EFA stakeholders about what higher education can bring to EFA. These workshops end with a commonly agreed upon statement that defines how to involve higher education in local EFA activities.
- The IAU online HEEFA platform, disseminates information about the work being undertaken by higher education in EFA-related fields and provides access and visibility to data on higher education projects, documents and experts active in EFA.





Thematic priorities



Doctoral Programmes in Africa

- In collaboration with institutional Members in sub-Saharan Africa, IAU is monitoring and analysing the changes taking place in doctoral programmes in in sub-Saharan Africa in order to:
 - ✓ Increase and disseminate knowledge about different models and alternate approaches
 - ✓ Forster networking and exchange of information among institutions
 - ✓ Enhance and strengthen doctoral programmes and training in Africa.
- In support of the project an institutional self-assessment tool has been developed and serves to collect and analyze policies.
- The IAU portal on *Innovative Approaches to Doctoral Education in Africa* (*IDEA-PhD*) provides tools and information to assist HEIs in the
 development of their Doctoral Programmes.







Thematic priorities



Ethics and Values

- IAU in collaboration with the Magna Charta Observatory (MCO), has
 elaborated a set of *Guidelines for an Institutional Code of Ethics in Higher Education*. The purpose of these Guidelines, adopted in 2012, is to serve as an instrument to develop, improve and strengthen policies and ethical codes in higher education institutions worldwide.
- Both organizations agreed to collaborate and set up a Joint Working Group to develop the next steps in bringing the Guidelines to life at the institutional level.
- The Joint Working Group will develop an action plan for moving forward, under consideration are possible offer of assistance to interested institutions in analysing, developing, improving policies and ethical codes and operationalizing the guidelines.







Thematic priorities



- Training and Support programme for Academic Librarians on Open
 Educational Resources (OER) Use, Re-Use, and Production aims at raising
 awareness on the possibilities offered by OER for improving access to
 higher education worldwide and increasing the re-use and production of
 OER in regions where they are still under-developed;
- The ICT for Information Accessibility Project (ICT4IAL) project led by the European Agency for Development in Special Needs Education – aims at raising awareness and increasing the visibility of the issue of accessible online information provision and developing guidelines to support their development within organizations, including higher education institutions.







IAU also offers

- Access to the International Bibliographic Database on Higher Education (HEDBIB) containing more than 37,000 references on higher education systems, administration, planning, policy, and evaluation.
- Internationally adopted Policy statements published online and in IAU Speaks Out.
- Competitive LEADHER grants to initiate institutional partnerships for improved management and leadership.
