Intensity


Maximum sustained winds of **45 km/h** near the center, gustiness of up to **55 km/h**, and central pressure of **1000 hPa**

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rains

"CALOY" is forecast to enhance the Southwest Monsoon in the next 24 hours and bring monsoon rains over the
western sections of Luzon and Visayas. For more information, refer to Weather Advisory No. 6 for Southwest
Monsoon issued at 11:00 PM today.

Severe Winds

- No tropical cyclone wind signal is currently hoisted for this tropical cyclone.
- The Southwest Monsoon enhanced by this tropical depression will bring occasionally gusty conditions reaching strong breeze to near gale in strength over Extreme Northern Luzon, and the western sections of Luzon and Visayas. These conditions are more likely in coastal and mountainous/upland localities of these areas.

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

The tropical depression and the enhanced Southwest Monsoon will bring moderate to rough seas (1.2 to 3.1 m) over the seaboards of Northern Luzon and the western seaboards of Central and Southern Luzon. These conditions may be risky for those using small seacrafts. Mariners are advised to take precautionary measures when venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigating in these conditions.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK


- On the forecast track, Tropical Depression "CALOY" is forecast to track generally northwestward and may exit the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) within 24 hours. Outside the PAR region, the tropical depression will track north northwestward over the West Philippine Sea until Thursday (30 June), then turn west northwestward on Friday (01 July) towards southern China.
- "CALOY" developed into a tropical depression at 8:00 PM today. It is forecast to remain a tropical depression in the next 48 hours, then slightly intensify and reach tropical storm category by Friday afternoon.

Considering these developments, the public and disaster risk reduction and management offices concerned are advised to take all necessary measures to protect life and property. Persons living in areas identified to be highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards are advised to follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials. For heavy rainfall warnings, thunderstorm/rainfall advisories, and other severe weather information specific to your area, please monitor products issued by your local PAGASA Regional Services Division.
