Cis-gender

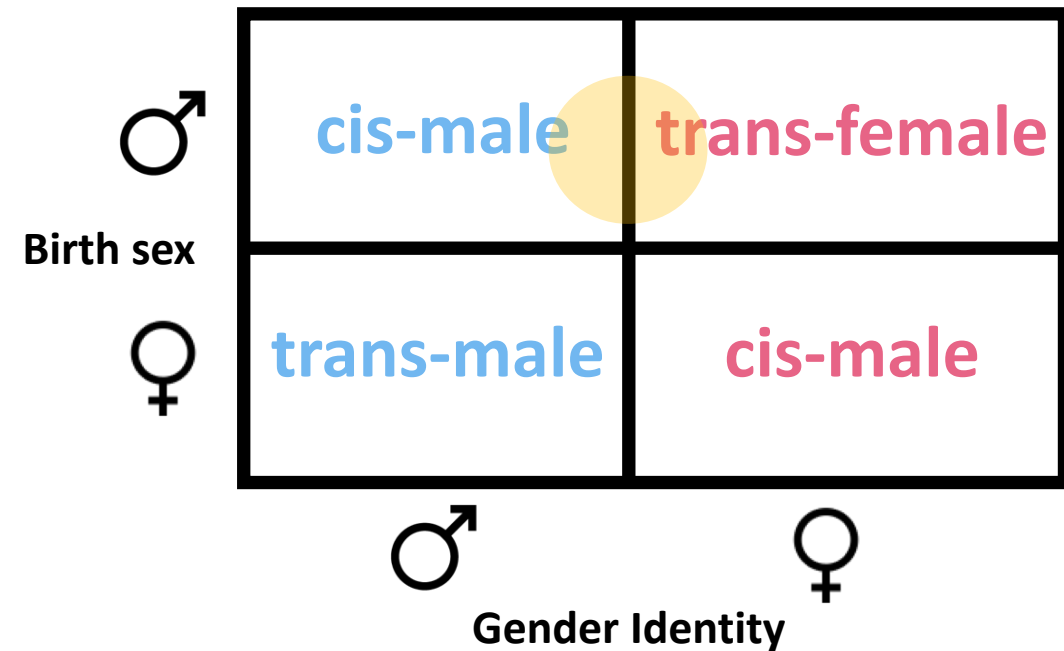
Gender identity = birth sex

Gender affirming hormones/surgery

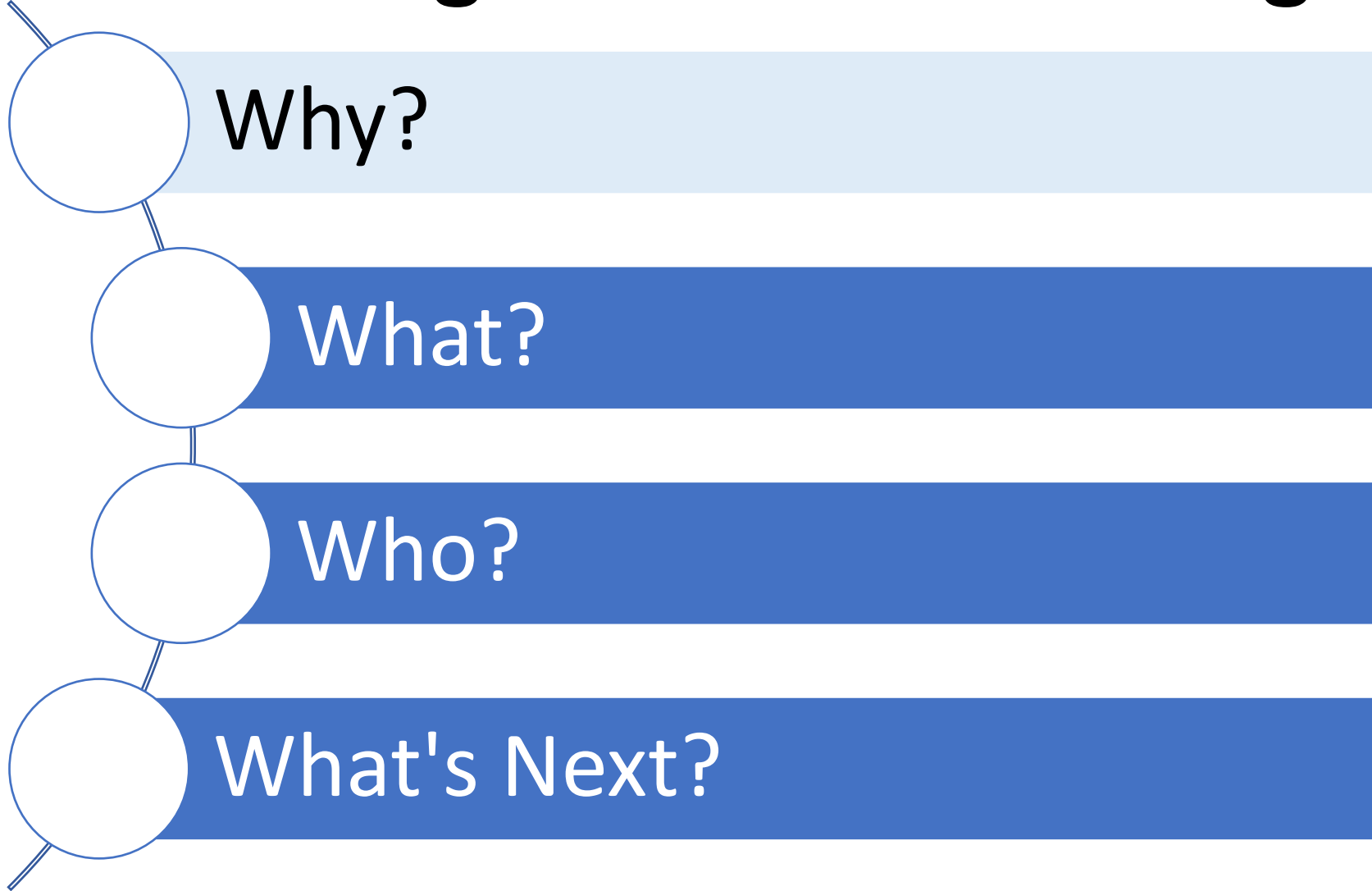
Make body = gender identity



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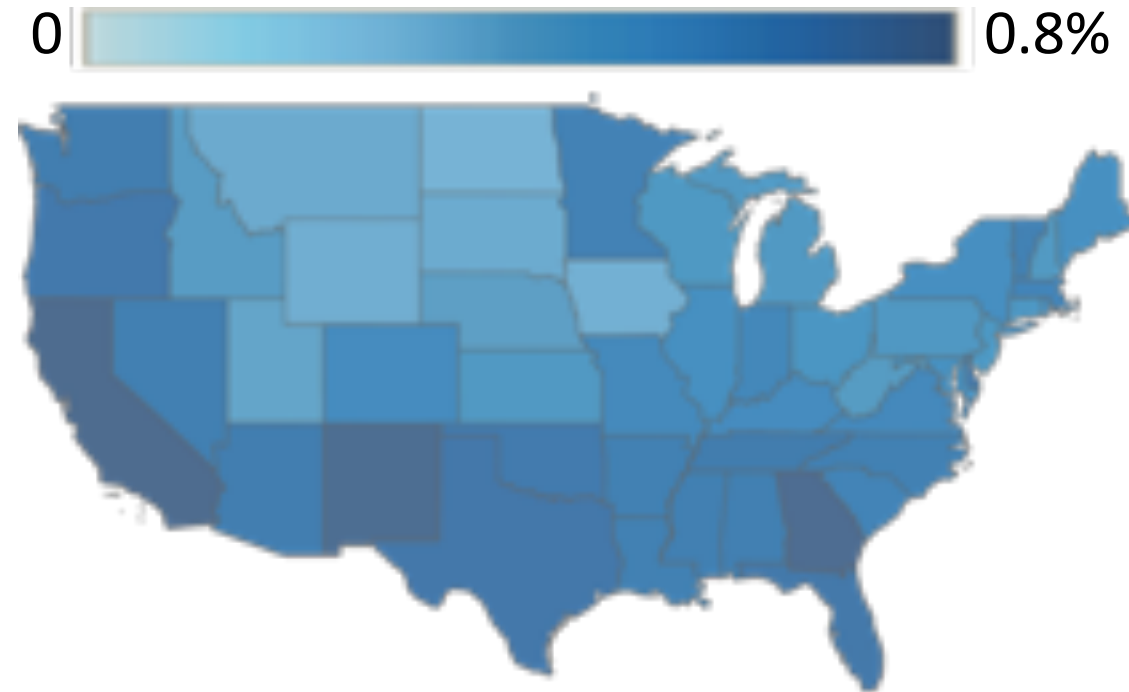

ADULTS WHO IDENTIFY AS TRANSGENDER

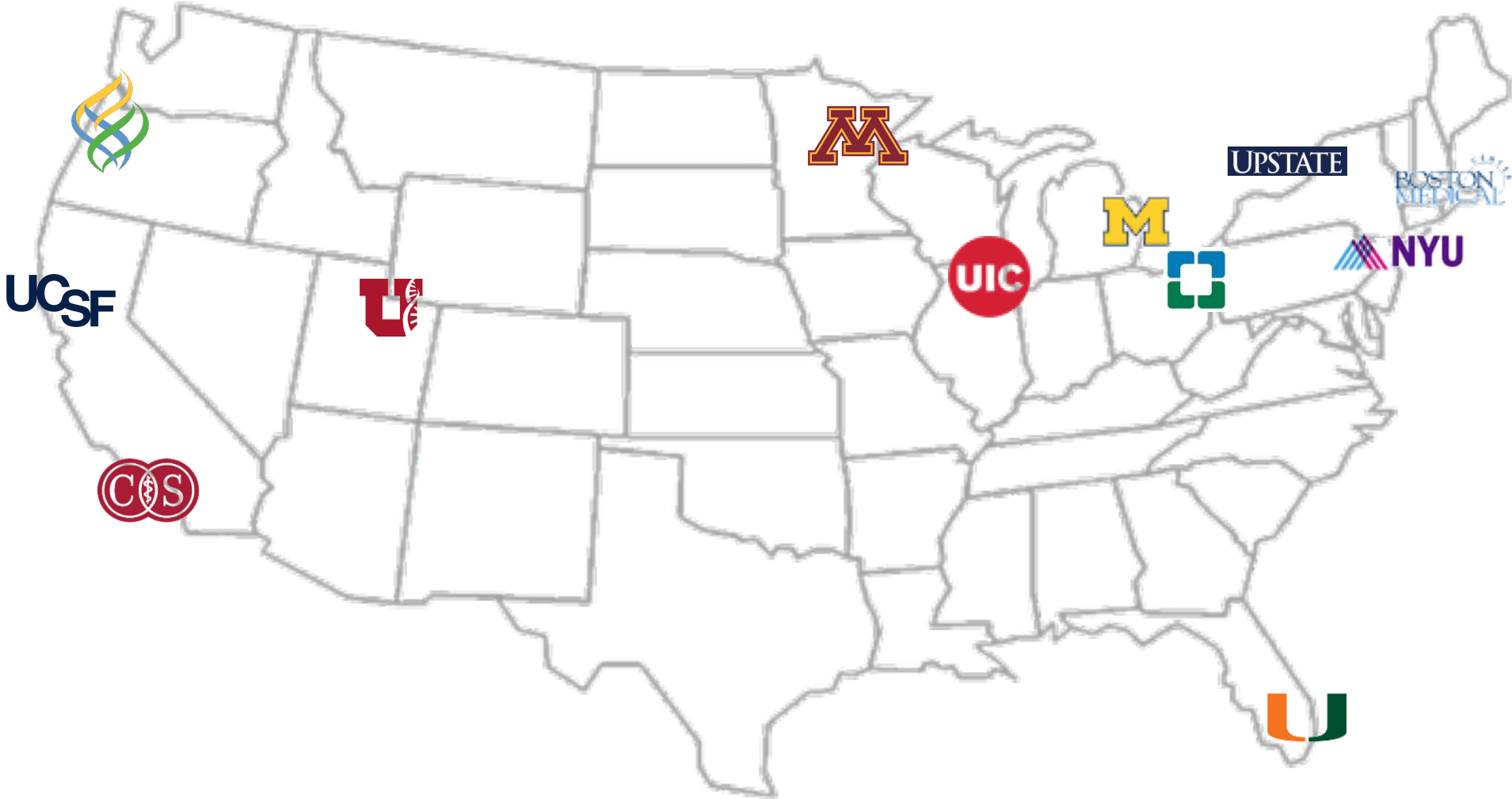
- United States: 1.4 million (0.6%)
- North Carolina
 - 44,750 (0.6%)
 - 7th largest population in U.S.
- Gender affirming hormones in ~50%
- Gender affirming surgery in ~25%
 - Transgender men: 42%
 - Transgender women: 23%
 - Non-binary: 9%

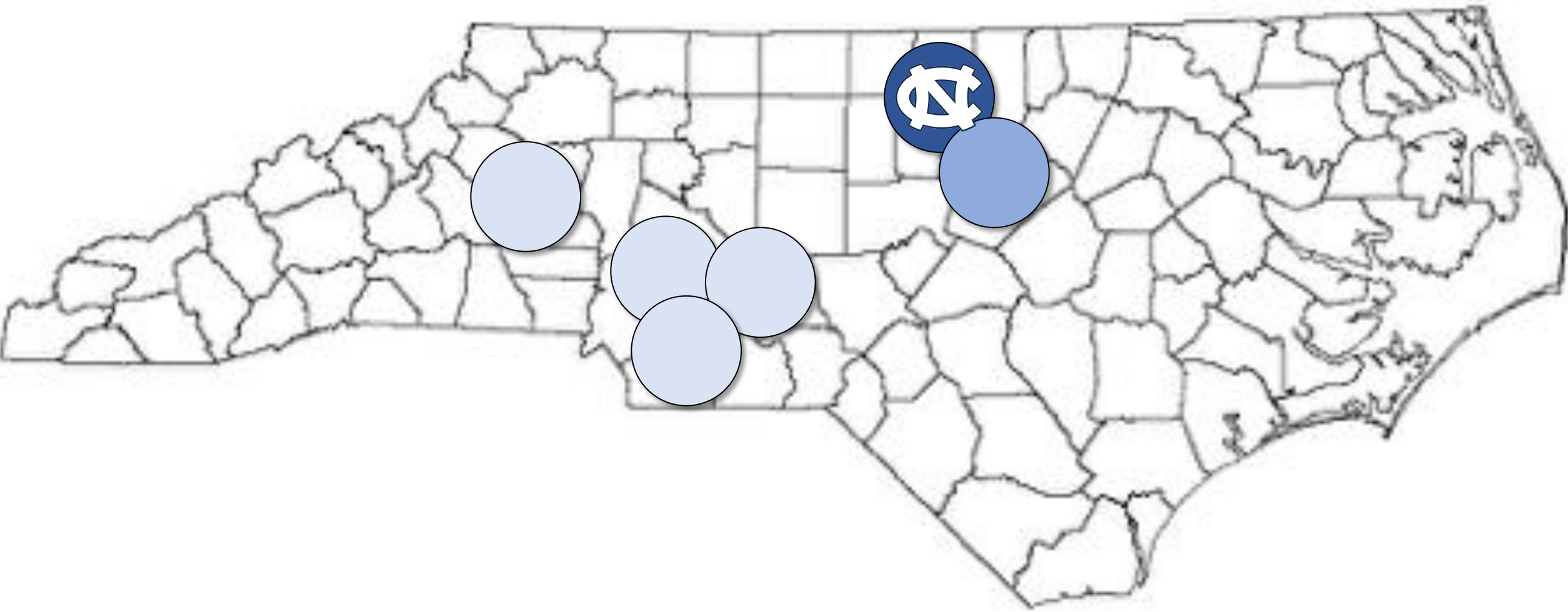

Masculinizing

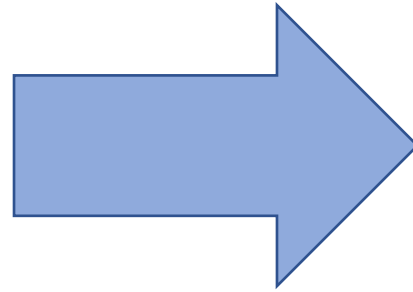
- Metoidioplasty (Urology)

- Vaginoplasty (Urology)
- Orchiectomy (Urology)
- Breast augmentation (Plastics)
- Facial feminization (Plastics)

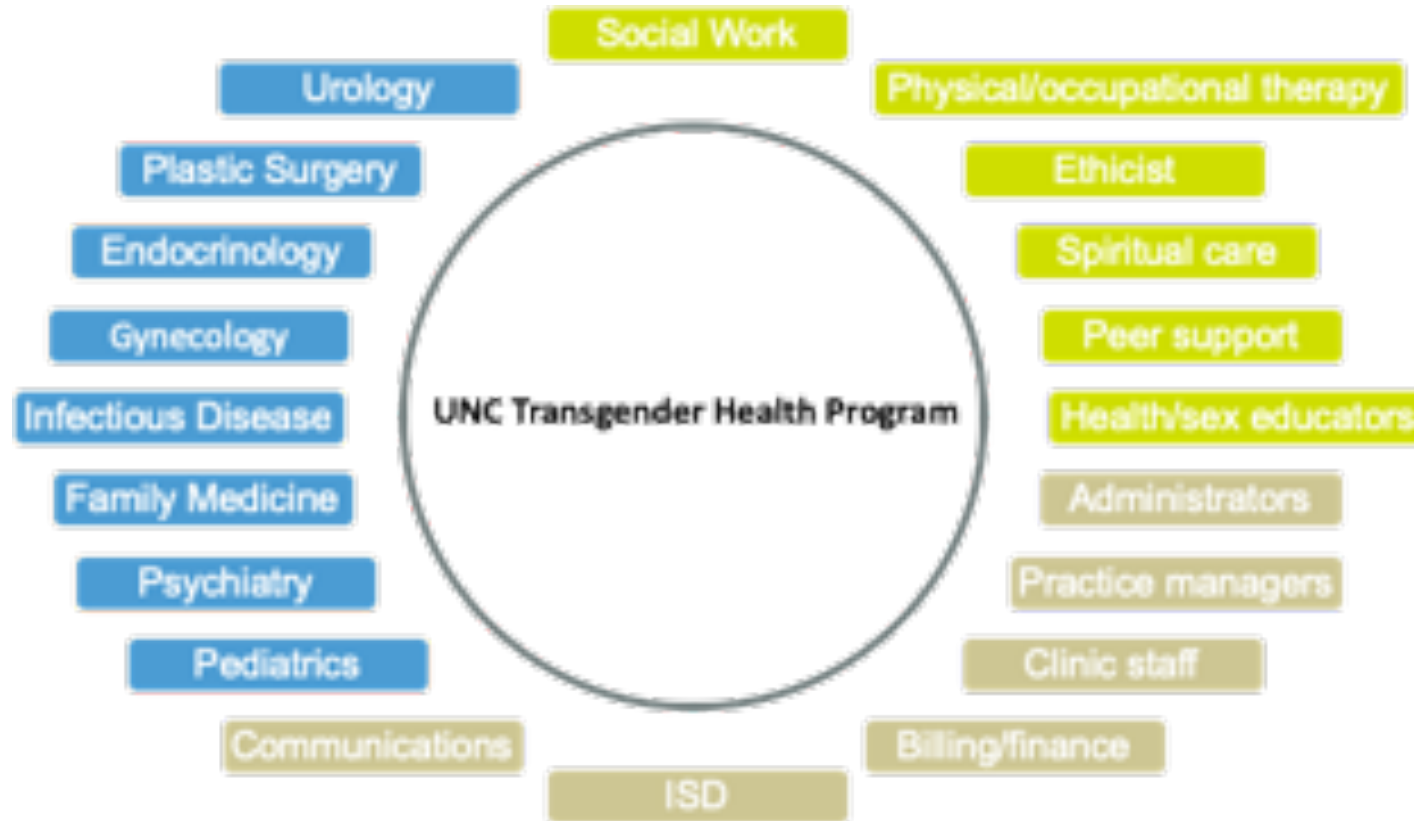
