

ASSAILS TRAITOR 'DUKES.'

**M. P. Suggests Cumberland and
and Albany Be Dropped.**

LONDON, April 12.—Swift MacNeill suggested in the House of Commons to-day that an act be passed depriving the "traitor" Dukes of Cumberland and Albany, cousins of King George, who are serving with the German army, of their British peerages.

Premier Asquith replied that he did not believe the time of the House would be employed profitably with such legislation, as the Dukes already had been expelled from the Order of the Garter.

Sir Arthur Markham said such a bill would pass in three minutes.
