Survey Methodology

TargetSmart designed and administered this multi-modal survey. The survey reached 704 adults, age 18 or older, who indicated they were registered to vote in Arizona and are almost certain to vote, will probably vote, or the chances are 50-50 that they will vote in the November's election for governor, U.S. Senate, Congress, state legislature, and other offices. The survey was conducted June 28-30, 2022, via live phones with trained operators and online via a link from an email or SMS.

The sample was randomly selected from TargetSmart's enhanced voter file. Seventy-one percent of respondents were reached on telephones (71 percent weighted). Seventy-four percent of the respondents who took the survey via phone were reached on a wireless phone (77 percent weighted). Seven percent were reached via email (7 percent weighted), while twenty-two percent were reached via SMS (22 percent weighted) and took the survey online. Quotas were assigned to reflect the demographic distribution of all registered voters in Arizona. The data were weighted by gender, age, race on file, TargetSmart Arizona Legislative Support Score, TargetSmart 2022 Arizona Midterm General Election Turnout Score, TargetSmart High School only score, and party registration to ensure an accurate reflection of the population.

The overall margin of error is +/- 3.7%. The margin of error for subgroups is larger and varies. Percentage totals may not add up precisely due to rounding.
