

Student Success

Katie Crowhurst

During half term Katie flew out to Italy to train with the GBR Para Swimming squad and last week she flew to Berlin to compete for Great Britain at the final leg of the Para Swimming World Series.

The athletes had a great time at camp in Italy fine tuning their strokes and race techniques, as well as learning about Sports Nutrition. At the World Series Event the team were very successful bringing home lots of medals and even breaking world records. Katie was the youngest member of the squad and it was her first time competing abroad for GB.

Katie made it through to 4 finals in her 100m Butterfly, 100m Freestyle, 50m Backstroke and 400m Freestyle. In her 50m Backstroke Katie touched in on a huge PB in heats and then again in finals. In the final Katie took second place youth (Silver). This means that out of all the athletes born 2002 or later she had the second highest points score. All disabilities compete together and winners are worked out on a points scoring system that calculates how close your swim time is to the world record for that event and your disability category. Winners have the highest point scores and are closer to their world record.

Zoë travelled to Landgraaf in the Netherlands over the bank holiday weekend to take part in the BASS races. These races are the highest level races that earn seed points to compete in the British Championships in France or international races. She also skied in Hemel last weekend in the Club National. With strong skiing she came 2nd.







Dear Teacher,

The RBWM Youth Ambassadors are running the Youth Voice Youth Choice Funding Scheme competition once again. This is a wonderful opportunity for your school to be in with a change to win some money to help fund projects.

There are four category slots - schools, youth groups, individuals and targeted groups. The maximum prize is £1,500 for groups and £500 for individuals.

There is a total fund of £10,000 with two winners in each category.

The competition is now open and we are accepting applications until 5pm 17 June 2019 so now is the time for young people to apply for any project that will benefit them and/or people in their community. Please see the attached poster with further details about dates.

I would encourage young people to apply for funding within any relevant category, for example if a young person attends a youth group – cubs, kayak club, music group, youth club or any other group, they could apply in that category where all attendees would benefit from a project. If they attend a targeted session or fall into a targeted group, they could apply for a project surrounding that such as Children in Care or learning disability or similarly, if a young person has been working on a personal project – sports, music, etc they could benefit from the cash to support their chosen individual hobby.

EPQ Presentations

Just before half term, a group of 8 Year 12 students stayed behind afterschool to give their EPQ presentations, which is the final stage in their EPQ journey. The EPQ (Extended Project Qualification) is a prestigious qualification giving students the same UCAS points as an AS level examination and is taken alongside their A levels. The award is greatly respected by elite British Universities who value the research skills, higher order thinking skills and academic independence the qualification seeks to promote. To complete the award in just Year 12 is a real achievement since students need to invest 120 hours to the qualification in addition to their other A level studies. The qualification allows students to research any topic in which they have an interest, formulate a problem, and then evaluate the evidence they have researched before arriving at a conclusion which attempts to solve the problem they have set themselves. The presentation but also facing an audience consisting of staff, governors and other students who question them on their project. Each presentation was well prepared and presented in a professional manner. Students not only did great justice to their work, but also showed great support to one another by staying and listening to each other's presentations and offering support.

The presentations were as follows:

Amelia Rawson: Do uniform policies in UK schools promote gender equality?

Charikleia-Chara Vettou: To what extend do the benefits of treating acute lymphoblastic leukaemia outweigh the ethical issues it sometimes present?

Hannah Irwin: Could alternative treatments be more effective than antidepressants in treating depression?

Tom Gallagher: The Rise of the Right in 20th and 21st century Britain: To what extent may history repeat itself?

Laura Franks: To What Extent is Holding Apes in Captivity Beneficial to the Species? Keira Smales: Can we wipe out HIV in Southern Africa using antiretroviral therapy? Julita Cuiba: What was the largest contributing factor to Mary Bell committing murder? Hope Dangerfield: To what extent does Film Noir glorify crime in the 1950s'
