Match background

It was beneath Wembley's old Twin Towers that FC Barcelona and Manchester United FC both won their first European Champion Clubs' Cup but only one can claim a fourth title when these rivals meet at the new Wembley in a repeat of the 2009 UEFA Champions League final.

Previous meetings

- This is the clubs' 11th meeting and the record so far is three wins each and four draws; neither side has won consecutive games. The teams have contested two major finals, Barcelona prevailing in their last meeting in Rome in 2009 while United won their 1991 UEFA Cup Winners' Cup decider in Rotterdam.

- Samuel Eto'o (10) and Lionel Messi (70) scored when Barcelona beat United 2-0 at the Stadio Olimpico on 27 May 2009.

- The full lineups were:

- Sir Alex Ferguson won his first European honour at United with a 2-1 win against Barcelona in the UEFA Cup Winners' Cup final 20 years ago. Former Azulgrana striker Mark Hughes scored twice (67, 74) before Ronald Koeman struck (79) for a Barcelona side reduced to ten men by Nando's dismissal.

- The lineups for that final on 15 May 1991 were:

- Carlos Busquets, father of Barcelona's Sergio, was in goal for the Catalan club. Brian McClair and Mike Phelan – United's academy director and assistant manager respectively – were among the opposition.

- That was the second time Sir Alex had won the UEFA Cup Winners' Cup against Spanish opponents, his Aberdeen FC side having defeated Real Madrid CF 2-1 in 1983.

- Ryan Giggs and Paul Scholes struck in United's 3-3 group stage draw against Barcelona at Old Trafford in September 1998. Scholes, who got the only goal of the teams' 2008 semi-final, made his UEFA Champions League debut against Barcelona in a 2-2 draw in October 1994. Giggs and Josep Guardiola also appeared in the teams' 1994/95 group stage meetings.

Match background

- Barcelona and United are both seeking a fourth European Cup, which would take them level with AFC Ajax and FC Bayern München and behind only Liverpool FC (five wins), AC Milan (seven) and Real Madrid (nine).

- If successful, Sir Alex would join Liverpool's Bob Paisley (1977, 1978, 1981) as the manager with most European Cup victories.

- The old Wembley staged five European Cup finals, with English teams prevailing twice:

1963 AC Milan 2-1 SL Benfica

1968 Manchester United FC 4-1 SL Benfica (aet)

1971 AFC Ajax 2-0 Panathinaikos FC

1978 Liverpool FC 1-0 Club Brugge KV

- United director Sir Bobby Charlton scored twice in the 1968 Wembley triumph with which the Old Trafford team became England's first European Cup winners.
- Like United in 1968, Barcelona needed extra time against Sampdoria in 1992 before Koeman's 112th-minute free-kick earned victory in a match featuring a 21-year-old Guardiola. Guardiola was in the Barcelona side beaten in the 1994 final by Milan.
- By steering Barcelona past United in 2009, Guardiola became the sixth man to claim the European Cup as player and coach, following Miguel Muñoz, Giovanni Trapattoni, Johan Cruyff, Carlo Ancelotti and Frank Rijkaard. The Spaniard was seven when a 36-year-old Sir Alex embarked on his first European campaign as a manager with Aberdeen in 1978/79.
- The only European Cup-winning coach older than Sir Alex is on the day of the final (69 years and 148 days) was Belgian Raymond Goethals, who was 71 years and 232 days when his Olympique de Marseille team triumphed in 1993.
- United have played nine times at the new Wembley and five of their matches have gone to penalties:

- This is the 11th European Cup final involving a team playing in their home country and seven times the 'home' team have prevailed – Real Madrid (1957), Milan (1965), Manchester United (1968), Ajax (1972), Liverpool (1978), Juventus (1996) and Borussia Dortmund (1997). Stade de Reims (1956), AS Roma (1984) and Barcelona (1986) all lost a final on home soil.
- Barcelona lost 2-1 at Arsenal on their last visit to London in February. They did beat the Gunners 4-2 at Wembley in the 1999/2000 group stage, the only previous time they have faced English opponents at the national stadium.
- Barcelona's record away to English opposition is W6 D8 L13. Their record against English clubs in London is W2 D3 L4; their overall record against English clubs is W23 D18 L16.
- Since the 2009 final United's only meetings with Spanish opposition have come this season, a 1-0 away win and 1-1 home draw with Valencia CF. United's overall record against Spanish clubs is W11 D17 L12.

Team ties

- Gerard Piqué joined United in 2004 after seven years in Barcelona's youth ranks. He made 23 appearances, scoring twice, before rejoining Barça in 2008.

- Messi had not scored in ten UEFA Champions League games against English opponents before striking in the 2009 final.
- Edwin van der Sar is hoping for a third UEFA Champions League winners' medal on his final United appearance, 16 years after his first with Ajax in 1995. Paolo Maldini holds the record for the longest span between triumphs, in 1989 and 2007.
- Víctor Valdés and Carles Puyol started Barcelona's 2006 final win against Arsenal while Andrés Iniesta came on at half-time.
- Giggs is the only survivor of United's 1999 UEFA Champions League final-winning team.
- Patrice Evra tasted UEFA Champions League final defeat with AS Monaco FC in 2004, and Dimitar Berbatov suffered the same fate as a substitute with Bayer 04 Leverkusen against Real Madrid in 2002. Javier Mascherano was in the Liverpool team that lost to Milan in 2007.
- Berbatov scored Leverkusen's goal in a 2-1 home UEFA Champions League defeat by Barcelona on 27 November 2002.
- Michael Owen scored Real Madrid's final goal in a 4-2 home Liga win against Barcelona on 10 April 2005.

UEFA milestones

- Barcelona's club record-equalling run of nine successive home wins in UEFA competition was halted by Real Madrid CF in the semi-finals. They set the mark from 1977 to 1979 and matched it between 1993 and 1994.
- Carles Puyol made his 100th UEFA Champions League appearance in the second leg against Real Madrid.

UEFA Champions League statistics

- The Catalan club are the competition's highest scorers with 27 goals. They scored 30 en route to the 2009 showpiece, three short of Real Madrid's competition record set getting to Glasgow in 2002.
- Lionel Messi is the competition's top scorer with 11 goals – seven more than United's best, Javier Hernández – and has had more shots on target than any other player (36).
- The Argentinian was the competition's top scorer in 2008/09 (nine goals) and 2009/10 (eight). Ruud van Nistelrooy holds the record for goals in a UEFA Champions League season having struck 12 in 2002/03.
- José Pinto is suspended following his red card in the semi-final, first leg.

 - Sergi Roberto made his full debut as Víctor Valdés, Puyol, Gerard Piqué, Xavi Hernández, Andrés Iniesta, Messi and David Villa all sat out what was only the Catalan outfit's second win in six games in all competitions.
 - Valdés won the Ricardo Zamora Trophy, awarded to the Liga keeper with the lowest goals to games ratio, for the third successive season and fourth occasion in all. He is now one shy of Antoni Ramallets' all-time record.
 - Barcelona wrapped up their third successive Liga title, 21st in all, with two games to spare on 11 May after a 1-1 draw with UD Levante. It means Guardiola has amassed a national record 25 major titles as player and coach, two more than previous record holder Miguel Muñoz.
 - Barcelona have lost five of their 31 games away from the Camp Nou this season, and three of those were in two-legged cup ties they ultimately won. The exceptions were the 1-0 extra-time Copa del Rey final defeat by Real Madrid on 20 April and a 2-1 Liga loss at Real Sociedad de Fútbol ten days later.
 - Messi has scored 55 goals in 61 games for club and country this season, though none in his last four outings. He has surpassed the previous best goal tally for a Spanish campaign of 49 set by Real Madrid's Ferenc Puskás in 1959/60, but heads to Wembley one behind Cristiano Ronaldo's haul this term.
 - This season Barcelona established Spanish top-flight records for longest winning run (16 games), longest unbeaten sequence on their travels (23) and most away wins (14). They also came within one game of Real Sociedad's 31-year-old mark of 32 Liga matches unbeaten.
 - Barcelona's 31-game unbeaten run in the Liga (14 September to 30 April) nevertheless marked a club record, one of several this term. The Catalan outfit began the season with ten successive Liga away wins and went 28 matches unbeaten in all competitions between 14 September and 19 January. The 8-0 victory at UD Almería on 20 November equalled Barça's record for a Liga away win.
 - Xavi has played 576 games for Barcelona, surpassing Migueli's club record of 549 on 5 January.
- #### Injury news
- Puyol is fit but has been plagued by the knee and hamstring problems since January and last played on 3 May.
 - Bojan Krkić was expected to miss the rest of the season after suffering knee ligament damage on 9 April but returned on 15 May.
 - Maxwell (groin, 23 April to 15 May) and Adriano (thigh, 20 April to 21 May) are back in action, as is Éric Abidal, who had a liver tumour removed on 17 March before returning for the semi-final second leg against Real Madrid.
 - Martín Montoya's first start for Barcelona against Real Sociedad on 30 April lasted 14 minutes as he broke his collarbone and dislocated a shoulder. Gabriel Milito tore a thigh muscle in the same game but is back in training.

Manchester United

UEFA milestones

- Antonio Valencia's goal at home to FC Schalke 04 in the semi-finals second leg was United's 300th in the UEFA Champions League, group stage to final.
- Already United's oldest ever UEFA Champions League outfield player, Ryan Giggs became the oldest scorer in the competition with his first-leg goal against Schalke. Aged 37 years and 148 days, he surpassed the record of Filippo Inzaghi, who was 37 years and 86 days when he registered for AC Milan against Real Madrid CF on Matchday 4.
- Should Edwin van der Sar feature and United win, the Dutchman would become the oldest player to appear in a UEFA Champions League final victory, aged 40 years 211 days. Paolo Maldini was 38 years 332 days when AC Milan defeated Liverpool FC in the 2007 final.

UEFA Champions League statistics

- United have conceded four goals, the joint lowest total in the competition along with FC Rubin Kazan, who were eliminated after the group stage. AFC Ajax (1996) and Arsenal FC (2006) conceded two en route to the final.
- If United emerge victorious it will be the third time they have won the European Champion Clubs' Cup without losing a match having managed the feat previously in 1998/99 and 2007/08. Ajax (1971/72, 1994/95), Liverpool (1980/81, 1983/84), and Milan (1988/89, 1993/94) have also been unbeaten champions twice previously.

- United finished their Premier League campaign with a 15th successive home win, setting a league record. Newcastle United FC held the previous mark, set between May 1995 and February 1996.
- Sir Alex Ferguson's side sealed their 19th league title, and 12th in the Premier League era, with a 1-1 draw at Blackburn Rovers FC on 14 May. It sets a new English league record, overtaking Liverpool's previous best of 18.
- United suffered four league defeats, equalling their lowest total set in 1999/2000. Their five away victories was the lowest for title winners since 1976/77.
- Prior to losing 1-0 at Arsenal FC on 1 May, United had kept seven clean sheets in 11 matches, but they have managed none in their last five.
- Dimitar Berbatov scored 21 league goals this season, equalling his best return set in the Bundesliga with Bayer 04 Leverkusen in 2005/06. He became the fourth player to score five goals in a Premier League game on 27 November as United beat Blackburn 7-1.
- Berbatov finished as the Premier League's joint leading scorer along with former United striker Carlos Tévez.
- Nani provided 18 assists in the 2010/11 league season, more than any other player.
- Giggs played his 607th league game for United at Anfield on 6 March, breaking Sir Bobby Charlton's club record.
- United's 24-match unbeaten start to the league season ended with a 2-1 loss at Wolverhampton Wanderers FC on 5 February.

Injury news

- John O'Shea has been out since 8 May with a leg problem.
- Darren Fletcher played 90 minutes for the first time since 1 March against Blackpool. The midfielder has been suffering from a virus and has otherwise been restricted to two substitute appearances.
- Anders Lindegaard has been out of first-team action since early March with a knee problem.

Miscellaneous

- Van der Sar will retire after the final at the age of 40.
- Sir Alex and Nemanja Vidić were named Premier League manager and player of the season respectively.
- Sir Alex will be made a Doctor of the University of Stirling on 29 June in recognition of his outstanding contribution to sport.
- United have confirmed Owen Hargreaves, who made only 39 appearances in four years at the club and who is not in the UEFA Champions League squad, will leave Old Trafford when his contract expires this summer.

- Known as 'Pep', he came up through Barcelona's youth ranks to win six Spanish Liga titles, one European Champion Clubs' Cup, a UEFA Cup Winners' Cup and two Copa del Rey trophies from 1990 to 2001.
- Also had spells with Brescia, Fabio Capello's Roma, Al-Ahly in Doha and Mexico's Dorados de Sinola before ending his playing career in 2006.
- Won 40 caps and Olympic footballing gold with Spain in 1992, but missed the 1998 and 2002 FIFA World Cup tournaments through injury.
- Having coached Barcelona's B team, became the 15th Catalan-born boss of the senior team in 2008 and won the UEFA Champions League, Spanish Liga and Copa del Rey in his first season in charge.
- Success in the 2008/09 final made Guardiola the sixth man to lift the European Cup as a player and a coach. Barcelona followed up with victories in the Spanish and UEFA Super Cups at the start of 2009/10, going on to win the FIFA Club World Cup and retain the Liga title. Steered the Azulgrana to a third successive Liga crown in 2010/11.

- Replaced Ron Atkinson at Old Trafford in November 1986, and ended United's 26-year wait for a league title in 1993. Has since added 11 more championships – including the Red Devils' record 19th English crown in 2010/11 – to a domestic collection which includes five FA Cups and four League Cups.
- Guided United to UEFA Cup Winners' Cup glory with victory against FC Barcelona in 1991, though his greatest achievements are the UEFA Champions League triumphs of 1999 and 2008.
- Knighted in June 1999, Sir Alex is head of the UEFA Coaches Panel.

- Viktor Kassai works as a travel agent in his native Hungary and his progress to UEFA's list of Elite referees has ensured plenty of opportunities to broaden his horizons still further.
- Born on 10 September 1975, Kassai has taken charge of more than 100 matches in the Hungarian top flight, getting his first taste of international action in the 2001 UEFA Regions' Cup.
- Kassai, whose principle interests are sports and film, officiated two UEFA Cup matches in 2003/04 and the following season brought his first UEFA Champions League engagement, the second qualifying round first leg between HNK Hajduk Split and Shelbourne FC. Went onto officiate FIFA World Cup and UEFA European Under-21 Championship games the same season.
- In July 2005 Kassai refereed three games at the UEFA European U19 Championship in Northern Ireland and has remained a regular in international fixtures ever since, also working at the 2007 FIFA U-20 World Cup in Canada.
- Worked as a fourth official at UEFA EURO 2008, where he was given three matches, and was a referee at the football tournament at the Olympic Games in Beijing later that summer, taking charge of the final as Argentina defeated Nigeria. Oversaw four games at the 2010 World Cup, including the Germany-Spain semi-final, and seven matches in the UEFA Champions League the following season, concluding with the Wembley final between FC Barcelona and Manchester United FC.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League final: Did you know?

- Spain and Italy are the most successful nations with five triumphs each. Spain's wins – 1998, 2000, 2002, 2006 and 2009 – came from eight final dates while Italy were victorious in 1994, 1996, 2003, 2007 and 2010 from their 11 appearances. England emerged victorious in 1999, 2005 and 2008, and were losing finalists in 2006, 2007, 2008 and 2009 while Germany were winners in 1997 and 2001 and runners-up in 1999, 2002 and 2010.
- No team has played in more finals than AC Milan as 2007 marked their sixth appearance. They equalled Real Madrid CF's record of three victories with that triumph against Liverpool FC in Athens.
- Italy with 26 has the most appearances per nation in all-time European Champion Clubs' Cup finals – of those 12 have ended in victory and 14 in defeat. England has recorded 11 wins from 17 final appearances. Spain has 21 final appearances (12 wins/nine defeats), Germany 14 (six wins) and the Netherlands eight (six wins).
- In the previous 18 finals, there have been 13 outright wins and five matches decided on shoot-outs. A total of 45 goals have been scored with the most common results being 2-1, which has happened on four occasions, while three finals have finished 1-0.
- Fourteen European Cup finals have gone to extra time. The finals of 1958, 1968, 1970 and 1992 were decided in the additional period, while the 1974 showpiece between FC Bayern München and Club Atlético de Madrid ended 1-1 after 120 minutes with Bayern subsequently winning a replay. The other nine finals were settled by a penalty shoot-out after extra time: in 1984, 1986, 1988, 1991, 1996, 2001, 2003, 2005 and 2008 when Manchester United FC defeated Chelsea FC 6-5 in the shoot-out after a 1-1 draw.
- Milan's 4-0 win against FC Barcelona in the 1994 final remains the biggest winning margin and the Rossoneri were also involved in the highest scoring showpiece when they shared six goals with Liverpool in 2005 before penalties. In terms of the all-time European Cup, Madrid's 7-3 defeat of Eintracht Frankfurt in 1960 remains the most impressive while Bayern (1974 v Club Atlético de Madrid) and Milan (1989 v FC Steaua Bucureşti) also recorded 4-0 successes.
- No player has scored a hat-trick in a final. Daniele Massaro (Milan 1994), Karlheinz Riedle (BV Borussia Dortmund 1997), Hernán Crespo (Milan 2005), Filippo Inzaghi (2007) and Diego Milito (2010) all struck twice. In European Cup terms, only Ferenc Puskás (Madrid 1962) and Pierino Prati (Milan 1969) have managed a final hat-trick.
- Only Raúl González (Madrid 2000 and 2002) and Samuel Eto'o (Barcelona 2006 and 2009) have scored in two UEFA Champions League finals – part of an exclusive club of 13 players to have found the net in more than one European Cup showpiece. Alfredo di Stéfano leads the list having scored seven goals in five separate finals for Madrid.
- Jens Lehmann (2006) and Didier Drogba (2008) are the only players to be dismissed in a European Cup final.
- Clarence Seedorf is the only player to win the European Cup with three clubs (AFC Ajax 1995, Real Madrid CF 1998, AC Milan 2003, 2007). Liverpool's Bob Paisley (1977, 1978, 1981) is the only coach to win three times.
- Ottmar Hitzfeld (Borussia Dortmund 1997, Bayern 2001), Ernst Happel (Feyenoord 1970, Hamburger SV 1983) and José Mourinho (FC Porto 2004, FC Internazionale Milano 2010) are the only coaches to win the trophy with two clubs.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Champion Clubs' Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United (2008, 2009) have all returned to the final as holders only to lose.
- Only two teams have ever previously won – or even reached the final of – the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome). Five teams won European Cup finals on home soil: Real Madrid CF (1957), FC Internazionale Milano (1965), Manchester United FC (1968), AFC Ajax (1972) and Liverpool FC (1978), while Stade de Reims Champagne (1956), AS Roma (1984) and FC Barcelona (1986) all lost finals in their own country.

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having been aged 43 years 252 days when he featured against Real Madrid CF on Matchday 6 of the 2007/08 edition.
- Ryan Giggs is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 148 days, in Manchester United's 2-0 win at FC Schalke 04 on 26 April 2011.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared. He was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against Steaua on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
