With USP, the Learning Behavior Disorders major required nine hours of Social Sciences courses, with six hours in USP, and in Program Related Studies, an additional three-credit hour course in one of the two Social Science disciplines which were chosen to fulfill the USP requirement. With Gen Ed, the major would also require nine hours of Social Sciences, but in Program Related Studies (not including PSY 100, which is already listed separately), with six of the hours taken in one of the Social Science disciplines (ANT, ECO, FAM, GEO, PS, PSY, or SOC).

The remaining credits will be made up in electives chosen with the help of an advisor, to bring the total number of earned hours up to 120.




