FATAH WINS CONTROL OF PALESTINE GROUP

BEIRUT, Lebanon, Feb. 4— Al Fatah, the commando organization headed by Yasir Arafat, has taken control, politically and militarily, of the Palestinian national movement. This was the effect of the election in Cairo yesterday of a new 11-man executive committee of the Palestine Liberation Organization, which today elected Mr. Arafat as its chairman.

The results of the election, held in secret session, were an-

nounced by the Cairo radio. The new chariman and executive committee, in contrast to the organization's first leadership headed by Ahmed Shukairy, introduce a style of leadership, emphasiizing action. Speaking briefly after his election, Mr. Arafat promised to intensify the "armed revolution in all parts of our Palestinian territory to make of it a war of liberation." "Armed struggle," he said, "is the only way. We reject all political settlements."

Mr. Arafat, the soft-voiced leader and spokesman of Al Fatah, is generally known by his old pseudonym Abu Amar.
