



WELCOME TO WOLLONGONG, AUSTRALIA

Nestled on the south-east coast of Australia, Wollongong is a city that brings together urban living and coastal relaxation.

Australia's international gateway, Sydney, is just 80km to the north with the Royal National Park connecting the Harbour City to the Illawarra region that encompasses Wollongong. Some of the country's most recognisable coastline stretches from north of Wollongong at Helensburgh, then heads south via the iconic Sea Cliff Bridge and through the small beach villages of Wombarra, Coledale, Austinmer, Thirroul, Bulli, Bellambi and into Wollongong, making the city a desirable place to live, work and visit.

Wollongong is Australia's 10th largest city, and its 300,000 residents and constant stream of visitors embrace the unique lifestyle that comes with the collision of beautiful beaches and the spectacular sub-tropical rainforest of the escarpment. The ocean and the escarpment set the scene for outdoor adventures, and artistic, cultural and historic discoveries including chic coastal towns, unique attractions, inviting eateries and small bars.

Ancient indigenous Australians first travelled to Wollongong for food and safety. The proud Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community of the region - known as Dharawal country - continues to encourage learning about and celebration of local cultural traditions today.

The city later became a thriving industrial centre, where its coal port and steel works attracted a generation of new Australians from across Europe in the second half of the 20th century.

Today, Wollongong is a hub for knowledge services, health and wellbeing, as well as technology and innovation. These modern industries are the mainstay of the city's economy.

Cycling has become an emblem of Wollongong's transformation and lifestyle revolution that captures the city's positive energy, love of outdoors and sense of community.

In February 2021, Wollongong was named a UCI Bike City – the only one in the Southern Hemisphere – in recognition of its commitment to cycling as a sport, mode of transport and lifestyle choice.

The UCI Bike City label is a significant vote of confidence in Wollongong's ability to host major events, and a powerful endorsement of the city's Cycling Strategy.

Wollongong has a long and proud history of supporting cycling, each year welcoming 10,000 riders for the MS Sydney to Gong ride. It has also hosted the NSW Grand Prix and a round of the 2018 National Criterium Series. Meanwhile, cyclists of all levels can enjoy more than 42 kilometres of shared pathways from Sandon Point in the North to Lake Illawarra in the South.

Further, Wollongong has demonstrated its major event hosting credentials through a range of high-profile activities including International Federation of American Football Championships (2019), Wiggin v Hull FC Super League (2018), and the International Downhill Speed Skating World Cup (2016).

The 2022 UCI Road World Championship courses will highlight how quickly the environment changes in the city, with the Wollongong City Circuit featuring flat sections that will allow for high speeds through city streets to a deceptively steep climb (average gradient of 7.7% and a maximum of 14%) up Mount Pleasant. The Elite road races incorporate the climb of Mount Keira and Mount Kembla, two sites that are loved and frequented by the local cycling community for their ferocity and mountain biking opportunities.

Meanwhile, both the road races and time trials finish on Marine Drive in the city centre, with the perfectly white sand of City Beach adjacent and the iconic Flagstaff Hill lighthouse set behind in the distance.

The local community is looking forward to welcoming all participants to Wollongong!


TEAM TIME TRIAL

MIXED RELAY














MOUNT KEIRA LOOP



















HOW TO REACH WOLLONGONG, AUSTRALIA







By plane

Sydney Airport (SYD) International Terminal (T1) is approximately 80km from Wollongong, and just 8km from the Sydney Central Business District (CBD), with flights from all major global cities. The airport is serviced by train, shuttle, bus, taxi and rideshare.



By train

- FROM SYDNEY AIRPORT

Go to the Airport railway station's Platform 2. Catch the train to Wolli Creek Station and change to Platform 4 for your train to Wollongong (*The South Coast line). The journey will take approximately 2 hours.

*Please note that not all trains to the South Coast stop at Wolli Creek Station, so check https://transportnsw.info/ or travel to Sydney's Central Station and transfer to the South Coast Line.

- FROM SYDNEY AIRPORT VIA SYDNEY'S CENTRAL STATION

Go to Sydney Airport Domestic or Sydney Airport International Train Station. At either of these stations go to Platform 1. Catch the train to Sydney's Central Station and once there, change to the South Coast Line from the Country Platforms (1-13). The journey will take approximately 2 hours and 15 minutes.

— FROM SYDNEY CBD

Wollongong is located on Sydney Train's South Coast Line. Sydney Trains operate commuter trains at regular intervals to Wollongong. The journey will take approximately 1 hour and 45 minutes.

By car

The quickest route to get to Wollongong by car is via the Westlink (M7) motorway that can be accessed from Macarthur in Sydney's west. Allow 1 hour for this journey depending on your point of departure.

Another straightforward and easy option when travelling by car is to take the M1 motorway from Sydney central that will take approximately 1 hour 20 minutes to reach Wollongong.

If you wish to enjoy some of the coastal scenery, take the scenic route via Grand Pacific Drive which starts just 45 minutes south of the Sydney CBD. The route takes you from the Royal National Park through glorious tropical rainforests, from the mountains onto the incredible coastline that leads you all the way into Wollongong.

Attention: If your driving license is not written in English, it is mandatory to have an **international driving license** to drive in Australia. For more information on how to apply for an international driving license, please refer to

REQUIREMENTS FOR ENTRY INTO AUSTRALIA

The below information is correct as of March 2022. Further communications will be made if the entry requirements into Australia, including vaccination requirements, change.

COVID-19

From 21 February 2022, all fully vaccinated visa holders can travel to Australia without a travel exemption. Complete vaccination will be mandatory to enter in Australia. Unvaccinated visa holders will still need a valid travel exemption to enter Australia.

Travellers with acceptable proof they cannot be vaccinated for medical reasons (medical contraindication), and children under 12 can access the same travel arrangement as fully vaccinated travellers, and do not need to apply for a travel exemption. The Australian Department of Health advises that previous infection from Covid-19 is not considered a medical contraindication for Covid-19 vaccination.

VACCINATION STATUS

Vaccination status impacts whether some passengers are automatically exempt or not from Australia's incoming travel restrictions. While you may have an existing or approved eligible visa for Australia, this does not exempt you from the vaccination requirements for entry into Australia.

Individuals are considered to be fully vaccinated for travel to Australia if they have completed a course of a vaccine approved or recognised by the Therapeutic Goods Administration. At least 7 days must have passed since the final dose of vaccine in a course of immunisation.

Travellers to Australia must declare their vaccination status to enter Australia and must be able to provide appropriate supporting evidence. They will need to present this information at check-in for their flight to Australia.

Travellers who do not meet vaccination requirements are subject to incoming passenger caps, and all travellers are subject to any quarantine requirements set by the state or territory in which they arrive.

COMPLETION OF CRITICAL HEALTH INFORMATION DOCUMENT PRIOR TO TRAVEL

Travellers to Australia are also required to complete a Digital Passenger Declaration (DPD). The DPD must be completed within 72 hours before departure.

When filling out the DPD, you will need to:

- provide your contact details, including a contact phone number for you in Australia, which can be your international mobile/cell number.
- make a legally binding declaration in relation to your vaccination status
- make a declaration regarding your last 14 days' travel history
- make a declaration that you are aware of the quarantine and testing requirements that apply when coming to Australia and in the state or territory you are landing, and the penalties for non-compliance.

VISA APPLICATION FORM

Australian Visa Options for Event Participants

There are many visa options available to people wishing to visit Australia. The appropriate visa option will depend, amongst others, on the person's purpose for visiting Australia. Please find information regarding available visa options for participants in the 2022 UCI Road World Championships.

We would like to point out that the visa application procedure is time consuming and should be done well in advance of the 2022 UCI Road World Championships.

In addition, we would like to inform you that some visa applicants from specific countries (a complete list can be found on this link) may be required to go to a biometric data collection center to provide their personal identifiers before their visa can be processed by the Department of Home Affairs.

Elite competitors and all members of their support team (including coaches and managers for all categories) taking part in the 2022 UCI Road World Championships, as well as Officials (UCI officials, management and administration staff) who will be working, or otherwise be paid to contribute at the events may be eliqible to apply for the following visa options:

TRAVEL & TRANSPORT GUIDANCE FOR NATIONAL FEDERATIONS

Due to Australia's geographical location, the impact from extensive participant air travel will be greater than at previous editions of the UCI Road World Championships.

As well as emitting carbon dioxide from burning fuel, planes also affect the concentration of other gases and pollutants in the atmosphere. The increased concentration of greenhouse gases in the atmosphere is causing the planet's temperature to rise rapidly. The resulting climate change threatens the natural environment that cyclists treasure, our way of life, health, and the economy.

As a sport we must demonstrate climate responsibility for attending the Wollongong 2022 UCI Road World Championships by mitigating these impacts wherever possible and compensating for our unavoidable emissions.

Taking climate action in this area means **reducing the amount of travel and decarbonising the mode of transportation** wherever possible. These recommended actions can help guide more sustainable choices and decision-making for your National Federation:

FLYING

 Fly direct: Direct flights generally use less fuel than flights with connections and are often more convenient for travellers.

GROUND TRANSPORTATION

- If hiring cars or other transport in Australia, seek fuel-efficient vehicles fitted with particle filters or low/zero-emission vehicles (electric or hybrid).
- Increase the use of public transport and cycling rather than vehicle use.
- Increase vehicle sharing (car-pooling) to reduce the number of vehicles and journeys.
- Choose the "greenest" travel option when travelling to or from airports: catching a bus or train from the airport has a far smaller carbon footprint than scores of taxis or hire cars.

EQUIPMENT TRANSPORT

- Use shipping in preference to airfreight.
- Choose freight and courier companies that operate low-emission vehicle fleets and implement green practices (route and load optimisation).
- For materials that must be shipped, select a freight haulier that uses environmentally responsible practices in their operations.

ACCOMMODATION

- Find accommodation near the event or located in close proximity to public transport connections.
- Look for establishments that prioritise sustainability across their operations and have implemented an environmental or sustainability policy to improve performance on water usage, GHG emissions, energy efficiency and waste management. This information will usually be stated on websites.



CLIMATE COMPENSATION

Carbon offsetting is the process of compensating for the emissions you produce by funding projects that will help to absorb the equivalent amount of CO2 from the atmosphere. Carbon offsetting is a last resort and should only be used sparingly once emissions have been reduced as far as possible.

To take responsibility for unavoidable travel emissions related to participating in the Wollongong 2022 UCI Road World Championships, follow these steps:

- Use the <u>ICAO Carbon Emissions Calculator</u> to establish the emissions from all flights associated with your National Federation's travel to Australia.
- Compensate for these emissions through <u>Gold Standard offset projects</u> by purchasing credits for the equivalent amount of emissions. Gold Standard credits are reputable, verified, and of high environmental integrity, reinforcing the objectives of the <u>UN Sustainable Development Goals</u>.
- Share information of your carbon offsetting activities with your UCI contact to help us quantify the total amount of emissions being compensated from National Federations travel.

VEHICLES ALLOCATED TO NATIONAL FEDERATIONS

A limited supply of team cars will be provided to the National Federations by the organiser and its vehicle partner. These cars will be assigned to the top-ranked National Federations according to the number of riders in their delegation. Information on the allocation of these vehicles to the National Federations will be detailed in the Technical Guide of the 2022 UCI Road World Championships which will be published mid-August

All drivers representing National Federations in the race convoy at UCI Road World Championships must have a UCI Licence issued by a National Federation and are obliged to respect the UCI Regulations as well as the current guidelines for vehicle circulation. The UCI Licence must include the necessary third-party liability insurance in case of material damage or injury to others, which must be valid in all countries where the licence-holder is likely to perform his/her duties.

Drivers are required to have an in-depth knowledge of cycle racing and its regulations as well as experience and ability to anticipate a wide range of race situations. It is the National Federations' responsibility to ensure that their drivers have the necessary experience to drive in the race convoy at the UCI Road World Championships.

Drivers are responsible for the manner in which they drive; if they fail to observe the regulations, they face significant financial penalties as well as the suspension of their UCI Licence (as a driver and any other role they may have). The sanctions related to driving in the race convoy are defined by Articles 2.2.038 and subsequent of the UCI Regulations.

Attention: It is mandatory to have an **international driving license** to drive an official vehicle in Australia. An identity card/passport and an attestation by the National Federation have to be provided as well. For more information on how to apply for an international driving license, please refer to:

RADIO FREQUENCIES

Any teams, broadcasters, press and other individuals planning to use radio equipment in Australia must apply for a Short-Term Special Event licence from the Australian Communications and Media Authority (ACMA), the regulator of communication services Australia. https://www.acma.gov.au/

ACMA recommends the use of an Accredited Person to assist with the processing of your application, who will also advise of the costs involved. Wollongong 2022 recommends SpecCom to assist you with your application, or you can find a full list of accredited persons at https://www.acma.gov.au/find-accredited-person
