The North Norfolk (Parishes) Order 1987

<u>Made</u>	27th January 1987
<u>Coming into Force</u>	
for the purposes described	
in article 2(1)	1st February 1987
for all other purposes	1st April 1987

Whereas the North Norfolk District Council, acting pursuant to section 48(8) of the Local Government Act 1972 (a), has made recommendations to the Local Government Boundary Commission for England for proposals about parishes in the district:

And whereas in consequence of those recommendations the Commission has seen fit, pursuant to sections 47, 48(9) and 51(1) of that Act, to make proposals to the Secretary of State:

And whereas more than six weeks has elapsed since those proposals were made:

And whereas the Secretary of State has decided to give effect to the proposals:

Now, therefore, the Secretary of State, in exercise of his powers under sections 51(2) and 67(4) and (5) of that Act and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following order:-

Title and commencement

1. This order may be cited as the North Norfolk (Parishes) Order 1987.

(a) 1972 c.70.

2. - (1) 1st February 1987 is hereby specified as the day on which this order shall come into force for any purpose set out in regulation 4(1) (coming into operation of order) of the Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976 (a).

(2) For all other purposes, this order shall come into force on 1st April 1987.

Interpretation

3. In this order -

"boundary maps" means the 11 maps prepared by the Department of the Environment, marked "Maps of the North Norfolk (Parishes) Order 1987", duly numbered for reference, and deposited in accordance with regulation 5 of the Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976;

"county electoral division" means an electoral division of the county of Norfolk;

"district council" means the North Norfolk District Council; and

"district ward" means a ward of the district of North Norfolk.

Creation of new parishes

4. - (1) There shall be created in the district of North Norfolk three new parishes of High Kelling, Ryburgh and Walsingham.

(2) The new parish of High Kelling shall consist of:

(a) that part of the parish of Bodham which is marked D2 on boundary map 2;

(b) that part of the parish of Holt which is marked D1 on boundary map 2; and

(c) that part of the parish of Kelling which is marked D3 on boundary map 2.

It shall form part of the Bodham district ward.

(3) The new parish of Ryburgh shall consist of the areas of the parishes of Great Ryburgh and Little Ryburgh.

(4) The new parish of Walsingham shall consist of the areas of the parishes of Great Walsingham and Little Walsingham.

Parish councils for the new parishes

5. - (1) There shall be a parish council for each new parish created by article 4.

(2) From 1st April 1987 until the fourth day after the ordinary day of election of councillors in 1987 the new parish council of High Kelling shall consist of those parish councillors representing the parishes of Bodham, Holt and Kelling immediately before 1st April 1987 who reside in the area of the new parish. Thereafter the new parish council of High Kelling shall consist of 7 councillors.

(3) The parish of Walsingham shall be divided into 2 parish wards, to be known as the Great Walsingham ward and the Little Walsingham ward, formed from the areas of the parishes of the same name as constituted before 1st April 1987.

(4) From 1st April 1987 until the fourth day after the ordinary day of election of councillors in 1987 each ward of the parish of Walsingham shall be represented by those parish councillors representing the parish of the same name immediately before 1st April 1987. Thereafter the Great Walsingham ward shall be represented by 5 parish councillors and the Little Walsingham ward shall be represented by 6 parish councillors.

(5) The parish of Ryburgh shall be divided into 2 parish wards, to be known as the Great Ryburgh ward and the Little Ryburgh ward, formed from the areas of the parishes of the same name as constituted before 1st April 1987.

(6) From 1st April 1987 until the fourth day after the ordinary day of elections in 1987 each ward of the parish of Ryburgh shall be represented by those parish councillors representing the parish of the same name immediately

before 1st April 1987. Thereafter the Great Ryburgh ward shall be represented by 6 parish councillors and the Little Ryburgh ward shall be represented by 1 parish councillor.

(7) The proper officer of the district council shall convene -

the first annual meeting of each new parish council; and
the first assembly of the parish meeting for each new parish.

If in any new parish the first assembly of the parish meeting is held before the first annual meeting of the new parish council, the parish meeting for that parish may appoint a person to take the chair, who shall have, for the purpose of that occasion only, the powers and authority of the chairman.

(8) In the financial year beginning on 1st April 1987, the district council shall levy rates in each new parish, and make payments to each new parish council, as if that parish council had issued a precept to the district council requiring the payment of a sum equal to the product of a rate of the amount in the pound set out below, calculated on the total rateable value of the new parish as set out in the valuation list at the beginning of that financial year -

High Kelling	0.7 p
Ryburgh	2.3 p
Walsingham	5.6 p.

Transfers between parishes

6.- (1) Each area marked on the boundary maps as shown in columns 1 and 2 of the Schedule hereto shall be transferred from the relevant parish named in column 3 to that named in column 4.

(2) Where in column 5 there is mentioned in relation to any area -

- (a) a parish ward;
- (b) a district ward; or
- (c) a county electoral division

that area shall additionally be transferred to that ward or division.

Abolition of parishes

7. - (1) The parishes and parish councils of Great Ryburgh and Little Ryburgh shall be abolished. The new parish council of Ryburgh shall be their residuary successor, and shall assume custody of the public books and documents of the abolished parishes.

(2) The parishes and parish trustees of Great Walsingham and Little Walsingham and the grouped parish council of Walsingham shall be abolished. The new parish council of Walsingham shall be their residuary successor and shall assume custody of the public books and documents of the abolished parishes.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the order)

This order affects parishes in the district of North Norfolk, by

- (a) creating 3 new parishes and parish councils of High Kelling, Ryburgh and Walsingham;
- (b) transferring areas between parishes; and
- (c) abolishing the parishes of Great Ryburgh, Little Ryburgh, Great Walsingham, and Little Walsingham.

The map forming part of this note (page 10) gives a general guide to the areas affected by this order as from 1st April 1987.

Prints of the detailed boundary maps, which are referred to in article 3, may be inspected at the offices of North Norfolk District Council and may be inspected at or purchased from the Department of the Environment's Map Library, 2 Marsham Street, London SW1P 3EB.

The new parishes will each have approximately the area population, and rateable value shown below -

New parish	Area (hectares)	Population	Rateable value
High Kelling	148	587	£61,000.
Ryburgh	1004	480	£80,609.
Walsingham	1898	993	£90,339.

Consequential changes to local government electoral areas are made.

The Local Government Area Changes Regulations 1976, mentioned in articles 2(1) and 3, contain further provisions about the effect and implementation of orders such as the present one.
