

### PANDEMIC PROTOCOLS

Today Nova Scotia is the only jurisdiction in Canada able to hold an *in-person* Commemorative Service in Honour of His Royal Highness The Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh.

With this in mind, in the interest of your safety and in accordance with public health directives, please adhere to the following guidelines:

- We encourage you to participate by singing the various hymns and anthems, however you must keep your mask in place

- Once the service has concluded, you will be asked to depart in an orderly, socially-distanced fashion
- Your contact details will be retained for the requisite period of time for the purposes of contact tracing

### TERRITORIAL ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

Through the *Treaty of Peace and Friendship of 1725* and subsequent Treaties, the connection between the Mi'kmaq people and the Crown was formalized, and it remains a foundational aspect of modern Canada.

This kinship and connection endures through the special relationship that exists between the Queen of Canada and the Mi'kmaq people.
