#### Re: Hybrid Hearing on "Moving Beyond the Coronavirus Crisis: The Biden Administration's Progress in Combating the Pandemic and Plan for the Next Phase"

On <u>Wednesday, March 30, 2022, at 10:00 a.m. E.T.</u>, the Select Subcommittee on the Coronavirus Crisis will hold a hybrid hearing on "Moving Beyond the Coronavirus Crisis: The Biden Administration's Progress in Combating the Pandemic and Plan for the Next Phase."

This hearing will convene in person in 2154 Rayburn House Office Building and remotely using Zoom, which has been approved by the House, at the discretion of the Chairman, the witnesses, and other Members.
