# REVISED TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS GUIDELINES AND QUARANTINE CLASSIFICATIONS

Relative to: (1) IATF-MEID Resolution Nos. 160-B and 160-D dated 03 and 10 February 2022; and (2) IATF-MEID Resolution No. 164-A dated 10 March 2022, please be advised of the following revised travel restrictions guidelines and quarantine classifications, effective immediately:

### I. FOR ARRIVING FILIPINO NATIONALS

All arriving Filipino nationals shall register with One Health Pass prior to arrival in the country.

<b>Documentary and Quarantine Requirements</b>	
1. FOR FULLY VACCINATED EXLIPINO NATIONALS	a. Negative RT-PCR test taken within forty-eight (48) hours, or a negative laboratory based Antigen Test taken within twenty-four (24) hours, prior to departure from country or origin/first port of embarkation, excluding layovers, PROVIDED, the passenger has not left the airport premises or was not admitted into the transit country; AND b. Seven (7) days self-monitoring for symptoms (date of armal being the first day)
2. FOR UNIVACCINATED, PARTIALLY UNIVACCINATED OR FILIPINO NATIONALS WHOSE VACCINATION STATUS CANNOT RE VALIDATED	<ul> <li>Negative RT-PCR test taken within forty-eight (46) hours, or a negative laboratory based prior to departure from country of orign/first port of embarkation, excluding layovers, PROVIDED, the passenger has not left the airport premises or was not admitted into the transit country.</li> <li>Facility-based quarantine until release of negative RT-PCR test taken on the \$\frac{12}{2} \text{day} \text{AND}\$</li> <li>C. 3. FOR <u>UNVACCINATED MINOR</u> FILIPINO NATIONALS	a. Unvaccinated Filipino nationals below 12 years of age shall follow quarantine protocols of their parents or accompanying adultifurations traveling with them; b. Filipino nationals from 12 years to 17 years of age shall follow quarantine requirements relative to their vaccination status. Foreign or Filipino parents should accompany their unaccinated minor children during facility-based quarantine.
4. FOR FULLY-RECOVERED FILIPINO NATIONALS WITH POSITIVE RT-PCR PRE- DEPARTURE TEST RESULTS	Pre-departure Requirements     Positive RT-PCR test taken not earlier than 10 days but not later than 30 days prior to

departure from country of origin/port of embarkation:

- Positive RT-PCR test taken within forty-eight (48) hours prior to departure from country of origin/first port of embarkation, excluding lavovers. PROVIDED, the passenger has not left the airport premises or was not admitted into the transit country: AND
- Medical certificate issued by licensed physician stating that the Filipino: (i) was asymptomatic, mild, moderate, severe or critical case of COVID-19, as the case may be; (ii) has completed the mandatory isolation period; (iii) is no longer infectious; AND (iv) has been allowed free movement and travel.

#### b. Quarantine Requirements

- · For fully vaccinated 7 days selfmonitoring for symptoms (date of arrival being the first day):
- · For unvaccinated, partially vaccinated, or vaccination status cannot be determined - (1)facility-based guarantine until release of negative RT-PCR test taken on the 5th day; and (2) home quarantine until the 14th day (date of arrival being the first day)

#### II. FOR ARRIVING FOREIGN NATIONALS

**Documentary and Quarantine Requirements** 

1. Former Filipino citizens with Balikbayan privilege under Republic Act No. 91741, including their spouse and/or children traveling with them to the Philippines: PROVIDED, they are not restricted nationals:

Citizen/national of countries2 allowed to a stay not exceeding thirty (30) days per Executive Order No. 408, s. 1960, as amended; OR

A. Foreign Nationals Entering the Philippines Visa-Free

Holders of Hong Kong Special Administrative Region or Macau SAR passports are entitled to stay for a period not exceeding fourteen (14) days

- 2. Fully vaccinated, except for minor children below 12 years of age travelling with their fullyvaccinated foreign parent/s;
- 3. Possess acceptable proof of vaccination;
- 4. With negative RT-PCR test taken within fortyeight (48) hours, or a negative laboratory based

Antigen Test taken within twenty-four (24) hours, prior to departure from country of origin/first port of embarkation, excluding layovers, PROVIDED, the passenger has not left the airport premises or was not admitted into the transit country:

 With <u>valid return ticket</u> to port of origin or next port of destination not later than 30 days from date of arrival in the country;

With passport valid for at least six (6) months at the time of entry;

 With travel insurance for COVID-19 treatment costs, with a minimum coverage of USD35,0000.00 for the duration of stay in the Philippines; and

7 days self-monitoring for symptoms (date of arrival being the first day).

 Unvaccinated foreign children below 12 years of age, traveling with Filipino parent/s, shall follow health and quarantine protocols of Filipino parent/s traveling with them;
 Foreign children from 12 years to 17 years of

age, traveling with Filipino parent/s, shall follow health and quarantine requirements relative to their vaccination status. Foreign or Filipino parents should accompany their unvaccinated minor children during facility-based quarantine.

 Foreign nationals coming from visa-required countries or restricted countries shall secure an entry exemption document (EED) and must meet the following requirements:

 Fully vaccinated, except for minor children below 12 years of age travelling with their fully-vaccinated parent/s;

2. Possess acceptable proof of vaccination;

 With <u>negative RT-PCR test</u> taken within fortyeight (48) hours, prior to departure from country of origin/first port of embarkation, excluding layovers, PROVIDED, the passenger has not left the airport premises or was not admitted into the transit country; AMD

7 days self-monitoring for symptoms (date of arrival being the first day).

b. - 4. With valid return ticket to port of origin or next port of destination not later than 30 days from date of arrival in the country:
- 5. With passport valid for at least six (6) months at the time of entry:
- 6. With travel insurance for COVID-19 treatment costs, with a minimum coverage of USD35.0000.00 for the duration of stay in the Philippines: and
- 7. 7 days self-monitoring for symptoms (date of arrival being the first day).

\*Fully vaccinated foreign nationals covered under this Section who fail to present acceptable proof of vaccination shall be subjected to:(1) facility-based quarantine until release of negative RT-PCR test taken on the 5th day; and (2) home guarantine until the 14th day (date of arrival being the first day).

Foreign nationals with valid and existing visas other than 9A visas may be allowed entry subject to the following:

- 1. Fully vaccinated;
- 2. Possess acceptable proof of vaccination:
- 3. 7 days self-monitoring for symptoms (date of arrival being the first day):
- 4. Not fully vaccinated individuals under this category shall be denied entry; and
- 5. Fully vaccinated foreign nationals covered under this Section who fail to present acceptable proof of vaccination shall be subjected to: (1) facilitybased guarantine until release of negative RT-PCR test taken on the 5th day; and (2) home quarantine until the 14th day (date of arrival being the first day).

#### III. VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS

A. Basis of Full Vaccination Status	Received 2"d dose (2-dose series) or single dose vaccine more than 14 days prior to arrival in the country;     Vaccine is included in any of the following:
	Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) List of Compassionate Special Permit (CSP) issue by the Philippine Food and Druit Administration; OR     Emergency Use Listing of the World Health Organization
B. Proof of Vaccination	World Health Organization Internations Certificates of Vaccination and Prophylaxis;     VaxCertPH;     National/state digital certificate of the foreig government which has accepted VaxCertPl under a reciprocal arrangement unles otherwise permitted by IATF; OR     Other proofs of vaccination permitted by IATF.

#### IV. AIRLINE RESPONSIBILITY

Fraudulent and/or unverified vaccine certification, and passengers non-compliance with insurance requirements shall be the liability of airline carriers.

Existing guidelines for arriving Section 9(e) visa holders and crew member/s shall still be observed.

The foregoing is without prejudice to the exercise of the mandate of the Bureau of Immigration in Arrival and Departure formalities.
