Course Structure

One year LL.M Program in Corporate Laws and IPR Laws

NLUJ offers One-Year LL.M degree programme in 2 specialized branches of Law namely Corporate Laws and IPR Laws. The LL.M programme aims at disseminating a wider knowledge of contemporary developments in and applicability of laws in specialized scenarios and also encourages the post-graduate students to identify and carve out *au courant* approaches to the study of law.

Course Structure

The LL.M. programme is based on semester system with general and specialized courses offered in each semester. The second semester constitutes Dissertation writing which sees its initiation in the first semester itself and helps the student build the citadel of his/her own specialised learning. The programme seeks to build legal scholarship for the future in diverse arenas of law.
