
RUDOLPH ELLIS DEAD.

President of the Fidelity Trust Company of Philadelphia; Was 78.

PHILADELPHIA, Sept. 22.—Rudolph Ellis, a Director of the Pennsylvania Railroad Company and prominent in financial circles of Philadelphia and New York, died at his home at Bryn Mawr today. He was 78 years old. Mr. Ellis was a Director in the Pennsylvania Railroad for twelve years, President of the Fidelity Trust Company of Philadelphia, and was interested in many financial institutions as Director and otherwise in Philadelphia and New York.

He was born in Elkton, Md., and was a son of Francis A. and Eliza Howard Ellis. At the outbreak of the civil war Mr. Ellis enlisted in the First Troop, Philadelphia City Cavalry, and was mustered out in December, 1864, as a Captain. Mr. Ellis was Pennsylvania Commander of the Loyal Legion and President of the Radnor Hunt Club. His wife survives him.
