

Warner Baxter Dies at 62; Vega Caravan Nicholas A. Denn to Be Honored by Legion Post

Original Film 'Cisco Kid' Sets Election

Beverly Hills, Calif.—(AP)—Death has stopped the horrible pain which handsome Warner Baxter, 62, the movie's original Cisco Kid, suffered for years. The suave, virile matinee idol died last night at his home.

For years he had suffered from arthritis, the pain of which was so great that he was unable to eat. It also created a vitamin deficiency and the combination brought on slow starvation.

Three weeks ago, a lobotomy (brain operation) was performed to lessen the pain. Bronchial pneumonia set into hasten the end.

Won Second Oscar
Baxter was the second actor ever to win the top Academy award Oscar—and a scared jack-rabbit was responsible.

In 1928, Raoul Walsh, the famed director, was both directing and playing the top role of the Cisco Kid in the first outdoor all-talking picture "In Old Arizona."

While he was driving home from location scenes in Zion Canyon, Utah, the headlights on Walsh's car frightened a jack-rabbit. It jumped and crashed through the windshield, blinding Walsh's right eye.

Baxter replaced him in the role. Both the picture and Baxter won 1929 Oscars. Emil Jannings had won the first male acting Oscar the year previous.

Favorite Role
Although Baxter was one of Hollywood's top stars before and after the 1929 award, he always considered the Cisco Kid his favorite role.

Baxter's first movie role was in 1916 with Ethel Clayton in "Her Own Money." Before that he had been an office boy, an insurance salesman, a dancer and a juvenile lead in stock companies.

He broke into show business in 1910 in his native city of Columbus, Ohio, when a dancer broke his ankle. He stayed in the theater thereafter except for brief excursions as a salesman.

In 1913 he joined a stock company in Tulsa, Okla.

Better Known Pictures
Among his better known pictures were "Daddy Long Legs," "The Cisco Kid," "42nd Street," "Broadway Bill," "The Great Gatsby," "Kidnaped," and "Under the Pampas Moon."

Long a favorite, his \$284,000 income in 1936 was the industry's highest.

In recent years, he played "Dr. Ordway" in the "Crime Doctor" series but the movies soon became a sideline to real estate and other business interests.

He was married in 1911 to Viola Caldwell of Philadelphia but the marriage lasted only a short time. In January 1951 he and his second wife, former actress Winifred Bryson, observed their 33rd wedding anniversary.

She was with him when death came. He also leaves his mother, Mrs. Jane Baxter.

Herbert Marshall, 60, In Critical Condition

Hollywood—(AP)—Actor Herbert Marshall, 60, critically ill with a pulmonary embolism, was reported improved today at Cedars of Lebanon Hospital.

The British actor entered the hospital Apr. 29 for a minor hernia operation. He developed the embolism (blood clot) after surgery and was placed in an oxygen tent. The hospital called his condition better, but said he's still on the critical list.
