NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

On Thursday, March 24, 1983, at
4:30 p.m. the New York City Transit
Authority will hold a public hearing
on proposed service changes on the
IRT division of the New York City
Rapid Transit System. The proposed
changes would affect the IRT No. 2,
No. 3 No. 4 and No. 5 services.

These changes are recommended to
provide better service to the ma-
jority of our riders; a dedicated
fleet for each line; an easily accessi-
ble maintenance barn for each ser-
vice; and reduced non-revenue
passenger car mileage. The en-
hancement of the No. 2 and No. 3
southern terminals will allow the
Authority to dedicate the No. 3
fleet to the Livonia Barn and the
No. 2 fleet to the 239th Street In-
spection Barn with a minimum of
car miles. These barns, formerly
trouble locations, opened as inspec-
tion barns on January 10, 1983.
Changing the No. 2 and No. 3 ser-
vices necessitates changes on the
No. 4 and No. 5 lines to provide
balanced service to all riders.

The following IRT Division service
changes have been recommended:

No. 2 AND No. 3 LINES
CURRENT OPERATION
The No. 2 Line runs from 241st
Street and White Plains Road to
New Lots Avenue at all times.
The No. 3 Lines runs from 148th
Street and Lenox Avenue to:
—Flatbush Avenue, except late
PM's and Midnights.
—135th Street and Lenox Avenue,
late PM's and Midnights.

RECOMMENDED OPERATION
The No. 2 Line will operate from
241st Street and White Plains Road
to Flatbush Avenue at all times.
The No. 3 Line will operate from
148th Street and Lenox Avenue to:
—New Lots Avenue, except late
PM's and Midnights.
—135th Street and Lenox Avenue,
late PM's and Midnights (same as
existing).

No. 4 AND No. 5 LINES
CURRENT OPERATION
The No. 4 Lines runs from
Woodlawn to:
—Flatbush Avenue, Rush Hours
—Atlantic Avenue, Middays
—Utica Avenue, PM's
—Flatbush Avenue, late PM's and
Midnights.

The No. 5 Line runs from Dyre
Avenue to:
—Utica Avenue, Rush Hours
—Atlantic Avenue, Middays
—Bowling Green, PM's
—East 180th Street, Midnights

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RECOMMENDED OPERATION
The No. 4 Line will operate from
Woodlawn to:

—Utica Avenue, Rush Hours
—New Lots Avenue, late PM's and
Midnights
—Atlantic Avenue, Middays (same
as existing)
—Utica Avenue, PM's (same as
existing)

The No. 5 Line will run from Dyre
Avenue to:
—Flatbush Avenue, Rush Hours
—Atlantic Avenue, Middays (same
as existing)
—Bowling Green, PM's (same as
existing)
—East 180th Street, Midnights
(same as existing)

Train lengths along the Flatbush
Avenue route during rush hours will
increase from 9 to 10 cars. This will
ease passenger loading warranted
by the heavier ridership on the Flat-
bush route compared to the New
Lots route. Train length along the
New Lots Avenue route will
decrease from 10 to 9 cars. We will
still maintain acceptable passenger
comfort levels on the New Lots line
while providing greater overall
comfort levels to all IRT Brooklyn
riders.

The hearing will be held at the 3rd
floor Court Room (hearing room) at
209 Joralemon Street in the
Borough of Brooklyn.

Access for the handicapped is
available to the hearing room.
Registration for speakers will be
open from 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.

All presentations will be limited to 5
minutes. Written Testimony for
incorporation in the record will be
accepted by the Assistant Secretary
no later than the closing of the
hearing.

Those wishing to be heard must

or in person at the hearing. It is
