An association of Canadian Personal Managers has been formed with Don Hunter elected president. Other officers elected were Bernie Finkelstein, Chairman; Leonard T. Rambeau, vice-president; and Bruce Bell as secretary-treasurer.

The Association was formed to bring about a better understanding of and protection for artists and groups and, as an Association, creates a very powerful bloc within the industry. It is hoped the Association will be representative of the whole personal management industry from coast to coast in Canada. A spokesman for the Association has stated that: "Through unified efforts

and an exchange of ideas, we hope to improve the quality of Management which will aid in the advancement and development of Canadian performing and recording artists".

The initial meeting of managers coincided with RPM's Communication Eight during which time a strong representation of important managers was in evidence. RATO PUSHES HARD FOR COOPER'S "NEW WORDS"

Vancouver-based Rato Enterprises is making an all out effort to get "New Words for an Old Song" by Tony Cooper established on Canada's airwaves. The single appears on

Rato's Dorado Records label and is currently distributed by mail order through German-language newspapers in this country. Rato head, Rudi Peichert, is currently seeking a distribution agreement for Dorado product.

Cooper, a Canadian-Maori resident of Vancouver, has met considerable contemporary success with his two Dorado albums, the first of which was distributed by London Records, and numerous singles. Cooper has toured widely, including Europe and the United States, and sings in many languages including English, Maori, German and Spanish. Several of his discs have been re-issued in Europe through a West German distributor with considerable success.

Cooper's current album, "Small Town Blues", is now a big item on adult contemporary stations in Canada and Europe, according to Peichert. The album features a lavish production, enhanced by the inclusion on many of the cuts of the string section of the Berlin Symphony.

Cooper's material is written by Peichert and published by Rato Music (BMI).

BERGLER FOOTLOOSE ON VANCOUVER SCENE

David Bergler, until this fall Capitol Records' western promotion representative, is now back in Vancouver following a Volkswagen camper tour through Canada and the United States.

Bergler, a Detroitian, joined Capitol Canada originally in the Ontario region, having served with Capitol in the United States. He was transferred to the western region in the fall of 1972.

THUNDERMUG/TELFER RECEIVE AXE PUSH

Axe recording unit, Thundermug, have just completed a successful week at Toronto's Gasworks to be followed by a series of dates in Ontario. Wallaceburg has been set for March 29 followed by a week at Duffy's Tavern in Hamilton (Apr. 1-6). That following Monday (18) they will headline a Victory Theatre (Toronto) engagement with Nazareth. Other dates include Centennial College/Scarborough (18), Huntsville (19) and Niagara Falls (26).

The Axe people are launching a national promotion push along with London Records on a new album by Jay Telfer. London's promotion rep (Ontario), Jim Macdonald and Axe have arranged an opening night press party for Telfer's week at Egerton's (1-8). In-store displays, plays and promotions will be given an added boost with radio station advertising.

PETER CLARKE RELEASES ON NEW P.L.P LABEL

A new Calgary-based label, P.L.P. moves into the recording field with a single release by Peter Clarke. Both sides of the single, "Writing This Song For You" and "Sharing Our Love Together" are Clarke originals through P.L.P. Publishing-BMI. The session was produced by Paul Palaschuk, P.L.P. general manager, at Edmonton's Century II Studio. Les Bateman, studio manager, handled the board chores with Ray Sikora and Kurt Watts looking after string and horn arrangements respectively.

A total of six Clarke originals were laid down at the session which will be the basis for an album session to take place at a later date.

Palaschuk is currently negotiating the signing of several other Canadian acts to his label. Distribution is handled through Musimart Limited of Montreal.

days of the winter in Montreal. The studios, located in Old Montreal, in a building more than five hundred years old, had a heating malfunction during the recording which made the temperature in the studios plunge to 10 degrees below.

Undaunted by the cold and with a great desire to complete his first album, Wall and his producer Dougie Trineer along with the studio staff and musicians stayed on into the early morning and the completion of "Introducing The Singing Newfoundlander Michael T. Wall".

Wall, who will marry Sandra Dianne Roxborough in a Toronto ceremony (April 27), has been a part of the music industry for several years and has gained a great following throughout Eastern Canada, particularly on the penitentiary circuit. A big plus for the Newfoundlander and for Rodeo Records is the number of Newfoundlanders living in Toronto alone — an estimated 65,000, which should make for heavy record sales.

SUN TO TOUR WITH STAND-IN

Sun, the Vancouver group managed by Stan Cayer of SGM Records, will tour Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba and Northern Ontario in the near future, despite the loss of the services of drummer, Al Brodie who was hospitalized following a recent automobile accident. Rather than cancel or postpone the tour, Cayer has

The Juno Awards

Well over 1,500 people spilled into the Centennial Ballroom, Inn On The Park, Toronto, on March 25th to watch the annual RPM Weekly Juno Awards presentation.

The well-organized event, hosted by CFRB's George Wilson and arranged by RPM's special projects co-ordinator Stan Klees, at times resembled a victory party for triple award winners Murray McLauchlan and Terry Jacks. Jacks picked up awards for Canadian Male Vocalist, Canadian Contemporary Single (Hit Parade) for "Seasons In The Sun" and Canadian Pop Music Single (MOR) for "Seasons In The Sun"; while McLauchlan was awarded Canadian Country single for "Farmer's Song", Canadian Composer and Canadian Folk Single for "Farmer's Song". McLauchlan also received the Canadian Independent Label (Record Label) award on behalf of True North Records.

Following these two trendsetters with two awards each were: Anne Murray — Canadian Female Vocalist and Canadian Pop Music Album (MOR) ("Danny's Song"); Stompin' Tom Connors—Canadian Country Vocalist (Male) and Canadian Country Album ("To It and At It"); and Bachman-Turner Over-

drive — Canada's Most Promising Group and Canadian Contemporary Album (Hit Parade) for "Bachman-Turner Overdrive."

Single awards were presented to: Lighthouse (Canadian Group Of The Year); Valdy (Canadian Folksinger of the Year); Ian Thomas (Canada's Most Promising Male Vocalist); Cathy Young (Most Promising Female Vocalist); Dave Nicol (Most Promising Folksinger); Shirley Eikhard (Canadian Country Vocalist (Female)); The Mercey Brothers (Country Group); and Gordon Lightfoot (Canadian Folk Album) for "Old Dan's Records".

Company awards were presented to: GRT of Canada Ltd. (Canadian Content Company); A&M Records Of Canada Ltd. (Canadian Record Company of the Year in Promotional Activities); and WEA Music of Canada Ltd. (Top Record Company of the Year — Manufacturer and Distributor).

The Honourable Stanley Haidasz, Minister of State Multiculturalism, assisted by Mrs. Douglas McGowan, presented Alexander Zelkin with the CHIN Radio-created McGowan Award — a painting by Joseph Sanchez titled "The Apparitions of the Virgin of Light".

An interesting aspect of the Juno Awards evening was the presenters themselves were entertainers. Also the night's musical theme played by the 20-piece orchestra was written by Stan Klees. The title of the piece is "Stars In The North."

The Juno party was a fitting close to three days of industry activities at the Inn On The Park.

C8, held on Saturday, was the best attended and most interesting of all RPM communication meets. The speakers Judy LaMarsh, Marshall McLuhan, Dr. Tom Turicchi, Art Sinclair and Kal Rudman each provided some very interesting commentary on the entertainment business.

Rudman, in particular, sounded the note for the three day fest. He said: "If I was getting started in the record industry today I think I'd head for Canada. This is really where it's

at. This is the Old West in music."

Dr. Tom Turicchi, of Perception, a Houston-based firm which studies records and radio stations', dropped a "bombshell" when he noted that tests on CHED (Edmonton) and CKLG (Vancouver) indicated that Cancon records were showing up as a problem. "Of the turkeys", he explained, "most of them were Canadian records. I don't know how to put this nice. Of the 10% that were problem records 90% of them were Canadian records. It's a serious problem."

Questions from the C8 audience (approximately 480) showed that registrants were better informed than in the past and keenly interested in the future of Canadian product at home and on U.S. charts.

C8 was a pit stop for Cancon interests. It provided none of the dulling 30% Cancon talk of previous meets and very little of the pessimism of the earlier meetings. If anything, it produced a better understanding of the music medium and a toughened attitude toward Canadian product and Canadian business practices. Once again the company hospitality suites, held open for most of the weekend, provided the setting for in-depth dialogues and new meetings.

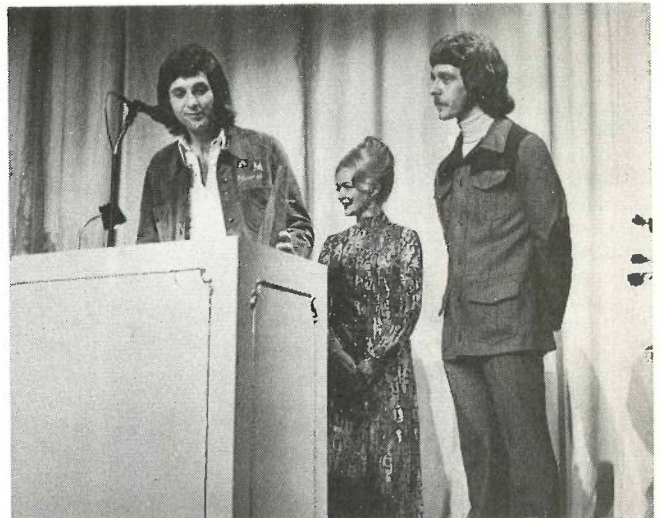

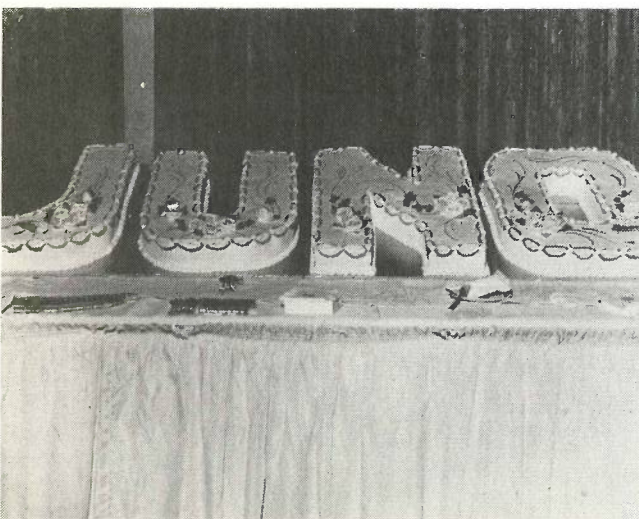

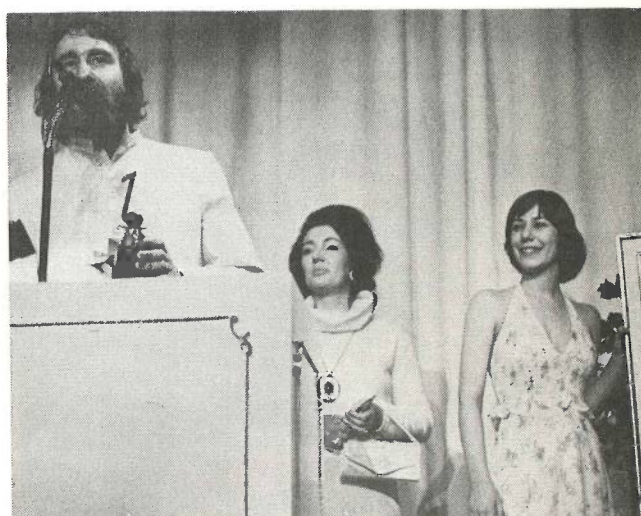

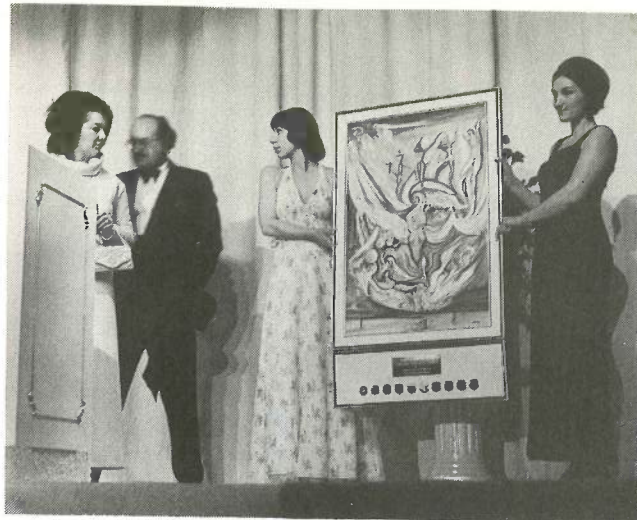

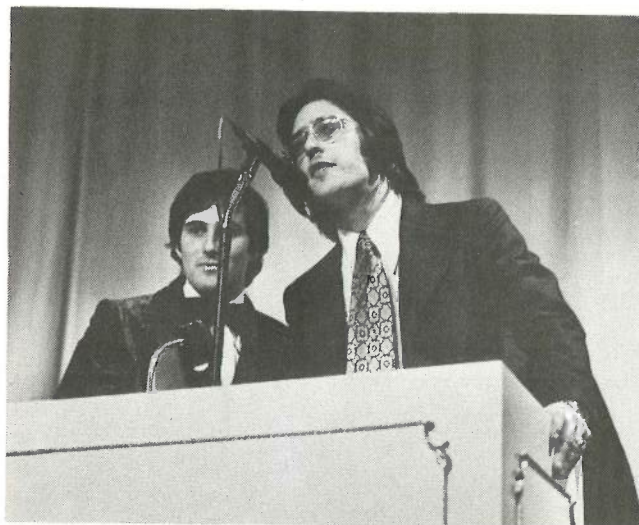

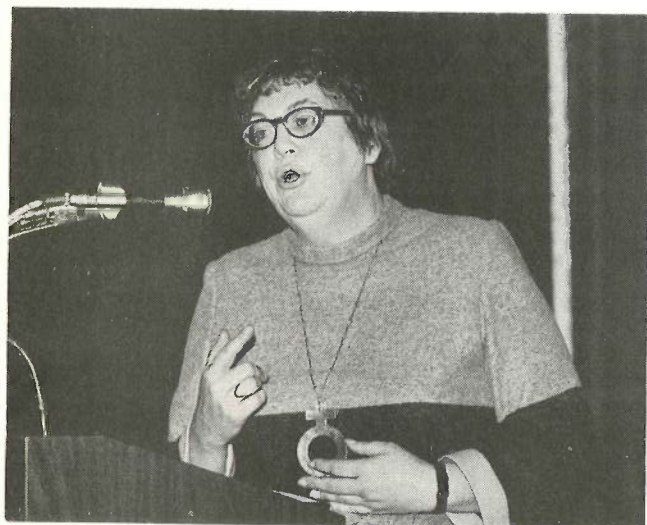

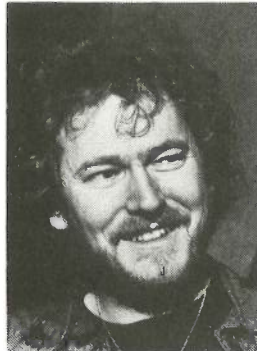

The Juno Awards

My reaction to C8 and the Juno Awards was, paradoxically, one of elation and disappointment.

C8, to my mind, was a tremendous success. The speakers were both well chosen and well qualified to comment on the various subjects with which they "put us on".

Of particular interest were the comments of Kal Rudman whose frank-to-the-point discussion of the American industry helped point out the greater need for a professional, business-like attitude in our own. If we really hope to develop a viable Canadian enterprise, surely we must take the risks necessary to create enough activity to justify a domestic effort.

The large turnout from all sectors of the industry, as well as the many companies that opened up hospitality suites, indicates a definite increase in, and concern for, the development of the Canadian music scene. It shows the new maturity and growth. But more important, the various complimentary segments of the industry are finally starting to get results by learning more about each other, and how to use each other's resources.

Frankly, we can be proud to have progressed to the point where we have to nit-pick to find criticism. The movie on Sunday night was a good idea, though somewhat dated, and perhaps the quadrophonic demonstration on Saturday would have been better presented as a separate exhibit. My only disappointment is that we did not realize earlier our potential to create an industry of consequence.



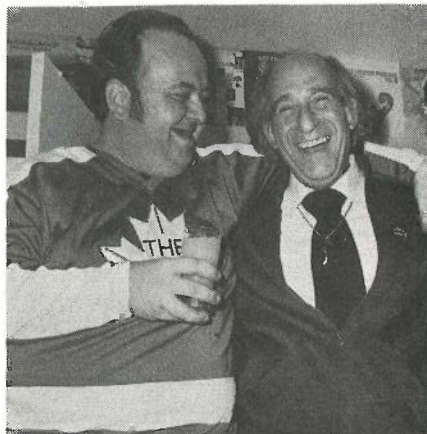
C8/Juno co-ordinator Stan Klees flanked by Judy LaMarsh and Marshall McLuhan.

The presentation of the Juno Awards clearly illustrates the level we have reached as an industry. There was a wide range of categories representing industry activity, and its variety gave a fair indication of the successes we have achieved, individually and collectively. The large turnout was particularly impressive. It showed that the Juno Awards mean something to a lot of people in and out of the industry, and that they are an important, permanent segment of our industry.

Perhaps because of their importance, we should take more care in the future over logistics. The hall was much too small for the number of invited guests, which included a large number of non-industry people. Their interest was gratifying, but

certainly the Juno nominees and winners should be allowed to enjoy their evening without being subjected to autograph hunters.

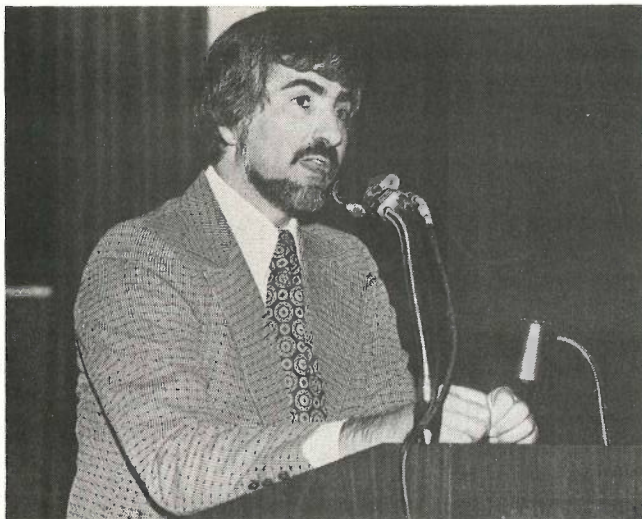
On at least two occasions during the evening, nominees were chosen to present awards in their own categories. Win or lose, it was an embarrassing dilemma. The Juno Awards Night is a gala affair. There should be a tension and a drama in the air. A build-up in the order of awards, reaching a climax at the end of the evening will better reflect the consequence of the event. An abrupt ending tends to diminish its significance.

I cannot comment on the winners (who are justly so), but perhaps we should be more careful in their selection. I feel strongly that the industry should know the qualifications for balloting, the number of people voting, and which segments and proportions of the industry they represent. If the Junos are to be truly meaningful, a great deal of the meaning lies in the selection as well as the winners.

I have great expectations for this industry. I wait, eager, yet impatient, for the thrust to come.

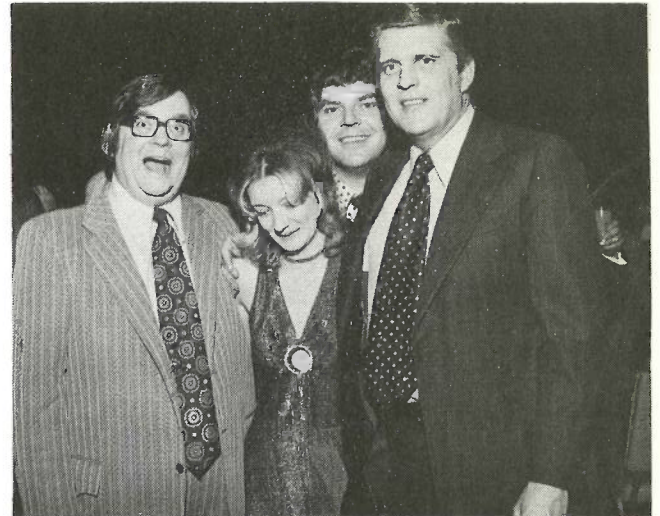

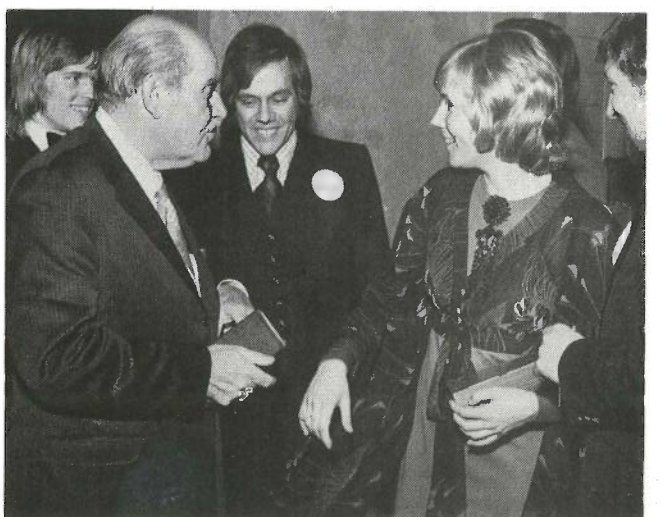

The Juno Awards

Before we get into any discussions of the proceedings at the Inn On The Park on the weekend of March 23 which culminated in the presenting of the Juno Awards on the following Monday night, let me first say that over the last year I have been one of the more persistent critics of both the awards system in Canada and of portions of RPM's editorial tact in general.

My feelings have not changed significantly in the past month or two and you may well ask what I am doing taking up valuable white space in the current issue of RPM? Well, the best answer for that is, I was truly impressed by the goings-on and got quite caught up in the aura of excitement that surrounded the whole event. For this reason, I was sufficiently moved to come back and put a few observations on paper.

There is no doubt that this year's Communication 8 was productive. In the three days and with one of the largest gatherings of Canadian music industry personnel from all parts of the country in attendance, the meet lived up to its title. Communication was the key word for the whole affair and many people took time to meet some of the new

faces, renew old acquaintances and made plans to see each other more often in the coming year. Above all it brought together representatives from all across Canada and for many it was good to meet the faces behind the voice or handwriting of the people that they talk to on the telephone or correspond with the rest of the year.

The managers of many of Canada's top artists chose the occasion to establish an association which will no doubt have far-reaching effects on the industry in the coming year. The C8 atmosphere was conducive to this and from all reports, the Canadian Personal Managers Association was launched in the spirit of true cooperation and with an uncharacteristic absence of bellyaching about the troubles besetting the managerial fraternity in this country. The CPMA will be of invaluable assistance as a consulting body to any awards program that might be set up next year and certainly as representatives of the artists, their impacts on any plans involving their acts will be close to "veto-power" proportions.

If it's highlights that I am trying to bring out here then surely the presentation of the first "McGowan Award" on the Juno's night presented by CHIN Radio International to the person who contributed the most in the past year to the cause of multiculturalism in Canada was significant.

Multiculturalism has always been Canada's heritage and though it has led to a sense of lack as far as a true Canadian identity goes, it is one of the attitudes that this country can be truly proud of.

When Murray McLauchlan accepted his first Juno Award of the night be noted, "We are human beings first, citizens of the world next and then we are Canadians." Murray may have coined the inscription for future "McGowan Awards".

The Juno Awards are still not ready for television in their present form and the whole event was rushed and totally disorganized. Having the nominees standing on the stage and reading out their own names in many cases indicated an incredible lack of

planning.

My feeling towards the awards (Junos) have not changed. They are a magazine award and cannot be considered anything but that. Before a true industry award can be established — and by stating that I am not excluding the possibility of the Junos being retained as the official industry awards — we have to have more control over the voters. My suggestion is to set an academy of recording arts in Canada to which all eligible voters would have to be registered. There has to be a limit on how many votes a particular company can have besides regional limits. Let's say that one of the major labels has 100 subscriptions spread out through their organization in Canada and another has 50, I don't need a crystal ball to tell me in whose favour the odds are. This awards set up could become a battle of magazine subscriptions.

What about the many consumers that must have subscriptions to RPM? Should they be eligible to vote in what is now an industry award?

Where was the representation from the French market at the Junos? The market in Quebec the last time I looked was 35% of the whole Canadian industry. It is a large segment to omit.

These are a few of the areas in which there has to be improvements made and the improvement does not lie in the CRIA's plan to set up an awards program which would culminate in a one hour special produced in the confines of a television studio. The last thing Canada needs at the moment is another Miss Teen Canada Pageant.

I'm sure that these are some of the things that will be settled in the next year and will end with an awards program that is truly indicative of what the Canadian music industry as a whole is feeling. Enough said.

What above all will I remember when I look back to this year's Communications 8? Of course, there was the National Film

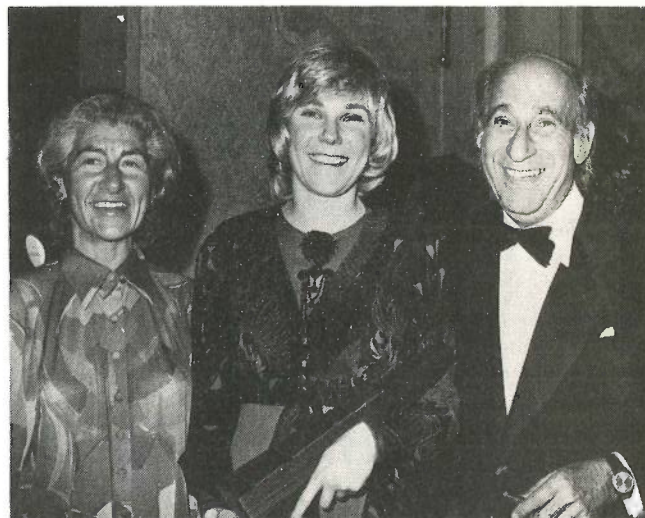

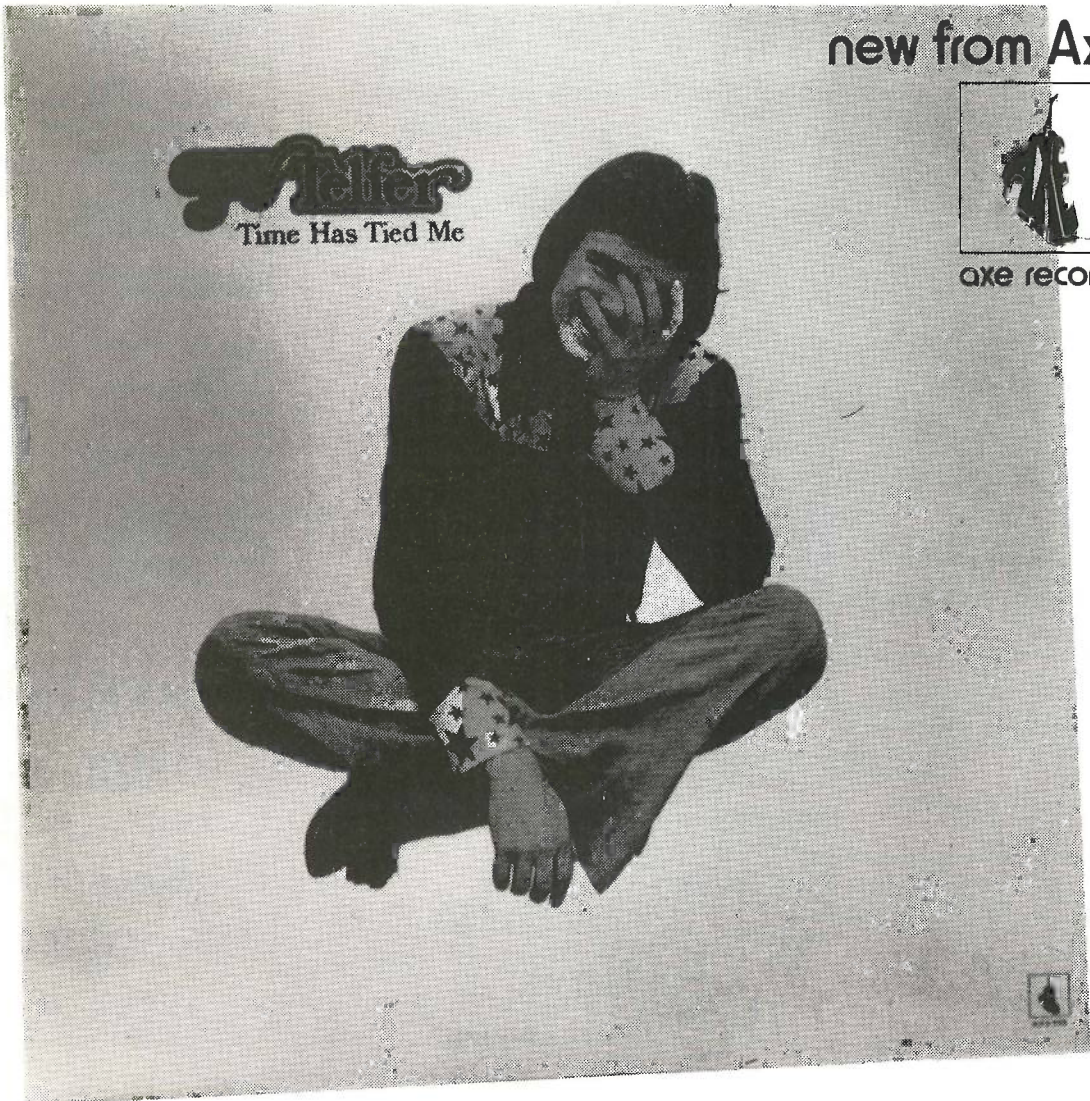

BRUCE MARSH DEAD AFTER DRAMATIC WAIT

CBC announcer Bruce Marsh died Monday, March 18 after a dramatic search for a suitable heart donor. He died in his hotel room in Los Angeles waiting word from the Stanford Medical Centre that a donor had been found.

Marsh, a native of Hamilton, had an extensive career in broadcasting. His first position was at CFPA in Port Arthur, later moving on to radio in Woodstock and Ottawa. Marsh joined CBC Winnipeg in 1952. In 1955, he moved to Toronto to become a well-known news reader on "Metro News" for over a decade. He also worked on the Phil Nimmons show and the Juliette show and covered many special events such as the royal tours of 1957 and 1959 and the federal elections of 1957 and 1958. His last position was with the program "Concern" which he had to leave in 1973 due to ill health. Marsh was probably best known as the voice of Kraft Foods and other national accounts.

Oddly enough, he died a year to the day doctors told him a transplant was needed to save his life. The CBC "Man Alive" series will feature an interview April 8th with Marsh, recorded just before his death.

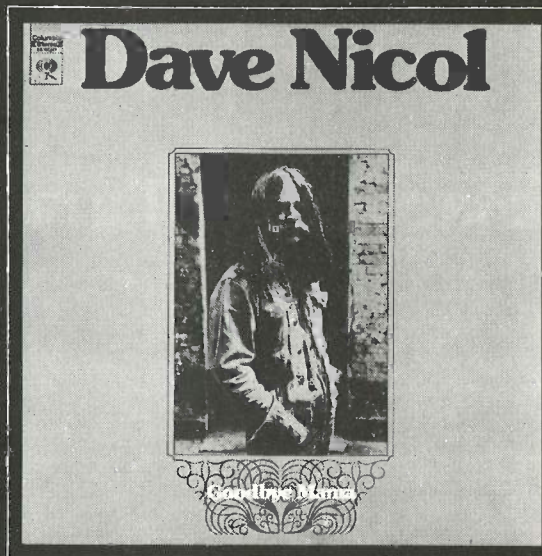

ing while listening to McLuhan's own mind drift, and made you wish you had paid attention to the arguments leading up to these mind-blowers. With regard to broadcasting, the McLuhanism for the evening was "the user is the content". And we'll leave it at that.

Ms. Judy LaMarsh was sharp. No one really won an argument with her. Points were made but she always seemed to have the last word. Her basic stand on broadcasting was a noble one, and also the same as that of the government: "The airwaves belong to the people". I doubt whether any of the four hundred and eighty in the audience of the Park Ballroom disagreed with that stand. All have the interest of the people at heart, except different factions have different ways of getting at that heart. The industry programs for ratings - the government programs for votes. Both perspectives may be over-simplified - surely each contains the elements of social consciousness somewhere. But the hypocritical arguments rage on.....

One of the most stimulating speakers was Dr. Tom Turicchi. He has a method of wiring people to test their psycho-physical responses to a particular record and, for that matter, a particular radio station and the elements therein. He says he is ninety percent accurate. Most of those in attendance were fascinated but it was obvious there were those who were frightened as well.

And then there was the dramatic presentation of Kal Rudman. Reaction to this legendary Cagney-ish figure in the music industry ranged from people laughing or leaving the room in disgust, to transfexion on every word. He takes his role seriously, as do many others in regarding him. His comments hit home several times.

A more detailed report on some of these people, what they had to say and the industry reaction will be forthcoming.

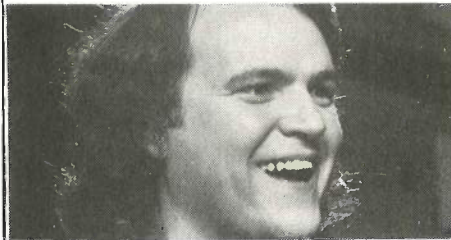

Board presentation of the movie, "Rock-A-Bye" which led to one particular A&R director and a producer to consider purchasing one way tickets to Tierra del Fuego — there haven't been that many red faces in one place since the Iroquois held their powwows in this area three hundred years ago.

Then there was the Burton Cummings-Maclean and Maclean minstrel show, which moved downtown to the El Mocambo for a week's engagement after C8; Don Hunter leading raids on the Hospitality suites; the look on Bernie Finkelstein's face while Murray was accepting his fourth award; Johnny Murphy of RCA winning the Quality Records jukebox; radio programmers and record promotion people finding out that they could be replaced by a computer that picks the hits; someone putting up \$100. for somebody to streak and having no takers, not even Mike Reed; the conspicuous absence of CHUM radio brass; Bachman-Turner Overdrive and Terry Jacks reminding us that there is something happening across the great divide; the Inn On The Park finally get rid of a birthday cake that they made up a few months ago with the name Steve on it when Billboard's Steve Lappin celebrated his birthday in the Harvest Room in the hotel; and on the final night, Bernie Finkelstein and Murray McLachlan being driven away in a long, sleek black limousine — back to the country no doubt.

I look forward to seeing the Junos going out to the consumer next year and the industry pitching in with RPM, the CRIA and any other organizations charged with the responsibility of presenting the awards show to the public in a professional manner.

If this year's C8 was any indication, cooperation in all areas of the Canadian music industry will be the norm rather than the exception from now on. It's a good habit to cultivate.

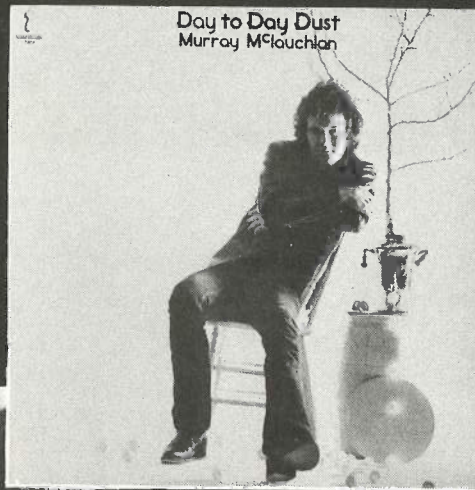

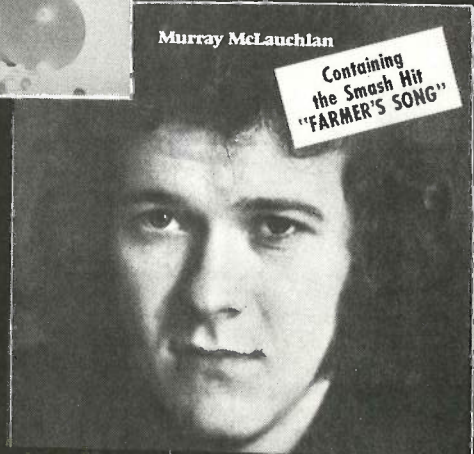
