CHAPTER OF OTTO THE GREAT, EMPEROR OF THE ROMANS, ISSUED IN PAVIA IN THE YEAR OF THE LORD'S INCARNATION 971.

If there should be dissension or a struggle over property between churches or different nobles or different free men, or between a church and an individual, let it be decided by combat. If he does not dare to do so, let their property be rendered to the fisc and let their property be rendered to the church or the individual to whom it belongs in justice.
