

Our wiring workshop will include. Wiring basics for members who may have missed earlier workshops. **Wiring well.** Bring a wired tree for a group critique. Everyone is encouraged to participate. Wire may need to be removed. It can be reapplied with a change of angle so you don't exaggerate any furrows caused by tight wire.



Regarding our future workshop **Making Bonsai pots.** Look for a tree in your collection that needs a pot. The shape of the pot may be decided by the style of the tree.

When designing a bonsai pot, I sometimes refer to Naka's drawing for inspiration on how my pot can represent the landscape where it may have been collected. **Bonsai Techniques**, **John Ishio Naka** in our library





Here is an example, a pot David Allen commissioned Trevor to make around 2017.

He asked to have several small 'tie in' holes so the tree can be secured in the pot and a large drainage hole to prevent water logging

Correctly working on the bevel edge, she has a EZE- Lap sharpener, or a stone for bigger pieces.


It's also a great idea to engrave your tool to keep them from getting misplaced. Thank you Nicky for an informative talk.

Wisteria floribunda (Japanese wisteria) Grown from seeds January 2020. Three seedlings bound together with grafting tape to form a triple trunk. The tree is stands about 20cm high from the rim of the pot. It may take decades for it to flower but when it does the fragrant, mauve racemes can reach up to half a metre in length. (I'm waiting with bated breath!!!) Catherine

Yvonne's Bonsai care notes

Early Autumn

Temperatures and daylight are decreasing, but it's still important to keep checking your watering as we still get some hot days.

If you airlayered this spring, check to see if they can be separated from the mother plant. If you are leaving them until spring ensure they stay moist.

You can take cuttings from your conifers and plant them.

Autumn is time to start fertilising again to boost your trees before winter. Japanese black pines need a good feed this time of the year as well.

Keep an eye out for pests and fungal diseases as warm and windy autumn days can encourage pests and fungal diseases such as powdery mildew.
