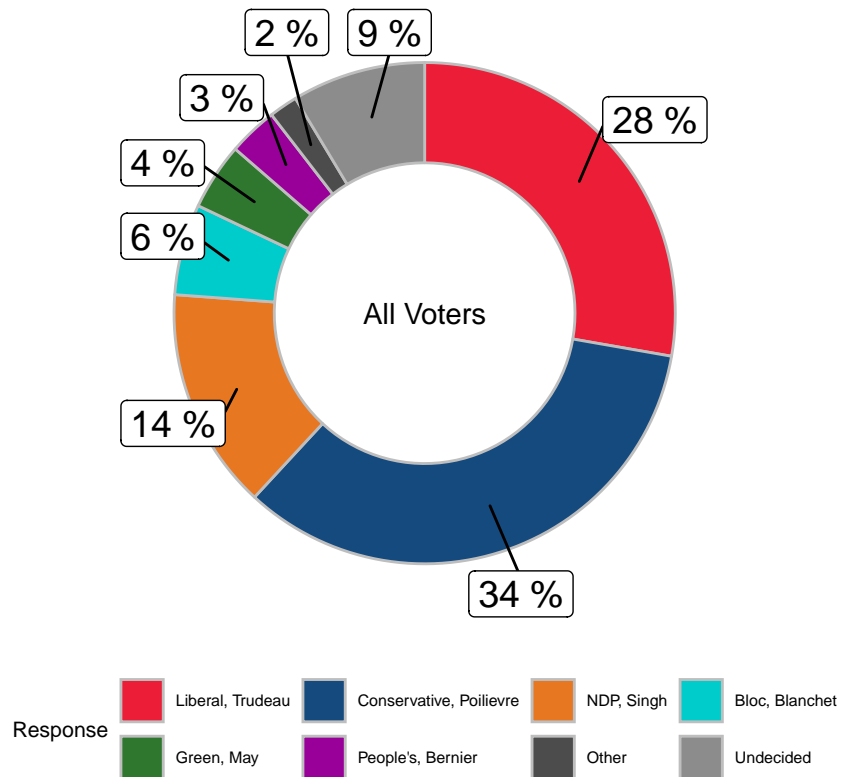
Methodology

The analysis in this report is based on results of a survey conducted from Wednesday, March 8th to Friday, March 10th, 2023, among a sample of 1255 adults, 18 years of age or older, living in Canada. The survey was conducted using automated telephone interviews (Smart IVR). The survey is intended to represent the voting population in Canada.

The margin of error for the poll is +/- 2.8% at the 95% confidence level. Margins of error are higher in each subsample.

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If the federal election were held today, how would you vote? (all voters)



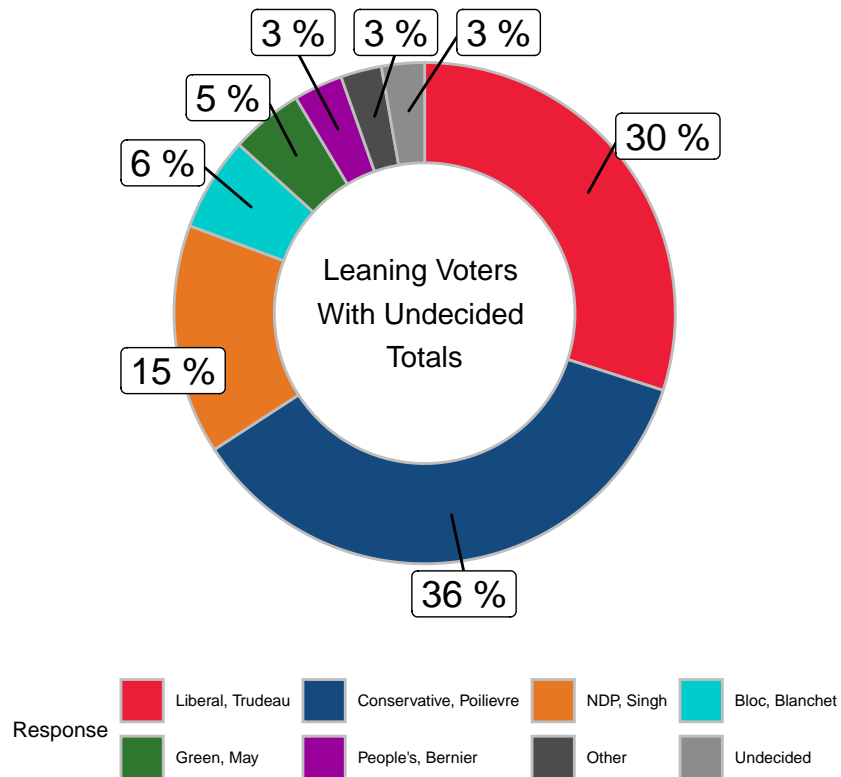

If the federal election were held today, how would you vote? (leaning voters with undecided totals)





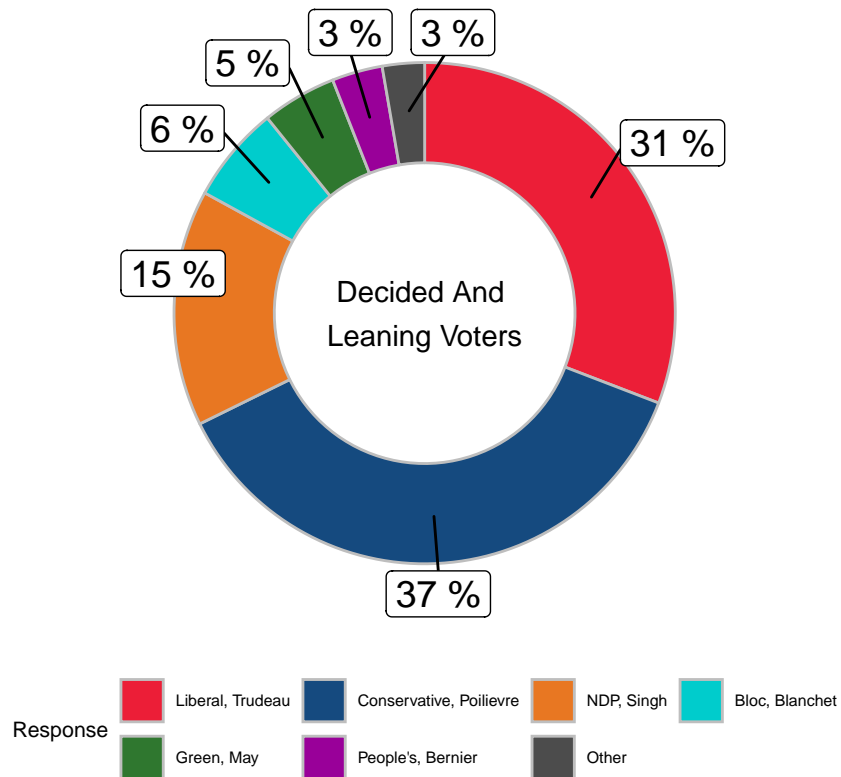

If the federal election were held today, how would you vote? (decided and leaning voters)





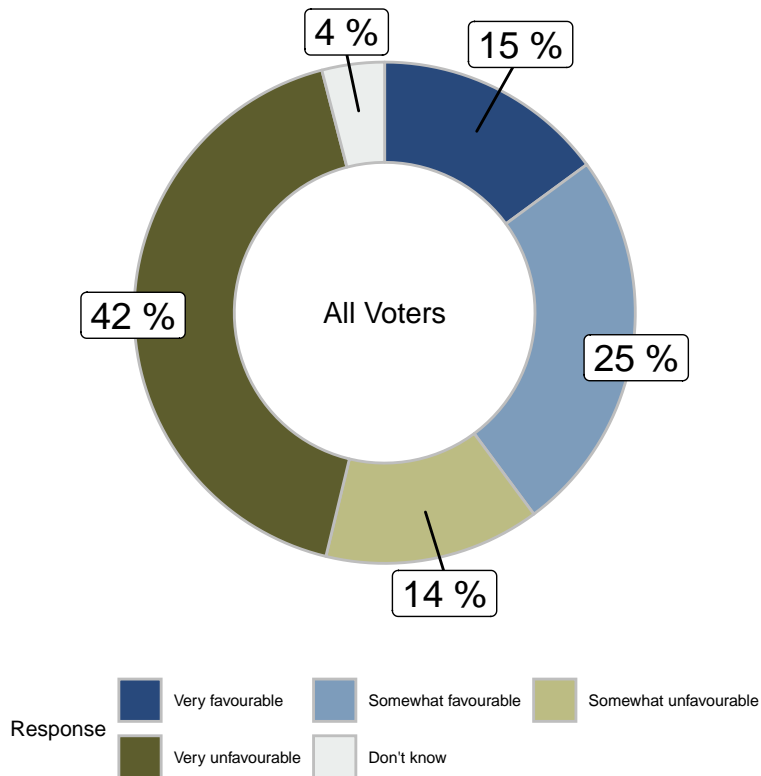

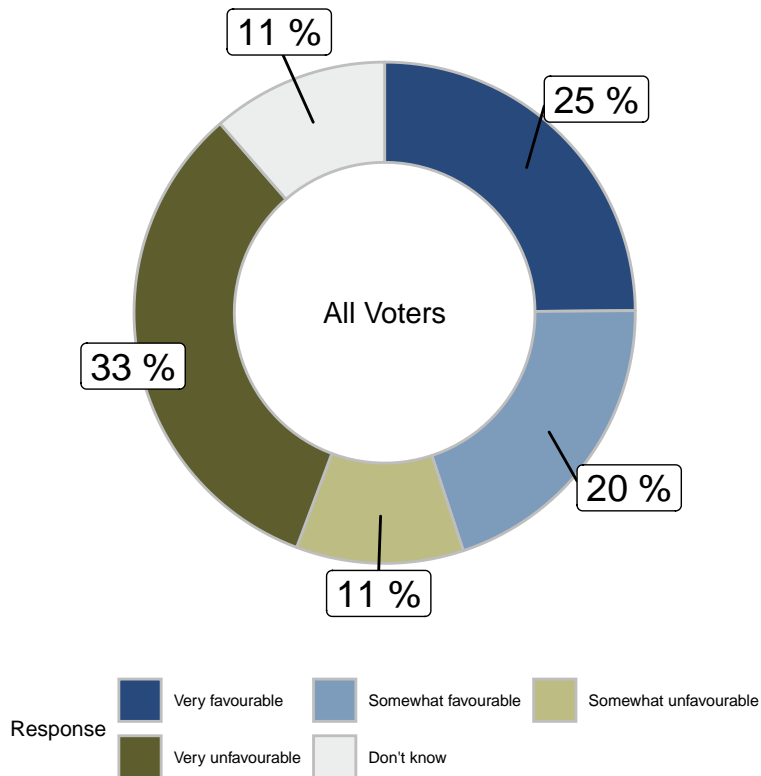

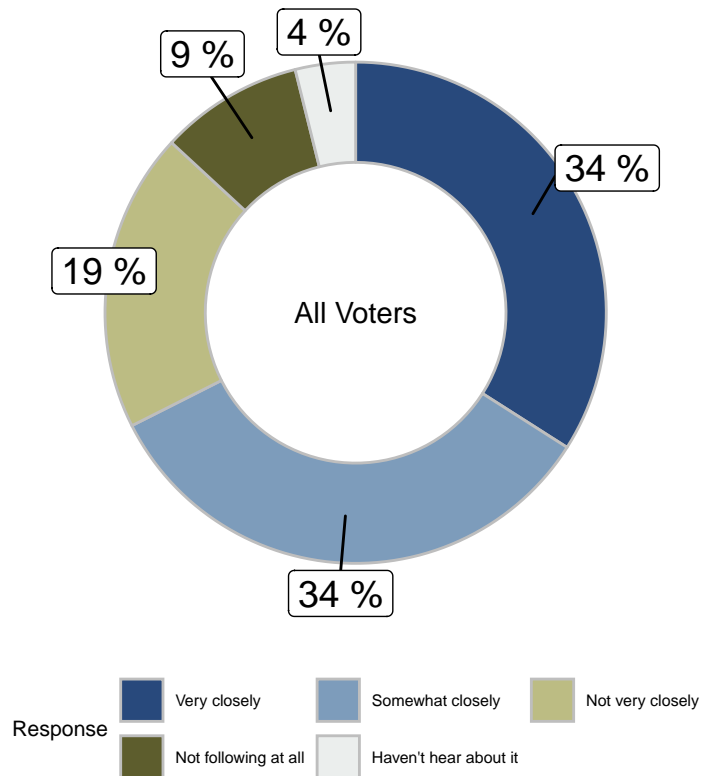

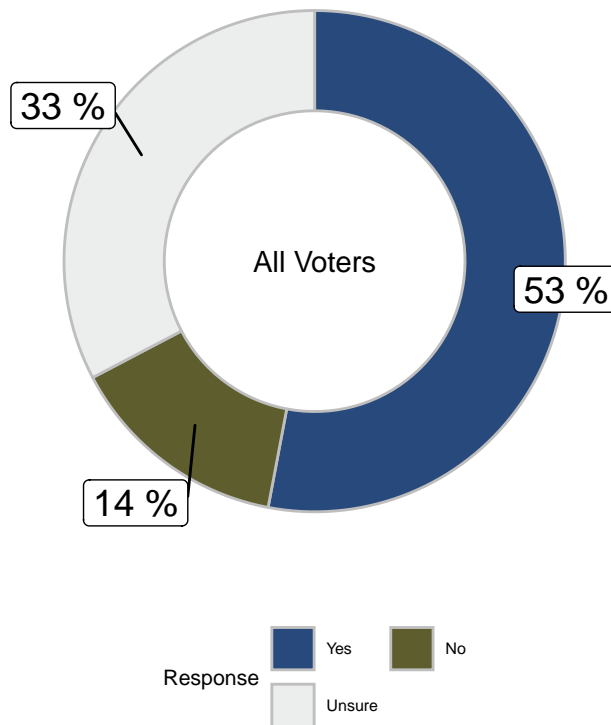

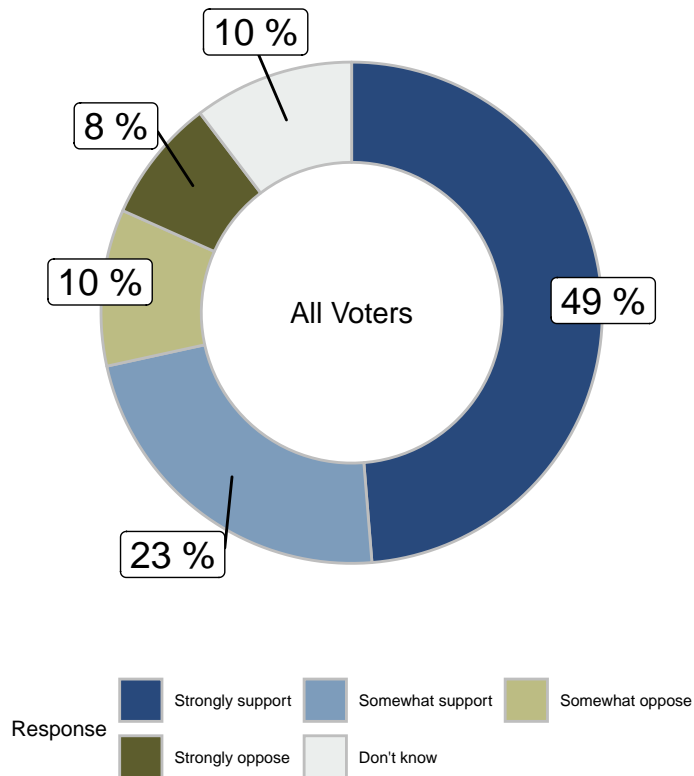

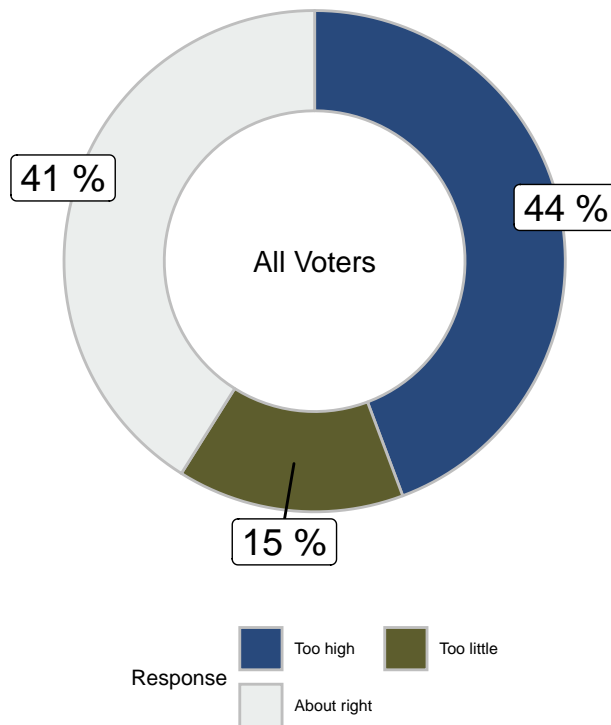

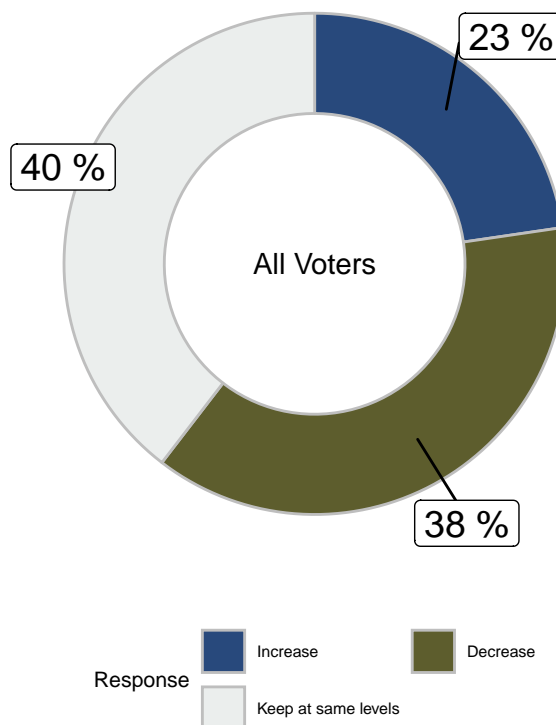
