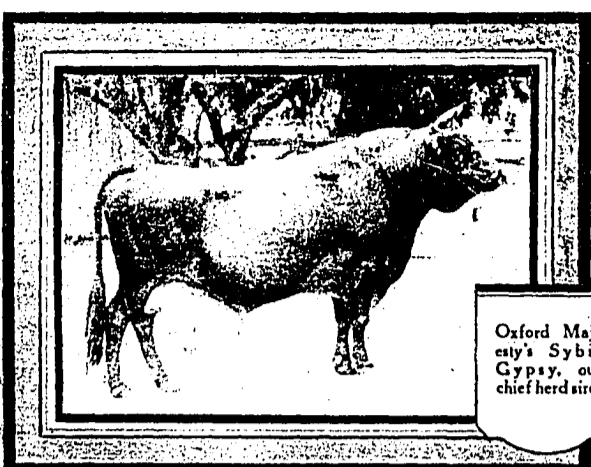

Oxford Majesty's Sybil Gypsy, our chief herd sire.

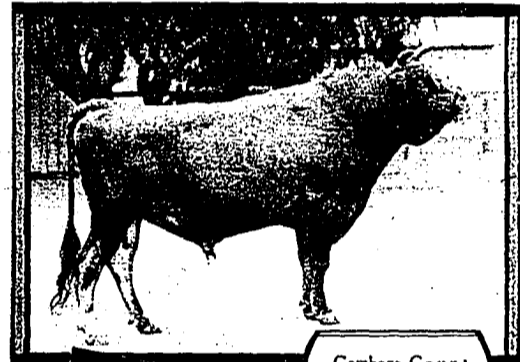

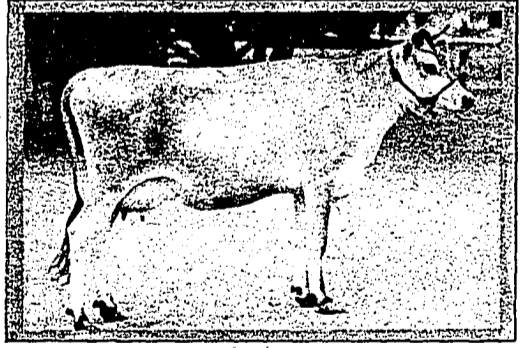

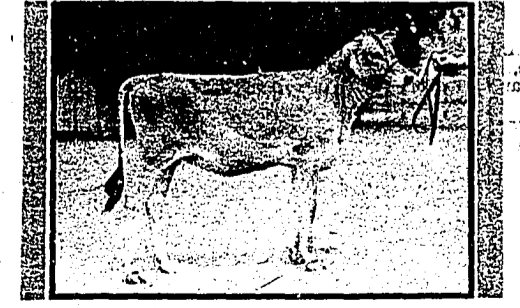

THIS choice selection of Jersey cattle from the La Lomita Herd comprises our first annual public sale offering and represents some of the best bloodlines of the breed.

These animals are being offered at this time to bring more fully before the public the type of Jerseys we are breeding.

The increasing demand for more real dairy cows leads us to believe that the Jersey is destined to play an important part in filling such a demand.

It is our intention to give buyers an opportunity to procure animals that will make good in heavy producing herds and, as such, will be a boost for more and better Jerseys on farms of the Southwest.

We are confident that this offering will meet with your most exacting approval, and are willing to have you place your own valuation upon its merits.

In this choice line-up of 45 head are 40 females and 5 bulls. The females include 17 cows, 7 two-year-old heifers, 12 yearling bred heifers and 4 open heifers. Two of the bulls in the sale are of serviceable age, while three of them are from 8 to 9 months of age.

The herd is under State and Federal supervision, having just passed the Government test. We cull through the stockyard instead of on the auction block.

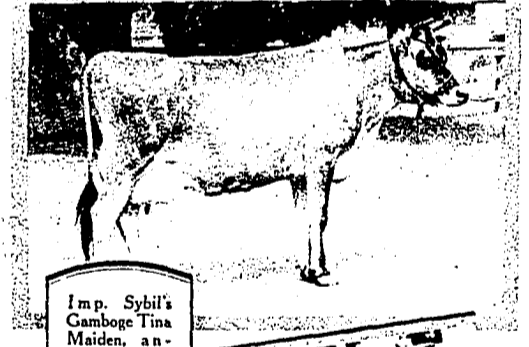
Drive out Washington Blvd., turn right at National Blvd. before entering Culver City, follow National Blvd. to La Lomita Rancho.

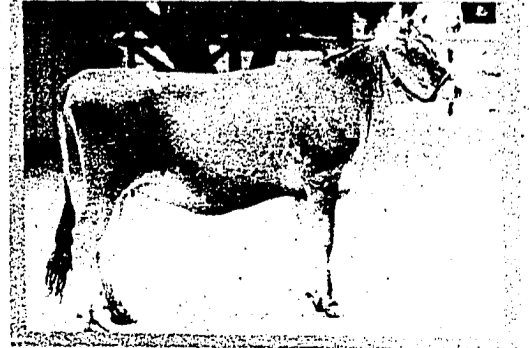
